Adopting a pet isn't a long, difficult process, but it isn't easy either.

You can't just walk into an animal shelter or adoption clinic and just pick

At Adopt-A-Pet, Director Jody Mad dock said there are rules and interviews people must first pass before adopting a pet. "Everything we require and go through ment for that particular animal. with the potential adopters is always in the

animal's best interest," she said.

When someone wants to adopt a new furry friend, they visit the shelter or another adoption company and find an animal that interests them.

They meet with an employee who will ask about their living conditions.

"That means we try to recommend another animal who would be a better fit," she said.

Certain animals need a different environment than others. For example, some dogs need fenced-in yards, some dogs aren't good with active kids, and some kittens have so much energy that they need a family home or to live with another companion.

Adopt-A-Pet also requires that the potential adopters speak to a landlord or bring in the pet agreement to see if they have breed-size/amount of pet restrictions.

"We've had many people upset that they have to bring the animal back because they didn't know they weren't allowed a second pet," she said.

Maddock said they also require the animals in the home be spayed or neutered and up to date on their shots and other medical matters.

"If they can't keep their current animal up to date, how will they keep a second one," she asked.

Adopt-A-Pet requires everyone in the home to know about or be on board with getting the animal. Maddock said bringing home a new family member is the quickest way to cause stress in a relationship.

"Sadly, the animal is the one who typically suffers the stress and poten - tially being returned," she said.

Maddock recommends bringing in the other pets in the house to introduce it to the new animal.

Adopt-A-Pet employees make sure the potential adopters have done their research on what breed of animal they want, what it takes to own that pet, the cost, how much exercise that animal needs, how much training, and the level of commitment.

The guidelines at Genesee County Animal Control are similar.

Amy Warner, volunteer and special events coordinator, said they gather information on potential adopters like what animals they already have and if they have small children.

They also make sure the animal the person wants to adopt is a good fit for their home.

"The dog's evaluation is used for this process. For example, a dog that is a jumper or overly hyper may not be a good fit for a family with small children," she said.

All dogs up for adoption are temperament tested.

"This tells us if they are cat and dog friendly, food or toy aggressive and how they may react to a toddler," she said. "All homes with dogs require a 'meet and greet' between animals. If there are cats, only dogs passing the cat test are considered. Dogs with a high prey drive, those not passing the cat test, should also avoid farms with smaller animals."

People can only adopt cats anddogs if

they are spayed/neutered. GCAC of fers the service.

"If they are not fixed already we offer a pre-pay program. An unfixed dog/cat can be prepaid after the stray hold has expired and dogs have passed the temperament test. Prepays are cash only and the animal must be picked up the day after the spay/ neuter," she said.

Warner said if the fit is right and adoption is possible, the fee to buy the animal covers the spay/neuter, a par-vovirus/bordetella, distemper booster, rabies shot and license, and treatment for fleas and worm.

After the adopters pass all inspections, they can take home their new best friend.

I have a '93 GMC Sonoma that ran out of gas. I put gas in it and it will not crank. I changed the spark plugs and the fuel filter and still nothing, but it is getting gas and firing.

Nick, The problem you may be having now is low fuel pressure due to the pump getting hot from running low on fuel. On a new and healthy pump this may not happen right away, but on an older fuel pump you want to be careful not to run it low on fuel too often. You can check this with a fuel pressure gauge. However, you will need to know the specification for your vehicle.

Threatened coach leaves kids in gym

DEAR AMY:

I am a high school teacher and fifthgrade basketball coach. I was recently

coaching a fifthgrade practice when a disgruntled parent walked into the gym with 10 minutes left to go and started harassing me verbally. He got into my face, and started yelling at me with foul language. The parent was a rather large individual, and I did not want to start a physical altercation, so I handed him the ball and walked away. I did not want to try and negotiate with him because I didn't

know how he would react. The children's safety was not at stake, but I felt mine was. I left the gym and sat in my truck because I didn't have access to a phone inside the gymnasium. There were about five or 10 parents and children who were on the sidelines who witnessed the event. Afterward, the parents told me that the disgruntled parent just yelled at the kids to go home. No one was hurt. The school superintendent charged me with leaving the kids unsupervised for a period of 10 minutes. I felt I handled the situation best by walking away, keeping my distance from the parent, and not trying to negotiate. Do you feel that this is how most reasonable people would have reacted? Does the school have the right to charge me with leaving the children unattended for 10 minutes, when my own personal safety was at stake? — Upset Coach

DEAR COACH:

I am very sorry this happened to you. I do happen to agree with the school's reprimand, however. If there were a different sort of episode that frightened you (a lightning storm, power outage, etc.), would you have left these fifth-graders unsupervised (by school personnel) in the gym?

Obviously not. You should have asked a witnessing parent to please call school security (or the police) while you tried to deal with the parent.

DEAR AMY:

I am a 56-year-old woman. I married at 36 and have always kept my baptismal name. Everyone knows me as "Patricia J. Clarke." I never adopted my husband's name. Recently, we received an invitation to a very good friend's daughter's wedding. The invitation was address to "Mr. and Mrs. David Smith." What is up with that?

Is there some law that says you have to address wedding invitations to "Mr. and Mrs.?" When I said to my friend that the only Mrs. Smith I know is my husband's deceased mother, she laughed at me. Crushed fingertip is slow to heal

DEAR DR. ROACH:

Three months ago, I slammed the fingertip of my left index finger in a

drawer. The fingertip is still swollen and painful. My doctor sent me for an X-ray, and there is no fracture. I can bend it at the joint, but cannot put pressure on the fingertip. I looked online, and read something that said a fingertip crush injury can take six months to a year to heal, and the swelling may never go away completely. Can this possibly be true? Why does it take so long? Is there anything I can do to help it heal? I can

get along OK without using the finger for everyday functioning, but I am a guitar player, and I really need to use that fingertip to play. Is there hope that I will be able to play again someday? I would be very sad to have to give it up. — D.L.

ANSWER:

Crush injuries to the fingertip often do take months to heal completely, due to the fact that there isn't a lot of room in the fingertip and that there are many important structures in the fingertip, and that a little bit of inflammation can cause pain and loss of function for a long time. Fortunately, most people do regain complete use of the hand,

and I wouldn't sell your guitar just yet.
Think about what Pete Townshend of the
Who did to his hand, and he's still a pretty
good guitar player.

DEAR DR. ROACH:

My 18-year-old grandson has just been diagnosed with superior mesenteric artery syndrome. It sounds extremely serious. Would you be able to tell me more? I am very worried. — G.D.

ANSWER:

The superior mesenteric artery is one of the critical arteries that supplies blood to the intestines. Directly

underneath the SMA is the duodenum, the first part of the small intestine. In SMA syndrome, loss of the normal fat around the duodenum causes the artery to constrict the duodenum, causing a compression of the duodenum and an obstruction to food going through. Serious weight loss due to medical illness, surgery or anorexia nervosa is the most common cause of SMA syndrome. It's a difficult diagnosis to make, and there is some controversy about what criteria are used for diagnosis. If weight loss is the underlying cause of SMA syndrome, then nutritional support and weight gain become the primary treatment. Surgery is sometimes necessary.


