 This time of year, flowers take center stage
at our homes as we celebrate the coming of
spring, plus many special occasions from
prom to Mother's Day, and the planting
of our own gardens. Flowers have always
been infused with symbolism and meaning,
bringing a beautiful yet subtle way to com-
municate one's deepest emotions.

 Even flowers with the simplest of names
— roses, tulips and daisies — each have a
history behind their names that you likely

 don't think of when picking your favorites
at your local flower shop or nursery center.

ROSES

 Long a symbol of love and passion, roses
have been associated with Aphrodite and
Venus, the goddesses of love, by the ancient
Greeks and Romans.

 The name "rose" comes from French,
rooted in the Latin word "rosa." Used for hun-
dreds of years to convey messages without
words, roses also represent confidentiality. In

fact, the Latin expression “sub rosa” literally means “under the rose,” or something told in secret.

Each color reflects a distinct meaning: red, the lover’s rose; white, humility and innocence; yellow, expressing friendship and joy; pink, gratitude, appreciation and admiration, etc.

TULIP

The tulip’s cup-shape “mouth” may remind you of “two lips,” but that’s not how the flower got its name, according to the Farmers Almanac. The Dutch borrowed “tulip” from the French “tulipan,” who borrowed it from the Turks “tulbend, who noted that the shape of the flower reminded them of a turban.

Tulips symbolize perfect love, with different colors carrying their own significance. Red tulips are most strongly associated with true love, while purple symbolizes royalty.

DAISY

The name “daisy” was created in Old English from the poetical “day’s eye.” It was so named because daisies open at dawn, just as the day begins. A daisy symbolizes innocence and purity, as well as new beginnings.

DAFFODIL

Did you know that daffodils actually do symbolize rebirth and new beginnings?

Their botanical name is “narcissus,” named after the ancient Greek god Narcissus. According to legend, Narcissus was so enamored with his own reflection in the river that he drowned trying to capture his reflection. The daffodils growing along stream banks soon became associated with Narcissus, and took on his name, probably because of the beauty of their reflected image in the water.

PANSY

The word “pansy” comes from the 15th century French word “pensee.” Pensee is the feminine form of the word, meaning to think or ponder over something.

The pansy flower was used to convey feelings not easily expressed in Victorian England, such as “I’m feeling amorous to-

ward you” or “I have thoughts of you,” so it was used for secret courting. The pansy was placed in what was called a “tussie mussie,” a bunch of herbs wrapped in a doily with flowers in the middle.

Today, the pansy still symbolizes the love or admiration of one person for another.

GERANIUM

This flower name comes from the Greek word “geranos,” meaning crane, because the seed pods of the plant resembled a crane’s bill. The symbolism of the geranium is most commonly associated with the type or color of the flower, with many conflicting messages — horseshoe geranium, stupidity or folly; ivy geranium, favor; oak leaf geranium, true friendship, to name a few.

IMPATIENS

Impatiens get their name from the fact that all summer long, their seed pods grow and grow, just waiting to burst open to spread their seed for propagation and longevity. Eventually, they become so full and “impatient” that at the slightest touch they explode, sending their seeds scattering.

These gentle, tender flowers are symbolic of motherly love. In the medieval Mary gardens devoted to the Virgin Mary, impatiens were viewed as “Our Lady’s Earrings.”

LILY

Derived from the Greek word “leiron” (generally assumed to refer to the white Madonna lily), the lily was so revered by the Greeks that they believed it sprouted from the milk of Hera, the queen of the gods.

Symbolizing humility and devotion, lilies are the 30th wedding anniversary flower.

FLOWER POWER

Violet, May, Daisy and Iris were all in the top 100 names in the Edwardian era. Those names then went out of favor until 1996, when nine floral names were in the top 100. In 2011, the name Lily was even in the top 10, with Daisy close behind.

As the flowers most often associated with funerals, lilies symbolize that the soul of the departed has received restored innocence after death.

PEONY

One legend has it that the peony was named after Paeon, a physician to the gods, who received the flower on Mount Olympus from the mother of Apollo. Another tells the story of that same physician who was “saved” from the fate of dying as other mortals, by being turned into the flower we know today as the peony.

Peonies are known as the flower of riches and honor, embodying romance and prosperity, as well as an omen of good fortune and a happy marriage.

Check out this list of common foods we eat everyday

Many of the snacks you eat that you think are healthy actually have little to no nutritional value. What many people consider "health foods" contain processed sugar and empty calories. They might make you feel healthy because they're only 100 calories, but caloric intake does not measure health.

Here are **10** foods and drinks believed to be healthy but actually aren't.

Cereal

Cereal has little nutritional value. Approximately 31 percent of Americans eat cereal for breakfast, unaware of all the sugar they're consuming before 9 a.m. Even cereals like Honey Nut Cheerios and Raisin Brand have nearly as much sugar in them as Fruity Pebbles.

'Fat-free' anything

The human body needs fat to support all body functions. Avoiding fat will skew your macronutrient ratio and cause even more fat gain.



Skim or low-fat milk

Skim and low-fat milk may have fewer calories but they're lacking essential nutrition whole milk has. Whole milk contains more saturated and monounsaturated fats to help you feel full, support metabolism and support body composition. Skim and low-fat milks contain less A, D, E, and K vitamins.

In 2012, researchers found a correlation between child obesity and higher consumption levels of skim and low-fat milk.



Protein bars

Granola and protein bars are filled with sugars, high fructose corn syrup, trans fats, and artificial sweeteners.



Fruit juices

Fruit juices may have some vitamins, but they also contain a lot of sugar. One 8 ounce glass of grape juice contains 40 grams of sugar, which is more sugar than a 12 ounce can of Coke.



Dried fruit

Dried fruit contains many sugars and chemicals added to improve shelf life. Because it's dried, the snack contains more calories per bite than a piece of fruit.

Sports drinks

Sports drinks contain a high level of sugar and while they claim to enhance performance during a workout, there have been no studies proving their worth.



Yogurt

Most low-fat and fat-free yogurts contain high fructose corn syrup, sugar, starch, and artificial sweeteners. Experts recommend avoiding yogurts with fruit inside because they're usually soaked in sugar or from concentrate.

Egg white-only anything

All parts of an egg are healthy for you. Many people don't eat the yolks because of the cholesterol, but the human liver produces more cholesterol a day than you ingest. Dietary cholesterol does not strongly correlate with blood cholesterol.

The yolk contains vitamins A, D, E, and K, which are fat-soluble, healthy vitamins.



Wheat bread

Even with labels of "multi-grain" or "seven-grain," certain breads marked as wheat bread may still use refined flour. These breads may only contain a few actual whole grains. Many also contain partially hydrogenated oils, artificial sweeteners, high-fructose corn syrup preservatives, and food coloring.

The Township Board of the Township of Argentine Ordains:

SECTION 1

That the Code of Ordinances of the Township of Argentine is hereby amended by adding a section to be numbered 13-67 and which reads as follows:

Pursuant to MCLA 42.23 the Code of Ordinances of the Township of Argentine is hereby amended by reference through the adoption of Michigan Public Act 94 of 2000, Michigan Public Act 97 of 2000, and Michigan Public Act 98 of 2000:

Michigan Public Act 94 of 2000, which is an act to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled “An act to provide for the regulation, titling, sale, transfer, and regulation of certain vehicles operated upon the public highways of this state or any other place open to the general public or generally accessible to motor vehicles and distressed vehicles; to provide for the licensing of dealers; to provide for the examination, licensing, and control of operators and chauffeurs; to provide for the giving of proof of financial responsibility and security by owners and operators of vehicles; to provide for the imposition, levy, and collection of specific taxes on vehicles, and the levy and collection of sales and use taxes, license fees, and permit fees; to provide for the regulation and use of streets and highways; to create certain funds; to provide penalties and sanctions for a violation of this act; to provide for civil liability of owners and operators of vehicles and services of process on residents and nonresidents; to provide for the levy of certain assessments; to provide for the enforcement of this act; to provide for the creation of and to prescribe the powers and enforcement of this act; to provide for the creation of and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state and local agencies; to repeal all other acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act or contrary to this act; and to repeal certain parts of this act on a specific date,” by amending section 909 (MCLA 257.909).

Michigan Public Act 97 of 2000, which is an act to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled “An act to provide for the registration, titling, sale, transfer, and regulation of certain vehicles operated upon the public highways of this state or any other place open to the general public or generally accessible to motor vehicles and distressed vehicles; to provide for the licensing of dealers; to provide for the examination, licensing, and control of operators and chauffeurs; to provide for the giving of proof of financial responsibility and security by owners and operators of vehicles; to provide for the imposition, levy, and collection of specific taxes on vehicles, and the levy and collection of sales and use taxes, license fees, and permit fees; to provide for the regulation and use of streets and highways; to create certain funds; to provide penalties and sanctions for a violation of this act; to provide for civil liability of owners and operators of vehicles and services of process on residents and nonresidents; to provide for the levy of certain assessments; to provide for the enforcement of this act; to provide for the creation of and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state and local agencies; to repeal all other acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act or contrary to this act; and to repeal certain parts of this act on a specific date,” by amending sections 605 and 683 (MCL 257.605 and 257.688), section 605 as amended by 1999 PA 267.

Michigan Public Act .98 of 2000, which is an act to amend 1963 PA 181, entitled “An act to promote safety upon the public highways by regulating the operation of certain vehicles; to provide consistent regulation of these areas by state agencies and local units of government; to establish the qualifications of persons necessary for the safe operation of such vehicles; to limit the hours of service of persons engaged in operating such vehicles; to require the keeping of records of such operations; to provide penalties for the violation of this act; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state agencies; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts,” by amending sections 7, 7b, 7c and 11 (MCL 480.17, 480.17b, 480.17c, and 480.21), sections 7 and 11 as amended and section 7c as added by 1995 PA 265 and section 7b as amended by 1990 PA 339.

SECTION 2

Any changes or amendments of the Michigan Motor Vehicle Code, the Motor Carrier Act, or the Motor Carrier Safety Act subsequent to the effective date of this ordinance shall be deemed to be incorporated by reference and made a part hereof as if such changes or amendments were in effect as of the effective date of this ordinance.

SECTION 3

This ordinance shall be published in a newspaper circulated within the Township of Argentine, Genesee County, Michigan.

SECTION 4

This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after publication.

SECTION 5

A copy of this ordinance, Michigan Public Act 94 of 2000, Michigan Public Act 97 of 2000, and Michigan Public Act 98 of 2000 which have been adopted by reference can be inspected or obtained at the Township of Argentine Hall, 9048 Silver Lake Road, Linden, Michigan, during regular business hours.

Any changes or amendments of the Motor Carrier Act, the Motor Carrier Safety Act, or the Motor Carrier Fuel Tax Act subsequent to the effective date of this ordinance shall be deemed to be incorporated by reference and made a part hereof as if such changes or amendments were in effect as of the effective date of this ordinance.

SECTION 3

If any portion of this Ordinance shall be determined invalid or unconstitutional by a Court, the remainder shall be considered severable and shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4

This Ordinance shall be published in a newspaper circulated within the Township of Argentine, Genesee County, Michigan.

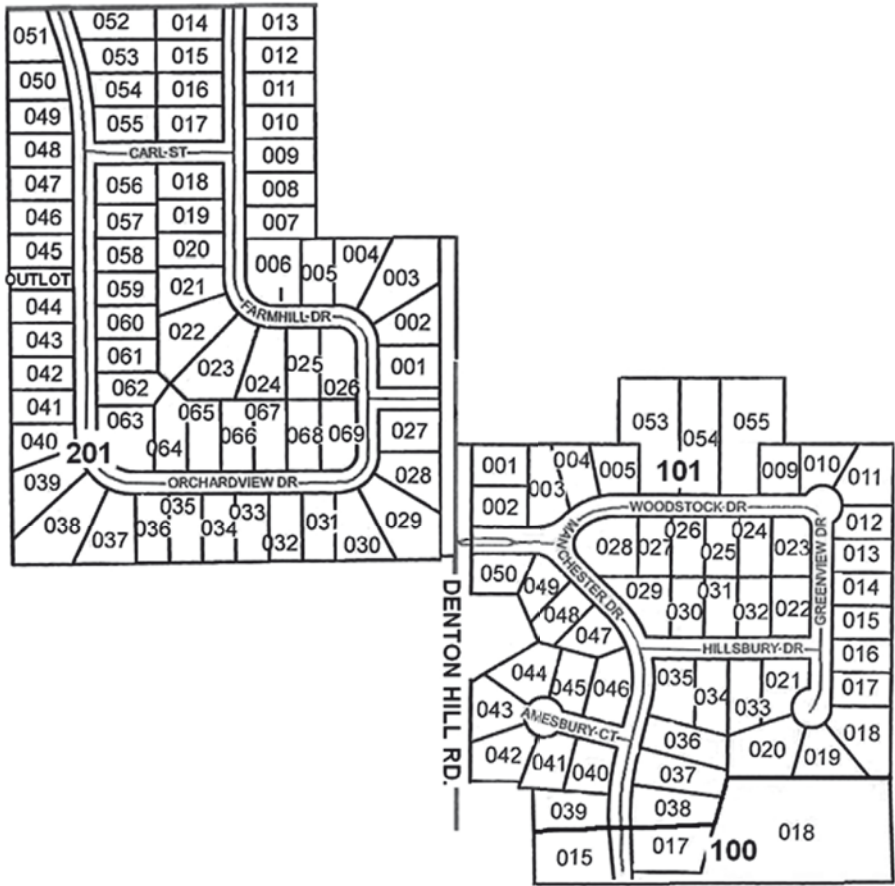

weren’t there? What would your husband do if you decided to get an evening job and weren’t available, or if you decided to get drunk yourself one evening? You are the main person feeling uncomfortable over this whole situation and one way to stop enabling is to try to spread out the discomfort and share it with others who are impacted by your husband’s drinking. Let’s say you decide to tell your family, “I will very happily drive on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. Dad is responsible for the other days.” Your husband either has to stay sober, or he will have to go through the process of finding someone other than you to drive the kids. If the children are put out or made uncomfortable by this restriction, they can tell their father how they feel and he can explain to them why he isn’t available when they need him. I certainly hope you and your children avail yourselves of Al-anon and Alateen meetings. Alateen has helped many young people try to make sense of a parent’s drinking. Check al-anon.org for the location of meetings near you. Perhaps your husband could drive his children to a meeting.

DEAR CURIOUS: Yes, you are enabling your husband to stay drunk during times when he might otherwise have to stay sober. Mind you, whenever you take care of your children — you are simply seeing to their needs and you should feel good about that. This is what parenting is all about. But what would your family do if you

Exercising with Atrial Fibrillation

DEAR DR. ROACH: I am a 76-year-old man who has atrial fibrillation. To control this problem, I am presently taking Tikosyn, metoprolol, warfarin and aspirin. For exercise, I walk or run at least 5 miles, five days weekly. In that 5 miles, I jog rapidly at least 3-4 miles. I push myself pretty hard. What I want to know is, in your opinion, am I putting myself in jeopardy by exercising in this manner? — J.M.G.

monitor might be a good idea to make sure you aren’t going into a dangerously high range. The metoprolol tends to keep heart rate low, but exercise can overwhelm that effect. The American Heart Association would recommend a heart rate no higher than 125-130; however, some healthy 76-year-olds can exceed that safely. Exercise while on anticoagulation medicine also is safe, with reasonable precautions. You shouldn’t be in a sport that is likely to cause significant trauma. Fortunately, running is safe, unless you have had falls. I am a big believer in the value of exercise across all ages. Regular exercise makes us feel better and have fewer falls, and it helps reduce heart risk and cancer risk. Overdoing it, however, is never a good idea. Stay with a moderate, not extreme effort, and build yourself up gradually. It sounds to me like you are exercising safely, but I would want to double-check your pulse rate at maximum effort.

ANSWER: There are three parts to your question. Is vigorous exercise dangerous for: someone with atrial fibrillation on a rhythm-control medication; someone on anticoagulation; and a 76-year-old man in general. Tikosyn (dofetilide) is an antiarrhythmic drug used to stop A-fib (a chaotic heartbeat) and keep people in normal heart rhythm. Exercise generally is considered safe with this medication, but I think a pulse
