It doesn't matter how young or old they are, the public library has always held a special place in the hearts of most Americans. Libraries today are much more than just a place to take out a book or two.

Genesee County

"Families should take advantage of their local libraries because they can save big money," said Kelly Flynn, community relations manager for Genesee District Library (GDL).

"Rather than pay for a Netflix subscription, or rent movies from Red Box or Family Video, they can visit their local library, check out 10 videos at once, and keep them for a full week," she said. "We have movies in every genre, and the selection is current."

"Instead of buying music on iTunes, use your library card to log on to Freegal, and download and keep five free songs each week," Flynn added. Also with Freegal you can stream music free, 24/7, with no advertisements.

"Rather than pay the newsstand price of a magazine — upwards of \$5, use your device to read all of your favorite magazines online using our magazine service, Zinio," said Flynn. "You can also download eBooks for free. And the great thing about that is when they are due they simply expire — so no overdue book fees," she added.

Fenton's Jack R. Winegarden Library

"The Fenton-Winegarden Library has a state-of-the-art 3-D printer, so they are offering a 3-D printer demonstration on Nov. 12 at 2 p.m., TinkerCad for Kids on Nov. 14 at 4 p.m., and TinkerCad for adults on Nov. 15 at 6 p.m.," said Flynn.

"They are also hosting a Harry Potter Trivia and Crafts

program on Nov. 12 at 11 a.m.

"We have fabulous free family programming at GDL, including concerts, authors, computer classes, genealogy, magic shows, yoga, animal programs, educational talks, story times, crafts — the list is long and varied," said Flynn.

"If you're looking for something to do, visit thegdl.org, go to the Calendar of Events, and look around. There's something for everyone," she said.

Linden Library

At the Linden Library, housed in the Linden Mill building, library cardholders can check out any of the 23,000 items available, according to Branch Librarian John Ekleberry.

"So far this month the library has had an average of 120 visitors per day, with Mondays typically being our busiest day of the week," he said.

Books range from fiction and nonfiction, to manga and graphic novels, to magazines and newspapers.

Oakland County Regional Transit Authority of Southeast Michigan

This is a proposal authorizing the Regional Transit Authority of Southeast Michigan (RTA) to levy an assessment. The proposal would authorize the Regional Transit Authority of Southeast Michigan (RTA) to levy within Macomb, Oakland, Washtenaw, and Wayne counties a property tax assessment at a rate of 1.2 mills (\$1.20 per \$1,000 of taxable value) for 20 years beginning in 2016 and ending in 2035. It may not be increased, renewed, or used for other purposes without direct voter approval, and to be used upon the affirmative vote of an RTA board member from each RTA member jurisdiction for the purpose of construction and operation of a public transportation system connecting Macomb, Oakland, Washtenaw, and Wayne counties.

If approved, this will include rapid transit bus routes across county lines, specialized service for senior citizens and people with disabilities, commuter rail, airport express service, and other public transportation purposes permitted by law, consistent with RTA bylaws and subject to the limitations of the Regional Transit Authority Act. If this new additional assessment is approved and levied, revenue will be disbursed to the RTA. It is estimated that \$160,907,285 will be collected in the first year.

Q: I have a 1994 Pontiac Firebird w/88,000 miles. The front end has not sounded tight or reliable since I bought it. I recently merged onto the freeway and felt a snap in front end. It made a REALLY loud clunking noise, so I stopped it ASAP. I noticed it did not make this noise in reverse. Any ideas? It is now undrivable until I get it towed.

A: Trenna, I would recommend that you have it towed to a repair shop and looked at. Anytime that you are dealing with a steering or suspension noise like this, it could be serious. It could cause you to lose control of the vehicle by not being able to steer it properly causing an accident or injury.

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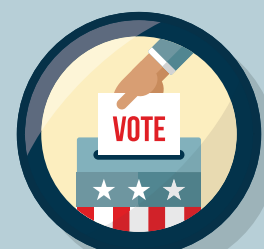

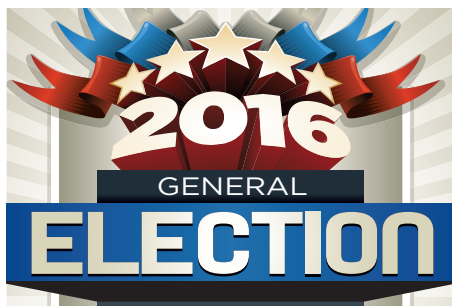

Woods and Lee Child are very popular. Mysteries and thrillers are the most popular genres with adults, while kids tend to check out humor, fantasy and scary stories. Beginning reader titles and children's nonfiction are also well used at Linden," Ekleberry said.

Their DVD selection includes feature films, television series, documentaries, and children's movies. Ekleberry said new DVDs come in every Thursday and are "swiftly checked out."

Cardholders can also check out any of the thousands of e-books, audiobooks or magazines that can be downloaded onto a phone, tablet, or computer. People can also download music and use online databases like Consumer Reports, ancestry genealogy, and many more, Ekleberry said.

Storytime at the Linden Library resumes in January on Tuesdays at 10:30 a.m., Ekleberry said, and all 19 Genesee County District Libraries offer programs for children and adults.

Holly Township Library

You don't even have to take a book off the shelf to find something to like at the Holly Township Library. With more than 10,000 titles available in their Overdrive e-collection of audio books and digital books, you can enjoy all the benefits of reading from the comfort of your own home.

Audio books are some of the most popular media available from the library. "They're a nice alternative for adults on the road or kids on car trips," said Kate Scheid, librarian. "When kids are reluctant readers, an audio book can be helpful way to engage them in a book."

Films can also be downloaded on Overdrive, she added.

If you do enjoy browsing the shelves for your favorite author, Holly Township Library has 43,855 titles to choose from, in kids, teens and adult fiction and nonfiction categories. "We participate in MeLCAT, Michigan's e-library, so we can have any title shipped anywhere from the state, right here for you to pick up," said Scheid.

The library hosts three story hours a week, one every Wednesday at 10 a.m. for infants from birth to age 3, and on Thursday and Friday at 10 a.m. for preschoolers age 3 to 5.

On the second Tuesday of each month, there's a S.T.E.A.M. (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Math) program related to books for kindergarten through third grade students from 4:15 to 5:30 p.m.

A Book Club is open to all on the last Wednesday of the month, at 10 a.m.

One-time programs fill in many upcoming dates. "Right now, we're having a pumpkin painting contest and we just recently had a ghost hunter come in for a talk," said Scheid. "He's the one who had investigated the Holly Hotel."

Other dates include Nov. 7-8, when kids can stop in and make cards for Veterans Day, in time to be delivered to local veterans. Kids from kindergarten through fifth-grade can play Book Bingo on Nov. 22 from 5 to 6 p.m., just before the Thanksgiving holiday.

Adults enjoy many programs, too, including "Essential oils" on Nov. 12 at 1 p.m. and "Data breaches — how to use your debit card safely online" on Nov. 30 from 1:30 to 2:30 p.m.

The Holly Township Library remains a place to go to find a book, meet with friends or learn something new. "We'll have between 100 and 300 visitors to the library on any given day," said Scheid.

Do we still Dewey?

At a time when libraries have become "media centers" and card catalogs have been replaced with computers, it seems somewhat strange that the 19th-century Dewey decimal system should retain its hold on the stacks.

Does GDL still use the Dewey Decimal system? "Yes, Dewey is unsurpassed as a means of organizing books so they can be easily found," said Kelly Flynn, community relations manager for Genesee District Library (GDL).

The Dewey Decimal Classification (DDC), or Dewey Decimal System, is a proprietary library classification system first published in the United States by Melvil Dewey in 1876.
