Boating fever

■Michigan is in top three for number of registered boats and boat accessory sales in U.S.

If you live in the tri-county area, there are only two seasons of the year: winter and boating.

Boating fever is definitely heating up, even if Mich igan's temperatures this spring have been slow to rise. Memorial Day is the of ficial launch of Michigan's boating season, and people are excited about getting their boats back in the water, after a long winter of snow and boat

With 3.177 miles of Great Lakes shoreline and 11,000 inland lakes, its no surprise that Michigan is in the top three states in the number of registered boats, third only to Florida and Minnesota.

Michigan's nearly one million reg istered boats recorded in 2015 didn't include the half-million legally non-reg istered canoes, kayaks andnon-powered watercraft under 16 feet, according to Nicki Polan, executive director of the Michigan Boating Industries As sociation. Adding those numbers to

tri-county area residents live near some of Michigan's most beautiful and bountiful lakes. According to the Michigan Historical Center, a Michigan resident is never more than six miles from an inland lake or more than 85 miles from one of the Great Lakes.

Even if you don't live on a lake, you







Michigan is in the top three states na tionally for new boat, motor, trailer and accessory sales, behind only Florida and Texas. Atotal of\$762.4 million was spent in 2015 on new boats, motors, trailers and accessories, marking five years of consecutive growth.

Nationally, bo ating dollars have also grown, with this year's boating expenditures forecasted to surpass \$37 billion, equaling the all-time high of \$37.6 billion attained in

2006, according to MBIA's immediate past chairman Jim Coburn.

Michigan also has a strong presence in boats manufactured in this state. With 95 percent of all boats made in the U.S., many brands are made in Michigan, including A valon Pontoons in Alma, Crest Pontoons in Owosso, Four Winns-Glaston-Wellcraft in Cadillac, Manitou Pontoons in Lansing, to name a few.



GONE WILD

A typical human pregnancy lasts nine months, and the baby is barely ready to survive in the world. How do human moms compare to animal moms?

ELEPHANTS

Elephants are pregnant for 22 months, and give birth to the biggest babies on earth at an average of 200 pounds. Calves are initially born blind so they rely on their trunks for navigation and discovery. Elephants also live in a matriarchal society. The other female elephants, called "allomothers," in the family help raise the babies.

KOALA

Female koalas only eat poisonous eucalyptus leaves because their digestive system can detoxify the poisons. However, their babies, called joeys, aren't born with that special bacteria so the mom feeds them their feces until they can.

ALLIGATORS

Pregnant alligators make their nests in an area of rotting vegetation because it produces warmth so she doesn't have to lay on her own eggs when they're born. If the heat is less than 88 degrees, it's a girl, but if it's over 91 degrees then it's a boy. The mothers carry around the babies in their jaw for protection.

POLAR BEARS

After a male polar bear gets a female polar bear pregnant, he leaves while she works to put on approximately 400 pounds while the baby grows. The females

need to double
their weight or else
their body will absorb the
fetus. The mom actually hibernates through
the baby's birth, giving
them the easiest labor.
Newborns stay by their
mother's side for about
two years.

CHEETAHS

Females usually are caring for four to six cubs at any given time. The moth-

ers teach the cubs how
to hunt and survive,
and once that's
done, they
move on
to another
family.
The male
siblings will
stay together, but
the female offspring
will usually go out on their own,
preferring solitude.

ORANGUTAN

Female orangutans spend nearly their entire lives up in trees, making nests every day from branches and foliage. She never puts her babies down, nursing until they're about age 6 or 7, the longest dependence of any animal.

The males will leave their mom

faster, but the females will stick around to learn how to take care of the babies.

ELEPHANT SEALS

Female elephant seals bulk up even bigger than their usual 1,700 pounds. They gain weight every day during the 11-month pregnancy period. After giving birth,

she'll drop about 600 pounds in less than a month while nursing her cubs.

OCTOPUS

Female octopus lay approximately 40,000 eggs at one time, and protect the eggs over the 40 days it takes for

them to develop and hatch However, that means she doesn't have time to hunt for herself, so what does she eat? A few of the eggs.

SEA LOUSE

This small aquatic crustacean has a hard time when she wants to mate. She enters into a male's layer and finds about 25 other pregnant females.

The females also experience the worst child-birth ever because once the babies are ready to come out, they do so by eating her from the inside out.

COUGARS

Cougars have the most vigorous

breeding behavior among mammals with copulation occurring 50 to 70 times in 24 hours for about a week. Once the female

> is pregnant, she secludes herself to her den. She

to her den. She'll give birth to one to six cubs and raised them mainly by herself, teaching them how to hunt and deliver the killing bite, which severs the prey's spinal cord. Human females

who seek out younger men are referred to as cougars, yet there's no correlation between the animal and the slang term.

On Feb. 21, Heather and Len Quasa -

rano, along with their four young chil dren, Luke, Brenden, Rachel and Grant were discovered in their Stony Brook Pass home in Fenton T ownship. They died from accidental carbon monoxide poisoning.

"The Qs have been a very important **Fenton Twp.** — Pancakes proved to be part of the robotics team. We're a community-based team and the Qs have been

> a part of it for 10 years so it hurt a lot when all this happened. When they hurt, we hurt," Weber said.

Over 20 businesses donated products or services for the event.

Proceeds will go to the Fenton Township Fire Department for carbon monoxide education in

local schools, and the silent auction pro ceeds will be split up between the fire department and The Q Project, which also promotes carbon monoxide education.

"I'm extremely proud of what our kids accomplished yesterday. They were amazing. They did all the work," Weber said. "Everybody get a carbon monoxide detector and never run a generator in your house."

A few members of the Quasarano fam ily attended the event. Laura Quasarano, the mother of Len, talked with guests

along her hus band, Phil, and daughter Nina. She said her kids are all about family and she hopes to spread that spirit.

"I think it's wonderful that they're coming to support the fam ilv and I thinkit's

wonderful that they're coming to support the fire department. The fire department has shown so much love to us. I realized that it's not just a tragedy for my family, it's a tragedy for a lot of people," she said.

She added that she "can't say enough good things" about the sherif f's department, Fenton Township, the fire department and the EMS crews.

A family night will be held on May 26, from 5-8 p.m. at Eagles Wooden Park in Linden in honor of the Quasarano family. They will have crafts, fishing, and free food.

NATIONAL HISTORY

MAY 8

1945: Both Great Britain and the United States celebrate Victory in Europe Day. Cities in both nations, as well as formerly occupied cities in Western Europe, put out flags and banners, rejoicing in the defeat of the Nazi war machine. German troops throughout Europe finally laid down their arms on the eighth day in Mav.

MAY 9

1950: Lafayette Ronald Hubbard (1911-1986) publishes "Dianetics: The Modern Science of Mental Health." With this book, Hubbard introduced a branch of self-help psychology called Dianetics, which quickly caught fire and, over time, morphed into a belief system boasting millions of subscribers: Scientology.

MAY 10

1869: The presidents of the Union Pacific and Central Pacific railroads meet in Promontory, Utah, and drive a ceremonial last spike into a rail line that connects their railroads. This made transcontinental railroad travel possible for the first time in U.S. history. No longer would western-bound travelers need to take the long and dangerous journey by wagon train, and the West would surely lose some of its wild charm with the new connection to the civilized East.

MAY 11

1947: The B.F. Goodrich Company of Akron, Ohio, announces it has developed a tubeless tire, a technological innovation that would make automobiles safer and more efficient.

MAY 12

1932: The body of aviation hero Charles Lindbergh's baby is found, more than two months after he was kidnapped from his family's Hopewell, New Jersey, mansion. Lindbergh and his wife Anne discovered a ransom note in their 20-month-old child's empty room on March 1. The kidnapper had used a ladder to climb up to the open second-floor window and had left muddy footprints in the room. The ransom note demanded \$50,000 in barely literate English. The crime captured the attention of the entire nation.

MAY 13

1981: Pope John Paul II is shot and wounded at St. Peter's Square in Rome, Italy. Turkish terrorist Mehmet Ali Agca, an escaped fugitive already convicted of a previous murder, fired several shots at the religious leader, two of which wounded nearby tourists. Agca was immediately captured. He claimed that he had planned to go to England to kill the king but couldn't because it turned out there was only a queen and "Turks don't shoot womer

MAY 14

1804: One year after the United States doubled its territory with the Louisiana Purchase, the Lewis and Clark expedition leaves St. Louis, Missouri, on a mission to explore the Northwest from the Mississippi River to the Pacific Ocean. The expedition traveled up the Missouri River in a 55-foot long keelboat and two smaller boats. On Nov. 8, 1805, the expedition arrived at the Pacific Ocean, the first European explorers to do so by an overland route from the east.



I do the best I can for my kids, as she works, sleeps and goes to her gym. I am all for her wanting and needing to

feel better mentally and physically, but she has totally disconnected with the rest of us and I am here as a roommate to cook and clean when I get home from work. I am in this relationship only because of my children, but I struggle with leaving her and worry about what will happen to her. What will my kids think? Is it wrong to want more for myself and for my children — because I feel guilty about that every day. I'd appreciate your take on this.

DEAR DR. ROACH:

You advised an 81-year-old farmer who was drinking an energy drink

several times a week to "stick with coffee" in order to avoid the added sugar in the energy drink. What is your opinion of getting an equivalent amount of caffeine through over-the-counter caffeine pills instead of coffee? I am a 55-yearold woman, and except for being overweight, I am in excellent health. I exercise daily, sleep well at night and have no complaints whatsoever. I get

about six or seven hours of sleep a night, and am a naturally early riser. I do not drink either tea or coffee (don't like the taste), but I have found that if I take one half of a 200-mg caffeine pill immediately on arising, it does wonders for my mood and

productivity. On some days I take a second pill in the early afternoon, and rarely, a third in the evening, though

> never later than 6 p.m. Is there anything wrong with this? I've found that many people who drink several cups of coffee a day seem to look askance at me because I get my caffeine in a pill. — A.C.


ANSWER:

Some people drink coffee for the caffeine; some people drink decaf to avoid the caffeine; most people like both the taste and the caffeine

effect. You are unusual in only wanting the caffeine effect. A 16-ounce cup of coffee at a large chain contains 330 mg of caffeine. I don't see anything wrong with taking caffeine pills the way you are. However, some people won't sleep well if taking as much as you are.






