Michigan FALL COLORS

SEVERAL WEEKS BEHIND THIS YEAR



Michigan's warm, sunny autumn means fall color is waiting for colder evenings to stimulate pigments other than green.

■ Watch for peak color in northern Michigan closer to mid-to-late October

Summer may be slipping away degree by degree, but Michigan residents will soon be rewarded with a breathtaking show of fall foliage that would rival any fireworks display.

Now is the season for fall color tours, wine tours, hayrides, cider and doughnuts, all amidst a backdrop of spectacular Michigan color.

However, we'll have to wait

several weeks or more, as early autumn's warm and sunny temperatures have put this year's fall color behind schedule, according to puremichigan.com.

"If I had to guess, we're not even at 10 percent (trees changing color)," said Mary Carroll, president of the Benzie County Chamber of Commerce and Benzie County Visitor's Bureau. "Usually by now we're at 25 to 30 percent. I'd say peak color will be later in October."

ASK THE MECHANIC

Q: My PCV valve rattles loudly while engine is at idle. I've replaced it three times. What could be the problem?

- Aaron

A: Aaron, The first thing I ask is, are you using an OEM quality PCV valve (meaning A/C Delco or from the dealer)? We see a lot of aftermarket PCV valves cause problems. Next thing that comes to mind is to check the port where the PCV hose hooks to the engine. Make sure it is clear and getting full vacuum. Other than these items, try a good cleaning of the throttle bore and check the timing if it is adjustable.

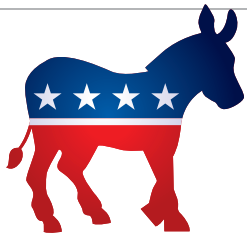

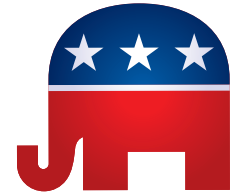

Palin did better than people expected, and Biden did not insult her.

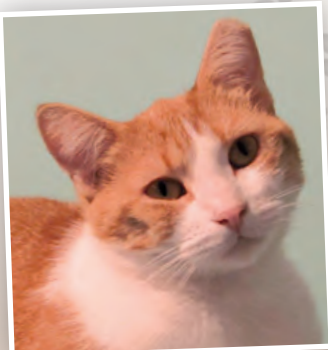

House Bill 4282: Exempt small-project home repair contractors from licensure mandates

To exempt individuals who do residential repair and rehab jobs worth less than \$4,000 from licensure mandates imposed

on contractors.

House Bill 5469: Extend open records law to legislature

To extend the Freedom of Information Act to legislators, whose offices are currently exempt, subject to a broad range of exceptions and exemptions. The House also passed House Bill 5477, which extends the disclosure requirements to certain kinds of documents held by the governor's office.

House Bill 5475: Exceptions to applying open records law to legislature

To define the records that would be exempt from Freedom of Information Act requests to the state legislature under House Bill 5469. These include standard provisions on records dealing with security matters, active contract bidding, information of a personal nature or business proprietary records, records that violate attorney-client privilege or involve ongoing litigation, etc. The bill would also exempt records of exchanges between a lawmaker and a constituent. Notably, records held by the Republican and Democratic caucus staffs also would be exempt, including their communications and public relations operations.

House Bill 4822: Ban social promotions for third-graders who can't read

To prohibit "social promotions" of third-graders who have not reached minimum reading benchmarks starting in the 2019-2020 school year, subject to many conditions and exceptions, and with requirements that additional interventions and tutoring be tried before a student is actually held back. This final version of the bill allows

a school district superintendent to make an exception but not teachers or principals, and only if the student is proficient in other subjects.

House Bill 5826: Ban government suing person who submits open records law request

To prohibit public bodies from suing a person or entity making document requests authorized by the state Freedom of Information Act.

House Bill 5651: Let new port authorities give private company partnership status

To permit a government port authority to grant partnership status to a private business or developer, which would permit them to operate and collect revenue from the facility. New port authorities would not get half their expenses paid by the state like existing ones, but would be able to keep any annual profits rather than turning them over to the local and state government.

House Bill 4580: Require "claw back" provisions in some selective tax break deals

To require that starting in 2017 local governments and a state "Next Michigan Development Corporation" must include "claw back" provisions in new tax break deals they selectively grant to particular corporations or developers, allowing foregone taxes to be demanded if the beneficiary does not abide by the terms of the tax break agreement. This applies to property taxes levied on business tools and equipment ("personal property tax").

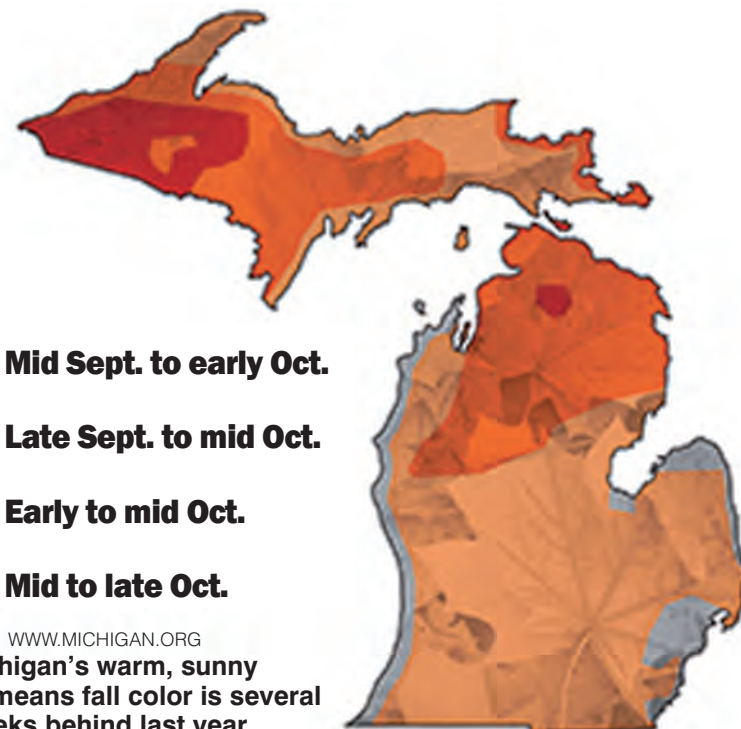

Pops of fall color are just beginning to advance across the Upper Peninsula, but the latest fall color updates show that real peak color even in the U.P. is still about a week away.

If you're planning a trip past the Mackinac Bridge, you'll find peak color the weekend of Oct. 8-9, with late season peak color the following weekend, Oct. 15-16. You can treat yourself to fall chairlift rides at Porcupine Mountains Ski Area, which runs the lifts each Saturday and Sunday from 12 to 7 p.m. through the first three weeks of October, according to www.newsupnorth.com/fall/.

Colder nights with temperatures in the 30s and 40s will help get the color show started throughout the rest of Michigan. This colder air will shut down the green-producing chlorophyll in the leaves, allowing the underlying color pigments to show through.

These deep reds, bright oranges and sunny yellows will provide a majestic contrast to the beautiful blue waters of Michigan's Great Lakes, inland lakes and flowing rivers. Then later in the fall, as temperatures continue to drop, trees will shed their leaves to allow the tree to save as much water as possible to survive winter.

You'll find fall color throughout Michigan for about a month, but many people do enjoy heading north to catch the show a little early. "Every Saturday in October, you can ride the chairlift at Crystal Mountain Ski Resort for \$7 a person," said Carroll. "Even if the color isn't at peak when you come, there's still plenty to do. There's something going on in Frankfort every weekend."

One popular Michigan destination, Traverse City, has been named one of America's Top 10 Fall Foliage Destinations, honored among such well-known

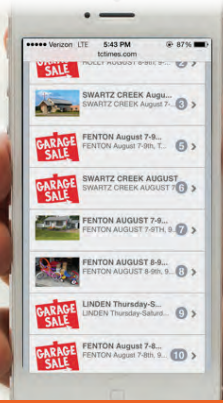

Friend’s elder assessment not well received

DEAR AMY:

When my late father was ill, I always appreciated hearing comments from friends who visited Dad, since I didn’t live with him. It helped me adjust the level of care and change what I did for him. I’ve had two occasions where I have noticed some concerning things about the parents of two of my friends. I shared my observations with these friends, and neither received it very well. Mostly they were shocked to find out their parents were exhibiting odd behavior or had such strong dementia they could be a driving hazard. I truly felt that I was helping the greater good by mentioning to their families what I had noticed, or been told, or experienced. I think something had to be said. I was kind and factual. One friend has completely stopped speaking to me, and the second one decidedly cooled our long friendship. In the future, I honestly don’t know what to do. — Concerned in CA

DEAR CONCERNED:


You mention passing along things you “had noticed, or been told, or experienced.” There is a big difference between reporting something you have personally observed, versus something you have been told. In the first case, you are a first-person witness. In the second, you are a gossip. You should re-examine how you are delivering this news. Being kind and factual is great. But you should start by preparing the person for the news by demonstrating that you understand how challenging it can be to receive it. For example:

“When my father was becoming more frail, I really appreciated learning what other people observed when they saw him. Sometimes it was hard, because I wasn’t there to see for myself. I just visited with your dad and noticed some things. Do you want me to share this with you?” The person may not be prepared in that moment to talk about it, but might later. Offer assurances: “I just want you to know, I’ve been there. I know it’s hard.”

Heart disease can have few or no symptoms

DEAR DR. ROACH:

I recently went to my family doctor, complaining of left-arm pain and heartburn-like pain in my throat area. He said that he could admit me to the hospital for two days of testing or that it could be a pinched nerve in my neck. It was my choice not to go to the hospital, so he recommended meloxicam for a possible pinched nerve. As it turns out, my symptoms later became so uncomfortable that I decided to go to the ER three days after seeing my doctor. It was a serious blockage of a main artery to my heart, and emergency surgery was performed to put a stent in. I am lucky to have made it in time. I realize that it was my decision to not be admitted — I guess I was in denial. I never thought to ask him if he could have given me an electrocardiogram there in his office, and some people, including my intensive-care nurse, asked why he didn’t. Because he didn’t offer to test me in his office, I am considering changing doctors. I like him and he has always given me good care in the past, so I’m not sure what to do. I feel that had he done the ECG that day, my problem could have been diagnosed much sooner and possibly prevented my heart attack. Why wouldn’t he have checked my heart function right there with the electrocardiogram? He did check my blood pressure and listened to my heart, but those seemed to be normal. Can you give me your opinion on this? I am a 64-year-old male. — F.M.

ANSWER:

Without being there, I can’t give an opinion on whether your doctor should have insisted on your being admitted to the hospital, but I am printing your letter to once again emphasize that heart disease, even serious blockages, can have minimal or no symptoms. It sounds like your doctor did suspect heart disease, and I bet he now regrets not insisting that you be admitted. It’s a judgment call, and you have to consider not only the symptoms, but also the risk factors. Just being a 64-year-old man is a risk factor; if you had other risks, such as elevated blood pressure, cholesterol, a history of smoking or a family history of heart disease, that would make heart disease more likely. The electrocardiogram is not a perfect test, and although it might have been abnormal at the time, it also is possible that it could have been perfectly normal. In hindsight, I wonder if your knowing your EKG was normal would have kept you from going to the emergency room when you did. To me, this isn’t so egregious that I would suggest you find a different doctor, but only you can decide whether you still have confidence in him. READERS: Heart disease remains the No. 1 killer. The booklet on clogged heart arteries explains why they happen and what can be done to prevent clogging. Chocolate Almond Breakfast Cookies

- INGREDIENTS
- 1 cup whole raw unsalted almonds
 - 1 1/2 cups old-fashioned rolled oats
 - 1/3 cup whole wheat flour
 - 1/2 cup ground flax seed
 - 1 teaspoon baking soda
 - 1/2 teaspoon salt
 - 1 1/2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
 - 1/2 cup almond butter
 - 1/3 cup coconut oil, melted
 - 1/3 cup honey
 - 1/3 cup light brown sugar
 - 2 eggs
 - 2 teaspoons pure vanilla extract
 - 1/2 cup unsweetened shredded coconut
 - 1/2 cup sliced almonds
 - 1 cup dark chocolate chips

Chocolate Almond Breakfast Cookies are loaded with dark chocolate chips, almonds and coconut. They also contain some better-for-you cookie ingredients like whole wheat flour, natural almond butter and flaxseed meal. Sugar can be lessened and substituted with a bit of honey.

DIRECTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees F. Line baking sheets with parchment paper.
2. Add almonds to a food processor bowl and pulse until the almonds are ground into almond flour.
3. In a medium bowl, mix the ground almonds, rolled oats, whole wheat flour, flax meal, baking soda, salt, and cinnamon until thoroughly combined.
4. In a large bowl with an electric mixer, combine the almond butter, coconut oil, honey, brown sugar, eggs, and vanilla extract until well combined.
5. Add the dry ingredients to the wet ingredients and mix until just combined.
6. Stir in the coconut, sliced almonds and dark chocolate chips.
7. Use a medium cookie scoop (about 1 1/2 tablespoons) to scoop the dough onto prepared baking sheets, about 2 inches apart.
8. Bake in the preheated oven from 8-9 minutes, or until golden brown.
9. The cookies do not flatten much while baking, so you can use a spatula to flatten them out a bit if you want a flatter cookie.
10. Allow the cookies to cool on the pans for about 5 minutes before removing them to a wire rack to cool completely.
