ly...the charm and hospitality of Charleston, South Carolina.

Wherever your dreams of travel take you, this year will offer you affordable destinations, from international hot spots to breathtaking vistas at home in the U.S. Whether you have a vacation planned yet for this summer or are dreaming about trips in the future, now is the time to begin making plans.

In the U.S., popular familyfriendly destinations are Orlando, Florida, the National Parks out west, Chicago, New York City and Washington, D.C. "D.C. is a great city to visit," said Chris Nikitaides, travel consultant at Travel Brokers, with an office in Fenton. "It's a friendly city and the people are helpful. There's so much to do."

The "big-three" theme parks in Orlando — Disney World, Universal Studios and SeaWorld — all have rolled out new attractions in 2014, making these destinations even more popular this year. Summer travel brings out the crowds, however, so if you can wait until September or October, you'll find fewer crowds and less wait time, whether you're visiting Disney World in Florida or Yosemite National Park in California.

Some places in the world are friendlier to American travelers, while others are "hot spots" due to political unrest, staggering crime rates and terrorist activity. Other locales may be temporarily unsafe to travel in because of natural disasters, extreme weather conditions, fire danger, etc.

Here are a few countries you might want to avoid this year when planning your travel itinerary:

Libya — anti-American sentiment, militia groups and terrorist cells.

Brazil — political instability, staggering crime rate four times that of the U.S.

Iraq — embroiled in war for decades, anti-American sentiment, persistent terrorist activity, military battles with Turkey and Iran.

Somalia — no U.S. Embassy, highest level of travel warning from the U.S.

Nigeria — one of the most dangerous countries for American



North Carolina and Galena, Illinois (once home to President Ulysses S. Grant). These cities all made the grade in Conde Naste Traveler's recent Reader's Choice

Survey for friendliest U.S. cities.

Great travel deals in the U.S. also include Philadelphia, Seattle, Las Vegas Minneapolis and Maui, according to Conde Naste Traveler.

All-inclusive resorts in popular vaca-

tion spots like the Dominican Republic, Jamaica and Cancun continue to be the best value for travel, according to both Travel Brokers and Superior Travel.

"If a traveler is seeking the 'best bang for the buck' and wants to see something more unusual, the absolute best value is U.S. national parks, and escorted vacations, which are available worldwide," said John Schmitt of Superior Travel.

For international destinations beyond all-inclusives, Randy Church at Travel Brokers suggests taking a close look at Spain — from Madrid to Barcelona. "You can take a 10-day land tour to Spain for about \$1,475 per person," said Church. "That price doesn't include airfare, but it's still a great value. "

Greece and Egypt are on both local travel companies' lists for their own wishlist travel. Schmitt's favorite trip was to Greece, Egypt and Israel, where his family enjoyed a three-night stay in Athens, Greece, followed by a seven-night cruise to the Greek Islands, Egypt and Israel. "We rode camels to the Pyramids, crossed the Nile and then in Israel, visited the 12 stations of Christ. What a life-changing trip," said Schmitt.

While some people might hesitate to travel in these areas due to today's political and economic climate, experienced travelers should feel safe there. "The rich history and culture compares to no other," said Schmitt. "I would go there again today."

Other options, however, would be to travel anywhere in the Mediterranean, including Italy, France and Spain.

Italy continues to be a favorite destination. Nikitaides of Travel Brokers says that travel to Italy is their number one most requested European vacation destination. "Travel to Europe is becoming more affordable again, with the Euro exchange," she said.

On a personal note, a return trip to Italy is on Church's wish list for travel. "Rome has all the history, and sights like the Coliseum and the Vatican," he said. "We've been to Sicily, Rome and the Amalfi Coast. The next time we travel to Italy, we'd like to visit Venice and other northern cities."

Other travel destinations to keep in mind?

"European river cruises continue to be popular," said Church, "as well as combination land and cruise trips to Alaska."

INTERESTING TRAVEL NOTE:

Travel to Cuba, forbidden by the U.S. government for its citizens since the 1960s, is slowly opening up to Americans. The most common legal travel option is through "People to People" programs for an educational tour.

"A trip to Cuba is like traveling back in time," said Randy Church of Travel Brokers. It's a mixture of a simple pace and lifestyle with colorful 1950s cars parked in front of colonial and neoclassical architecture. It's the melting pot of the Caribbean.

Travel to Cuba comes at a price, however. Church said there is a 13-day tour through "People to People" for \$7,465 per person.

tourists, kidnapping is commonplace, pirating in the Gulf of Guinea, extremist groups.

Mexico — state of Sonora is now advising U.S. citizens to take highest precautions for personal safety in and around Nogoles. Sonora is a key region in international drug and human trafficking.

Venezuela — growing murder rate, travelers must remain vigilant by traveling in groups during daytime only.

Skipping a weekly mowing

Extended gaps between mowings allow lawns to grow tall and shaggy rather than thick and dense. If done repeatedly, fewer blades of grass will grow because tall grass will

block out the sun. When that tall grass finally is mowed, the gaps between the blades will be large enough for weeds to take hold.

TIP: Frequent mowing is the single biggest reason why golf courses and professional baseball diamonds tend to look lusher than yards.

What to do: Mow

at least once a week. If a gap of more than a week does occur, adjust your mower's blade height to avoid clipping off more than one-third of the grass height in the next mowing, then mow again a few days later to bring the lawn down to the preferred height.



Buying off-brand grass seed

Bargain-brand grass seed is inexpensive for a reason — most often it failed to pass an inspection because there was weed seed mixed in with the grass seed. So if you plant bargain seed, there's a good chance that you are introducing weeds to your lawn.

What to do: Pay a bit more for the seed that is at least 99.5 percent weedseed free. By law, this statistic should be listed on grass-seed packaging.

Overwatering

More lawns are damaged by overwatering than by underwatering. Overwatering increases the odds of getting lawn diseases, it can wash away fertilizer and it can cause a lawn to grow faster than normal, increasing the odds that it will be scalped during a subsequent mowing

What to do: Purchase a soil moisture meter so that you don't have to guess when your lawn needs water. Simple meters are available for as little as \$10.



Not knowing what type of grass you have

Grass is not just grass. Many different turfgrasses are grown in US lawns — Kentucky bluegrass, fescue and ryegrass are common in cold climates...to name just a few. Not knowing what type of grass you have means that you can't care for your grass the way that it prefers to be treated. For example, different types of grass thrive at different heights.

- What to do: Bring a sample of your grass to your local garden center, home center or hardware store wherever grass seed is sold-and ask what type of grass you have.
- TIP: You can enter the name of this grass into a search engine to find Websites from university extensions and other sources that provide mowing height recommendations and other care tips for your specific lawn.



Overfertilizing

Excess fertilizer could seriously dehydrate grass, something known as "burning" the lawn. And even if a lawn escapes this fate, the excess fertilizer could make the grass grow faster than normal, potentially leading to scalping of the lawn when it is mowed.

- What to do: The amount of fertilizer recommended on the packaging is the maximum amount that's safe to use. Spend a little extra for a "timerelease," or "slow-release," fertilizer that supplies nutrients to the lawn slowly over a period of weeks, not all at once.
- about 50 percent of its total nitrogen as slow-release nitrogen. To determine this, find the overall percentage of "slowly available nitrogen" (indicated in small print on the package) and make sure that it is about half the overall percentage of "total nitrogen."



Mowing with dull blades

Dull mower blades rip grass blades apart rather than making a clean cut. This rough treatment can make grass more susceptible to drought and disease. It also can make the grass appear white.

What to do: Sharpen your mower blades at least once a year — potentially several times a year if your lawn has lots of rocks or roots that often nick your blade.

Which means: A 50 lb. bag equals five pounds (or 10 percent) Nitrogen, five pounds phosphorus, and five pounds potassium. The remaining 70 percent is simply filler, or inert ingredients, which are there mostly to help disperse the chemicals.

Bagging grass

Grass clippings provide much needed nutrients to your lawn. Contrary to widely held belief, leaving clippings on a lawn does not increase the odds of thatch problems — thatch is a layer of decomposing grass roots, not grass clippings.

What to do: Mulching is easier, faster and better for your lawn than bagging. Mulching mowers are specifically designed to finely chop clippings and return them to the lawn.





To your good health



DEAR DR. ROACH: Why do people snicker when I tell them I have RLS? They wouldn't laugh if they knew the amount of sleep deprivation I have endured during the 20 years it took to correctly diagnose it. I think if it hadn't been for Sinemet (levodopa and carbidopa), a Parkinson's drug, I would have gone mad long ago. Has anyone discovered what causes it? — G.S.G.

ANSWER: Restless leg syndrome causes an urge to move the legs (and sometimes arms), which is worse at nighttime and is relieved by movement. It is usually accompanied by unpleasant sensations in the legs. When accompanied by sleep deprivation, as yours has been, it is also called periodic limb movement disorder. The cause is known only in a minority of cases. About 40 percent of cases seem to run in families, and several genetic factors have been identified. Iron deficiency sometimes is associated with RLS, and replacement of the iron can improve symptoms. Moderate exercise, leg massage and heat (say, a warm bath before bed) are some nondrug ways of improving symptoms. Levodopa/ carbidopa is an effective treatment; pramipexole (Mirapex) and ropinirole (Requip) also are effective for many people. There are other alternatives as well. An expert in the condition, usually a neurologist, is essential for severe cases. I think the name 'restless leg syndrome' may be part of the reason why people don't take this condition as seriously as it deserves. After all, legs are supposed to move, and being "restless" doesn't sound so bad — but as you know, it's a lot more than that. For this reason, the new name, Willis-Ekbom disease, is preferred by some. Great information about this condition is available at RLS.org

SAVORY GOAT CHEESE & CHIVE BISCUITS

INGREDIENTS

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 t. baking powder
- ½ t. baking soda
 ¾ t. fine sea salt
- ½ t. freshly ground pepper
- 1¾ oz. grated parmesan (3/4 cup)
- 6 T. cold, unsalted butter, in ½" chunks
- 1 bunch chives, finely sliced
- 3 oz. fresh goat cheese, plus 3 more oz. for sprinkling (about 1 cup total)
- ¾ cup buttermilk

DIRECTIONS

- In a large bowl, sift together the flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt, and pepper. Add the parmesan and butter, and work with your fingertips until the butter is incorporated with lots of butter chunks remaining.
- 2. Stir in the chives and crumble in 3 ounces of the goat cheese.
- 3. Add the buttermilk little by little, stirring until the dough just begins to clump together and no dry, floury bits remain. Gently knead the dough in the bowl a few times to bring the dough together into a ball.
- 4. Roll the dough out on a lightly floured surface into a rectangle that is a scant 1/2" thick and roughly twice as wide as it is tall. Crumble 2/3 of the remaining goat cheese over the center square of the dough then fold the dough in half, like closing a book. You should have a long rectangle of dough layered with cheese. Press down gently to flatten, then roll the rectangle into a loose spiral, starting with a skinny end.
- 5. Roll the layered dough into a 7x7" square that is 3/4" thick, then cut the dough into 16 squares.
- 6. Bake at 450 degrees until the biscuits are golden on top, about 15 min.
