#### Alpena — Gaylord — Mio Tour

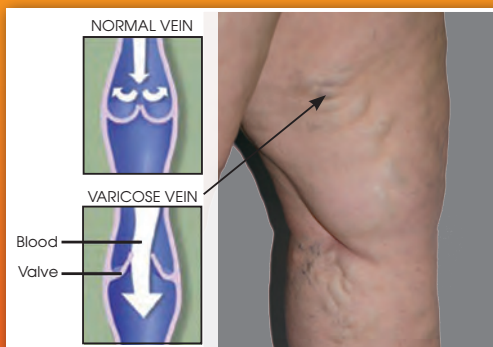
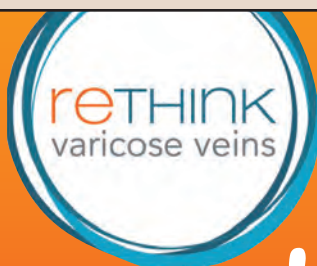

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# 9 foods that'll re-grow from kitchen scraps

► There are heaps of different foods that will re-grow from the pieces that you'd normally throw out.

## Onions

Onions are one of the easiest vegetables to propagate. Just cut off the root end of your onion, leaving a half inch of onion on the roots. Place it in a sunny position in your garden and cover the top with soil. Ensure the soil is kept moist.

Keep re-planting the root ends you cut off, and you'll never need to buy onions again.

## Garlic

When garlic begins to sprout, you can put them in a glass with a little water and grow garlic sprouts. The sprouts have a more mild flavor than garlic and can be added to salads, pasta and other dishes.



## Pineapple

To re-grow pineapples, you need to remove the green leafy piece at the top and ensure that no fruit remains attached. Carefully slice small, horizontal sections from the bottom of the crown until you see root buds (the small circles on the flat base of the stalk). Remove the bottom few layers of leaves, leaving about an inch base at the bottom of the stalk. Plant your pineapple crown in a warm and well-drained environment. Water your plant regularly at first, reducing to weekly watering once the plant is established.



## Carrots

Put carrot tops in a dish with a little water. Set the dish in a well-lit room or a window sill. You'll have carrot tops to use in salads.

Mushrooms can be propagated from cuttings, but they're one of the more difficult veggies to re-grow.



## Mushrooms

Prepare a mix of soil and compost in a pot (not in the ground) so your re-growth is portable and you can control the temperature of your mushrooms. Just remove the head of the mushroom and plant the stalk in the soil, leaving just the top exposed. In the right conditions, the base will grow a whole new head. You'll know fairly quickly if your mushroom has taken to the soil as it will either start to grow or start to rot in the first few days.

## Celery

Cut off the base of the celery and place it in a saucer or shallow bowl of warm water in the sun. Leaves will begin to thicken and grow in the middle of the base, then transfer the celery to soil.



## Scallions

You can regrow scallions by leaving an inch attached to the roots and placing them in a small glass with a little water in a well-lit room.



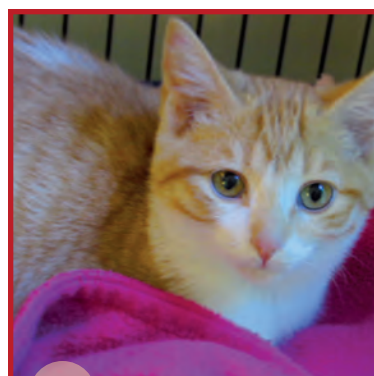
## Potatoes

Pick a potato that has robust "eyes" growing on it, and cut it into pieces around 2 inches square, ensuring each piece has at least one or two eyes. Leave the cut pieces to sit at room temperature for a day or two, which allows the cut areas to dry and callous over. Plant your potato pieces around 8 inches deep with the eye facing upward, and cover it with around 4 inches of soil, leaving the other 4 inches empty. As your plant begins to grow and more roots appear, add more soil.



## Ginger

Ginger is very easy to re-grow. Simply plant a spare piece of ginger rhizome (the thick knobby bit you cook with) in potting soil with the newest (ie. smallest) buds facing upward. Ginger enjoys filtered, not direct, sunlight in a warm, moist environment.

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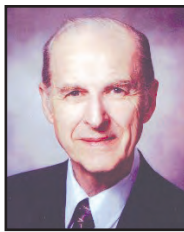

## Learning from life's close calls

'Now may your guardian angel be at the wheel.'

Those words were part of a prayer offered by my father-in-law while standing beside our car as Pauline and I prepared to leave central New York, heading home after a family get-together. Less than 30 minutes later, our lives would be in jeopardy.

When the traffic signal ahead turned green, we started to proceed, unaware of the speeding car bearing down on us from our left; the careless driver ignored the red light warning him to stop.

'Roger!' my frightened wife exclaimed; the urgency in her voice causing me to glance to my left in time to see a speeding car bearing down on us, soon to strike us broadside. I had but a split-second to decide whether to hit the brake or the accelerator and, thankfully, chose the brake. The other driver veered left and roared past us.

Had I decided to accelerate, there would have been a terrible crash, the twisting of metal, the sounds of sirens, probable hospitalization and possibly death. All of these terrible consequenc-

es of reckless driving would have taken place within minutes of the time we had been safely embracing loved ones.

We had been the youngest of those gathered in New York for that special time with our family, yet had left, apart from God's protection, the closest to death.

You probably remember some close call, a brush with death. Just thinking about it conjures up scenes of a near auto accident, swimming to shore from an overturned boat, missing a plane that crashed or surviving some deadly disease.

The Psalmist understood close calls and wrote the following prayer of thanksgiving for deliverance from them: 'Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all His benefits. Who forgives all your iniquities, who heals all your diseases; who redeems your life from destruction' (Psalm 103:2-4), a prayer I quote every morning to start my day praising instead of pouting.

While many of us remember close calls, it's likely we're delivered daily from unknown dangers. God lovingly guides us through minefields of destruction even when we're not aware of His protection. And this raises an important question: Why has God spared you and me while others have lost their lives in similar situations?

The obvious answer is that we have work to do. We don't have time to pine, pout or nurse wounded feelings. Life's too precious to squander on trivial pursuits. The time we have left must be invested in doing things that make a difference and have eternal value.

Several missionaries were being transported down the Amazon River. The captain of the boat kept warning them about the dangers ahead and couldn't understand their courage in the face of danger. 'We died before we left,' one of them explained.

Having faced death and survived, let's live each day for the glory of God.

# MICHIGAN VOTES

WHAT YOUR LEGISLATORS VOTED ON RECENTLY

*MichiganVotes.org is a free, non-partisan website created by the Mackinac Center for Public Policy to provide concise, non-partisan, plain-English descriptions of every bill and vote in the Michigan House and Senate. This report was released on Friday, Sept. 12.*

## Senate Bill 156: Reverse effect of Supreme Court business tax ruling.

To clarify the intent of provisions in the Michigan Business Tax enacted in 2007, so as to reverse the effect of a recent state Supreme Court ruling (IBM v. Treasury) that reportedly would force the state to refund more than \$1 billion to many companies headquartered outside this state. The case involved the interaction of MBT provisions with a separate multistate Tax Compact entered in 2006. (The MBT was repealed in 2011, but is still in effect for certain companies awarded state subsidies and tax breaks under its provisions.)

## Senate Bill 633: Allow community service to cover some "bad driver" fees.

To allow a person to do 10 hours of "community service" in lieu of paying a state "bad driver fee" for certain offenses, including driving without a license and failing to have or produce proof of insurance. The fees for these particular offenses were repealed by a 2011 law, so the bill would apply only to individuals who incurred and failed to pay them in the past. These very high, revenue-raising fees were originally imposed in 2003 to avoid spending cuts in that year's and subsequent state government budgets. A law enacted earlier in 2014 would gradually phase out the fees imposed for additional offenses.

## Senate Bill 758: Authorize more stringent sanctions for delinquent hotel tax.

To empower counties that choose to impose a tax of up to 5 percent on hotel and motel room charges to enforce the tax with the more stringent sanctions authorized for delinquent "special assessment" levies, which include forfeiture and foreclosure. Under current law, a delinquent owner is liable for a penalty of 25 percent of the amount in arrears plus interest, and up to 90 days in jail.

## House Bill 4783: Expand a corporate/developer subsidy regime.

To authorize creation of a seventh "Next Michigan Development Corporation," which is a government agency that gives tax breaks and subsidies to particular corporations or developers selected by political appointees on the entity's board, for projects meeting extremely broad "multi-modal commerce" criteria (basically, any form of goods-related commerce). Reportedly the new entity will probably be in Detroit. In December 2013, the legislature enacted a law authorizing a sixth such entity, this in the Upper Peninsula.

## ASK THE MECHANIC

**Q:** When I drive my '92 Dodge Dakota it sounds like I got a flat tire, but it isn't flat. There's a knocking sound. However, when I turn left it quits. I think it has something to do with the steering, but not sure. Please help me! - Chris

**A:** Chris, this sounds most like a wheel bearing making noise to me. You can sometimes check this by jacking up the wheel in question. Try moving the tire in and out from top to bottom. If this does not show any movement, then you may need a stethoscope and a partner to rotate the wheel while you listen for the noise. If you do not find the cause; most repair shops have specialty equipment like a chassis ear to find these types of noises while driving. You may need it diagnosed by them. I hope this helps.

## Meet Dr. Wayne Wright

- Lake Fenton schools' superintendent
- Pilot
- Fisherman

Dr. Wayne Wright has been superintendent of Lake Fenton Community Schools since 2010, coming from a seven-year career as Superintendent at Birch Run Schools. He has been in education for 41 years, spending his first 29 years at Montrose Schools as a teacher, coach and administrator. He and his wife, Gloria Jue, D.O., OB/GYN, have lived on Lake Ponemah since 1998. They have one son, Chris, who lives in California with his wife and three children.

**What's the most exciting thing happening at Lake Fenton schools?** I'd say it's the positive perception of what's going on here. We have a very good image, which I think has a lot to do with the new high school building. Believe it or not, it's our 10th year here. Since we built it, we've had continuous growth every year. Now we're up to about 2,040 students. They said, "If you build it, they will come." They were right.

**What's a typical day like for you?** I'm up at 5:30 a.m. and in the building between 6:30 and 7 a.m. I'm usually still in the buildings at 5. I have an agenda every day that's often dictated by meetings — with parents, at the ISD (Intermediate School District), in Lansing.

I have a lot of paperwork, always looking at budgets, contracts, personnel issues. My experience over 41 years has given me a vast background in many of the things that cross my desk. Three or four nights a week, I have meetings or sports events. I'm here almost every Sunday for three to four hours. Saturday is the day I always try to take off, unless there's a board meeting.

**What's the biggest challenge facing kids in high school today?** The changing job market. What they look at going into today may be gone tomorrow. Kids today have to be able to change directions, have a strong work ethic and

people skills to be able to succeed.

**Where did you get your strong work ethic?** I grew up on a dairy farm in Caro, in the Thumb. I was the oldest, so I had to do the chores. I went to a one-room country school through the sixth grade. It all gave me a different perspective, how to survive. I graduated from Caro High School and Central Michigan University.

**Speaking of college, what's your favorite college rivalry?** I'm a U of M fan. I don't miss too many games on TV, although I often have to record them and watch them later.

**What do you like best about working with kids?** The kids are the whole reason I do what I do. I love their energy, their plans and their positive attitude. Kids haven't changed at all in the 41 years I've been working with them. Society has changed a lot, but kids are the same.

**If you weren't a school superintendent, what would you like to be?**

I've been in education so long, I can't imagine myself doing anything else. I really enjoyed coaching and teaching. I don't think people realize just how much influence a teacher can have on a kid's life.

**What's something most people probably don't know about you?** I have

a pilot's license, but I haven't flown since I've been a superintendent. I am also a retired lieutenant colonel in the Michigan Army National Guard, where I served for 24 years.

**Grayling — Torch Lake — Lake City Tour**

This fall color tour can be enjoyed by car, on foot, or in a canoe. The winding AuSable River is the perfect waterway to paddle and enjoy the splashes of beautiful colors. This tour is 120 miles from Grayling to Lake City. Grayling is approximately 100 miles from the Fenton area.

**Mackinaw City — Petoskey — Charlevoix**

This tour takes you to the northwestern parts of Michigan, full of hills, beautiful forested countrysides, and views of the blue waters of Lake Michigan. It's a simple 50-mile tour, and would fit in well with any of the others listed. Mackinaw City is a 237-mile drive from Fenton.

**Oscoda — West Branch — Tawas City**

Take a scenic drive along Lake Huron, where abundant wildlife flourishes. You can enjoy the River Road Scenic Byway along the beautiful Au Sable River. Your trip starts with a 140-mile drive up to Oscoda, on the shoreline. The tour is about 90 miles long.

**Rogers City — Cheboygan — Indian River**

Woods and water are a huge part of this area of northeast Michigan, known as the "Tip of the Mitt." This is another 200-mile tour, which includes the breathtaking sandy beaches of Lake Huron. You will also find the only

## Other scenic drives in northern Michigan

### • Old Mission Peninsula

Traverse City is a 20-mile long and three-mile wide drive with beautiful views of both sides of the bay, dotted with wineries and vineyards along the way, including Black Star Farms and Chateau Grand Traverse.

• **Leelenau Peninsula**, which juts 30 miles into Lake Michigan, is known for its scenic views and wineries.

• **Sleeping Bear Dunes** National Lakeshore, voted "The Most Beautiful Place in America" by a poll from ABC-TV's Good Morning America. This gem includes 64 miles of beaches, two islands, 26 inland lakes and 50,000 acres of land.

• **A 69-mile circle** around the Chain of Lakes, beginning and ending in Elk Rapids. The route's crown jewel is Torch Lake, according to Traverse magazine.

• **Forest Lakes Area**, with high elevations, south of Traverse City.

## ORDINANCE NO. 351

## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE 13 SECTIONS 13.2.1 OF THE CITY OF LINDEN ZONING ORDINANCE (ORDINANCE NO. 285); EFFECTIVE DATE; PUBLICATION

## THE CITY OF LINDEN ORDAINS:

A. The City of Linden hereby amends the City of Linden Zoning Ordinance No. 285 (Zoning Ordinance) as follows:

**Article 13**

Section 13.2.1 is amended as follows:

The Commission shall consist of nine (9) members who shall be representative of important segments of the City, such as the economic, governmental, educational, and social development of the City, in accordance with the major interests as they exist in the City, such as agriculture, natural resources, recreation, education, public health, government, transportation, industry, and commerce. The membership shall also be representative of the entire geography of the local unit of government to the extent practicable. The Mayor and/or up to three (3) members of the City Council, or any combination thereof, may be appointed to the Planning Commission as ex officio members; however, not more than one-third (1/3) of the members of the Planning Commission shall be ex officio members. All members, except the Mayor, shall be appointed by the Mayor, subject to the approval of a majority vote of the members elect of the City Council. Except for the Mayor, City Council member(s), one (1) member of the Zoning Board of Appeals, and one (1) member of the Historic District Commission, no member of the Commission shall hold any other municipal office. The Commission members shall serve without compensation, except for necessary expenses in connection with their work. The term of each appointed member shall be three (3) years. The Mayor and the City Council member(s) shall serve only so long as they are members of the City Council. Appointed members of the Planning Commission may, after public hearing, be removed by the Mayor for inefficiency, neglect of duty or malfeasance in office.

B. This ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after publication.

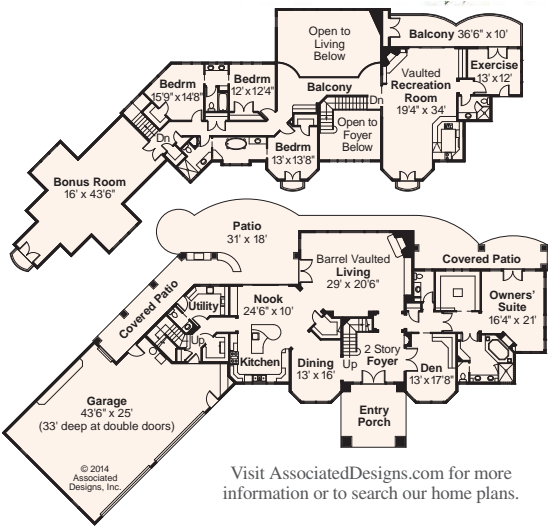

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## Parents of cyberharassment victim seek advice

### DEAR AMY:

My 25-year-old daughter briefly dated a man she met in church last December. After one month, she ended the friendship (he was too emotionally needy). He continues to pursue her by constant texting and emailing. She says he alternates between ‘saying mean things’ and then apologizing and begging her to give him another chance. She does not respond and blocked his phone, but he continues to text from different numbers. She does not reply to his emails. She moved to a different side of town, and so far he has not shown up at her work. We’re very worried about this. What steps can she take to be safe and get this man to stop contacting her? — Very Worried

### DEAR WORRIED:

Michele Archer, an expert on stalking with the victim’s advocacy group Safe Horizon, safehorizon.org suggests, “Keep a stalking log of all incidents, including the date, time, location and a brief description of the incident. Save and print out the emails. Save all text messages and document them in the log.”

“I would suggest not changing her email address, but she may want to open another account and give that to people she trusts. Changing her email address may escalate his behavior, and the emails he is sending become evidence of stalking, which she can

use if she goes to the police.

“If she has concerns about him showing up at her work, she should let her place of employment know. If she has a photo of him (look on the Internet) she can make a color copy and give it to her workplace.

“If she uses any social networking sites, make them private and be mindful of what she posts.

“If this continues, she may want to contact police. The stalking log is useful for this, and she should also show them the text messages. She can also reach out to a domestic violence organization in her community for support or help advocating with the police (if needed) or the district attorney’s office.”

### DEAR AMY:

My husband and I are both approaching 65. Whenever I ask him about his preferences regarding a final ‘resting place’ he becomes very irate or clams up altogether. I’ve suggested that he put something in writing regarding his wishes on this matter, but that goes nowhere. Do you have any advice for me? — Unsettled

### DEAR UNSETTLED:

For whatever reason, this topic makes your husband very uncomfortable. You should make your own plans, write them down, place this document with other important papers, and make sure your husband and other family members and friends are aware of your plans.

## Why is traveling so tiresome?

### DEAR DR. ROACH:

Traveling for a length of time — say, six hours or more — on a train, bus or plane makes me rather tired. Others I discussed this with have had similar experiences. I find this strange, because for most of the travel time I am sitting doing nothing but reading or daydreaming. My question is: Do physiological changes taking place in the body brought on by the long period of sitting while in transit account for the fatigue, or is it simply mental boredom? — R.S.

### ANSWER:

I think it’s both mental and physical. Prolonged sitting recently has been shown to put people at increased risk for

heart disease, as well as the known risk of blood clots. Getting up and walking around is always a good idea physically, and might help mentally as well. More than simple tiredness, chronic fatigue syndrome is all-encompassing.

### DEAR DR. ROACH:

Orange juice was a staple for breakfast when we were growing up. Mom would say, ‘Hurry up and drink your orange juice before it loses its vitamins.’ Was mom right? — M.E.K.

### ANSWER:

Mom was partially right. Orange juice will lose its vitamins over time, especially if it gets warm. But that doesn’t happen in five minutes. Products that sit on the shelf for a long time lose their vitamins.

## S'MORE BROWNIES



### INGREDIENTS:

- 15 graham crackers, divided use
- 2½ C sugar, divided use
- 6 T. butter, melted
- 2 sticks butter, softened
- 4 eggs
- 1½ tsp vanilla extract
- 1/2 C cocoa powder
- 1½ C. flour
- 1/2 t. salt
- 1½ C. mini marshmallows
- 3 chocolate bars

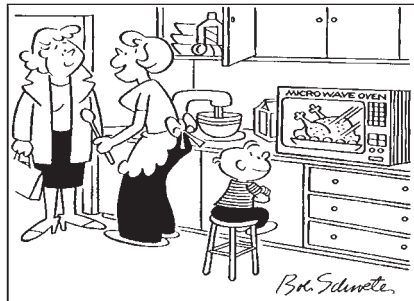
### DIRECTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees F.
2. Crush 12 of the graham crackers into crumbs. You should have about 1 1/2 C of crumbs. Combine crumbs with 1/2 C sugar and 6 tbsp melted butter. Press into the bottom of a 9×13 pan and bake for 7 minutes.
3. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
4. In the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with the paddle attachment cream together 2 sticks softened butter with 2 C sugar. Add eggs, one at a time. Add vanilla extract.
5. In a bowl whisk together the cocoa powder, flour, and salt. Add to the stand mixer and mix until incorporated.
6. Pour batter evenly over graham cracker crust. Bake for 15 minutes.
7. Break chocolate bars and remaining 3 graham crackers into bite size pieces. Top brownies with chocolate, crackers, and marshmallows. Bake another 10 – 15 minutes.
8. If you have leftovers, they’re best reheated in a toaster oven for a few minutes until chocolate and marshmallows are again melty and gooey.

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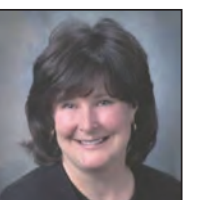
