According to Karen Piacentini, "Go Set a Watchman," the highly anticipated book by Harper Lee, will be released on July 14.

Lee's book is a sequel to Lee's Pulitzer Prize-winning novel, "To


Kill a Mockingbird." The new book chronicles the return of Scout, the young girl in Mockingbird to her home in the South.







# Exploring the amazing health benefits of reading

It can be hard for some people to pick up a book when there are so many distractions at the ready. But while books might not be as flashy as the latest must-have gadget, they can provide benefits that might surprise even the most avid readers.

In addition to the intellectual benefits of reading, indulging in a good book can also boost physical health. According to

Ken Pugh, PhD, president and director of research at Haskins Laboratories, which is devoted to the science of language, when a person is reading "parts of the brain that have evolved for other functions connect in a specific neural circuit for reading, which is very challenging." Just like muscles in the body,

the brain benefits when it is pushed beyond its normal abilities, and reading is a great way to push those limits.

But the benefits of reading do not stop there. Reading can help reduce stress, benefitting the body in numerous ways. A 2009 University of Sussex study found that turning to a good book can be an effective relaxation strategy when things become too stressful. Reading fiction can stimulate the imagination and distract a person from the stressors in everyday life. Choosing a humorous or uplifting story can boost mood and help people relax, particularly when reading before bedtime.

Reading also can help men and women get a better night's rest. People who are

accustomed to reading books before going to bed actually train their mind and body for relaxation. Picking up a book can send signals that it is time to settle down and get ready for sleep. Health experts often recommend developing a sleep routine to people who struggle to fall asleep at night, and reading for 30 minutes before bed each night can be an

integral part of such routines.

Research has shown that reading and engaging the brain in other ways, such as through intellectual games and puzzles, can stave off dementia. These activities stimulate the cells in the brain to grow and connect, increasing the power of brain tissue. According to the Alzheimer's Association,

keeping the mind active through reading can strengthen connections between brain cells and build up brain cell reserves. Mental activity might even generate new brain cells. All of these factors can reduce the risk of Alzheimer's disease and dementia.

According to a paper from researchers at Carnegie Mellon University, reading can stimulate the brain to produce more white matter. White matter works together with gray matter and is responsible for sending sensory and motor stimuli to the central nervous system to stimulate a response. Healthy white matter keeps the central nervous system working effectively and may reduce risk of learning disabilities as well as impaired motor functions.







First question ...over the winter I purchased a 1988 Camaro IROC-Z for cruising and shows and I have not found a mechanic to work on it yet. Do you work on these older cars? 2nd ...today I noticed a slight coolant leak coming from under the very front of the engine. I suspect it"s the water pump ...could you give me an estimate for parts and labor, or do you need to see the car? I am a current customer. Thank you, Sir!

John, Yes we do work on this vehicle, as far as the coolant leak be sure to look very closely at the intake manifold gasket as this is a common problem on this engine, there are also freeze in the front that can leak as well as the water pump mounting gasket, my best advise is to rinse the engine down let it dry then pressure test the cooling system, have a mirror and a flashlight ready to look under the water pump and surrounding area when you first pressurize it to see the leak when it starts, once it has run down the engine it can look like something lower but could be coming from a higher point and leaking down.



# Little things you can do to burn fat

When trying to lose weight, the main goal of any exercise program should be to increase your metabolism enough to where it is burning more calories than you are consuming.

Not only is your metabolism involved in this procedure, but the type of food you eat is just as important. Your metabolism can burn the calories very quickly, but if you are taking in 5,000 calories per day, it's not going to make a difference.

When your metabolism is up to speed and is working diligently to help you burn calories, your body will naturally stay warm. Keeping the levels of water in your body high enough to achieve this state is very important in the weight loss process.

# **Eat Protein**

Pendergraft points out that "protein can help in increasing the metabolism rate in human beings two to three times more than that of carbohydrates."

Foods that are commonplace in today's world are usually saturated with carbo-

hydrates, and we always get plenty of those, but it is actually the protein in our food that ultimately helps us lose weight quickly and efficiently.

# **Get Enough Sleep**

You want to make sure that you are getting good amounts of sleep at night in order to give your metabolism the break that it needs from working all day.

According to Pendergraft, "like every human being, the metabolism process in our body also needs some rest. So it is advisable that you do take in good sleep at regular intervals so as to maintain the metabolism rates in our body."

Your body is able to burn a lot of calories when it is in a resting state, so you don't want to deprive it of its capabilities to function sufficiently.

# **Watch Your Diet**

In addition to the above suggestions, you also will want to include the regular weight loss suggestions of eating a healthy diet and making sure to get plenty of exercise, but it is also very important to listen to your body.

When your body is telling you that it is tired, you should rest. If you feel a burst of energy throughout the day, go outside for a jog, as your metabolism is just begging to be used.

Following these steps will help you to not only lose weight but also live a healthier life.





# The links between hearing loss, Dementia

Seniors who have untreated hearing loss may be at an increased risk for developing dementia, a loss of brain function that can affect memory, thinking, language, judgment and behavior. This is the finding of a study conducted by researchers from the Division of Otology at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine.

The study included 639 people whose hearing and cognitive abilities were tested over a period of time, starting in 1990 and concluding in 2008. Researchers found that study participants who had hearing loss at the beginning of the study were significantly more likely to develop dementia by the end of the study. How might hearing loss and dementia be connected? Investigators aren't sure, but they think a common pathology may underlie both conditions, or possibly the strain of decoding sounds over the years may overwhelm the brains of people with hearing loss, leaving them more vulnerable to dementia.

The article concludes that, whatever the cause, these findings may offer a starting point for further research as to whether interventions, even as simple as hearing aids, could delay or prevent dementia by improving patients' hearing.
