less busy, because they can only do interior work this time of year. "You'll get the best bang for your buck for discounts by hiring a painter in December, January or February," said Scott Constable of Scott's Painting in Fenton.

Today's new low- or zero-VOC (volatile organic compounds) paints don't require ventilation like paints used to, so keeping windows open while painting is not as important as it used to be. Plus, paint will dry faster in cooler weather without the humidity of summer's air.

"If you're using oil-based paint, which is only about 1 percent of my business, then ventilation is important," said Todd Lauricello, a local professional painter with more than 20 years of experience. "But with today's latex paint, homeowners don't really have to worry about this."

While grays continue their run as popular neutral colors, whites with their many layers and complexities are the "new neutral" for 2016. The 2016 Color of the Year for Sherwin Williams Paints is Alabaster (SW7008). For Benjamin Moore Paints, it's Simply White (OC-

117), taking advantage of the subtleties and interplays of whites and light.

"Whites and off-whites are definitely making their statement as trendy colors this year," said Glenda Cornfoot, designer for the Sherwin-Williams store in Fenton. "White is really in, in paint, countertops and backsplashes. People like the clean, simple, uncluttered lines of white."

# SOME DESIGN IDEAS FOR ALABASTER FROM SHERWIN WILLIAMS INCLUDE:

- Use it to set the tone for healing, rest and meditation in residential or commercial spaces.
- Let the color stand by itself as a chic hue in an entryway or lobby.
- Pair with light blushes or grays and bridge transitional and traditional styles.
- Create a yin and yang harmony with contrasting dark colors, such as Urbane Bronze (SW 7048) or Gray Area (SW 7052).

Before you get your paintbrushes and rollers ready to tackle your walls and ceilings, take some advice from the pros.

"Most people don't prep correctly," said Lauricella. "Painting is only 25 percent of the work; the other 75 percent is prep. That means pole-sanding the walls to knock down all the grease, pet marks, kids' residues, etc., and sanding the trim work and moldings. If you skip the sanding, you won't be happy with the end result. Then there's dry wall repair."

He uses the Duration brand of Sherwin Williams paint for all his projects. "It's the best for homeowners because it's so 'forgiving' with great coverage, and they stand behind it. You'll

save time and money with quality paint."

Constable says that not buying quality paint and toolsisthebiggestmistake do-it-yourselfers make. "They tend to buy cheap everything. Buy the more expensive brush and roller cover, because you will definitely get

what you pay for."
He says that the best paint in the market is Home Depot's Behr Paint with Primer. "If you don't use good paint, it's going to

use good paint, it's going to take extra labor to cover the area."

If you're not a person who enjoys all the detail work of prepping, or you're not comfortable with the actual painting process, you may want to consider calling a professional painter.

"That's one of the biggest mistakes people make, not calling a professional," said Lauricella. "It's just as important of a skilled trade as an electrician or plumber. It's that important to get it done right."

Brands like BMW, Mercedes-Benz,
Porshe, Fisker, Lexus and others are set to show their newest and most anticipated models.



# 2017 Lincoln Continental

This not-yet priced car comes with a chrome grill, a luxurious interior with Venetian leather, rose-gold-colored trim, 30-way seats, tray tables, a Champagne-storage compartment, and seats that fully recline.



# 2016 Henrik Fisker the Force 1

Only a rough sketch of this sports car has been revealed, but the mystery isn't the only factor garnering attention. It cost just under \$300,000, the only sports car in that price category. The car will seat two. It will be manufactured in the United States with production of up to 50 units starting in April.

# 2016 BMW X4 M40i

With the best-in-class acceleration and most powerful M Performance gasoline engine to date, this model has a new Twin-Power Turbo inline 6-cylinder engine. It can achieve 355 hp and goes from 0 to 60 mph in 4.7 seconds, which is an 18-percent increase compared to the X4 xDrive35i. The vehicle comes with all-wheel drive, standard performance control, ferric gray metallic accents, black chrome tailpipes and interior comfort features.



# 2017 Porsche 911 Turbo S

The newest model of the 911 Turbo S comes with a redesigned front and rear lights, 20-inch wheels, dual tailpipes, and a three-part decklid grill. This car has 580 hp, which is 20 more horsepower and can go up to 205 mph, seven mph faster than the previous model. More upgrades include front and rear Park Assist, the Porsche Dynamic Light System, 18-way adaptive Sport Seats Plus and a two-tone leather interior.



# 2016 BMW M2

The newest BMW model, not available until spring, was designed for performance, with lightweightaluminum design features and smart tires, brakes and oil supply. With a new M TwinPower Turbo 6-cylinder engine, it produces 365 hp and can go from zero mph to 60 mph in 4.2 seconds. It has a more muscular appearance and accommodations for wider tracks and wheels.



# **Acura Precision Concept**

This is one of the most mysterious cars that will debut at the NAIAS. Acura has only released a teaser image of the future brand's design. From what is visible of the car, it has sleek lines and bulging fenders. The entire car will debut the morning of Jan. 12.







For the 2nd Semester of the 2015-2016 school year, Fenton Area Public Schools will accept applications from non-resident students for all secondary grade levels at AGS Middle School and Fenton High School. At the elementary grade levels nonresident student applications will be accepted as follows:

grades 1, 2 and 5 Tomek-Eastern:

North Road: grades 1 through 4 only

State Road: grades 1 and 3 only

Once a student's application is submitted and accepted a release from the student's resident district is <u>not</u> required. There are no tuition fees to enroll in Fenton Area Public School Schools; however, transportation to and from school is the responsibility of the student's family. Applications for second semester enrollment will be accepted from January 18, 2016 through February 1, 2016 for enrollment not later than February 5, 2016.

# **NATIONAL**

# **JANUARY 10**

**2000:** In one of the biggest media mergers in history, America Online Inc. announces plans to acquire Time Warner Inc. for some \$182 billion in stock and debt. The result was a \$350 billion mega-corporation, AOL Time Warner, which held dominant positions in every type of media, including music, publishing, news, entertainment, cable and the Internet.

# **JANUARY 11**

1908: U.S. President Theodore Roosevelt declares the massive Grand Canyon in northwestern Arizona a national monument. Though Native Americans lived in the area as early as the 13th century, because of its remote location, several centuries passed before North American settlers really explored the canyon.

# **JANUARY 12**

**2010:** A magnitude 7.0 earthquake devastated the Caribbean island nation of Haiti. The quake, which was the strongest to strike the region in more than 200 years, left over 200,000 people dead and some 895,000 Haitians homeless. The earthquake hit southern Haiti at 4:53 p.m. local time.

# **JANUARY 13**

1962: Ernie Kovacs, a comedian who hosted his own television shows during the 1950s and is said to have influenced such TV hosts as Johnny Carson and David Letterman, dies at the age of 42 after crashing his Chevrolet Corvair into a telephone pole in Los Angeles, California, while driving in a rainstorm. Kovacs, who often appeared on camera with his trademark cigar, was found by police with an unlit

cigar, leading to speculation that he had been reaching for the cigar and lost control of his vehicle.

# **JANUARY 14**

1943: Franklin Roosevelt becomes the first president to travel on official business by airplane. Crossing the Atlantic by air, Roosevelt flew in a Boeing 314 Flying Boat dubbed the Dixie Clipper to a World War II strategy meeting with Winston Churchill at Casablanca in North Africa. Roosevelt, at a frail 60 years old, gamely made the arduous 17,000-mile round trip.

# **JANUARY 15**

1967: At the Los Angeles Coliseum, the Green Bay Packers beat the Kansas City Chiefs in the first-ever world championship game of American football. In the mid-1960s, the intense competition for players and fans between the National Football League (NFL) and the upstart American Football League (AFL) led to talks of a possible merger. It was decided that the winners of each league's championship would meet each year in a single game to determine the "world champion of football."

## **JANUARY 16**

1919: The 18th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, prohibiting the "manufacture, sale, or transportation of intoxicating liquors for beverage purposes," is ratified on this day in 1919 and becomes the law of the land. The movement for the prohibition of alcohol began in the early 19th century, when Americans concerned about the adverse effects of drinking began forming temperance societies. By the late 19th century, these groups had become a powerful political force, campaigning on the state level and calling for total national abstinence.





# TURKEY CHILI MINI TACO BOWLS

# **INGREDIENTS:**

FOR THE TURKEY CHILI

- Oil for cooking
- 1 onion, peeled and chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, finely chopped or crushed1 carrot, peeled and fairly finely diced
- 1 red and 1 yellow pepper, chopped
- 14 oz. ground turkey
- 1 t. each of: hot chili powder, paprika, ground cumin
- 1 bunch fresh coriander, chopped
- 1 T. balsamic vinegar
- 2 14 oz. cans chopped tomatoes • 3 T. tomato puree
- 14 oz. can beans (butter beans, chickpeas) or chili beans are all fine)

# FOR THE TORTILLA BOWLS

- Soft tortillas (10"), cut into quarters **TOPPINGS**
- grated cheese, guacamole, sour cream (or Greek yoghurt), chopped tomatoes or a simple tomato salsa, limes for squeezing



# **PREPARATION:**

1. Pre-heat the oven to 350F. Heat up a good drizzle or two of oil in a heavy based ovenproof casserole pan, then fry the onions for a few minutes until softened. Add the garlic, carrot and pepper and cook for about seven minutes, stirring regularly.

**2.** Add the ground turkey and cook and stir until browned. Then add the chili powder, paprika, ground cumin and most of the coriander and cook for about another 10 minutes, stirring often.

3. Add the balsamic vinegar, tomatoes, tomato puree and beans, then put the casserole dish in the oven for about two hours. Add a splash or two of water after an hour if you




5. When the chili is ready, spoon it into your homemade tortilla bowls and top generously with the toppings and reserved coriander. Serve immediately.
