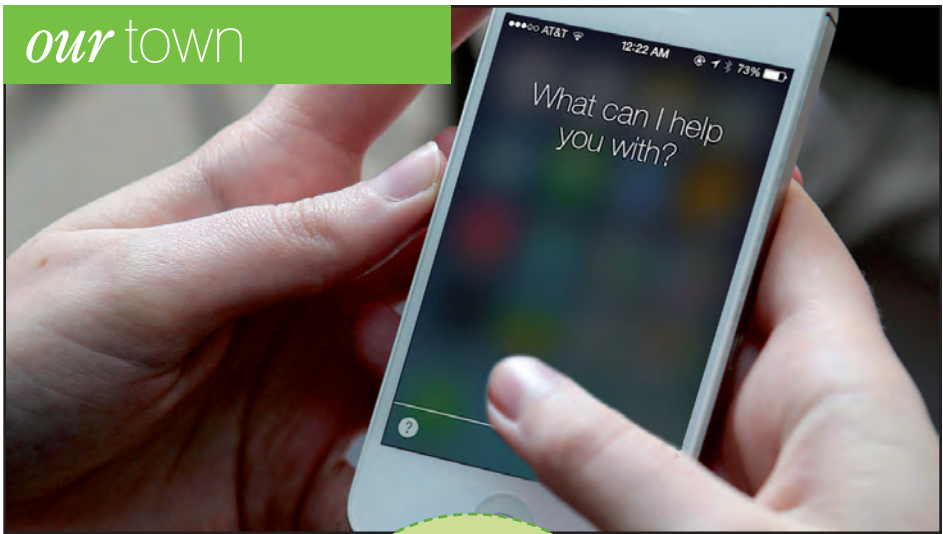

10. Jaws

Horror doesn't always mean creepy murderers who stalk teenagers. Anticipation can be just as terrifying and nail-biting, which is why the poll found that "Jaws" (1975) made the list. Even though the tale of a killer Great White shark terrorizing the people of Amity Island came out over 40 years ago, it's still known as a classic in the genre.



9. Night of the Living Dead

Zombies may be popular now, but they were terrifying in 1968 when "Night of the Living Dead" came out. A group of people get trapped inside a farmhouse and try to survive a zombie attack.

8. Psycho

Bates Motel has become a cultural icon just as much as "Psycho" (1960) has become a classic in the horror genre. A few memorable moments include the shower scene and Norman Bates' other life.

7. Halloween

One movie that influenced the archetype of a stalking murderer is "Halloween" (1978), when a psychotic murderer, who was institutionalized since childhood for the murder of his sister, escapes and stalks a teenage girl.

6. The Thing

This movie, which came out in 1982, inspired fear in viewers because it carried the message "don't trust anyone." Set in the Antarctic, scientists have to deal with a shapeshifting alien that takes the appearance of people it killed.

5. Alien

One of the few the science-fiction movies on the list is still popular today. This 1979 movie features a spaceship crew discovering thousands of eggs on a planet. One hatches and attacks an explorer.

4. Rosemary's Baby

Also along the lines of "don't trust anyone," "Rosemary's Baby" (1968), shows a young couple moving into a popular New York apartment building to have a baby and start a family. Terror ensues as Rosemary suspects her neighbors aren't safe people.

3. The Texas Chain Saw Massacre

The fear is brought out in full with this 1974 film, where five friends visit a house in the country. A man, who's part of a family of grave-robbing cannibals, wields a chainsaw while hunting and terrorizing them.

2. The Shining

This film made people wary of creepy hotels in 1980. A family moves to a hotel for the winter, isolating themselves from the world.

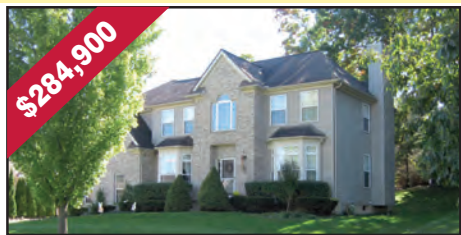

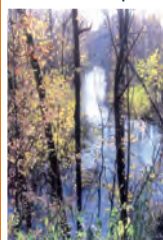

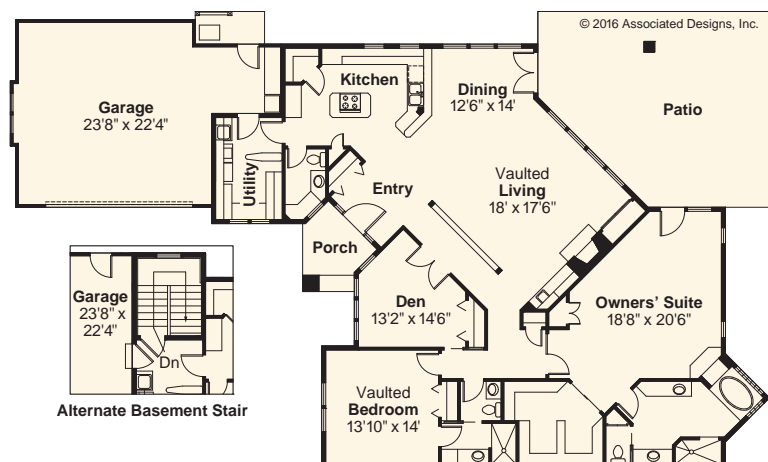

She's the voice on one billion iPhones

■ Siri's answers are informative, sarcastic and even mysterious

Susan Bennett is probably not a name you would recognize, however, you might recognize her voice. Bennett is the voice of Siri, which iPhone users have been listening to since 2007.

Bennett, 67, originally of New York, began her voice-over career in the 1970s and her voice was heard often in the early 2000s on radio and TV. She began doing-text-to speech voices in 2005. Her calm, soothing voice was easy to listen to and she eventually ended up being the voice of Siri.

Originally, she spoke sentences and phrases as Siri to create every combination of vowels. These sounds were captured and through the latest technology, could be manipulated to say anything.

The one billion owners of iPhones worldwide can ask Siri any question, including if it will rain near them, direc-

tions to a particular restaurant, or even personal questions about Siri. Although Siri will provide facts and directions, she is likely to stay mum on facts about herself. It's apparent that she likes to remain a mystery.

According to forbes.com, Siri's name was a culmination of the iPhone team who created the technology. They wanted something that was easy to remember, short to type, comfortable to pronounce, and a not-too-common human name. And they wanted to be able to get the domain name for not too much money.

Dag Kittlaus, their Norwegian-American CEO, once considered using Siri as the name of his child and liked the Norse meaning "beautiful woman who leads you to victory."

For Adam Cheyer, co-founder of Siri, he said, Siri, which means "secret" in Swahili, was a tip of the hat to their pre-named days when they began as stealth-company.com. He also liked the fact that it was the reverse of Iris, a software system he helped build as part of the CALO project which Siri spun from.

Cooled Thermotherapy is prostate option

DEAR DR. ROACH:
What's your opinion on cooled thermotherapy for benign enlargement of the prostate? I recently was put on Flomax and finasteride, and was given the option of having this procedure to eliminate taking these two drugs. My urologist has had great success, while my internist says the success rate is only 60 percent. My internist did say it's great if it works.
— S.V.

ANSWER:
Benign enlargement of the prostate is very common in older men, and medications like tamsulosin (Flomax) and finasteride (Proscar) often are used, and are pretty effective in most men. The most effective treatment remains surgery, called transurethral resection of the prostate, TURP, which reduces symptoms by at least half in 98 percent of men.

Unfortunately, TURP causes side effects in at least 20 percent of men, so there are several procedures designed to try to get the benefit of surgery without the drawbacks. Cooled thermotherapy is a procedure using a microwave device to reduce prostate tissue. It isn't as effective as TURP: Only 72 percent of men reduce their symptoms by half or more; however, it has reduced side effects, such as need for blood transfusion. Unfortunately, there were more symptoms of uncomfortable urination, urgency and need for a catheter after surgery. I think both of your doctors are right: Some men have good experiences, but not everyone will get relief. Some serious side effects are better with thermotherapy, and others are worse. You need to decide how much taking the medications bothers you and if you can live with the symptoms the way they are.
