DTE Energy Music Theatre, formerly Pine Knob, has been the venue of choice for 44 years

Summer wouldn't be summer without at least one trip to see a performance by your favorite entertainers at DTE Energy Music Theatre in Clarkston.

Originally called Pine Knob, in 2001 DTE Energy Music Theatre (the parent company of Detroit Edison) purchased the naming rights to the amphitheater in a 10-year, \$10 million deal.

Although it has been 15 years, the theatre can't seem to shake the

name "Pine Knob" as it is often referred to by concert-goers.

Pine Knob was built in 1972 to be the primary outdoor amphitheater in the Detroit metro area. It was named Pine Knob because of its close proximity with the popular Pine Knob golf course and ski area.

At the time, Pine Knob was the largest amphitheater in the country, with a capacity of 12,500, later growing to 15,000 when the tunnel that bisected the lawn was filled in during the early 1980s. Pine

■ DTE Energy Music Theatre was so named in 2001 after its parent company, Detroit Edison purchased the naming rights for \$10 million. Originally built in 1972, the amphitheater was called Pine Knob Music Theater.



Knob gave a summer home to rock, pop, R&B and other contemporary styles, creating a template that was followed by more, and increasingly larger, outdoor venues.

One such venue called "Poplar Creek," located in Hoffman Estates, Illinois, was nearly identical to Pine Knob.

Today, DTE Energy Music Theatre has a seating capacity of 15,294.

Pine Knob/DTE has received more than 32 industry awards since 1991, including Billboard's Top Amphitheatre for attendance in 2011 and Pollstar's Top Amphitheatre Venue Worldwide for total tickets sold in 2011.

EZ Kayak & Canoe Rental opens in Linden

■ Local kayaker wants to share his love of the sport and the Shiawassee River with others

Gary Messenger got his feet wet in kayaking seven years ago, and wants to make this water sport more accessible to everyone.

He recently opened EZ Kayak & Canoe Rental in Linden, along the banks of the Shiawassee River in the lower level of the former Gavin Smith Photography building downtown at 208 Bridge St.

"I want people to get out there and enjoy the sport, the water, this river," said Messenger, 58.

His inventory includes six 10-foot sit-in kayaks, one sit-on-top kayak and one sit-in tandem kayak, plus three canoes. He is open Saturday and Sunday from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m., and during all paddling events of fering by the Keepers of the Shiawassee. He plans to expand his hours in the future, as interest grows in trying the sport.

"Renting a kayak or canoe is a perfect opportunity for people who want to try a paddle sport for the first time without investing in one," said Messenger. "I want people to experience this little jewel (the Shiawassee) we have right in our own backyard."

Interested paddlers can paddle upstream by the hour or downstream by destination point. "I can put you in at the Linden Mill Pond and you can paddle upstream into

Tupper Lake, Lake Ponemah and Squaw Lake," said Messenger. "We supply the vessel, life vest and paddles and make sure you get started."

For a more challenging downstream paddle, Messenger will put you in behind the Down the Hatch Pub, for a paddle toward various destination points at Hogan Road, Cole Road and McCaslin Lake Road.

Musicians will climb on stage equipment, drink shots, and jump on attendees to crowd surf during their concerts. These antics are normal. However, some concerts throughout the years have ended with heart attacks, lightning strikes, and a lollipop stuck in someone's eye.

Here are eight crazy things that have happened at concerts:

1 When The Who was on tour in 1973, on their first night drummer Keith Moon was so nervous he puked before the show and took what he thought was an elephant tranquilizer to calm him down. It was actually PCP. His drumming got sloppy during the show, and he eventually passed out on stage. They asked the crowd if anyone could play drums, and a 19-year-old played drums for the rest of the night.

2 Famous performer Jackie Wilson was popular in the '50s and '60s. When he was performing on Dick Clark's Oldies Show at a nightclub in 1975, he collapsed on stage from a heart attack. Wilson went into a coma and never recovered. He died eight years later in a hospital in New Jersey.

3 Right before a Grateful Dead concert on June 25, 1995, a few fans were huddled outside by a tree, trying to get shelter from an oncoming storm. Lightning struck the tree and the fans. One of them was in a coma for a while, but all three made a full recovery.

4 In 2004 when David Bowie was performing at the Norwegian Wood Festival in Oslo, Norway, a fan threw a lollipop on stage, hitting him in the eye. It was lodged between his eyeball and eye socket. One of his eyes was damaged in a childhood fight, giving him different color eyes. He told the crowd the fan was lucky he hit his bad eye and said he was going to punish the crowd and make the concert extra long.

5 At a Beyoncé and Jay-Z concert on Aug. 2, 2014, a 25-year-old man groped a woman. Her boyfriend got into a fight with the man and the man bit off a chunk of the boyfriend's finger. The boyfriend was taken to the hospital and the man was booked on a charge of mayhem.

6 Soul/funk musician Curtis Mayfield was performing a concert in New York on Aug. 13, 1990, when a strong wind caused stage lighting to fall on him. The accident paralyzed him from the

neck down. He continued to make music afterward and even released an album. He died in 1999 from diabetes complications.

7 A 24-year-old, Nathan Gale, shot and killed Dimebag Darrell, guitarist of Damageplan in 2004 when they were playing a show. It's said that Gale was upset over dissolution of Pantera, which later became Damageplan. Gale jumped a 6-foot fence, ran into the venue, and shot Dimebag in the head when he was on stage. He also shot into the crowd a few times, killing four people, before he was killed by a police officer.

8 In 2003, metal band Great White was playing at a nightclub in Rhode Island. During the set, the tour manager set off the pyrotechnics and the walls caught on fire. The club went up in flames quickly and despite the club having four exits, there was a stampede, blocking a few exits. A bouncer even tried to stop people from exiting one door because it was for band members only. More than 100 people died and more than 200 were injured.

The first performance was an impromptu matinee on June 25, 1972, by David Cassidy, whose popular hit at the time, "I think I love you" was regularly sung on the TV show, "The Partridge Family," on which Cassidy portrayed a member of the singing family.

Two days later, on June 27, 1972, crooner Andy Williams and Quincy Jones joined forces for a five-night run that was considered the theatre's "official" opening.

The summer of 1973 brought Motown to Pine Knob with a performance by The Temptations. They shared the July 13-

14 bill with Earth, Wind & Fire. Stevie Wonder would play 10 days later.

In July 1974, KISS was gaining in popularity and made its first appearance at Pine Knob opening for Blue Oyster Cult.

Joni Mitchell made her Aug. 8 and 9 stop at Pine Knob the cover photo for her live album "Miles of Aisles" in November 1974.

Near and dear to every Michigander's heart is Bob Seger & the Silver Bullet Band. On July 27, 1977, they played the first of what would become 25 sold-out shows at Pine Knob.

The image of Jackson Browne and his girlfriend by the Pine Knob stage loading door was included on his "Running on Empty" album four months later.

Seger and the legendary Bruce Springsteen met for the first time backstage at Pine Knob.

During the early 1980s, Pine Knob hosted performances by Blondie, Duran Duran, Heart, John Cougar Mellencamp, The J. Geils Band, The Steve Miller Band, and the B-52s.

Bette Midler collapsed onstage during her July 1983 performance at Pine Knob. She was treated for exhaustion and an up-

set stomach at Pontiac General Hospital. She made up the show later that summer.

Neil Diamond performed for five nights in August 1984. Fans complained about an overcrowded lawn. Pine Knob said the conditions were due to picnic baskets and lawn chairs, but others suspected they oversold tickets.

On May 20, 1989, Eddie Money began his reign as Pine Knob/DTE's first weekend opener. With one exception (1995) he's played on the Friday of Memorial Day weekend of every season since.

Once the '90s rolled around, Pine Knob saw performances by top artists such as Sara McLachlan, Ozzy Osbourne, Metallica, Aerosmith and Peter Frampton.

During the next decade, top performers at Pine Knob included Kid Rock, Nelly, Jessica Simpson, Kenny Chesney, Eminem, 50 Cent, Bob Seger with Three Doors Down, Bare Naked Ladies, Toby Keith, Jimmy Buffett and Green Day.

Don't Let Summer Heat Curtail Cardio Workout

DEAR DR. ROACH: I usually walk 45 minutes daily for a cardio workout. However, the summer heat can be brutal, so instead of walking, I swim and walk one hour in the pool. Is that as good a cardio workout as walking? — R.G.

ANSWER: I think that having several different ways to exercise is a good idea, since the muscles used will always be at least somewhat different and it can keep you from being bored when doing the same thing day after day. In your situation, I think that it makes a great deal of sense to avoid the heat by getting in the pool. The intensity of a cardiovascular workout can be

measured simply by your pulse rate. A rough but commonly used guide is that moderate cardiovascular exercise is 50 percent to 70 percent of your age-predicted maximum of 220 minus your age. So for age 50, your maximum is 170, and moderate exercise is a pulse of 85 to 119. You can check your pulse at the wrist with a clock, or wear a heart monitor. Swimming almost always is a more-intense workout than walking (race walkers certainly can get a very fast pulse rate), and walking in the pool is a good exercise for your heart and many muscles. If the pool is outdoors, as is usual in warm, sunny places, you need to wear and reapply plenty of sunscreen to protect your skin.

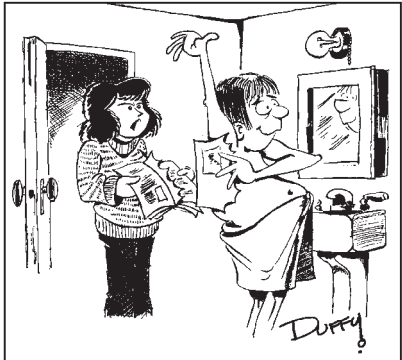
