ARGENTINE TOWNSHIP GENESEE COUNTY, MICHIGAN ORDINANCE NO: 71

AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL **ORDINANCES 16-6, 16-8, 16-9** THE STATE CONSTRUCTION CODE AND **REPLACE IT WITH ORDINANCE NO. 71** AND TO DESIGNATE VIOLATIONS AS A MUNICIPAL CIVIL INFRACTION

The Township Of Argentine, Genesee County, Michigan hereby Ordains:

The State Construction Code Ordinance 16 -- shall be repealed and replaced with the following:

"Ordinance No. 71 -- State Construction Code

Section 1: Construction Code Adopted - Pursuant to the provisions of the Stille-DeRossett-Hale Single State Construction Code Act, Public Act No. 230 of 1972 (MCL 125.1501 et seq.), the Michigan State Construction Codes are hereby adopted, as are subsequent amendments.

Section 2: References in Code - References in the Michigan State Construction Code to "State" and "Michigan" shall mean the State of Michigan; references to "municipality" shall mean the Argentine Township, references to "local ordinances" shall mean ordinances of Argentine Township, and references to "building officials" shall mean building official, building inspector, or his deputy.

Section 3 - Administration and Enforcement of State Construction Code Act and Code – The township assumes and shall be responsible for administering and enforcing the single state construction code act, Public Act No. 230 of 1972 (MCL 125.1501 et seq.), and state construction doe prepared and promulgated as provided in that Act (referred to in this section s the state construction code and act within the boundaries of the township).

Section 4 - Violations -- Violation of this Ordinance is a municipal civil infraction.'

SECTION 1 -- Repealer

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this ordinance full force and effect.

SECTION 2 – Severability

Should any section, subdivision, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared by the courts to be invalid. The same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so invalidated.

SECTION 3 – Effective Date

This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon publication.

Continued from Page 1B it follows the Colorado River through canyons, crossing the Sierra Nevada and California's majestic redwood forests.

A coach seat one-way ticket is \$211 in the fall, and a two-person "roomette" will be \$970. Wide, reclining coach seats are definitely the most affordable option.

Just a note, this writer's son, Andrew, 32, hopped on the California Zephyr on Thursday, with plans to fly back Saturday night from San Francisco to Detroit, using frequent flier miles from his job. The whole trip cost him about \$300, including dining car fare aboard the train.

The Cardinal

This one-night Amtrak route travels between New York City and Chicago, not on a direct route, but dipping south through the mid-Atlantic states and southeastern heartland, across the Blue Ridge and Allegheny mountains through the Shenandoah Valley. The most scenic feature of this route is the New River Gorge in West Virginia — the train follows the New River through the gorge for several hours.

A coach seat in the fall costs \$106. Visit amtrak.com/cardinal-train

The Grand Canyon Railway

This 65-mile scenic journey from Williams, Arizona will take you to the South Rim of the Grand Canyon. It's a two-and-a-half-hour tourist train, not an Amtrak route. Musicians perform on the train and conductors tell stories.

The train departs daily at 9:30 a.m. with a return trip at 3:30 p.m. You can enjoy a four-hour layover at the Grand Canyon, or stay overnight at Grand Canyon Village and return on a future day.

Round trip tickets start at \$65 up to \$219 for Luxury Parlor Class, which includes a private bar and access to an open-air platform.

Revolutionary Railway: Ethan Allen Express

Mood-altering scenery takes you on a 241-mile journey from the Big Apple north, taking in the Catskills in upper New York State and the Green Mountains in Vermont. The train departs in midafternoon, leaving enough daylight for sightseeing before arriving in Rutland, Vermont shortly after dark.

• The Agawa Canyon Train Tours from Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario, are a one-day rail adventure into the heart of the Canadian Wilderness. This 114-mile

excursion will take you over towering trestles, alongside pristine northern lakes and rivers and through granite rock formations.

At Mile 102, you will begin your descent over the next 10 miles to the floor of the Agawa Canyon, where you'll spend one and a half hours enjoying a boxed lunch and scenic walks along graveled trails.

The fall color tours operate Sept. 12 through Oct. 10 with adult ticket prices of \$101.77.

• Fall Color Train Tours are offered through the Michigan Steam Railroad Institute, from Cadillac to Mancelona on Oct. 8 and Mt. Pleasant to Cadillac on Oct. 15, on an antique diesel engine pulling antique passenger vessels. These sell out early, so book quickly, according to their website at michigansteamtrain.com. or cadillacmichigan.com/fall-color-tours.

Tips for riding Amtrak

• You can carry on two bags or check any additional bags for free. There's a 50-pound limit per bag. In addition to your two bags, you can bring travel necessities like pillows, blankets, computer cases or medical devices. You can also bring infant items like strollers and diaper bags that don't count toward the two-bag limit.

· Make sure if you have checked your bags in, that you also bring a carry-on bag with the necessities you'll need at your seat on the train.

• You can bring your own alcoholic beverages only if you have a Sleeper Car accommodation, not in a public area. You may purchase alcohol in the dining car.

• Not all trains have a Wi-Fi signal and some routes pass through remote areas where cell phone signals are limited, so plan accordingly.

• Bring a coat or jacket to also use as a blanket.

• If you'll be sitting up overnight, get an inflatable airplane pillow to use when sleeping. You may also want an eyeshade mask and earplugs.

• If you're traveling with kids, bring books, coloring books, movies or other entertainment devices.



AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR MUNICIPAL CIVIL INFRACTIONS OF CERTAIN TOWNSHIP ORDINANCES AND PENALTIES PURSUANT THERETO; ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES RELATING THERETO; AUTHORIZATION OF WHICH TOWNSHIP OFFICIALS CAN ISSUE CIVIL INFRACTION TICKETS AND APPEARANCE TICKETS; PENALTIES; AND PROCEDURES RELATING TO SUCH MATTERS

The Township Board of the Township of Argentine hereby Ordains: <u>SECTION 1 – Title</u> This Ordinance shall be known as the "Argentine Township Municipal P

This Ordinance shall be known as the "Argentine Township Municipal Penalty, Civil Infraction of Appearance Tickets Ordinance." <u>SECTION 2 -- Definitions</u>

As used in this Ordinance:

- "Act" means Act No. 236 of the Public Acts of 1961, as amended, and Public Acts 12-26 of 1994, as amended.
- "Authorized township official" means a township official, police officer or other personnel or agent of the township authorized by this Ordinance or any ordinance to issue municipal civil infraction citations.
- "Municipal civil infraction action" means a civil action in which the defendant is alleged to be responsible for a municipal civil infraction.
- "Municipal civil infraction citation" means a written complaint or notice prepared by an authorized township official, directing a person to appear in court regarding the occurrence or existence of a municipal civil infraction violation by the person cited.
- "Township" means Argentine Township.

SECTION 3 – Municipal Civil Infraction Action; Commencement

A municipal civil infraction action may be commenced upon the issuance by an authorized township official of a municipal civil infraction citation directing the alleged violator to appear in court.

SECTION 4 – Municipal Civil Infraction Citations: Issuance and Service

Municipal civil infraction citations shall be issued and served by authorized township officials as follows:

- A. The time for appearance specified in a citation shall be within a reasonable time after the citation is issued.
- B. The place for appearance specified in a citation shall be the District Court that has jurisdiction over Argentine Township.
- C. Each citation shall be numbered consecutively and shall be in a form approved by the state court administrator. The original citation shall be filed with the District Court. Copies of the citation shall be retained by the township and issued to the alleged violator as provided by Section 8705 of the Act.
- D. A citation for a municipal civil infraction signed by an authorized township official shall be treated as made under oath if the violation alleged in the citation occurred in the presence of the official signing the complaint and if the citation contained the following statement immediately above the date and signature to the official: "I declare under the penalties of perjury that the statements above are true to the best of my information, knowledge, and belief."
- E. An authorized township official who witnesses a person commit a municipal civil infraction shall prepare and subscribe, as soon as possible and as completely as possible, an original and required copies of a citation.
- F. An authorized township official may issue a citation to a person if:
 - Based upon investigation, the official has reasonable cause to believe that the person is responsible for a municipal civil infraction; or
 - Based upon investigation of a complaint by someone who allegedly witnessed the person commit a municipal civil infraction, the official has reasonable cause to believe that the person is responsible for an infraction and if the township attorney approves in writing the issuance of the citation.
- G. Municipal civil infraction citations shall be served by an authorized township official as follows:
 - Except as otherwise provided below, an authorized township official shall personally serve a copy of the citation upon the alleged violator.
 - ii) If the municipal civil infraction action involves the use or occupancy of land, a building or other structure, a copy of the citation does not need to be personally served upon the alleged violator, but may be served upon the owner or occupant of the land, building or structure by posting a copy on the land or attaching the copy to the building or structure, in addition, a copy of the citation shall be sent by first-class mail to the owner of the land, building or structure at the owner's last known address.

SECTION 5 – Municipal Civil Infraction Citations; Contents

- . A municipal ordinance citation shall contain the name and address of the alleged violator, the municipal civil infraction alleged, the place where the alleged violator shall appear in court, the telephone number of the court, and the time at or by which the appearance shall be made.
- B. Further, the citation shall inform the alleged violator that he or she may do one of the following:
 - Admit responsibility for the municipal civil infraction by mail, in person, or by representation, at or by the time specified for appearance.
 - ii) Admit responsibility for the municipal civil infraction "with

explanation" by mail by the time specified for appearance or, in person, or by representation.

- Deny responsibility for the municipal civil infraction by doing either of the following:
 - a) Appearing in person for an informal hearing before a judge or district court magistrate, without the opportunity of being represented by an attorney, unless a formal hearing before a judge is required by the township.
 - b) Appearing in court for a formal hearing before a judge, with the opportunity of being represented by an attorney.
- C. The citation shall also inform the alleged violator of all of the following:
 - That if the alleged violator desires to admit responsibility "with explanation" in person or by representation, the alleged violator must apply to the court in person, by mail, by telephone or by representation within the time specified for appearance, and obtain a scheduled date and time for an appearance.
 - ii) That if the alleged violator desires to deny responsibility, the alleged violator must apply to the court in person, by mail, by telephone or by representation within the time specified for appearance, and obtain a scheduled date and time to appear for a hearing, unless a hearing date is specified on the citation.
 - iii) That a hearing shall be an informal hearing unless a formal hearing is requested by the alleged violator or the township.
 - That at an informal hearing the alleged violator must appear in person before a judge or district court magistrate, without the opportunity of being represented by an attorney.
 - v) That at a formal hearing the alleged violator must appear in person before a judge with the opportunity of being represented by an attorney.
- D. The citation shall contain a notice in boldfaced type that the failure of the alleged violator to appear within the time specified in the citation or at the time scheduled for a hearing or appearance is a misdemeanor and will result in entry of a default judgment against the alleged violator on the municipal civil infraction.

SECTION 6 – General Penalties and Sanctions for Violations of Township Ordinance:

Continuing Violations: Injunctive Relief

- A. Unless a violation of an ordinance of the Argentine Township is specifically designated in the ordinance as a municipal civil infraction, the violation shall be deemed to be a criminal misdemeanor.
- B. The penalty for a misdemeanor violation shall be a fine not exceeding \$500.00 (plus costs of prosecution), or imprisonment not exceeding 93 days, or both, unless a specific penalty is otherwise provided for the violation by the ordinance involved.
- C. The sanction for a violation which is a municipal civil infraction shall be a civil fine in the amount as provided by the ordinances involved, plus any costs, damages, expenses and other sanctions, as authorized under Chapter 87 of Act No. 236 of the Public Acts of 1961, as amended, Public Acts 12-26 of 1994, as amended, and other applicable laws.
 - i) Unless otherwise specifically provided for a particular municipal civil infraction violation by an ordinance (or if the ordinance involved is silent, as set by the Township Board by resolution), the civil fine for a municipal civil infraction violation shall be not less than \$100.00, plus costs and other sanctions, for each infraction.
 - ii) Increased civil fines may be imposed for repeated violations by a person of any requirement or provision of an ordinance. As used in this Ordinance, "repeat offense" means a second (or any subsequent) municipal civil infraction violation of the same requirement or ordinance (i) committed by the same person for the same property within any twelve (12) month period (unless some other period is specifically provided by an Ordinance) and (ii) for which the person admits responsibility or is determined to be responsible. Unless otherwise specifically provided by an ordinance for a particular municipal civil infraction violation, the increased fine for a repeat offense shall be as follows:
 - a) The fine for any offense which is a first repeat offense shall be not less than \$100.00, plus costs.
 - b) The fine for any offense which is a second repeat offense or any subsequent repeat offense shall be not less than \$200.00, plus costs.
- D. A "violation" includes any act which is prohibited or made or declared to be unlawful or an offense by an ordinance, and any omission or failure

to act where the act is required by an ordinance.

- E. Each day on which any violation of an ordinance continues constitutes a separate offense and shall be subject to penalties or sanctions as a separate offense.
- In addition to any remedies available at law, the Township may bring F. an action for an injunction or other process against a person to restrain, prevent or abate any violation of any Township ordinance.

SECTION 7 – Authorized Persons—Civil Infraction Tickets

Unless prohibited by state law or unless otherwise provided by specific provisions of a particular Argentine Township ordinance to the contrary, the following officials are hereby designated as the authorized Township officials to issue and serve municipal civil infraction citations for violations of Township ordinance which provided for a municipal civil infraction for a violation thereof.

- The township building inspector
- A township police officer
- The township fire chief
- The township ordinance enforcement officer

SECTION 8 – Applicability Of The Act

If this Ordinance is silent as to given procedural requirements or in any way conflicts with the Act, the Act shall govern.

SECTION 9 – Severability

The various parts, sections and clauses of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable. If any part, sentence, paragraph, section or clause is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected thereby

SECTION 10 – Effective Date

This Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after its publication (publication of a summary thereof) in a newspaper in general circulation within Argentine Township.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CERTAIN SECTIONS OF THE **OMNIBUS NUISANCE ORDINANCE #35-E AND DESIGNATING CERTAIN SECTIONS AS HAVING**

VIOLATIONS DESIGNATED AS A MUNICIPAL CIVIL INFRACTION

The Township Of Argentine, Genesee County, Michigan Ordains that the below Argentine Township Omnibus Nuisance Ordinance shall be amended as follows:

Section IX – Begging or Panhandling – shall be amended by adding the wording indicated in Section 1 below.

Section XIII - Contractor Unlicensed -- shall be amended by adding the wording indicated in Section 1 below.

Section XVIII – Dogs shall be amended by adding section (D) to include the wording indicated in Section 1 below.

Section XXIX - Graffiti Removal -- shall be amended by adding the wording indicated in Section 2 below.

Section XXXV - Littering -- shall be amended by adding the wording indicated in Section 1 below.

Section LII -- Penalties shall be renumbered and now known as Section LIV.

New Section LII -- Parking, Stopping And Standing shall be added as follows:

- A) Definitions:
 - 1) Double Parking means parking a vehicle next to another legally or illegally parked vehicle in such a manner as to block or impede normal traffic flow.
 - 2) Parking means to stand an occupied or unoccupied vehicle for a period of time greater than necessary for the loading or unloading of persons or personal property.
- B) Double parking is prohibited on streets and roads accessible to the general public within the Township.
- X) Parking is prohibited in the following areas:
 - On sidewalks. 1)
 - Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant. 2)
 - Within ten (10) feet of any intersection. 3)
 - In any place that would block the use of a driveway. 4)
- Violations -- shall be amended by adding the wording indicated in Δ) Section 1 below.

Section LIII - Effective Date - shall be renumbered and now known as Section LV.

New Section LIII -- Qualifications Of Motor Vehicle Operators shall be added as follows:

- A) A person shall not operate a motor vehicle in the Township unless that person and vehicle meet the qualifications of the State of Michigan Motor Vehicle Code and Office of the Secretary of State.
- Violations -- shall be amended by adding the wording indicated in B) Section 1 below.

SECTION 1

The above ordinances shall be amended by adding the following as indicated above: "Violation of this ordinance is a municipal civil infraction. In addition to pursuing a municipal civil infraction proceeding, the Township may also institute an appropriate action in a court of competent jurisdiction seeking injunctive, declaratory, or other equitable relief to enforce or interpret this Ordinance or any provision of the Ordinance. All remedies available to the Township under this Ordinance and Michigan law shall be deemed to be cumulative and not exclusive. Each day a violation of this ordinance shall exist shall be deemed a separate offense. In addition to a fine to be determined by the township board, the court, at its discretion, may award other costs, attorney's fees, damages, expenses and other remedies as provided by law."

SECTION 2 -- Repealer

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this ordinance full force and effect.

SECTION 3 – Severability

Should any section, subdivision, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared by the courts to be invalid. The same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so invalidated.

SECTION 4 – Effective Date

This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon publication.







ARGENTINE TOWNSHIP GENESEE COUNTY, MICHIGAN ORDINANCE # 70

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR MUNICIPAL CIVIL INFRACTIONS VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES

The Township Board of the Township of Argentine hereby Ordains: SECTION 1

This Ordinance shall be known as the "Argentine Township Municipal Civil Infraction and Penalties Ordinance."

SECTION 2

- A. A violation of this Ordinance is a municipal civil infraction, for which the fine shall be not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$500.00 for the first offense and not less than \$100.00 nor more than \$2,500.00 for subsequent offenses, in the discretion of the Court, and such fine shall be in addition to all other costs, attorney fees, damages, expenses, and other remedies as provided by law. For purposes of this section, "subsequent offense" means a violation of the provisions of this Ordinance committed by the same person for the same property within twelve (12) months of a previous violation of the same provision of this Ordinance for which said person admitted responsibility or was adjudicated to be responsible, provided, however, that offenses committed on subsequent days within a period of one week following the issuance of a citation for a first offense shall all be considered separate first offenses.
 - In addition to pursuing a municipal civil infraction proceeding pursuant to subsection A hereof, the Township may also institute an appropriate action in a court of competent jurisdiction seeking injunctive, declaratory, or other equitable relief to enforce or interpret this Ordinance or any provision of the Ordinance.
- All remedies available to the Township under this Ordinance and Michigan law shall be deemed to be cumulative and not exclusive.
- Any use of land that is commenced or conducted, any activity, or any building, item or structure that is erected, moved, used, placed, reconstructed, razed, extended, enlarged, altered, maintained, or changed, in violation of any provision of this Ordinance is also hereby declared to be a nuisance per se.
- Each and every day during which a violation of this Ordinance shall exist shall be deemed to be a separate offense.
- Any person, firm or entity that assists with or enables the violation of this Ordinance shall be responsible for aiding and abetting, and shall be considered to have violated the provision of this Ordinance involved for which such aiding and abetting occurred. Furthermore, any attempt to violate this Ordinance shall be deemed a violation of the provision of this Ordinance involved as if the violation had been successful or completed.


