# 100 years of National Parks

■ This summer marks the beginning of the second century of preserving our national treasures

If your family includes a fourth-grade student, you might want to pack a bag with them and enjoy their free visit to any national park in the U.S. this year, thanks to the National Park Service's Centennial Celebration in 2016.

Hoping to encourage families to visit national parks this year, every fourth-grader in the U.S. gets a free pass to visit the parks of their choice.

## SUMMARY

■ If you and your family haven't vacationed at any national parks, this Centennial Year might give you 100 reasons to start packing.

It was 100 years ago, on Aug. 25, 1916, when President Woodrow Wilson established the National Park Service in order to promote and regulate the 35 national parks, monuments and reservations that had been managed prior to that time by the Department of the Interior.

The first national park in the U.S. was Yellowstone National Park, established and protected as a park in 1872 and considered today to be the showcase of the national park system. With 4.1 million visitors annually, its 2.2 million acres majestically spread across Wyoming, Idaho and Montana, and still leaves guests breathless, with its craggy peaks, explosive geysers, bison, bears, sheep and wolves.

Today's national park system includes 400 properties covering 84 million acres and attracting more than 307.2 million visitors each year across 50 states, District of Columbia and U.S. territories.



# Life lessons through fishing

■ Teacher takes 120 kids on field trip to Linden millpond every year

Give a man a fish and you'll feed him for a day. Teach him how to fish and you'll feed him for a lifetime.

That same philosophy applies to kids, which is why teacher Ben Anderson brings 120 students from his north Flint school, Rand els Elementary in the Carman-Ainsworth school system, to the Linden millpond every year for his annual fourth-grade fishing field trip.

"My favorite hobby is taking kids out fishing," said Anderson, 41, a teacher since 1999. He grew up enjoying the sport at his family's cabin on Lobdell Lake, and

now lives on a small lake in Durand with his family. "When I faced challenges in my life, fishing would bring me my peace. Most of the kids I teach face challenging situations every day."

His annual fishing field trip is a much-loved tradition among fourth-graders, and is now in its 16th year. It teaches the kids not only the mechanics of fishing, but also many life lessons and classroom skills, too.


Anderson connects this activity with Michigan's state benchmarks for science, and includes an ecosystem activity at the back of a book, he and his wife, Jamie wrote and illustrated in 2013, to coincide with the fishing trip.

The book is entitled "Liam's Fishing Lesson with Grandpa," and is read every year at the fishing field trip by Anderson's mother, Sharon Lafee of Fenton Township,

a retired educator. "She actually bought the books and donated them to support the event," said Anderson.

It's another way that Anderson's family has supported this annual fishing field trip. His father, Rolly Anderson of Swartz Creek, has donated many fishing poles, along with Tom Biggs of Fishing Tackle Grab Bag.

"When I started this field trip there weren't any fishing books on the market,"

said Anderson. "It looks like a picture book, but there's a lot of fishing information in there. The point of publishing the book was to provide the kids with another quality activity related to fishing."

This annual fishing field trip and book caught the attention of Michigan Out-of-Doors TV, which featured the event two years ago on one of their episodes.

Volunteers are at the heart of this fishing expedition, from teachers at Linden Community Schools who come out every year, to members of the Mundy Township volunteer police, who provide manpower, fishing licenses and background checks for adult volunteers.

Most of the kids have never caught a fish before, and that "light bulb moment" when it happens is what brings Anderson back year after year.

"There are a lot of sad stories out there about what happens to some of these kids," said Anderson. "They might brag and say they've been fishing before, but when they really catch a fish, they look you in the eye and tell you it's their first fish." Anderson estimates that 70 to 80 percent of the kids catch a fish that day.

All the fish are catch-and-release, and include the diverse bounty of the lakes, from blue gills to large- and small-mouth bass, crappies, pike, carp, sunfish, shiners and perch.

Anderson teaches them how to use the Department of Natural Resources Michigan Fishing Guide. "They need to know how to classify and weigh and measure their catch," he said.

Anderson also reminds the students and parents about the DNR's Free Fishing Weekend, which is coming up June 11 and 12. (See sidebar below)



**NATIONAL PARKS**

The National Park Service includes more than just the remote, vast areas of the Grand Canyon, Grand Teton, Zion and others, but also national lakeshores, monuments and historical parks.

You might not know that Michigan is home to its own national park, Isle Royale National Park in Houghton, a 382-mile trek up to the Upper Peninsula for a rugged, secluded destination, reachable only by seaplane or boat.

If that sounds too remote for your lifestyle, then your family can hop in the car for a pleasant 10-hour drive through four states (Michigan, Ohio, Kentucky and Tennessee), and end up at the nation's most visited national park, Great Smoky Mountains National Park, straddling the border of Tennessee and North Carolina.

With more than 10 million visitors a year, the Smoky Mountains attract more than twice the visitors than the number two most visited national park, the Grand Canyon, in the northwest corner of Arizona.

In addition to Michigan's Isle Royale National Park, this state is also home to Pictured Rocks National Lakeshore in Munising in the western Upper Peninsula, Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore in Empire, near Traverse City and the Keweenaw National Historical Park in Calumet, in the U.P. Even the Raisin River National Battlefield Park in Monroe and the Motor Cities National Heritage Area in Detroit are important parts of the National Park Service.

Many national parks will have special events planned this year, so it's worth checking out their websites to determine the best time to visit.

You can even enjoy VIP Access (Volunteers-in-Parks) and discover the best open secret in the National Park Service. Each year more than 240,000 Americans volunteer at parks in all 50 states, while enjoying an opportunity to camp on a remote Hawaiian beach or spend the summer hiking the Cascade Mountains. To become a VIP, visit [volunteer.gov](http://volunteer.gov), which lists hundreds of available opportunities.

**LOOKING BACK**

at this week in NATIONAL HISTORY

**JUNE 5**

**1933:** On June 5, 1933, the United States went off the gold standard, a monetary system in which currency is backed by gold, when Congress enacted a joint resolution nullifying the right of creditors to demand payment in gold. The United States had been on a gold standard since 1879, except for an embargo on gold exports during World War I, but bank failures during the Great Depression of the 1930s frightened the public into hoarding gold, making the policy untenable.

**JUNE 6**

**1944:** The term D-Day is used routinely as military lingo for the day an operation or event will take place. However, for many it is also synonymous with June 6, 1944, the day the Allied powers crossed the English Channel and landed on the beaches of Normandy, France, beginning the liberation of Western Europe from Nazi control during World War II. Within three months, the northern part of France would be freed and the invasion force would be preparing to enter Germany, where they would meet up with Soviet forces moving in from the east.

**JUNE 7**

**1913:** On this day in 1913, Hudson Stuck, an Alaskan missionary, leads the first successful ascent of Mt. McKinley, the highest point on the American continent at 20,320 feet.

**JUNE 8**

**1968:** James Earl Ray, an escaped American convict, is arrested in London, England, and charged with the assassination of African American civil rights leader Martin Luther King, Jr. on April 4, 1968.

**JUNE 9**

**1973:** With a spectacular victory at the Belmont Stakes, Secretariat becomes the first horse since Citation in 1948 to win America's coveted Triple Crown — the Kentucky Derby, the Preakness, and the Belmont Stakes. In one of the finest performances in racing history, Secretariat, ridden by Ron Turcotte, completed the 1.5-mile race in 2 minutes and 24 seconds, a dirt-track record for that distance.

**JUNE 10**

**1752:** On this day in 1752, Benjamin Franklin flies a kite during a thunderstorm and collects a charge in a Leyden jar when the kite is struck by lightning, enabling him to demonstrate the electrical nature of lightning. Franklin became interested in electricity in the mid-1740s, a time when much was still unknown on the topic, and spent almost a decade conducting electrical experiments. He coined a number of terms used today, including battery, conductor and electrician. He also invented the lightning rod, used to protect buildings and ships.

**JUNE 11**

**1986:** The hit John Hughes-directed teen comedy "Ferris Bueller's Day Off," released on this day in 1986, stars a young Matthew Broderick as a popular high school student in suburban Illinois who fakes an illness in order to score a day off from school, then leads his best friend and his girlfriend on a whirlwind day through Chicago.

## Meet Efrain Segarra

- Heading to MIT for Ph.D program

Efrain Segarra, a Fenton High School graduate, has much to be thankful for. As he prepares for next chapter in his education, he urges graduating seniors to follow their passion.

**Tell us a little bit about yourself. Are you originally from Fenton?**

I was actually born in McAllen, Texas, and then my family moved to Michigan before I started pre-school. We lived in Grand Blanc for a few years, moving to Fenton for first grade at Tomek as my sister started fifth grade.

**What year did you graduate from Fenton High School?**

I graduated Fenton High School in 2012 and was class valedictorian. I was also National Honor Society (NHS) Chapter President and Chair of the Blood Drive and Relay for Life.

**What else were you involved in at Fenton High School?**

For fun and passion, I participated in band and theatre. I spent four years in band, four years in marching band, two years in jazz band, and one year in wind ensemble. During my junior year, I was fortunate enough to be elected drum major of the marching band.

I participated in theatre for three years, the IB Theatre the last two years, and was involved in a long list of shows. Probably the most well known is Romeo and Juliet during my senior year. I played Romeo with Brooklyn Sondgeroth playing Juliet. Those who made the most significant impact during my high school years I met through theatre and band. I often confided in my closest mentors, Lori Thompson and Andrew Perkins.

**Tell us about your MIT scholarship.**

This fall, I'll be headed to the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) to pursue a Ph.D in Physics. I was extremely lucky to be awarded a three-year fellowship by MIT School of Science that provides full tuition and a stipend for living expenses. Moreover, I was awarded the National Science Foundation Graduate Fellowship as well as the Ford Foundation Fellowship.

**What are your future career plans?**

Beyond earning a PhD, I'm not too sure what I would like to do. I've always been fascinated by the idea of re-advancing human space exploration, so working for NASA or a company such as SpaceX would be exciting. If I were to go into academia, I would want to work on building the next generation detectors

to try and detect the cosmic neutrino background.

**Tell us why you chose this path.**

That introductory physics course I took began to give me a daily smile — boxes on inclined planes and all. In our final lecture, my physics professor outlined A-Day-in-the-Life for a physicist. Everything felt in place and it all hit me. My story is not unique, but my outcome is. I chose differently. I had found my niche. Each class I took challenged me, but it was a challenge I welcomed and needed. I disregarded the money, and focused my mind on physics

**What do you like to do in your spare time?**

I love to be outdoors, play piano, binge-watch Netflix shows, and cook. I love doing all of this with my girlfriend, Anna. I think it's so important to maintain a good work-life balance. Pursuing physics has not been the easiest, but what has kept me level is my unwavering support system — family, Anna, and friends.

**When were you a member of the Fenton Education Foundation Board of Directors?**

I was elected to the FEF Board through NHS as the student representative. One of the most rewarding parts about being on that board was seeing the actual opportunity for affecting classrooms in Fenton Area Public Schools in such a positive way.

During one meeting, we were able to vote on the allocation of funds for certain classrooms. It was eye opening to learn behind the scenes how a school is run, and giving teachers the tools and opportunities they needed in their classrooms.

**Tell us about your family.**

My mother, father, and aunt all live in Fenton and my sister is married (and recently pregnant) and living in Ohio. My father works at Kostal as a senior project

- a. Exhibit B attached to the Tax Increment Financing Plan is amended to provide the following additional provision: "The LDFA shall exclude 10.6226 mills from its capture of millage levied by the City of Fenton for fiscal year 2017 pursuant to an Agreement to share captured assessed value between the City of Fenton Local Development Finance Authority and the City of Fenton to be effective November 24, 2017."

The fiscal and economic implications of the proposed amendment are limited to the temporary shifting of tax revenue generated by the 10.6226 mills, in an amount not to exceed \$150,000.00, from the LDFA to the City of Fenton.

The district is composed substantially of the US-23 Industrial Park, Fenway Plaza industrial park and certain additional industrial zoned property adjacent to the east of these parks. The district is generally bounded by US 23 on the west, Owen Road on the south, Silver Lake Road on the north and Pontchartrain Boulevard extended on the east.

# Husband fears germs in Doctors' Offices

**DEAR DR. ROACH:**

Our issue is with doctors' offices and germs. My husband won't see a doctor because he says they are some of the "germiest" places around. After his last visit to the dermatologist, he said he wouldn't go back because the doctor didn't wash his hands or change gloves before examining him. I asked a doctor once to wash his hands, and he got very defensive, to the point of being rude, and I didn't feel comfortable seeing him again. Also, what about skin diseases, such as rosacea, lupus, etc.? Can these be transferred via stethoscopes, equipment or incidental contact? What can I do to reassure my husband that he won't get a disease at the doctor's office? — R.

your doctor's office be kept clean, and you have every right to ask your doctor to wash his or her hands before an exam,

if you haven't seen him or her washing hands in front of you. I don't blame you for being uncomfortable about seeing the defensive doctor — infection control is part of our business. However, it is impossible (and unnecessary) to keep the surfaces truly sterile, since diseases that are transmitted in the doctor's office most often come from hands, or occasionally are airborne, such as during flu season (which is why

you may be asked to wear a mask if you have a cough or sneeze). One exception is C. diff, which is why it is such a problem in hospitals. Washing your own hands is a good idea when leaving the physician's office, but you don't want to go overboard worrying about acquiring diseases in the doctor's office. Rosacea and lupus are not spread by skin-to-skin contact.



# Chicken Quesadillas with Gochujang Sauce

These chicken quesadillas with gochujang sauce are the perfect fusion between Mexican and Korean flavors!

**INGREDIENTS**

- 1 lb boneless skinless chicken breasts
- pinch of kosher salt
- 1/4 tsp granulated garlic
- 1 to 1 1/2 TBS olive oil
- 8 6-inch corn tortillas
- 3/4 cup shredded cheese (I used sharp cheddar and mozzarella)
- 2 scallions, thinly sliced
- 1 cup baby spinach (about a small handful)

**GOCHUJANG SAUCE**

- 2 TBS gochujang
- 3 TBS lowfat sour cream
- 2 tsp rice vinegar
- 1/4 tsp toasted sesame oil

**INSTRUCTIONS**

1. Remove chicken from packaging and pat dry. Slice your chicken breasts across to get thinner slices. This also helps the chicken cook faster. Sprinkle kosher salt and granulated garlic over chicken breasts.
2. Heat a pan with olive oil over medium-high heat. Add chicken breasts and cook for around 7 to 8 minutes, until the breasts reach 165 degrees F (75 degrees C). Dish up and set aside to rest. When the chicken is cool enough to handle, chop into thin slices.
3. Prepare gochujang sauce by mixing all ingredients in a bowl. Set aside.
4. Assemble quesadillas. Spread about a heaping teaspoon of gochujang sauce on a tortilla. Top with 3 tablespoons of cheese, sliced scallions, chicken, spinach, and another tortilla. Repeat for the remaining ingredients.
5. Wipe down pan and bring it to medium heat. Heat quesadillas for about 2 to 3 minutes, flipping in between.
6. Slice into quarters and serve immediately. You can use the rest of the gochujang sauce for dipping.


