Paris, France is the world's most popular tourist destination with about 45 million visitors each year, according to Touropia.com.

Also known as the City of Lights, the City of Love and Capital of Fashion, Paris is home to some of France's most visited landmarks — from the Eiffel Tower to the Arc de Triomphe, this historic region of Normandy, the Abbey at Mont Saint Michel, Notre Dame Cathedral, and the Louvre Museum.

You can linger over pain au chocolat in a sidewalk café, stroll along the Seine and marvel at landmarks like the Eiffel Tower that come to life in person. Sumptuous food, exquisite art, historic architecture, quaint villages, medieval castles, the Palace of Versailles, wine country of Bordeaux — there's no end to the beauty and bounty of a visit to France.

Thinking about Dad

During the month of January, I always think about my father, who was born on Jan. 4, 1930 and died on Jan. 16, 2010. My mother passed before him

I don't think I appreciated my father as much as I do today. I wish he was here so I could thank him.

When my two sisters and I were kids, we knew our parents didn't have a lot of money, but

we didn't know how little they really had until we were older. Yet, we always had nice clothes, including new clothes every school year, food on the table and a roof over our heads. That's



probably because my dad often worked two jobs, a full-time job during the day and part-time or side jobs at night. We grew up with a stay-at-home mom.

I believe the reason I don't have many health issues today is because of what I couldn't have when I was a kid. Since I didn't know what I was missing, it really was no big deal.

My mother cooked every meal from scratch. The meat came from the store, of course, but the vegetables came from the garden. In the winter, the vegetables came from the produce my parents canned in the fall. We never ate white bread. I think that's because my parents were German and they just preferred rye, from time to time.

My grade school lunches were nothing like they are today. We ate great meals — for \$1.25 a week. I'm not kidding, it cost my parents 25 cents a day each for us to eat a spaghetti dinner with salad, roll and dessert on Monday, meatloaf with mashed potatoes and gravy and green beans, and a little dessert on Tuesday, and so

it went through Friday. It was the same meal, every day of the week, and it was delicious. The food did not come from a food service. The mothers would take turns coming into the school every day to make meals from scratch.

When the girls in school reached eighth grade, it was a privilege to be released from class for two hours, on a rotating basis each month, to help serve the lunch to students and clean up the cafeteria afterward. The boys didn't get to do it. We didn't think it was discrimination, we thought it was because boys were too dumb to do it right. No foolin'!

There was only one fast-food chain at the time — McDonald's. When we would go places, and our parents took us everywhere, we would plaster our faces along the windows in the backseat searching for the "Golden Arches." When we spotted them, we would beg to stop and get a hamburger and fries. No Big Mac yet. Sometimes my dad stopped, and sometimes he didn't, so we never knew when it was going to happen and didn't expect it.

Aside from food, there was a lot of exercise, but not the kind of treacherous exercises found at the fitness center. We had a very large front, back and side yard at our house because we lived on the end. I used to literally beg my dad to mow the lawn. He would hem and haw and say I was too young, but then would give in and let me mow. By the time I was done my legs felt like they were going to fall off, but I didn't complain. I wanted to do it again. Raking a billion leaves and shoveling snow with dad also was a privilege and tons of fun.

I could go on all day about this, but suffice it to say that because we had nothing, we had everything — that is until we moved to the Chicago area after I graduated from eighth grade. That's when Dad started bringing home lots more money — and it all went uphill or downhill from there depending on how you look at it.

was written into the constitutions of 1946 and 1958 after the French Revolution from 1789-1799. It appears on coins, stamps, and government logos.



It's legal to marry a dead person in France. As long as the person can prove that the

deceased had the intent to marry while alive, they can receive permission from the French president.

Camouflage originated in France after the French Army was the first to use camouflage

in World War I in 1915. Guns and vehicles were painted by artists. The word "camouflage" comes from the French verb "to make up for the stage."



As of February 2016, France is the first country in the world to ban supermarkets from throwing away or

destroying unsold food. It must be donated to charity.



There are numerous indigenous regional dialects and languages in France, like Alsacian, Basque, Breton,

Catalan, Occitan, and Flemish. Approximately one million people near the Italian border speak Italian.



Due to the country's high birth rate, French is expected to become



the number one language spoken in Europe by 2025, unlike its number two status now. German is the most common, followed by French, then English.



The first public screening of a movie was in

France. Brothers Auguste and Louis Lumiere showed 10 films about 50 seconds each on Dec. 28, 1895. They predicted cinema did not have a future.



The correct order of dates in France is the day of the month first, then the month, then the year.

For example -15 January 2017.

The oldest human ever was a French woman. Jeanne Louise Calment was 122 years and

164 days old when she died Aug. 4 1997. She lived through the

opening of the Eiffel Tower in 1889, two world wars and the inventions of cars, TV, and planes.

- **Food** is to be enjoyed and savored. People linger over meals, especially in the evening. The French consume twice as much alcohol as Americans.
- The entire French culture appreciates **fine arts** and reveres their country as the birth place of many world-renowned artists.
- The French are more formal in day-to-day **etiquette** than Americans.
- Expect **kissing greetings** in social, friendly situations, up to four kisses on the cheek.
- The French are less inhibited than Americans about the **naked human body**, so you'll find bare bottoms, bare breasts on advertisements, television, etc.
- The French are more **politically active** than Americans, with an average 80 percent voter turnout.
- The French are more **fashionable** than Americans and tend not to wear jeans or sweats in public.
- The **stereotype** of the French being

unable to speak English is changing. Approximately 39 percent of the French population can speak English (more in the big cities), but many appreciate tourists in their country learning a few French words or phrases.

- · Sauces, cheeses, breads,
- **champagne** and **pastries** are just a few of the foods for which the French are famous. In addition, some of the world's best wines and cheeses come from France, including cheeses like Roquefort and Camembert de Normandie and wines like Chateau Rayas Blanc, Clos St. Hune and Beaujolais.
- Wines are paired with classic French dishes like Coq au vin, Beef bourguignon, Salad nicoise, Soupe a l'oignon, soufflés, to name a few.
- **Breads** are a staple at just about every meal, from sweets like eclairs, macarons and pain au chocolat from neighborhood patisseries to baguettes and croissants

served at lunch and dinner.

• **Baguettes** aren't served on their own side dish at meals, but are placed directly on the table at the upper right corner of the dinner plate.

LANGUAGE

• The French take their language very seriously. While most Parisians can understand basic English, they may or not acknowledge your questions, expecting that you will have made an effort to learn their language before coming to their country, even just a few words or phrases.

CURRENCY

French currency is the euro, and the exchange rate with the U.S. dollar was 1.059, on Jan. 10. While traveling in France, it's easiest to use international credit cards or debit cards. French ATMs accept most major debit cards, including Visa and Mastercard, while American Express isn't always accepted.







DEAR DR. ROACH:

I went in for an annual examination with my primary-care doctor, and she had my

blood tested at a laboratory. She told me that I have high potassium, 5.5, and had me retake it. I did, and the test came back with a much lower level of 4.3. What could have caused the level to go up so high? Was this due to eating a lot of avocado and yogurt? I was eating a whole avocado for breakfast and a yogurt with apple and peach. Should I be seeing a specialist to recheck it? Please advise what I should do. - A.V.R.



DEAR DR. ROACH:

I have chronic constipation, and have had this most of my life. I have used most of

> the bulking (husk) things that are out there. Nothing works for me. Years ago, I went to my doctor, and he said that I could use MiraLAX and use it for the rest of my life. It has worked. Now my new doctor wants me off of it, wants me to incorporate fiber into my diet. I already do this. Plus I drink a lot of water in a day. I start my day with 24 ounces of water every morning before anything else. Is there anything

wrong with taking MiraLAX every day? I do not take the full dose. — V.B.

ANSWER:

While I recommend non-drug treatments, such \0x00as increased water intake, highfiber diet and exercise, as treatment for constipation, that doesn't work for everybody. In that case, using a medication as recommended by your doctor makes sense. Polyethylene glycol (MiraLAX) is a generally safe treatment that works by increasing fluid in the bowel. It's a good idea to use it as little as is needed to keep the stool from getting uncomfortably hard.

In a 12" skillet, heat olive oil on medium.


Add garlic, onion, mushrooms, red bell pepper, sea salt & pepper. Saute 4-5 minutes until onions are translucent.


