



What you may not know about white-tailed deer



- A WHITE-TAILED DEER uses its tail to communicate with other deer. If a deer senses danger, it will raise its tail as well as stomp the ground and snort by blow-
- A DEER'S COAT will change from reddish brown in the summer to grayish brown in the winter to help the deer stay in camouflage all year long.

ing air through its nostrils.

- **THE DEER'S EYES**, which are located on the side of its head, give it 310 degrees of vision without moving its head. However this position of the eyes also makes it hard for a deer to focus on objects.
- A BUCK WILL use its antlers to establish dominance over other male deer and the right to mate with female deer or does.
- **GLANDS ON THE** deer's legs and feet leave a scent on the trail to help communicate with other deer.



• A DEER'S POWERFUL legs allow it to run at speeds of up to 40 miles per hour and jump fences up to 9 feet tall. A deer at a full run can broad jump 30 feet.

• **DEER ARE POWERFUL** swimmers and will often swim to cross bodies of water. A deer can swim at up to 13 miles per hour.

• A FULL GROWN deer will measure around 3 feet tall from the ground to the top of the back. A full grown white tail can weigh 200 plus pounds.

• DEER AGE

can be determined by checking its teeth. Deer have baby teeth just like people and lose their baby teeth by 18 months old.

called a buck rub. Once a deer
establishes a territory it will not leave
it unless it is bumped out by humans or

• WHEN FREE OF predators and hunting pressure, deer can double in population every year. Just two deer when left alone can produce up to 35 deer in just seven years.

• **DEER CAN LIVE** up to 11 years in the wild. If they don't fall victim to a predator or hunter at this age their teeth start to wear out and they can no longer eat.

- ONLY MALE DEER or bucks grow antlers. Deer are the only animals on the planet with antlers. Antlers are the fastest growing tissue on earth. A whitetail bucks antlers can grow up to 1/2 inch per day.
- THE SIZE, MASS and number of points on a buck's rack or antlers is determined by nutrition, age and genetics of the buck.



Linden man recalls 1967 train derailment

Floyd Staytheard about a train derailment in Linden on the radio early one winter day in February 1967, so the Flint resident and his son drove to see what happened.

"The roads were blocked and we couldn't get very far," the 87-year-old Stayt recently

recalled. "We parked the car and walked toward the track," said Stayt, who now resides at Caretel Inns of Linden with his wife. He is a retired General Motors engineer.

"I brought my camera with me, and took a few photos. That's about all I remember."

Stayt's scrapbook photos show how much damage can be done in a few moments, when tracks fail and train cars are involved. The westbound Grand Trunk Western Railroad freight was loaded with auto racks — open rail cars carrying several levels of new automobiles and trucks.

When the rail cars left the track just west of the Bridge Street crossing northwest of downtown Linden, these autos and trucks crashed to the ground and into each other, before anyone could ever drive them off a dealer's new car lot.

Total damage costs and other details are unknown today, 49 years later, but Stayt's grandson Dustin Jeffers of Linden shared these snapshots. He also published themona Grand

"All I remember is that it was quite a mess," Stayt said.

Background from one of Mark Rummel's train friends. Elba Steve:

A local high school student at the time was cruising with some friends

in their gold 1965 Chevy Biscayne, when they also heard on the radio of a train derailment in Linden, just west of downtown. They got there about 10 p.m. but couldn't get across Linden Road (Bridge Street) in Linden. It included some loaded auto racks, Elba Steve remembers.







Wife frustrated by husband's lack of steady work

My husband of 29 years has been

working as a contractor for the last nine years. His last stable position was in 2007. He finished two graduate degrees in the next couple of years, but that was when the economy had a downturn, and he never could find a job that would pay him adequately for what his degrees gave him the expertise to do. He's very diligent about applying and interviewing. When he does work, he makes

two to three times what I make, but only once in the last nine years has he worked all 12 months of the year. When he's not working he does all of the housework. He cooks. He's a wonderful husband and father. I'm just so resentful that he has four to six months off a year, and I don't know how to get over it. I'm sure it's no fun for him not to be working and to worry about how long he's been out of work. He recently took a position with a company that will sell in a year, so even this job will end abruptly. Since I can't depend on him to keep steady work, we've had to move out of our rental home after 11 years and into a mobile home. When we were talking the other night I told him that I'm always waiting for the other shoe to drop. He said that I was being nasty and that I say mean, horrible things to him all the time. I don't think I do. He always does his best and I've been supportive and very logical, but his income isn't steady. He doesn't appreciate that fact that I'm not big on working, but have always worked over 40 hours a week, year in and year out. But he doesn't understand that I'm in my 50s now and that I just feel this isn't what I signed up for. I wish we had money for counseling, but we have to save up what he earns, and he doesn't want to spend any extra when he could

be out of work in a few months. What to do? — Tired and Anxious



DEAR TIRED:

You say that your husband "always does his best," and yet you obviously don't think this is his best, because you also say you resent him for having "four to six months off each year." But — if your husband pulls in two or three times what you make when he's working, and does all the housework and cooking when he isn't working, then it seems that he really is pulling down an equal income and does more

housework, cooking and parenting than you do. There is no question that his work pattern is stressful for the entire household, but you seem to think that what you "signed up for" is a husband who should work harder outside the home than you do, and who should make more than you. In short, your assumptions are that your husband will basically support the family, while your income will be supplemental. You are the primary and steady breadwinner in your household. This might not be what you signed up for, but you should be proud of your own role, and perhaps more aware of how you cast your husband's relative success. You both sound responsible and successful. I hope you can find a way to give yourselves — and each other — a break.

DEAR AMY:

"Wondering" had lived through 30 years of an abusive marriage, and now her husband wants to reconcile. My husband did that, too. After every explosion and breakup, he wanted to get back together. I'm glad I finally got out, and I hope she stays out.

DEAR DR. ROACH:

My relative is a 69-year-old who has

smoked for 55 years. She has a terrible cough. I want her to cover her mouth with a hankie or tissue when she coughs. The coughing can go on for a few minutes. She insists that she is not sick, and that it's just allergies. I say she is spraying her sputum. and I might catch what she doesn't know she has. — S.B.

ANSWER:

You don't need to be

worrying about yourself. Although it is possible that she has pneumonia, most pneumonias are not transmitted from person to person, so the risk to others is low. You need to be worrying about your relative. With this degree of cough, it is very likely that she has chronic obstructive pulmonary disease.

What's worse, a small number of smokers


with a cough like this have lung cancer.

In all probability, she is fooling herself

that she has only allergies. She needs to

quit smoking, now, and also get evaluated. The booklet on COPD explains in detail

BUCKEYE BROWNIE COOKIES



1 box fudge brownie mix (19.5 ounce or family size) 1/4 cup butter, melted 4 oz. (1/2 block) cream cheese, softened 1 egg


cup powdered sugar 1 cup creamy peanut butter 4 blocks (about 4 ounces) chocolate Candiquik or your favorite chocolate

- 1. Heat oven to 350 degrees. In a medium bowl, beat the brownie mix, butter, cream cheese, and egg. The dough will be a little sticky. Scoop the dough onto an ungreased cookie sheet, making about 24 cookies. Smooth the edges of each to form a round cookie.
- 2. In a separate bowl, mix the powdered sugar and the peanut butter until it is completely combined. Form the mixture into about 1 inch balls. Make sure you have one ball for each cookie. Set aside.
- 3. Bake for the cookie dough 12 minutes, keeping an eye out to make sure the cookies doesn't overcook or undercook.
- 4. As soon as the cookies come out of the oven, press a peanut butter ball lightly into the center of each cookie. The peanut butter mixture will soften slightly, but that is OK. Let the cookies cool for 5 minutes, then transfer them to a wire rack to cool completely.
- 5. Melt the 4 blocks of chocolate in a microwavable bowl for 45 seconds. Stir the chocolate and melt for additional 15 seconds or until the chocolate is completely melted. (Candiquik comes in 16 ounce packages. When you open it, there are 16 blocks. Cut off 4 of these blocks for this recipe.) Spoon about 1/2 a tablespoon of melted chocolate on top of each cookie so it covers the peanut butter ball. Let the chocolate set. Store in an airtight container.
