# Shake it up

Breakfast shakes offer healthy, quick alternative to bacon and eggs

"Not all breakfast smoothies are created equal," said Shari Haley, owner of Nutrition Stop on South Bridge Street, in downtown Linden.

Shakes come in many forms and can be a helpful breakfast replacement, when weekday mornings are less leisurely, and more "go." Making a healthy breakfast shake that will sustain you is more than just cramming some fruit into a blender, she said. "You need to have a balance of protein and complex carbohydrates; that's gonna set you up for a good day." Shakes can also help to maintain, or attain healthy weight, which Haley herself experienced.

Haley said that a shake with fruit only has no protein, and is mostly sugar. It's not that fruit See SHAKE on 11A



# State dollars shrinking, most students need financial assistance

Tuition provides 75 percent of funding for universities

**Flint**—Electrician Tim Jagielo, of Goodrich, replaced the metal halide bulb 15 feet above Saginaw Street on a mild Wednesday, just outside the University Pavilion. A skilled-trades employee, his main projects include a lot of indoor and outdoor lighting, whether replacing bulbs or fixtures. He said these bulbs cost about \$26 each, and are replaced every five to 10 years.

Today, universities are around 75 percent tuition funded, so the \$26 light bulb and Jagielo's salary are mostly paid by tuition dollars.

Former students are paying back loans to the federal government, while some new students pay out of pocket.



# Advertising company on a roll

Michigan brothers want people to think before they flush

An Ann Arbor company is putting advertisement on the one place where everyone is guaranteed to look — toilet paper. Star Toilet Paper is a startup company founded by two brothers who claim to have come up with the idea while on the toilet.

"We have four venues to carry it and over 50 companies advertise with us," said Jordan Silverman. "It started off as a hard sell to advertisers, but as soon as they recognized it as a unique form of advertising, they jumped on board."

The company's tag line is "Don't rush, think before you flush."

Jordan said people laugh and agree that advertising on toilet paper is a great idea. The company's website describes the

toilet paper as septic safe and 100 percent recycled and environmentally friendly. Each advertisement costs half a cent and each roll features ads from six different companies.

A minimum order costs \$99 and one company receives 20,000 ads. The brothers, Bryan and Jordan Silverman, target areas with high traffic, such as bars and sporting arenas in order to reach a wide base of people. Star Toilet Paper attracted vendors by giving them free toilet paper — a deal that businesses did not want to turn down.

It took the brothers about a year of researching various printing methods and safe inks. Jordan said the company's toilet paper is completely safe and has no side effects.

Jordan, who graduated with a philosophy degree from the University of Michigan, said he wants to see his business grow and continue to be successful.

"I just graduated and I'm working on this full time," Jordan said. "We're staying in Michigan for the long term."

been asleep in his bed and was found by firefighters still lying in his bed.

The younger man had been sleeping on the couch in the living room. He escaped from the burning home,

with minor smoke inhalation injuries. Fire crews extinguished the fire and later extricated the victim, said Lintz.

Both the electric and the gas to the home had been shut off by the utility company more than a year ago and the occupants had been living in the home with no utilities, according to the fire chief.

Although the official cause of the fire is still under investigation by Michigan State Police and NOCFA, it appears that the cause may have been due to a candle that was burning in the living room of the home. Lintz said this is the first fire-related fatality that NOCFA has had in more than 10 years. More information will become avail-

able as the investigation continues.

# Enbridge hires sheriff's department for protection

Livingston County Sheriff's Department deputies are being paid \$60 an hour to provide protection to workers involved with the Enbridge pipeline, said Undersheriff Mike Murphy. Shifts usually last from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., or 10 hours a shift.

Murphy said only one deputy works the shift every day. A check from Enbridge is sent to the sheriff's department at the end of the month. The money is then distributed to the respective deputies who worked with pipeline workers. Work conducted by the deputies is considered overtime.

"We told Enbridge that it is our job to make sure your people are safe, and are not assaulted or abused by property owners," Murphy said. "But on the same token, we won't let workers assault or abuse property owners."

Last week, Debora Hense contacted the sheriff's department and halted destruction on her property caused by Enbridge. Murphy said Hense's incident is isolated

and that most residents have complied with Enbridge's demands. Murphy noted that the police will stop Enbridge from continuing with the pipeline project if homeowners call the police.

"Homeowners are not real thrilled with the work but understand that it needs to be done," Murphy said. Murphy recalled the 2010 incident where a pipeline busted and spilled nearly 50,000 gallons of oil into the Kalamazoo River.

Murphy doesn't know how long the contract will last and said the sheriff's department will honor the contract as long as Enbridge wants the department to be present.

"We're not here to pick sides, we're here to make sure cooler heads prevail," Murphy said. Murphy said if courts rule that Enbridge is no longer allowed to work on the project, the sheriff's department will evict workers.

Township Clerk Keith Kremer said Tyrone pays the Livingston County Sheriff's Department roughly \$150,000 a year for one on call, full-time deputy.

Enbridge is a Canadian pipeline company that is installing a new oil pipeline next to an existing pipeline that runs through southeast Michigan. Last week, Enbridge destroyed nearly 200 yards of Hense's property, uprooting roughly 80 trees. Enbridge Spokesperson Joe Martucci said the project serves the public interest and has been approved by the Michigan Public Service Commission (MPSC).

Hense may not be able to find refuge from her local government. Township Clerk Keith Kremer said Enbridge does not have to ask the township for permission to work on the pipeline since the MPSC has more authority than the township.

"We have no authority to stop Enbridge from using the easement," Kremer said. "Enbridge has approval from the state, which goes above the township and county."

Trustee Colleen Ameel said Enbridge presented the pipeline construction as a project that would have minimal impact to homeowners, with most of the work happening close to the existing

easement. Ameel was surprised by the amount of destruction Hense described.

Tyrone Township isn't the only municipality that's having difficulty with Enbridge. Brandon Township Supervisor Kathy Thurman said although her municipality recently passed a resolution requiring Enbridge to meet certain safety regulations, township officials are essentially powerless against the pipeline behemoth.

"Enbridge is of the opinion that they don't need our consent," Thurman said. "I'm not sure if our resolution will stop them. But it will make a statement."

Hense and Enbridge will appear in the Livingston County Circuit Court Sept. 25 to establish what Enbridge can and cannot do during the construction of the new pipeline. Enbridge is currently restricted from working on Hense's property by court order.

### Enbridge parking and storing

Vaughn Smith, owner of Mid Michigan Crushing and Recycling, is currently contracting with Enbridge and allowing the company to park their equipment on his property within the township. Board members said that Smith never notified the township of the business deal and have fined the business owner.

"If he wanted to do this, he could have come to us in June, not after the fact," Kremer said. Township Supervisor Mike Cunningham said numerous trailers, trucks, temporary restrooms and other equipment is being stored on Smith's property, which is not zoned for such activity. Cunningham said Smith is conducting an illegal business.

Kremer said the township could take criminal action against Smith if he does not come into compliance.

Smith did not respond before press time. In a previous Times article, Smith said he notified the board before pipeline construction. "I've had numerous conversations with township officials concerning this matter and until recently, it was not an issue," Smith said in the article.

**Continued from Page 3A** is unhealthy, it's just without the protein that you need to feel full. "It's gonna send you on a carb roller coaster," she said.

"You'll feel hungry in 30 to 40 minutes." This can lead to snacking, grazing, and the behavior you wanted to

avoid in the beginning.

Her shop makes shakes that are non-dairy based with low sugar and fat. Whoever makes your breakfast shake, it needs to be a balanced meal shake, with protein to sustain your energy until the next meal. "Not just a bunch of goodies in a glass," she said.

The good thing about shakes is that a lot of healthy ingredients can be mixed in, like supplement powders. Haley's shop uses Herbalife, a supplement powder, so Haley is partial to her own brand. Other companies like GNC have several powder options for around \$25. Meal

replacement powder ViSalus can be purchased from individual sales reps, and contains non GMO, soy-based protein.

According to Men's Health, the best protein powder should have whey and casein. The site said that whey is broken down into amino acids quickly, while casein is absorbed slowly.

Carnation, Kellogg's and Green Superfood offer breakfast powders on the shelf and a multitude are sold at health food stores.

The Food Network offers a breakfast shake recipe that contains a protein


powder called Spirotein. Haley doesn't like many over the counter powders because they use artificial sweeteners and food coloring.

Either way, Haley said the shake needs 18-25 grams of protein, complex carbohydrates, and should include a decent amount of vitamins and amino acids from supplements. An almond or soy milk can provide this.

The shake should taste good so you want to drink it, and should contain 20 to 23 of the vitamins you need, plus fiber and antioxidants. It should contain two servings of fruit and or vegetables.

Haley said that a shake can cost much less than the \$5 to \$8 the average American spends on breakfast out, which is usually greasy and less healthy.

"The human body has 100 trillion cells, each has special needs," she said. "It's hard to get because most food out there is over processed."

# **Linden families rally** around first grandchild

Chemo begins for baby girl with cancer of the retina

### Summary

Scott and Andrea (Starrs) Ward of Kalamazoo have re-located back to Linden following the recent diagnosis of their 10-month old daughter, Bella, with Bilateral Retinoblastoma.

Andrea (Starrs) Ward, h a s brought nothing but joy to her parents and local grandparents, Pat and Suzanne Starrs and Scott and Sue Ward, all of Linden. Now they are all calling on

their faith and strong family to help each other through Bella's diagnosis on Aug. 1 of Bilateral Retinoblastoma — cancer of the retina within the back of both eyes. This cancer is so rare that it affects only 250 to 300 children each year in the U.S., and about 5,000 children worldwide.

Bella has recently undergone her first round of intra-arterial chemotherapy at C.S. Mott Children's Hospital in Ann Arbor. This chemo regimen is the most aggressive treatment available to treat this particular type of cancer. Bella's right eye has been more seriously affected by the disease, but the condition is severe in both eyes, said her parents. An MRI and eye exam on

Sept. 11 will check on the shrinkage of the tumors and will determine the course of the next round of chemo.

"There's about a 50 percent chance of saving the vision in either eye," said Scott, a pharmaceutical researcher who recently took leave from his job in

Kalamazoo to be closer to Ann Arbor and the strong support system of both families. He's hoping to find another job on this side of the state so that Bella can be close to her grandparents — she's the first grandchild on each side of the family.

The Wards first noticed when Bella was 6 months old that her right eye appeared to be a "lazy eye." "My sister was the first one to bring it to my attention," said Andrea. "I just thought her eyes were crossing like many newborns."

By Memorial Day, however, she noticed that Bella's eyes were darker than normal and made an appointment with her pediatrician, who referred her to an ophthalmologist. By the Fourth of July weekend, the Wards were even more concerned with the look of Bella's eyes. "We tried to get in sooner to our appointment at the Kellogg Eye Center at U-M Hospital," said Andrea.

Today, both of Bella's eyes are swollen shut from the effects of chemo, but the Wards remain confident that she has some vision in her left eye. They are not so sure about her right eye. "We

know she can see light, but we're not sure what else she can see," they said.

Bella continues to play and crawl for a few minutes at a time, although she lacks energy and prefers to be rocked. "She requires care around the clock because she's

not sleeping well," said Andrea.

The Starrs family has stepped up to help, creating Bella's Flower Fund, which family members are selling at the daily at Starrs Farm in Linden. The Wards are appreciative to all of their family, as well as the Starrs' parish family at St. John

Catholic Church in Fenton.

Another upcoming appointment will be genetic testing for Andrea and Scott, because Bilateral Retinoblastoma is hereditary, according to a U-M Hospital website about the disease. "No one in either of our families has had this," said Andrea. "We don't know where it came from."

The Wards are hoping that Bella's diagnosis will alert other parents to make sure their babies are tested at birth with a Red Reflex test, and then watch their child's eyes closely for normal development. Retinoblastoma is generally discovered in babies between the ages of 6 and 24 months.

### What is **Retinoblastoma?**

The most common eye cancer in children, Retinoblastoma is cancer of the retina within the back of the eye. It is very rare, affecting only one in 15,000 live births.

someone may be trying to break in, just press the car alarm button and the loud noise will send any would-be burglar running away from the scene.

This same strategy would work in a parking lot or other area where safety can be an issue. If someone tries to attack you, rob you or lure you

into a car, push the button on your key fob and the attacker will likely flee.

### Here are a few other safety strategies you may not have thought of:

ensure vour own • Store valuables in your personal safety. child's sock drawer rather than a nightstand in your master bedroom, where thieves are

more likely to look for them. Thieves tend to leave children's rooms untouched, according to the book.

• If your front entrance contains decorative glass, make sure to install your security keypad in a space that's not visible from the doorstep. Burglars won't be able to look in and see if the alarm is set.

• Instead of having a mail slot in your door, which weakens its strength and makes it easier to kick in, opt for a mailbox or install the slot near the bottom of the front door, no higher than a quarter of the way up.

• Plant thorny shrubs, such as rosebushes, beneath ground floor windows. Not only will they add beauty to your landscape, they'll also deter burglars from getting in.

> • If you're going on vacation, ask a neighbor to check daily for flyers stuck in your front door or at your mailbox

– that's a clue for burglars that no one is home to pick them up.

• Don't load up your car for vacation the night before and leave it fully packed in your

driveway. A loaded car can serve as a green light for burglars who'll then know you'll be gone for a few days.

• Don't store wood near the side of the house, as it can easily be used by intruders as a stepladder up to a window. Keep logs in the garage or in a pile at the edge of the yard.

• If a yard worker or other unknown visitor uses your bathroom, he may unlatch the window to gain entry later on. Be sure to double-check the lock.

# LF falls just short vs. Gabriel Richard, 42-39

Each time fans have been presented with a tight and thrilling game. But, unfortunately for Blue Devil fans, each time it has resulted in a tough loss for the tri-county squad in blue and white.

The Blue Devils did a lot of things right, but gave up too many scores on defense, resulting in a 42-39 non-league loss to the Fighting Irish on Thursday night.

"They are a really good team," said Lake Fenton running back Nick VanDuser, who ran for a game-high 204 yards on 23 carries. "Like coach said, they are a championship team. We just need to stick with our assignments and that's what hurt us today. The defense didn't stick to their assignments.

"We worked together as a team and we worked hard. Everybody puts in a lot of energy with what they do. We just have to learn to make plays and stick to them."

'Up front offensively in the run game I thought we did a good job," Lake Fenton coach Eric Doyle said. "We have to do a better job protection wise. I thought offensively we weren't bad. A couple of turnovers hurt, but that's going to happen. I don't think there is going to be another game in which we score 39 points and lose. I expect us to get better from this, and we will."

The two teams were locked in an offensive battle all night long. The teams amassed 887 yards total offense combined, and that didn't include an 87-yard kickoff return for a touchdown by Lake Fenton's Neil Allor. In

short, neither team really ever stopped either squad's offense. The contest featured two ties and four lead changes.



A two-point conversion pass to Stevie Tracy put the Fighting Irish up 35-32 with 4:20 left in the third quarter.

The Blue Devils had the ball three times before the Irish scored again, each time being stopped near midfield. On one, Lake Fenton punted. Another ended on an interception and the final on downs. Just one play after Lake Fenton failed to convert a fourth-and-7 from the 50 after an incomplete pass, Gabriel Richard's Ashton Hundley ran 50 yards for a TD, putting the Irish up 42-32.

The Blue Devils didn't cut into the lead until there was just 1.9 seconds left, when quarterback Gage Smith completed a 14yard TD pass to Austin Frank. Frank converted the extra point, making the final gap 42-39

Tozer, the late prolific author of Christian classics called this 'pseudo faith,' writing: 'Pseudo faith always arranges a way out to serve in case God fails it. Real faith knows only one way and gladly allows itself to be stripped of makeshift substitutes. For true faith, it is either God or total collapse. And not since Adam first stood up on earth has God failed a single man or woman who trusted Him.'

True faith must be more than a name or a profession. It must exist in the heart!



is proposed with the governor's budget, and is then approved by the Michigan house and senate. As director for 12 years, she said she has watched the state dollars shrink to where they are now, at 12 percent at UM-Flint. "The amount of support coming through the state is reduce, reduce, reduce," she said.

Inside the University of Michigan, the provost's office develops the budget for the university, which is proposed to the board of regents, who vote to approve the budget. Each department, like the one Jagielo works for, has its own internal budget including line items for salaries and materials. "It's a big and complex budget," said Rick Fitzgerald, spokes-

person for the University of Michigan.

According to Bill Webb, UM-Flint assistant vice chancellor for business and finance, the "big campus" in Ann Arbor receives more state funding than UM-Flint. The department Jagielo works for reports to Webb. Part of Webb's job is making sure the environment at the university is conducive to learning, which includes these bigger lighting and boiler projects. "We have roads, we have streets," said Webb, which he is responsible for, overall.

Tim Barden, assistant director for skilled trades helps coordinate 14 trades -people, including electricians, plumbers, repair people and grounds keepers. His budget is \$5.4 million. Barden's job includes facilitating projects that will

save the university money. A \$70,000 library lighting improvement project will save the university around \$50,000 each year, in electricity, but also with a credit from Consumers Energy. "We are saving tremendous amounts of energy on lighting projects," said Barden.

To cover tuition that keeps the colleges running, students apply for grants, but many end up paying for tuition through federal loans. The New York Times reported that in 2011, the average student loan debt was \$23,000, with 10 percent owing more than \$54,000, and one percent owing more than \$100,000.

Tuition at the UM-Flint for fall and winter for a full 12 credits is \$4,308 per semester, plus fees, said Vedder.

But the university doesn't deal with the

federal government, as they wouldn't deal with students using a credit card to buy supplies. Money from the department of education is paid to a student account, which the student uses to pay the university.

While student tuition pays for university staff, facilities and academics, it does not pay for auxiliary services like the food service at UM-Flint, or athletics in Ann Arbor, which are fee-supported.



# One gallon or two liters?

### Americans mix metric and **U.S. standard measurements** on everyday products

When you're shopping at the grocery store, you're likely to purchase a gallon of milk and a 2-liter bottle of pop — without ever thinking that these two beverages represent two different world standards of measurement.

The U.S. is the only industrialized nation that does not use the metric system as its primary standard of measurement. The U.S. Standards of Measurements is nearly the same system brought over by the colonists

from England, with its origins from a variety of cultures — Babylonian, Egyptian, Roman, Anglo-Saxon and Norman French.

Now in uniform standards, these measurements are rooted from primitive societies that often used the parts of a body for measurement in constructing dwellings, clothing, bartering, etc.

Most of the world uses the metric system, more formally known as the International System of Units -a decimal-based system of measurement units related by factors of 10. In everyday use, the most common metric units are the meter to measure length, the second to measure time, the kilogram to measure mass or weight, the liter to measure volume and the degree Celsius to measure temperature.

Today, the U.S. uses the metric system in the armed forces, science, medicine, aviation, and government as well as various sectors of industry. In fact, a number of everyday items in the U.S. are manufactured in metric units. For

example, digital camera resolution is specified in megapixels, and computer memory storage capacity is measured in kilobytes, megabytes, or gigabytes. When you buy wine, it's measured in milliliters. A fifth of liquor,

once one-fifth of a U.S. gallon, or 757 mL, is now commonly labeled 750 mL, though it is still referred to as "a fifth."

Automobile parts are measured metrically, to be compatible in worldwide

markets. People in the scientific and medical/ pharmaceutical communities also use metric units almost exclusively. Some U.S. consumer products come in rounded metric sizes, due to the international nature of manufacturing, distribution,

and sales. One example is Crest Glide dental floss, which is available in 35-, 40-, and 50-meter packages. Even the expression, "She earns \$80k," is using the metric system, as the small "k" denotes "thousand."

"We teach a little of both systems," said Gary Horning, fourth-grade teacher at North Road Elementary School in Fenton. "It's part of our math curriculum and is useful especially when the kids start doing science experiments that utilize metric measurements."

He uses visuals such as a paper clip to denote the weight of a gram and a pop bottle to show the size of two liters. See METRIC on 2B

Teaching both systems of measurement is part of Michigan's Core Curriculum, a voluntary federal program, which standardizes school curriculum from kindergarten through high school. "Michigan is one of 46 states to be involved in Core Curriculum," said Holly's Patterson Elementary School Principal Dennis Inhulsen.

"As part of this curriculum, early elementary students begin to learn about measurements, increasing their exposure to these concepts each year."

While many people would like to see the U.S. convert entirely to the metric system, it is a voluntary measure. The Omnibus Trade & Competitiveness Act of 1988 amended the 1975 law to make the metric system the "preferred system of weights and measures for United States trade and commerce" and charged federal agencies with converting their activities to the metric system.

So far, it hasn't happened. Many cite economics as an obstacle to converting to the metric system, because of the expense of changing road signs, industrial machining, etc. Others say that conver-

**12. The last thing I want to do on the sidelines** of a basketball game or during intermission at the school play is have a conference with you about your child. If you have something to talk to me about, come by my office during the day or even better, make an appointment.

**13.** If you and your child don't like his teacher, tough luck. Think of it as a lesson: In school, as in life, sometimes you have to learn to deal with things you don't like.

**14. When an unruly student gets sent to my office,** my favorite strategy is not to engage right away. I just let them sit there in agony while I keep working. It gives them a chance to calm down and de-escalate. Try it at home; it works.

**15.** For years, folks have said that if you can't do anything else, you can always go into education. The truth is, we're not the leftovers, and this is what most of us wanted to do. I had been accepted to law school, but I chose this. — Reader's Digest

### Dear Parents,

On behalf of First Student and Lake Fenton Transportation Department, welcome to a new school year. We take great pride in our department and are looking forward to serving you during the 2012-2013 School year.

Our number one priority is to provide the safest, most reliable student transportation service. We focus on the safest loading and unloading procedure for your child.

Michigan State law requires bus stops to be 200 feet apart from one another. Please have your child at his/her bus stop 15 minutes early for the first few days of school. Loading times are approximate until drivers adjust the routes. When routes have been adjusted we recommend your children are at their bus stop 5 minutes prior to their loading time.

The entire bus fleet is equipped with the eight-light system, crossing gate, side stop arm, two-way radios, and all buses are equipped with the child check mate system. All the drivers use a uniform crossing pattern, and check their bus after each route to deactivate the child check mate system and hang a EMPTY PLAC-ARD SIGN to ensure no sleeping children are left on board. All drivers prior to employment will have an extensive Local, State and Federal background check on both criminal and drivers license records. After employment we update these records yearly. Physical and substance abuse screening. Random substance abuse screening is performed on the entire transportation staff throughout the year. Post accident screening. Every driver is fully trained with a minimum of 52 hours classroom and behind the wheel training. Every driver is to attend scheduled safety meetings. Every driver is re-evaluated at least once a calendar year.

We ask, for the safety of your child and to continue consistency for the driver that you maintain the same pick up and drop off location every day throughout the week. Your AM pick up may be different from your PM drop off.

- We feel it is very important for you to be visible to the bus driver when unloading your children; this reassures the bus driver and child you are home.
- Please keep your emergency card up to date, any bus changes please notify transportation as well.

### Who qualifies for transportation?

Michigan State Law does not require a school district to provide transportation to and from school. The Lake Fenton Community School District, as a courtesy to the public, provides transportation to all students who live outside the designated walk area from their home school. The Lake Fenton Community School District has established a one pickup one drop off procedure; this means that a student must have the same pick up point Monday through Friday and the same dropoff point Monday through Friday. The morning pickup location may be different from the afternoon drop-off point.

School District practice requires that a parent or other designated responsible adult be visible at the bus stop for students at, or under, the kindergarten grade level. If the child must cross the street to board the bus, the responsible adult must escort the child across the road. Kindergartens without adult supervision present at the bus stop will be instructed to remain on the bus and that student will then be transported to Kids Club. Parents of students in grades first through fifth may make a written request that the procedure used for kindergarten students be used for their older children. First Student Lake Fenton Community Schools will make every attempt to honor each of these requests. It is strongly advised that the parents of young children make arrangements to meet the bus both before and after school, especially during the first week that your child rides to school. This provides a wonderful opportunity to start and finish the school day on a positive note and ensures safety during the walk to and from the bus stop. There are certain programs that require parents or adults to meet the bus. If your student is involved in these programs information concerning special transportation procedures will be made available.

The entire bus fleet is equipped with the eight light system, crossing gate, side stop arm, two-way radios, digital cameras and all buses are equipped with the child check mate system. All the drivers use a uniform crossing pattern, and check their bus after each route to deactivate the child check mate system and hang a EMPTY PLACARD SIGN to ensure no sleeping children are left on board.

- · Prior to employment we perform an extensive Local, State and Federal background check on both criminal and drivers license records. after employment we update these records yearly.
- Physical and substance abuse screening. Random substance abuse screening is performed on the entire transportation staff throughout the year. Post accident screening.
- Every driver will be fully trained with a minimum of 52 hours classroom and behind the wheel training.
- Every driver is to attend scheduled safety meetings.
- · Every driver is re-evaluated at least once a calendar year.

The policy, for the safety of your child is to have consistent pick up and drop-off locations. You must maintain the same pick-up and drop-off location every day throughout the week. Your AM pick up may be different from your PM drop-off.

- We feel it is very important for you to be visible to the bus driver when unloading your children; this reassures the bus driver and child you are home.
- · Please keep your emergency card up to date, any bus changes please notify transportation as well.
- Please have your kindergarten child wear their bus tag for the first two weeks of school.



DEAR DR. DONOHUE: I am a diabetic male, age 96, with many aches and pains but no high blood pressure. I have low cholesterol and am in control of my diabetes. In the past few weeks, I've noticed swelling of my ankles and feet. I have been taking two water pills a day for it. I never use salt or eat salty foods. What can you suggest for me? - S.S.

ANSWER: That swelling is edema, and it has many causes. One is sitting for long periods with the legs dangling down. With the legs in that position, gravity pulls fluid from the legs' blood vessels. Treatment for this kind of edema consists in elevating the legs. Every hour, lie down for 10 minutes with pillows under your legs and feet so that they are above heart level. When sitting, squeeze the leg muscles over and over. Muscle contractions stop the oozing of fluids from the blood vessels. And take a morning and afternoon walk. Elastic hose can keep fluid in blood vessels and out of the surrounding tissues.

Dilated leg veins — varicose veins — promote edema. A clot in a leg vein is another cause. That's usually quite painful, and you'd be aware that something is going on if you had a clot. Liver ailments can lead to edema. The liver makes a blood protein, albumin, that keeps fluid in circulation. With a low production of this protein, fluid leaks out of vessels. Kidney failure is another reason why edema occurs. Medicines can lead to it. The popular nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory medicines such as Advil and Aleve are two examples. So are medicines called calcium channel blockers, such as nifedipine and verapamil. If you increased the dose of your water pill on your own, you shouldn't. You can develop a potassium deficiency from overuse of water pills.

Try the things I mentioned. See if they bring down the swelling. If they don't, you'll have to consult your doctor

A much more important cause of ankle-foot edema is heart failure, something that your doctor must check you for.

## Toddler bites dog; aunt is barking mad

DEAR AMY: I have a 9-year-old toy poodle, and he's gentle and great with children. The problems began when Mariah, my 21/2-year-old

niece, started biting the dog. My sister refuses to do anything about it. I thought I had a system worked out - I made sure he was always with me when I was at home, and I put him in his crate when I was at work. However, the last three days when I returned home the dog was outside the crate. My sister admits she let him out, though she won't say why. I understand this is a very hard time in her life, but something needs to be done



### now. I don't want anyone to get hurt. What can I do? — Worried

DEAR WORRIED: Biting is not necessarily a 'normal part of toddler-hood.' It is, however, a very common toddler reaction to stress. You can assume that this little girl is very confused and stressed. It also sounds as if your sister is not doing a very good job with her. You should try your best to teach your niece appropriate behavior around pets. You are right that this is an important safety issue.

### **DEAR AMY:** Is it inappropriate for a guest to wear a tuxedo to a wedding? I know some invitations say 'black tie optional,' but what if there is no reference to formal wear in the invitation? — AI

**DEAR AL:** Unless an invitation indicates 'formal attire' or 'black tie optional,' it is probably best to leave the tuxedo at home — unless you're a member of the bridal party (or the wait staff).
