Ideal 2015 ski season has nine weeks left

Groveland Twp. — While the casual skiers have fun on one side of Mt. Holly Wednesday night, high school teams, including the Fenton/Linden Ski Team, compete on the other.

Amidst all of this, Josh Petrusha, 13, of Ortonville was receiving a lesson in order to get his advanced "white patch"

from instructor Jeff Strausser. The goal for a lesson is simple — make sure they learn and have fun.

This is of course what skiing is all about. The tri-county area is fortunate to have most types of recreation nearby. The current ski season will last until around the end of March, depending on the weather.

"Our snow conditions are amazing right now," said Kurt Payne, assistant ski school director.

Payne said learning to ski or snowboard is a great way to break up the Michigan winter, adding that it's a full-body work out as well. New students range in ages 3 to 80 and Chuck Gosh is an instructor in his 80s. There is terrain for all ages and skill levels.

For anyone looking to try out skiing for the first time, Payne recommends a ski lesson, to learn how to be safe and in control on the slopes, and renting equipment onsite.

There are private one-on-one groups and group lessons. For skiing, groups range from six to eight participants, snowboarding has four to six. "Skiing is easier to learn, but harder to master," said Payne. "Snowboarding is harder to learn, but easier to master."

Payne said that skiing better mimics more familiar activities like walking, skating or rollerblading, whereas with snowboarding, you have to get used to your feet strapped to a snowboard.

If you decide to get serious about skiing, buying goggles, ski boots and proper attire for warmth is important. Payne said that new skiers can sometimes be unprepared for the cold and wet weather.



Why saturated fats are unhealthy

DR. ROACH:

I have a question about hydrogenated and partially hydrogenated fats. What is the difference? Nutritionists tell us to look out for partially hydrogenated, but never mention the other one. Seems to me both would be bad for you. — D.D.F.

ANSWER:

You are quite right. There are four kinds of fat. Two are healthier

- monounsaturated and polyunsaturated, and these are found in healthy oils, like olive oil and canola oil. Two fats are unhealthy trans-saturated, also called partially hydrogenated, and saturated, which is fully hydrogenated but isn't ever really called that. Transsaturated fat is not healthy. Food companies make it by adding hydrogen to vegetable oil at high temperature. The chemical

bonds are "trans," which are not normally found in nature. The process makes the fat more solid at room temperature. It isn't much of an exaggeration to call trans fat toxic, since even modest amounts increase risk for heart disease from blockage of the arteries. I recommend as little trans fat in the diet as possible — preferably none. Saturated fat isn't healthy either, but it isn't as bad for you as trans fat. There are two

major kinds of saturated fat: Those that come from animal products (butter, red meat), and those from tropical sources, like palm and coconut. Most experts think tropical saturated fats are not as unhealthy as those found in animal products. Nonetheless, I recommend keeping saturated fat intake low. The American Heart Association recommends less than 16 grams for a person on a 2,000-calorie-a-

- 1. Cut onions in half and slice into half rings.
- 2. Heat a medium skillet over medium heat and melt the butter.
- 3. Once the butter has melted add the onions and cook over medium low heat for 30 to 40 minutes, stirring every couple of minutes, until the onions are caramelized. Add a little water if the onions start to dry out or burn.
- 4. In a large bowl, stir together the beef base, onion powder, celery seed, parsley, and black pepper. Add the ground beef to the mixture and use your hands to work the seasoning all throughout the beef.
- 5. Break the mixture in half. Break each half into half again. Separate each portion into 3 chunks of meat and lightly roll into balls.
- 6. Heat a griddle or large skillet over high heat. Add enough butter to coat the bottom of the griddle or skillet.
- 7. Place the balls of meat at least 3 inches apart on the griddle and let cook on high for 2 minutes or until the bottoms are nicely seared.
- 8. Flip the meat over and immediately use a spatula to press the ball straight down to flatten it out. Continue cooking for 2-3 minutes and then flip. Top with cheese and continue cooking until the cheese has melted and the burger is done to your liking
- 9. Repeat with remaining burgers as necessary until all are cooked, adding more butter to the griddle as necessary.
- 10. Place the burgers on the buns, top with the caramelized onions, and enjoy!




