



Is it time to downsize?


■ As kids move out, many homeowners opt for savings, convenience of smaller homes





There are many types of powerboats

• BASS BOAT

Bass boats are generally 14- to 23-foot long, and are typically used for freshwater fishing.

• BAY BOAT

Bay boats are low profile and designed for use in shallow waters of large shallow bays, estuaries or near shore. Bay boats are 18 to 24 feet in length.

• BOWRIDER

A bowrider is considered a family boat and has an open bow area designed for extra seats forward of the helm. Bowriders are usually 17- to 30-foot long and can be used for fishing and water sports.

• CENTER CONSOLE

Center console boats are from 13 to 45 feet in length. The helm is on a console in the center of the boat, which helps anglers walk from bow to stern.

• CRUISER

Cruisers are from 21 to 45 feet long

and have a cabin in the bow of the boat. Cruiser cabins are typically large enough for a small galley, several berths and an enclosed head.

• CUDDY CABIN

Cuddy cabin boats have a small cabin for storage or a small seating area. They may accommodate a berth and or head. They are usually about 22 to 30 feet in length.

• DECK BOAT

Deck boats are 25 to 35 feet long, have a wide beam and feature a V-shaped hull, which offers more performance than a pontoon boat. They feature an open deck with plenty of seating. These are generally party or family boats, used for swimming and water sports.

• DINGHY

A dinghy is a small boat, usually 7 to 12 feet in length. They are usually powered by oars, small outboards, or sails.

Vendors will also be on hand to offer the latest services, accessories, engines, trailers, electronics, marinas, fishing gear and more for boaters and visitors.

In addition to displays and booths, there is also entertainment, free seminars, a sailing simulator, kids zone and more. The boat show is also offering a free boater safety class, sponsored by Yamaha, on Saturday, Feb. 20, from 10:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

The Detroit Boat Show is a 35-year tradition for Jeff and Patti Smith of Silver Spray Sports in Fenton, the longest-standing water ski/wake board dealership in Michigan.

"The show has changed a lot over the years," said Patti. "It used to be that people came to the show to learn about boats, docks and everything else they need for waterfront living. Now with the Internet, customers are already educated about boats and know what they want. They come to the show to touch, feel and experience the boats first-hand."

Patti is hoping that Punxsutawney Phil was right on Feb. 2 when he didn't see his shadow, indicating an early spring. "That will bring more people out to our dealership after the show, to test-drive boats. When you're spending \$70,000 and up on a boat, you want to drive it before you buy it."

The Detroit Boat Show is more than just an event; it also provides a time frame in which to get boat orders in soon enough for early summer delivery. "If you wait 'til the Novi show in March, it may be too late to have your custom boat delivered by Memorial Day weekend. Many of the

• DUAL CONSOLE

These boats have two dashboards and windshields with space to walk between them for allowing access to the bow area for seating and/or fishing. Lengths run 16 to 30 feet.

• FISH 'N SKI BOAT

Fish 'n Ski boats are used for fishing or skiing. They feature comfortable seating and offer live wells and tie downs for rods and have removable, elevated tow bars and ski lockers. They are usually 16 to 24 feet in length.

• FLATS BOAT

Flats boats range from 14 feet to 18 feet and are designed to navigate shallow waters. A push pole is used to navigate the shallow water.

• HIGH PERFORMANCE BOAT

These powerboats are built for speed. They have Spartan cabins. Cockpits seat two to six passengers. Powered by high horsepower outboards, stern drives or surface drives, these boats are carefully designed to be fast, light and strong, ideal for racing or fast cruising. They range from 25 to 60 feet in length.

• JET BOAT

Jet boats have single or multiple jet drives instead of a propeller for propulsion. These 14- to 24-foot boats are generally used for water sports and getting into shallow waters.

• JON BOAT

Jon boats are small utility craft primarily used for boating in shallow water. They range from 10 to 18 feet in length.

• PONTOON BOAT

Pontoon boats have shallow drafts and are very stable. They are usually found

on inland lakes and rivers and other small bodies of water. They are used for cruising, fishing and water sports. They come in lengths from 15 to 30 feet.

• POWER CATAMARAN

These dual-hull boats are generally used for offshore fishing. They are more rugged, provide a more stable ride, faster speeds and better fuel economy than mono-hulls. They are 25 to 40 feet in length.

• PWC (PERSONAL WATERCRAFT)

These entry-level boats come in lengths from 9 to 14 feet. They are usually built for one or two people but larger, more powerful model can seat up to four. They are powered by jet drive.

• RUNABOUT

Generally, a runabout is defined as a small powerboat somewhere in the 14 to 24 foot range. They are usually powered by an outboard or stern-drive engine. They are a multipurpose boat suitable for water sports, cruising and fishing.

• SKI AND WAKEBOARD BOAT

These boats are designed specifically for water sports. They can be ballasted for producing higher wakes for trick skiing and water-boarding. They are also great for pulling inflatable tubes.

• SKIFF

Like the Jon boat, the skiff is another entry-level boat, especially good for boating in shallow water.

• UTILITY BOAT

Utility boats are usually made for tough use. They range from 12 to 20 feet and are used for fishing or as workboats.

Cupcakes & Kisses adds sweetness to Holly's downtown

■ Owners trade medical careers to build a future for their family and community

Two registered nurses exchanged their hospital scrubs for kitchen aprons to open Cupcakes & Kisses in downtown Holly.

Kevin and Toni Barnett worked in emergency medicine and labor/delivery, respectively, at St. Joseph Mercy Oakland Hospital in Pontiac. After years of working away from their four kids, ages 4 to 11 on someone else's schedule, they decided to work for themselves and their family.

Cupcakes & Kisses opened on March 31, 2015 and the Barnetts haven't looked back.



Reader wonders why parents with visitation fade away

DEAR AMY:

Please help me to understand why it seems so common that after a divorce, the parent with visitation will allow themselves to fade out of their children's lives. In early 2009 I left my husband after repeated attempts to help him through his drug addiction. Our daughters were 11 and 13 at the time. For the first two years, he kept up his visitation schedule. Despite having as much access to them as he wanted, he stuck to the schedule for the most part and then faded away. I know so many stories of others in the same situation, whether it's a father or the mother who steps out of their responsibilities. My girls are 18 and 20 now and they have learned that in their father's world, they don't matter. It hurts them deeply. Our girls are busy but they would love to get a call from their father and feel a sense of importance to him. Messages or calls mostly go unanswered. When they are together for rare holiday occasions, he cannot relate to them and he seems too self-absorbed to really listen to them talk. The conversation is dominated by him and about him. His girls are strong, intelligent and independent. He is either too self-absorbed or feels inadequate around them.

DEAR LOSS:
I'm not aware that this happens as often as you seem to think it does. I also think that judging others based on your drug addict ex-husband's behavior is not fair to the scores of parents who try to be good parents under circumstances that are less than ideal. A typical visitation schedule of one evening a week and every other weekend means that it can be very challenging for the non-custodial parent to develop a consistent and close relationship with children, especially as they get older and have lots of competing interests. Intimacy is built not only through special occasions, but sheer quantity time spent together performing the mundane tasks of life in a family — going to the supermarket and school events, preparing dinner and cleaning up afterward. It is very challenging to build up an intimate family life on a visitation schedule. It is also best for children if the custodial parent does everything possible to assist the non-custodial parent in building a relationship. Obviously, your ex-husband has done a very poor job, and I'm sorry that your children long for a relationship they can't have.

Healthy bodies don't need supplements

DEAR DR. ROACH:

After viewing an infomercial that praised the benefits of probiotics, I would like to know what you think. Probiotics have been prescribed when one is taking antibiotics to replenish the good bacteria that is lost. When taking no medication, I found that when I took one capsule (30 billion live cultures per capsule/10 probiotic strains) on a daily basis, I would get gas and diarrhea; therefore, I stopped taking them. I thought that this was the exact opposite reaction that should have occurred. Please write about the pros and cons and the reasons/necessity for taking probiotics on a daily basis. — D.A.M.

ANSWER:

Probiotics are microorganisms, usually bacteria or yeast, that have beneficial properties. There is at least some evidence to support the use of probiotics for inflammatory bowel disease (Crohn's and ulcerative colitis), colon inflammation from radiation, irritable bowel syndrome and other diseases of the GI tract. However, with a few exceptions, there is very little evidence that taking anything (prescription or supplement) is of benefit to people who are healthy with no symptoms. Probiotics haven't been shown to benefit healthy people. Any treatment can have side effects. While there may be some benefits, such as preventing antibiotics-associated diarrhea, I hesitate before recommending any treatment to a healthy, asymptomatic person.

30-Minute Chicken Mushroom Pepper Stir Fry

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 onion, diced
- 3 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 large bell pepper, diced
- 4 large button mushrooms, diced
- 4 large chestnut mushrooms, diced
- 3 chicken breasts, diced or cut into thin strips
- 2-3 T. of coconut aminos
- ½ t. of dried garlic powder
- ½ t. of dried onion salt
- 1 teaspoon of dried basil
- 2 t. of dried lemon & thyme
- ½ t. of dried chili flakes
- 3 T. of coconut oil

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Dice all your veggies and chicken and set aside ready for frying.
2. Get a wok or a large frying pan (both with a lid) on high heat, add in your tablespoons of coconut oil.
3. Add in your onions, garlic, pepper and mushrooms. Cook these veggies for 3-5 minutes, stirring occasionally to keep them from burning.
4. Next, move your veggies aside in the pan and add in your chicken. Brown your chicken on all sides (while still stirring your veggies to keep them from burning) then mix together with your veggies.
5. Add in your aminos and seasonings. Reduce the heat to a medium, cover and cook for 10 minutes.
6. Check occasionally, to make sure all is well - if you see your veggies getting a little too crisp, reduce the heat.
