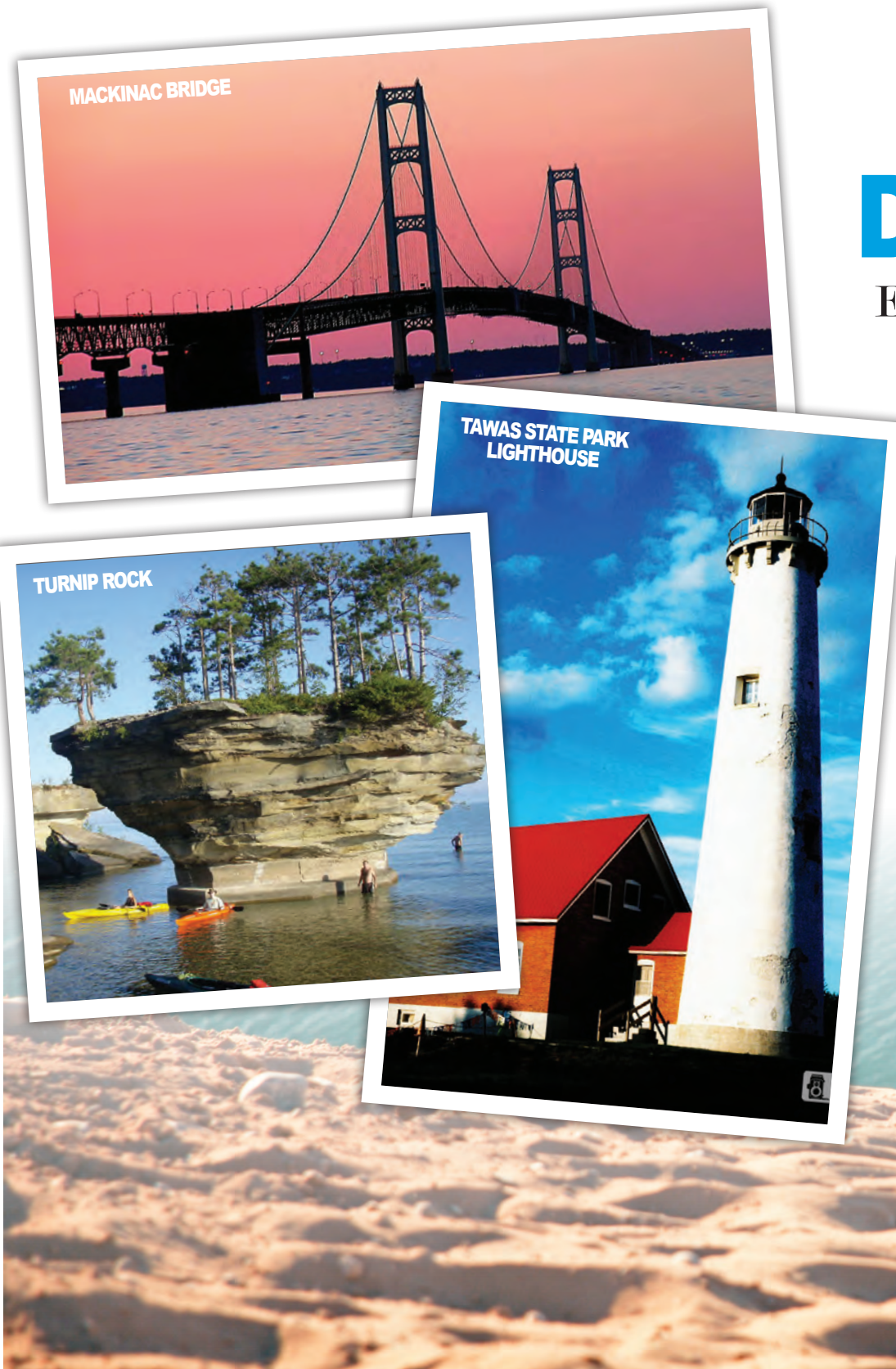

Siri is available on any iPhone 4S or newer.

Home button

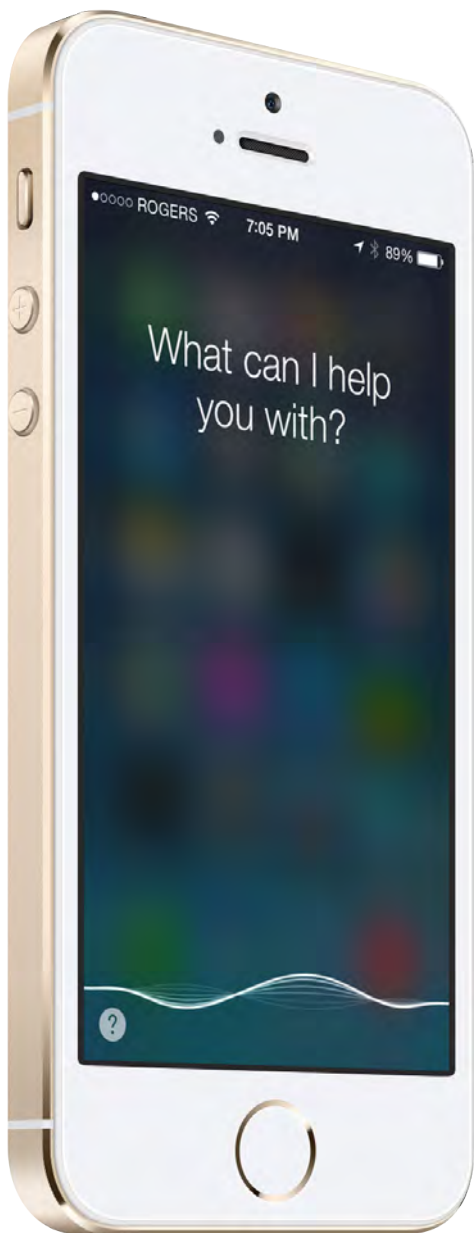
To talk to Siri, hold in the home button until you hear a prompt.

"Hey, Siri"

Now you can access Siri without lifting a finger. Simply by saying "Hey, Siri" you can wake your iPhone, but it only works when your iOS device is plugged in and charging. You can switch on "Hey, Siri" by going to your General Settings.

Raise to speak

Instead of bothering with the button, you can now put your iPhone to your ear and Siri is automatically activated.

Read my new texts.

Siri announces how many messages you have waiting for you. Siri then starts reading all new messages to you, beginning with the sender's name — or if the name is unknown, the phone number it's coming from.

Text Mom...

If you pause, Siri will politely ask, "what would you like to text, Sharon?" If you don't pause, your message just continues: "Will you resend me the link to your website?"

Reply to Mom...

You have a number of options when it comes to responding to a text message. You can say, "Tell her I'll be there in 15 minutes," "Call her," "E-mail her," or "Read it again."

Change it.

Should Siri read back your message and the wording is wrong, just say "Change it." Siri will immediately go back to the previous prompt so you can reenter your message.

What flights are above me right now?

Siri will present you with a list of flights scheduled for that day flying over your head, including the flight number, altitude and even its angle.

Give me directions to...

Within seconds, you'll get voice directions spoken to you, informing you of upcoming turns and road names, all way ahead of time so you can get into the proper lanes for travel.

Dim my screen.

You can toggle some of your iPhone's basic settings just by voicing your wishes to Siri. "Turn off bluetooth. Open mail settings."

Remind me...

The best part of the reminder functionality is that you can request the exact date and time you would like Siri to remind you to complete a task.

Wake me up at...

Siri will display the alarm widget on the screen. If you change your mind about the alarm, you can simply toggle it to "off."

Post to Facebook.

Siri then asks what you'd like to say. Dictate your post, then send when Siri confirms your message.

How many calories are in...

Siri can give you nutrition facts on just about the foods you are eating. All you have to do is ask.

What are the odds of...

You can use Siri as your poker side-kick and learn the rarity of various card hands by asking the odds.

Morse code for...

Siri will give you the Morse code for any word you can throw at her.

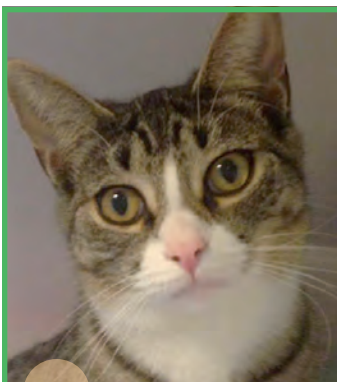

The U.P. looks forward to more than 200 inches of snow annually. Uptravel.com claims their temperatures are “comfortably cold” and not bone chilling. If you’re looking for winter adventure, there are countless miles of groomed snowmobile trails, dozens of ski resorts and hundreds of miles of cross-country and snowshoe trails.

Where there is ice you’ll see fishing shanties, pond hockey and ice skating. In the spring and summer months, U.P. travelers can visit more than 300 waterfalls, ranging from 5 feet to some with over a 48-foot vertical drop. For a slower pace, you can visit more than 40 lighthouses in the Upper Peninsula. Some of them offer packages allowing you to volunteer as a lighthouse keeper, while others have been transformed into a lovely bed and breakfast.

West Coast

Good Morning America voted Sleeping Bear Dunes “The most beautiful place in America.” The swim spot there, at the Platte River Pointe Beach, al-

lows tubers to float the river emptying into Lake Michigan. This and other common travel locations are popular hotspots on the west side of the state. Charlevoix, Petoskey, and Traverse City are all west side destinations with focus on beaches, boating, amazing golf courses, spas, and shopping.

The hidden jewels of the west side include Saugatuck, which bodes towering sand dunes to Oval Beach; Mount Baldhead, where visitors can climb 282 stairs and bravely run down the dune to the water’s edge, and a quaint downtown with restaurants, shopping and a marina and yacht club where you

can walk along the boardwalk gawking at the luxury yachts moored there. Just down the road, the art studios in Douglas are worth a trip.

South Haven, on Lake Michigan, is a completely walkable town with more than 50 specialty shops. Swim at South Haven Beach or dine at Riverfront Park to watch the tall ships. Grand Haven, St.

Joseph, Holland, I could go on and on.

East Coast

The laid back lake on the east side of the mitten, Lake Huron, is not lacking in the travel “to do’s.” Canoe the Ausable River to Oscoda, hike and bike through Tawas, scuba and snorkel in Alpena. Water lovers will find any H2O-related activity on the east side toward Lake Huron.

Thunder Bay National Marine Sanctuary near Alpena is home to “shipwreck alley,” with nearly 200 shipwrecks preserved and study available for scuba divers to explore.

Caseville is based at the mouth of the Pigeon River on Saginaw Bay and Lake Huron. A quiet little lake town for most of the year, its white sandy beach cannot be beat. For a couple of weeks every August, this quiet town transforms

into Margaritaville for their annual Jimmy Buffett tribute, “Cheeseburger in Caseville.” Around the Thumb is Port Austin with yet another gorgeous lighthouse, and the opportunity to kayak and paddleboard around hundreds of gorgeous rock formations, including Turnip Rock.

I’ve yet to mention the museums of Henry Ford, the children’s museum in Grand Rapids, or the Kalamazoo Institute of Arts. East, West or the U.P., we have culture and the arts covered as well. Shopping, camping, or diving to a shipwreck, golf course or spas, skiing and snowmobiling, it’s all within just a few hour’s drive.

Use houseplants for 'functional decorating'

►Cleaner air, stress relief are a few of the benefits of adding hardy varieties to your home

This is the time of year when we're so hopeful for spring, yet the joy of gardening and planting is still months away.

Hardy houseplants can be the answer to "spring fever" inside your home, and are the ultimate in functional decorating. Some well-placed greenery will not only brighten your living space, it will also increase oxygen indoors and clear out toxins for cleaner breathing air.

You'll also find that houseplants will help create a more relaxing, restful ambiance in any room in your house.

"All plants are good for cleaning the air," said Carol McAlister of Yard 'N Garden in Fenton. "Some are better than others. Plants with thinner, finer leaves give off more moisture."

Here are some popular houseplants that are very easy to maintain, while cleaning the air inside your home:

(1) **English Ivy** was voted the #1 air purifying plant, in a recent NASA study. They're

incredibly easy to grow and very adaptable to your living conditions.

(2) **Philodendron's** heart-shaped leaves and decorative vines make it one of McAlister's favorite houseplants. They require just moderate watering and some sunlight.

(3) **Golden Pothos** can be added to any kitchen or living area as a hanging plant with cascading vines, requiring low levels of sunlight.

(4) **Spider Plants** are one of the most common houseplants and easiest to grow. They grow easily in bright, indirect light.

(5) **Boston Ferns** like cool locations with high humidity and indirect light, making bathrooms a perfect spot.

(6) **Bamboo Palms** create a tropical indoor presence, growing up to 12 feet high. They thrive in full sun and bright light.

(7) **Rubber Trees** (or Ficus Trees) are easy to grow and can grow quite

large, depending on the pot they're in. You can also keep them outside in the spring and summer.

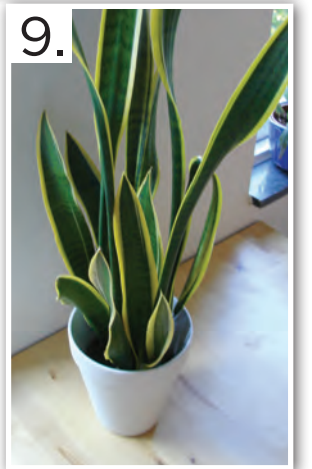
(8) **Aloe Vera** is a multi-use plant, with health benefits far beyond air cleaning.

(9) **Snake Plants** (or Mother-in-Law's Tongue) are almost impossible to kill, needing only occasional watering and indirect sunlight.

(10) **Peace Lily** is a very low-maintenance flower that sends up beautiful blooms, and they're almost impossible to kill.

Movie 'Selma' comes to life

►Local mother and daughter visit sites of civil rights movement from 50 years ago

Jennifer Wright and her daughter, Jailen Judson, viewed the powerful civil rights movie "Selma" in January, and the first thing Judson said when leaving the theater was, "I'm going to Selma!"

That one statement was the beginning of a journey that took Judson back to her roots as a 21-year-old biracial woman, creating not only memories, but also a new way of looking at her future.

Traveling south last Wednesday to Saturday night, this mother-daughter duo traveled back in time 50 years to the height of the civil rights movement, including the historic march from Selma to Montgomery, Alabama.

In 1965, hundreds of marchers were brutally beaten by Alabama state troopers as they protested racial discrimination in the voter registration process. About 600 people participated in the planned 50-mile journey on March 7, 1965 and marchers were pushed back by force and tear gas, injuring dozens of people.

Thousands of people gathered the weekend before Wright and Judson's visit to commemorate the 50th anniversary of "Bloody Sunday." Much of the confrontation between the authorities and marchers was captured in film and photographs on the Edmund Pettus Bridge, bringing the subject of race and violence into the living rooms of millions of homes in America.

Television coverage of the event triggered national outrage and eventually led Congress to pass the landmark Voting Rights Act of 1965. This legislation mandated federal oversight over elections in states with histories of discrimination.

Wright and Judson visited dozens of historic places, including the Selma to Montgomery Voting Rights Trail, the Edmund Pettus Bridge, Dr. Martin Luther King's home in Montgomery, the Rosa

Parks Museum and many other sites.

"We learned so much," said Judson, who experienced so many emotions on the trip. "These people all made sacrifices so I now can have basic rights," she said. "Experiencing it all with my mom was so special. Without these rights today, we wouldn't be a family."

Judson doesn't know her biological father, a man of color, but she is very close to her stepfather, Brad Wright, as well as her two brothers and one sister. Judson lives with her grandparents, Hewitt and Peggy Judson in Fenton Township. She's a 2012 graduate of Fenton High School and works in ministry for Young Life in Genesee County.

The memory that stood out the most to Judson was the reenactment of the march, which she and her mom unexpectedly joined in as today's marchers

gathered on the steps of the Alabama state capitol and heard the powerful words spoken by Martin Luther King III. "We were 25 feet away from the son of Dr. Martin Luther King," said Judson.

She and her mom also visited Dr. King's church, Dexter Avenue Baptist Church, and Judson had the opportunity to stand in front of his house, which is now a museum.

The stark contrast of 50 years ago to today really stood out to Judson. "Fifty years ago, the blood and beatings were on the hands of the police and city officials. Now, the police were here to protect the marchers."

This life-changing trip for Judson has charted a new course for her professional ambitions, as well as her own personal goals. "The first thing I'm going to do now that I'm back home is register to vote," said Judson. "People fought for me to have this right. It's time for me to use it."

Help for spinal stenosis pain

DEAR DR. ROACH:
I enjoyed your informative article on spinal stenosis. I also have acute and chronic pain in my lower back. I am 75 years of age and have had vertebroplasty on seven vertebrae. I realize that my back will not be normal again. I am currently working with a doctor who uses osteopathic manipulation. He is suggesting prolotherapy in conjunction with the manipulation. I have tried the prolotherapy previously without any relief of pain. What is your assessment of prolotherapy, or would you advise me to go to a pain clinic? The pain level in the lower back usually is about 6 or higher on pain scale of 1 to 10. I walk 3 miles every day in a grocery store using a small grocery cart. I am trying other exercises, even working on a balance ball. But it just does not seem to improve. I would greatly appreciate any advice you could give me. — D.R.

ANSWER:
Prolotherapy is the injection of an irritant solution into a space,

designed to stimulate healing and reduce pain. However, if it hasn't worked for you in the past, it is unlikely to work for you again. On the other hand, some studies have shown prolotherapy to be modestly effective when combined with spinal manipulation. A pain clinic has several modalities available, including steroid injections and pain medications. Unfortunately, steroid injections have been shown to be ineffective in back pain that is due to spinal stenosis lasting beyond six weeks. It sounds like you are doing what you can with exercise. I think continuing with the manipulation and prolotherapy as a trial of six weeks or so is reasonable, and at that point you can continue if it begins helping. If not, you can try a pain specialist, as there are effective non-narcotic medications that may be of help, in combination with your continued exercise. However, I think that an experienced physical therapist may be able to guide your exercises more effectively.

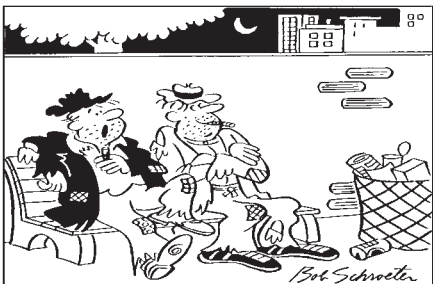

Ingredients

- 2 to 2½ pounds boneless beef chuck roast
- 1 package dry beefy onion soup mix
- 1 can (10.5 oz.) condensed cream of mushroom soup
- 1 can beef consommé
- 1/4 t. dried thyme
- 1/4 t. pepper
- 2 T. butter
- 3 T. flour
- 2 to 2½ C. of the beef cooking liquid
- rice or noodles for serving

Directions

1. Cut beef into 1-1/2 to 2-inch chunks, cutting off excess fat.
2. Add soup mix, mushroom soup, beef consommé, thyme, and pepper to crock pot and mix together.
3. Add beef chunks and stir to coat. Cover and cook on LOW for 6-8 hours.
4. Melt butter in a medium pot and add flour. Whisk until all of the flour is mixed into the butter. Gradually whisk in the 2 cups of cooking liquid from the crock pot. Bring to a simmer and remove from heat. If you want a thinner gravy, add more liquid.
5. To serve, remove beef from crock pot with a slotted spoon and serve with gravy.

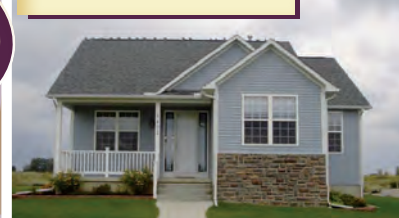

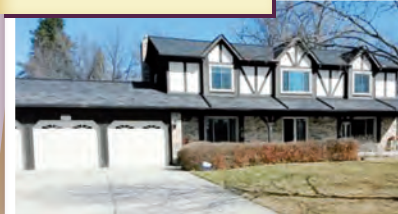

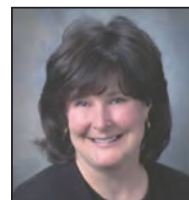
