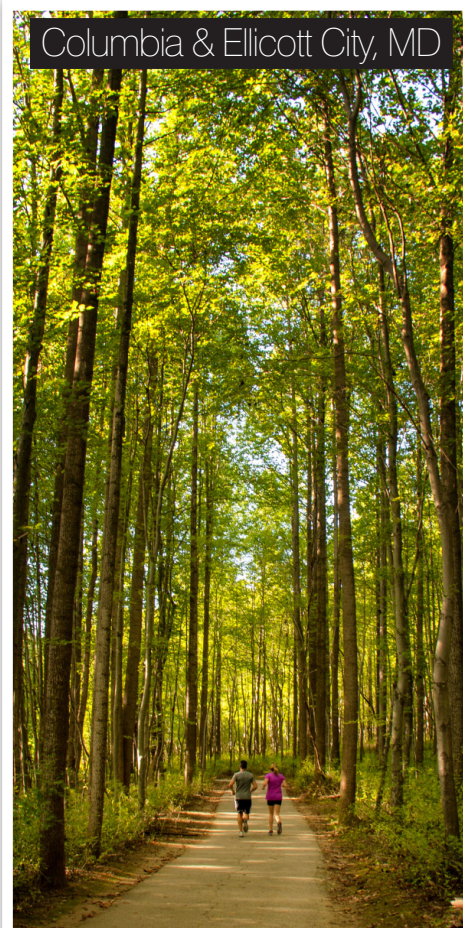

You won't ever want for something to do in this area with many restaurants, great shops for new and used items, a theater company, lots of nature and something fun for everyone.

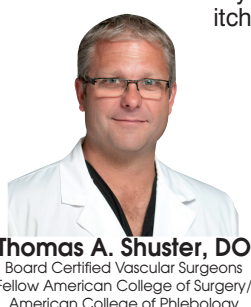

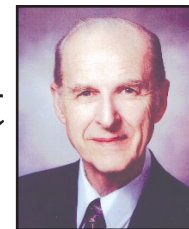

Tune out the downers

Reaching for the car radio dial to catch a weather report seemed so natural. We were heading for Arizona that winter and wondering what kind of weather we'd face on this long journey. Who knew we'd discover a weather reporter who specialized in storms?

Anticipating this trip, we had envisioned the pleasure of driving to ever-warmer weather and the beauty that accompanies that transition: green grass, flowers, birds on the wing as they joined us on their annual flight to warmer climes; but none of these pleasant scenes were described by our gloomy weather reporter. This negative forecaster focused on nothing but bad weather so we tuned him out. We wanted to enjoy the beauty of the moment, remember the glories of fall and look forward to what was ahead.

The enduring classic devotional guide, 'Streams in the Desert,' calls for giving thanks for the planned kaleidoscope we call the year, that the earth in its journey makes the one cycle a perpetual delight, emphasizing then how this is especially true in the season of splendor that arrives every October, asking: 'Who with the least bit of love of nature in his disposition has not gone out of his way to see hills covered and vales filled with the glory and splendor of falling leaves.'

Solomon said God has made everything beautiful in its time (Ecclesiastes 3:11). And the splendor of fall may make it the most beautiful time of all.

Who can doubt the existence of God in October? Bushes are ablaze, reminding us of Moses turning aside to view the burning bush from which God would call him to become the deliverer of his people.

Thomas Carlyle, the Scottish historian, wrote, 'I believe you will find in all histories that no nation that did not contemplate this wonderful universe with an awe-stricken and reverential belief that there was a great unknown, omnipotent and all-wise and all-just Being superintending all men in it and all interest in it ever came to much, nor did any man who forgot that.'

Who wouldn't enjoy the season of the Divine artist's crowning glory? A few.

'I can't enjoy the beauty of fall,' said one, 'because I keep thinking about what's soon to come: winter.' No wonder Jesus warned against facing tomorrow's difficulties today (Matthew 6:34).

Are you troubled by some forecaster of gloom who's robbing you of the blessings of today? Do you doubt that great blessings are ahead for your church, your family, your future?

Consider the source of this negativism and reject these doom and gloom forecasters.

The beauty of fall should convince us all that God is alive and cares.

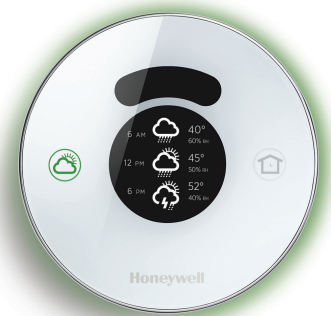
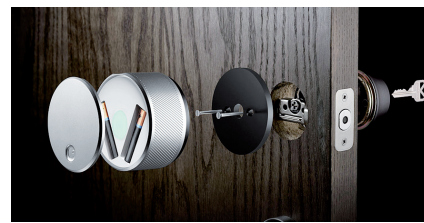

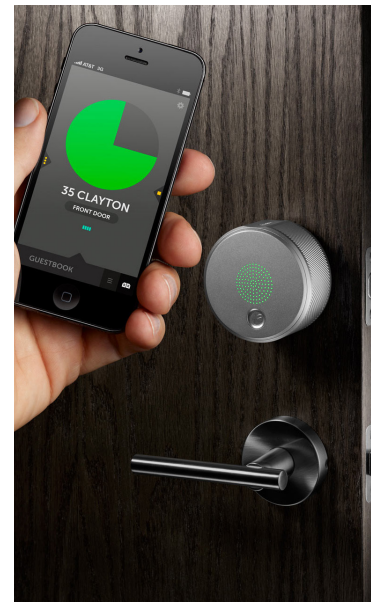

House Bill 5785: Expand permissible criminal court cost levies

To expand the costs that can be imposed on an individual convicted in a criminal case. The bill would authorize imposing assessments covering a share of court employee salaries and benefits, of "goods and services" used in operating the court, and of court building "operation and maintenance" costs. In addition, it would establish that a court has no duty to provide a "calculation of the costs involved in a particular case." The bill reverses a state Supreme Court case that limited charges to those specifically allowed in a particular statute; its provisions would expire in 36 months,

presumably to allow the legislature to rationalize these impositions for all courts across the state.

Senate Bill 1074: Eliminate debt cap on business job training subsidy program

To eliminate the \$50 million debt cap in a 2008 law that authorized state job training subsidies for particular employers, provided through community colleges. The bill would also eliminate a 2018 sunset on these subsidies, which according to the Senate Fiscal Agency have added up to \$10.7 million since the law was passed.

House Bill 5097: Exempt public safety employees from ban on certain automatic pay hikes

To exempt law enforcement and fire department employees from a 2011 law that banned automatic seniority-based pay hikes for individual government employees ("step increases") when a union contract has expired and no new one signed.

House Bill 4624: Allow multi-department firefighter employment

To prohibit a fire department from prohibiting its firefighters from also working as a volunteer, part-time or paid on-call firefighter with another department, if this does not conflict with the original employment. Also, to make this issue a prohibited subject of collective bargaining between a fire department and a government employee union.

House Bill 5385: Expand drunk driving provisions to include illegal drugs

To expand the law that requires a person stopped for drunk driving to take a breathalyzer or field sobriety test so that it instead refers to "a preliminary roadside analysis," expanding this law to suspected driving while drugged cases. The bill would not explicitly authorize the use of a roadside saliva test for marijuana, which has been challenged as inaccurate. This is part of a package extending the same or similar procedures to both drunk and drugged driving cases.

House Bill 5606: Expand "protectionist" auto dealer provision

To prohibit vehicle makers from preventing a dealer from tacking on extra fees that are permitted by a law that empowers the state to enforce exclusive new car dealer "territories" and regulate the terms of commercial relationships between dealers and manufacturers.

Senate Bill 991: Let terminal patients try non-FDA approved treatments

To establish that a person diagnosed with a terminal illness has a "right to try" experimental drugs or therapies not approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration, subject to various conditions specified in the bill. The bill would prohibit state officials from interfering, and ban licensing boards from sanctioning health care providers who participate, subject to specified conditions. Drug makers who comply with the specified conditions would be immune from liability if the patient is harmed. The bill responds to criticism that FDA "safe and effective" standards are not appropriate in these cases.
