LINDEN MAN TAKES A GAMBLE WITH

CASINO LIFE

Jesse Mason goes from poker player to poker
dealer and 'room supervisor' at Bellagio Las Vegas

Jesse Mason knew it was a gamble when he moved from Linden to Las Vegas to play poker, but it has become a win-win career for him in the crazy high stakes world of casinos.

An avid poker player since the poker boom in the early 2000s, Mason, 30, left for Las Vegas in 2014 to try his hand out there. Meanwhile back home, the state of Michigan shut down charity poker rooms, where Mason had played professionally in Flint and Fenton.

That's when he decided to make his living in Las Vegas, moving from poker dealer

at several prominent casinos to the prestigious job of supervising the highest cash game in the city at Bobby's Room at Bellagio Hotel and Casino.

"I knew good people in the industry," said Mason. "I started dealing and supervising. Last summer, I got the job at Bellagio, seating players, explaining and enforcing the rules."

Named after Bobby Baldwin, the 1978 World Series of Poker Champion, Bobby's Room is where pros and high rollers from around the world play their high-stake hands.

He said the most interesting part of that job was dealing to really big professionals, some who are famous celebrities.

"I've dealt to (actor) James Woods, professional poker player Phil Ivey

(regarded as best all-around poker player in the world), Charlie Hunnam, who plays Jax Teller on 'Sons of Anarchy,'" said Mason. "It's exciting, but you realize they're people just like everybody else."

Mason just recently made his biggest casino career move yet, hired to open MGM National Harbor Casino in Oxon Hill, Maryland, just outside Washington, D.C. He has been living nearby for the past month, taking care of gaming licenses.

"The casino will be opening in December," said Mason. "I'll be going back to being a poker dealer."

While he misses the friends he made in Las Vegas and the 24-hour lifestyle, he doesn't miss the "graveyard shift" of 3 to 11 a.m. "There's poker around the clock," he said.

He's also going back to dealing poker, which is what he loves to do. This new job will come with a benefits package, which he didn't have before.

"Poker is the only beatable game in the casino," said Mason. "I love the different variables. It's always changing. Sooner or later, something will come up you've never seen before."

Mason said he also uses his math skills. "Math was always my favorite subject in school. There's a mathematical equation for every deal."

He adds that the best strategy in poker is patience. "Patience to wait for the right cards, for the opportunity for the other person to make mistakes."



ASK THE MECHANIC

Q: I have a '84 S10 1/2 ton 2wd pickup 350 with the 350 tranny. It won't shift unless above 2500 rpms, but closer to 3000. It normally shifts by 2000 rpms at about 15 mph but now it won't shift until 35 mph which is a little much. Also, if I go wide open throttle it acts as if I was in neutral until I use a little gas, then it will accelerate again. It down shifts perfect but when shifting up it has to be high rpms. When it does shift, it is a smooth shift. - Jason

A: Jason, The first thing that you need to look at is the vacuum modulator on the rear of the transmission. It has a vacuum hose going to it and when you pull the hose off, make sure it does not have any transmission oil in it. Also make sure that it is getting vacuum when the engine is running.

Next thing to check is the governor valve, which is located on the side of the transmission under a small round metal cover. You will need to take the cover off, then the governor will pull out. Next, hold it up and clean it with brake cleaner and shop air while moving the small metal wings on the side in and out. Also make sure the valve in the center moves freely while you are doing this.

Pennsylvania native Greg Durkac, 53, has traveled to places like Iraq, Egypt, South America and many other places while on active duty in the U.S. Army. He joined the armed forces at age 18 as a private, and retired as a colonel after a 35-year career. He started his new position as Linden Community Schools athletic director in July. His wife, Kristine, is a math intervention teacher at Hyatt Elementary, and his daughter, Brooke, is in seventh grade at Linden Middle School while his son, Garrett, is a sophomore at the high school.

How did you come to have this job?

I retired from the Army after 35 years. We've been in Linden for the last 11 years. This has been our eighth move while I was in the military. We traveled around quite bit. The opportunity presented itself here. I applied for the position and then I went ahead and submitted my retirement paperwork.

That's a big change.

It is. I'm home more. This is a great community. For all the times that I traveled and was deployed, the teachers, the parents, the families, everyone in this community was phenomenal. When my daughter was born, I was in the Middle East. We don't have any family here in Michigan. When my wife was pregnant with my daughter it was all the folks around the community that helped out.

I can't say enough great things about the administration and the teachers and how wonderful they are. Hopefully, I can give back to the same district that took care of my family.

How does this job compare to being in the military?

Actually, the similarities are amazing. It's chaos. It's a very dynamic environment. Being in the military and leading soldiers in different environments, and training different soldiers, it's very similar. You have coaches who are training our kids for that particular sport. You're worried about their welfare, their academics, and life lessons that they learn over the years.

I told the teachers a couple stories about how our teachers and the leadership in our district have an impact on the kids that go out into the world. I would ask them (the kids), why did you choose the military? Who was influential in your life that helped you get to this level? Nine times out of 10, they would say 'my coach,' 'my teacher,' 'my counselor,' 'my principal.' It always led back to the school districts.

Did you play sports when you were in school?

I played football. I had an opportunity while I was overseas to play it at the next level. It was a German-American league. I've been

an infantry officer my entire career so everything I've done in the infantry is very similar to sports, all the different training that I went through.

What's your favorite sport to play?

Football.

Do you have a favorite to watch?

I absolutely love watching volleyball.

The intensity, the fast paced game, and the teamwork. Tomorrow night (Thursday, Nov. 3) we'll be playing Fenton in the districts. I coach football here. I'm the line coach for varsity.

What are your goals for this year?

To learn the job as fast as I can. The coaches have been wonderful. My goal is to be there for the coaches, be supportive, not let them down, and try to stay one step ahead of them, which is tough. Then try to develop a strategic plan for the future.

We're truly trying to give the best programs for our kids. We want to be competitive, we want our kids to focus on academics, on their sports, and we want them to get some life lessons out of it. Carol (Dolata, athletics secretary) is a blessing.

Do you have any hobbies?

I love to work. It's what I do. I love being here.

Did you watch the University of Michigan v Michigan State University game?

I'll still go to the game in a Penn State shirt. I truly love the rivalry. I was rooting for Michigan State. I'm actually going down to U of M tomorrow because I sit on a panel for veterans. We're doing a panel to talk about soldiers who are struggling with PTSD and other issues from the war.

What's something not a lot of people know about you?

I like to cook. I was raised by my grandmother a lot growing up, and she used to cook a lot. My dad liked to cook. It's kind of a hobby between my brother and me. The other night I pulled out my grandma's cookbook and made banana bread.





Don't lead with, "I'm falling in love with you," but do say, "I really enjoy hanging out with you." I think that generally, women tend to be very proactive if they're romantically interested.

Sneezing when eating? It's fairly common

DEAR DR. ROACH: All of us look forward to eating. However, in my case (age 79) it has become a chore. Whether it is breakfast, lunch, dinner or a few snacks, after the first few bites I have to blow my nose. This goes on throughout the eating period, and at the end, my handkerchief is soaked. At breakfast time, after eating, I proceed to sneeze five to 10 times, most of the time. I have become a recluse. I turn down invitations to dinners at homes and restaurants, as it has become an embarrassment. I have taken Toprol and Timoptic in the past 20 years, but this condition has occurred only in the past four or five years, so I don't think it's the drugs. During the day, I am fine with no sneezing and blowing my nose, except maybe once or twice. But when mealtime comes, out comes the handkerchief for another onslaught. Have you heard of this condition? Should I consult a specialist about it? — D.Z.

Your regular doctor should be able to help you. If non-medication treatments like nasal saline irrigation haven't helped, then I usually prescribe ip-ratropium bromide nasal spray before eating.

DEAR DR. ROACH: I am in good general health. My problem is not being able to drink enough water to quench my thirst, especially in warm weather. If I drink more than 25 ounces per day, my stomach becomes upset. In warm weather, I have to balance my fluid intake between dehydration and an upset stomach. I am not diabetic. Is there a solution? — E.K.

ANSWER: A sensation of feeling bloated after fluid intake is not uncommon among athletes during competitions. I have heard many possible treatments. These include sipping fluids slowly over time; however, some people seem to find relief by gulping fluids down in large amounts, the theory being that distending the stomach stimulates it to contract and send the fluid into the intestines to be absorbed. Having some food with the fluid helps many people, especially starchy foods (like cereals or crackers) to absorb lots of water. Tepid water may be more easily absorbed than ice-cold water. If none of these works, you might try adding a little fruit juice and very little salt to your water, which should reduce the stomach upset.
