BENEFITS & CHARACTERISTICS OF
FRUITS and VEGETABLES**C** is for carrot...

While the Cookie Monster would probably prefer a cookie, we are covering a large list of fruits and vegetables that begin with the letter C.

This is not a comprehensive list of all of the fruits and vegetables that are out there, but it is a list that will help you add more of them into your daily diet. It's likely you've heard about all of these fruits and vegetables, but you might not know how good they really are for you.

CARROT

Consider adding carrots to your diet. A study out of the Netherlands found that carrots are one of the best vegetables to fight against cardiovascular disease. They are a great source of beta-carotene and they are rich in other antioxidants.

Carrots are best raw or steamed. They make a great snack or side dish. Slice some carrots up and add them to your salad or soup.

CUCUMBER

Not all cucumbers are created equal. There are two basic types; pickling cucumbers are meant to be turned into pickles and slicing cucumbers are meant to be eaten fresh. Cucumbers are related to the squash family and melon family. Cucumbers have three lignans, chemical compounds high in antioxidants that are believed to fight several cancer types.

Slice up some fresh cucumber for salads or eat them alone.

CABBAGE

Cabbage is a low-calorie food and it is packed with vitamin K, which is good for brain function. The reason it has often been thought of as a diet food is that one cup of it is only 33 calories.

Even if you don't like cooked cabbage, there are ways to get cabbage into your diet. Try chopping some up and adding it to your salad greens, or make a tasty homemade coleslaw.

CELERY

Celery is great for the digestive tract because it is an essential source of dietary fiber. It also contains many vitamins and antioxidants. Simply chop up some celery and add it to soups and salads. Celery is also a great crunchy snack with some

nut butter, a sprinkle of spice or dipped in low-fat dressing.

CAULIFLOWER

Cauliflower is fast becoming a popular head in

kitchens. Its popularity isn't about the fact that it contains vitamins and minerals that help fight cancer, inflammation, and boost heart and brain health, among other things. It's because it is such a versatile vegetable.

Cauliflower has been used to replace mashed potatoes, it has been used as a gluten-free pizza crust, and it even makes tasty "bread" sticks.

CHERRY

Traverse City is known as the 'Cherry capital of the world,' but you don't have to travel up north to enjoy this juicy fruit.

Cherries are an amazing super fruit that fight cancer, boost the immune system, reduce inflammation, help promote better sleep, and even help with joint pain.

While cherries taste wonderful on their own, they also make great additions to main meat dishes for dinner, fruit salads, dinner salads and even as a dessert topping.

CLEMENTINE

The Clementine is an orange, and like oranges, they are packed with vitamin C. That means they are great for boosting the immune system. Try them alone or add them to smoothies or salads.

CRANBERRY

Cranberries are a bitter little fruit that pack a punch. Anyone who has ever suffered from a urinary tract infection knows that cranberry juice seems to be a likely cure for this painful ailment. It's believed that a component of this fruit attaches to the urinary tract lining, protecting it. Studies are also being done that link it to doing the same in the stomach lining, protecting from ulcers.

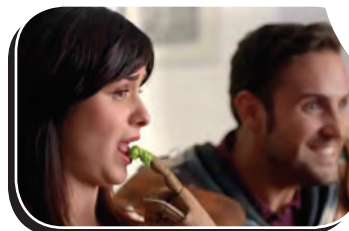

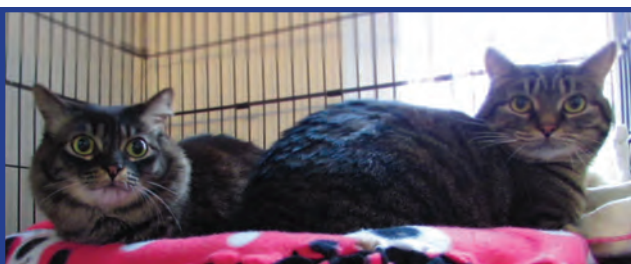

Kristen Steele and Cortney Gwaltney have been friends since the seventh-grade at Fenton Middle School, and 25 years later, have created an even stronger bond through the doors of two local businesses, The Retreat Salon & Skin Spa and The Yoga Retreat & Boutique.

These women didn't grow up dreaming about being in business together; in fact, their professional lives took them in two different directions, Gwaltney as a pharmaceutical rep and Steele as a hair stylist.

When Gwaltney missed a chance to open a medical spa for local physicians she knew professionally, she regretted not jumping at that opportunity. A chance comment from her husband, Kevin, "Why can't you do it now?" led her to turn to her long-time friend, Kristen. "We went for a long car ride and talked about it," said Gwaltney. Within 24 hours, Kristen called me back and said, 'Let's do it!'"

That was their first leap of faith, and this dynamic duo hasn't ever looked back.

Founding The Retreat Salon & Skin Spa in Fenton Township in 2010, the two once again joined hands to open The Yoga Retreat in downtown Fenton last

November.

"This was another huge leap of faith for us," said Gwaltney, 38. Neither she nor Steele had any vision of opening a yoga studio; in fact, both women are still new to the practice of yoga themselves.

But they had always wanted a business presence downtown, and realized that a yoga studio would fill a need in this area, while connecting downtown with their Fenton Township anchor business.

Now's the time to CLEAN UP YOUR CREDIT

to buy or refinance

► There are no quick fixes, but 'slow and steady' will win your race to a better credit score

With lower interest rates on conventional mortgages and FHA monthly mortgage insurance, it's pretty tempting to buy a home right now or refinance your current home.

However, in order to take advantage of these new rates, you have to make sure your credit is up to par to qualify for these new rates and programs.

"To qualify for an FHA loan, you have to have a credit score of at least 620," said Lori Rock, mortgage manager for Dort Federal Credit Union, with an office in Fenton Township. "A conventional 30-year mortgage also takes a 620 credit score, but as a credit union, we'll look at lower scores on a case-by-case basis."

Time is your best ally when it comes to repairing your credit. The best advice for rebuilding credit is to manage it responsibly over time, according to myficoscore.



To help with the frustration of applying for a mortgage or refinancing your home, be vigilant with monitoring your credit card accounts and any other bills that could potentially affect your credit score. Financial lenders suggest checking credit reports regularly to make sure everything is accurate.

com. If you haven't done that, then you need to repair your credit history before you see credit score improvement.

HERE ARE A FEW THINGS YOU CAN DO RIGHT NOW TO GET STARTED.

• **Check your credit report.** You can get one free credit report from each of the

three major credit bureaus (TransUnion, Equifax and Experian) once every 12 months from annualcreditreport.com. Check it for errors on all your accounts and report any errors to the credit bureau and reporting agency.

• **Pay your bills on time.** Your payment history contributes 35 percent to your credit score. The good news is that older credit problems count for less, so the longer you pay your bills on time after being late, the more your credit score will increase.

• **Set up payment reminders,** so you make your credit payments on time. Some banks offer reminders through their online banking portals that can send you an email or text when a payment is due. You can also consider enrolling in automatic payments through your credit card and loan providers, but this only makes the minimum payment on your credit card.

• **Reduce the amount of debt that you owe.** Stop using your credit cards and determine from your credit report how much

you owe on each account and at what interest rate. High outstanding debt will affect your credit score. Keep balances low for a better debt-to-income ratio.

According to Rock at Dort Federal Credit Union any delinquency or judgment needs to be taken care of before you can apply for a mortgage. "FHA requires them to be paid off," she said. "The more you pay off and wait over time, the better your score."

Hold off on any major purchases once you apply for a mortgage. Lenders re-check your credit before closing, and if your credit report reveals additional or new debts, this could stop the closing. Avoid financing a new car, buying home appliances or furniture with a credit card or co-signing someone else's loan.

In general, having credit cards and installment loans (and making on-time payments) will rebuild your credit score. Someone with no credit cards tends to be considered higher risk than someone who has managed credit cards responsibly.

Snow and ice

may hinder winter home inspections

► Whatever the season, it's still important for home sellers/buyers to gather as much information as possible

Snow and ice may cover the roof, the driveway and sidewalks, but that's no excuse to skip one of the homebuyer's most accurate tools for gauging the condition of a house they hope to buy.

Whatever the season, it's a smart financial move to have a home inspection done if you have a real estate transaction in your future. As a seller, knowing the condition of your property prior to listing will help you determine a fair price. As a buyer, it can help you avoid costly surprises down the road. It may also serve as a negotiating tool that could result in a reduction in the price of a property.

From a Realtor perspective, home inspections are very important, especially for major issues like roofs, foundations, etc., according to John Wentworth of Re/MAX Platinum in Fenton. “Buyers do need guidance through an inspection so they aren't alarmed by issues that aren't really that big. Choose a home inspector that is not an alarmist with words or pricing. An inspector should give the results of the findings, not offer a cost for repairs which may or may not be accurate.”

Mark Mustola, owner of ValueCheck Home Inspections in Fenton Township for 22 years, said that the majority of prospective homebuyers do opt for a home inspection of the property they hope to buy. “The homebuyer has the right to have a home inspection,” he said. “A Realtor often recommends an inspector they have successfully worked with before, and the buyer is the one who pays for it.”



Winter presents its challenges for home inspections, but they are still worthwhile tools for assessing whether a property is a sound investment.

He says that the biggest things people are concerned about when looking at a house's condition are the roof and basement water seepage.

“The roof is second only to septic systems as the most expensive repair in a house, and not everyone has a septic system to worry about,” he said. “People always want to know about possible water in the basement, as many people have plans for using the basement as living space.”

Winter presents a special challenge for roof inspections, with snow and ice often covering the shingles, flashing, etc. “When it's nice out, I like to walk the roof,” said Mike Cemazar of Cemazar Home Inspections in Fenton. “I can't do that in the winter. However, I can document in your report that I couldn't get up on the roof, but did look at photos from other seasons to see the condition of the shingles, etc. I can also look in the attic and if it's wet or moist, you know the roof has an issue.”

Snow and ice build-up also affect an inspector's ability to check on the grad-

ing of the soil away from the home, the foundation, driveways, sidewalks, underneath porches and decks. It's also not a time inspectors can check on termites or other insect infestations. “Every season has its challenges, when it comes to home inspections,” said Cemazar. One of the advantages of a winter home inspection is that a home inspector can more easily detect drafts, energy leaks, insulation, etc.

“We also can't check whether the air conditioning actually works by turning it on if it's less than 60 degrees outside,” said Mustola. “We might damage it by turning the actual unit on. But we can still look at it, knowing its size, brand name and age, all of which will provide valuable information. We can also reference the National Association of Home Builders building components' life expectancy chart to see what a homebuyer might likely expect down the road for repair or replacement.”

Mustola said it's still better to learn about the 80 percent of the home that is accessible for a home inspection during the winter.

Old friends' connection skips a generation

DEAR AMY: My husband and I have been friends with 'Alice' and 'Jim' for many years. Our daughters are the same age, so we have spent a lot of family time together, sharing celebrations, car trips, barbecues, etc. Now both families' daughters are in college but rarely interact, even though they still like each other. When they're on break and we invite Alice, Jim and their kids to our house, their daughters never come. When Alice and Jim invite us over, they never invite our kids. This bothers us (and our kids), but are we being unreasonable? Clearly, these young people are adults and should not be expected to see their parents' friends, but I still feel that Alice and Jim are being impolite by never including our children in their invitation — and by their daughters always refusing ours. Is it

really too much to expect that our friends' kids would be willing to spend a couple of hours once or twice a year socializing with us and their old friends — and that their parents would encourage this? — Feeling Slighted

DEAR MOMMY: I agree that it would be nice if your old friends included your daughters in invitations, as you do theirs, but they don't seem to treasure this generational connection as much as you do, and they are simply not being as socially thoughtful as you are. When Alice and Jim come to your house and your daughters are present, the older adults have an opportunity to interact and reconnect with the younger. You have the opportunity at their house. You should take advantage of these moments and let the young people be in charge of their own connection.

Patient fights doctor's advice

DR. ROACH: I am 95 now and take no medications. My primary-care doctor wants me to take aspirin, even just the baby aspirin, twice a week. Some of the supplements I take do have blood-thinning characteristics, and for that reason I am fighting the aspirin recommendation. In general, is it OK to refuse the recommendation of one's doctor? — F.V.

ANSWER: It is your body, and you have every right to make decisions about your treatment. However, you should be very circumspect about overruling your doctor, and you should be doing so for very good reasons. Your doctor has the obligation to tell you why he or she is recommending a treatment and what the downsides are from not

taking it. You, on the other hand, are obliged to tell your doctor the truth. In your case, it sounds like you don't want to take the aspirin because you feel the supplements you are taking have a similar effect to aspirin. Very few supplements, if any, have been studied as well as aspirin has. Aspirin has a clear risk of side effects, especially bleeding, but most evidence shows that it reduces the risk of heart attack more than it increases the risk of bleeding. It also might reduce cancer risk. The higher the risk of heart disease, the better aspirin is, in terms of risks versus benefits. At 95, your risk for heart attack is higher than a 50-year-old's, and so it would be expected to have more benefit than harm. So while I agree with your doctor to take it, I also respect your decision not to. Be sure you discuss your supplements with your doctor.

BEER-SOAKED CHILI CHEESE FRIES



Prep Time:	Cook Time:	Makes:
30 mins	35 mins	4 Servings

DIRECTIONS

- Place the fries and salt in a large mixing bowl, pour over the beer, and then fill the bowl with water until the fries are completely submerged. Soak in the refrigerator for at least two hours, but preferably overnight.
- Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Drain the fries, rinse thoroughly, and then pat dry.
- Whisk together the oil, paprika, and garlic powder in a large mixing bowl, add in the fries, and toss to coat. Spread the fries out on a large baking sheet, making sure fries are only in one layer.
- Bake in preheated oven for 20-25 minutes, flipping once halfway through baking. The fries will be golden brown on the outside, and soft and tender on the inside.
- Meanwhile, begin preparing the chili by browning the ground beef in a medium-size saucepan over medium-high heat. Add in the onion and garlic and cook until just fragrant and tender, about five minutes.
- Add in the diced tomatoes with chiles, salsa, chili powder, cumin, water, beans, salt and pepper. Bring to a boil, reduce heat and simmer for 15-20 minutes.
- To assemble the fries, preheat the broiler. Pile the fries in the middle of a baking sheet, spoon on the chili (you might not need it all), and then sprinkle with cheddar cheese. Place under broiler for 2-3 minutes, or just until the cheese is melted. Top with sliced green onions and serve.
