news@tctimes.com; 810-629-8282 The story of Noah's Ark is one of the most well known in the Bible, but most people don't expect to come face to face with Noah, the ark, the animals or the flood, anytime during their lifetime.

But you can step right into a life-size reconstruction of Noah's Ark at the Ark Encounter in Williamstown, Kentucky, just 20 minutes off I-75, between Cincinnati and Lexington.

After a one-mile bus ride from the parking lot, visitors will be in the shadows of a mammoth structure, 510 foot long, 85 foot wide and 51 foot tall, dominating the landscape of this small Kentucky community.

Each of three decks contains interactive exhibits and models of animals many Christians believe to have been saved by Noah and his family through a covenant with God before He sent a flood to destroy the earth. Because of its size and 132 displays, Ark Encounter recom-

mends at least four hours for a visit. Billed as a fundamentalist Christian theme park, the Ark is built according See ARK on 4B



Sexual harassment and other unwanted sexual advances are a very serious problem, and I would venture a guess that almost every woman has some kind of personal story to tell.

In 1981, when I was 28 years old and divorced. I

worked as the office supervisor in the Chicago regional office of a large, wellknown international company. My boss was the general man-

The staff at the regional office would occasionally meet for a drink after work on Fridays.

Although my boss usually flew home on Friday afternoons, he decided to stay one weekend. I don't remember the reason but it was business-related. So. of course, he came with us to the bar for a drink. Well, he had more than one cocktail and I ended up having to give him a lift to his apartment.

While in front of the building, he invited me inside and I declined. He wouldn't take no for an answer and although I don't remember his exact words, I got that prickly feeling and instantly sensed that my job could be in serious jeopardy.

I was shocked. I'm not stupid, but I seriously did not expect this. In addition to his career with this company, he appeared to be the ultimate family man and held some prestigious offices in various organizations. His friends, who visited the office frequently, were the CEOs of well-known companies. None of these guys ever made an untoward remark to me. Not to mention that they were old dudes!

I didn't go inside the apartment with him, but I did start some fancy talking. I reminded him that we work for a very large company, with a very large



human resources department in California. I reminded him that his next moves could result in some negative outcomes, the least of which would be that some pinched-looking HR lady would be on the next plane from San Francisco to investigate the situation. This company had a very strict policy on sexual harassment, one that involved many hearings and stuff you

just don't want to have to go through regardless of whether you're the perpetrator or the victim. I don't know if I started getting

through to him or if he just started sobering up, but he eventually got out of my car, said good night and went up to his apartment.

The next day at the office he provided a sincere apology for his behavior and asked that I give him another chance. I did and nothing like it ever happened again. In fact, a year later, when he decided to work as the general manager in New York exclusively, he flew me to his offices there so that I could train the staff on how things operated in the Chicago office. I trusted him and didn't think twice about going.

While there, he took me to see "Annie" on Broadway and we enjoyed a nice dinner at a small bistro next to Central Park, after which he delivered me back to my hotel. He was the perfect gentleman the entire time.

That was 36 years ago. As I said, unwanted sexual advances are a very serious issue, and my experience could have ended much differently than it did.

But it makes me angry when I hear what's happening to Comedian Bill Cosby. The man is going to be 80 years old in July. Three years ago, some women, the latest number being 60, publicly outed him with all kinds of sex-related allegations, with the earliest taking place in mid-1960s.

I believe a few of them, but not all. I can't believe, if these women were seriously injured by this man's behaviors, why did they wait more than 40 years to tell their stories. Could it be that Dr. Cosby's net worth is about \$400 million today?

Do you think if this old man was dirt poor, rocking the rest of his life away on the front porch of some old shack that anyone would come forward with their tale of woe? I don't think so.

The Freemasons

One popular theme in "The Lost Symbol" in 2009 is that the Freemasons are a secret society that secretly run America. In the book, Langdon finds out that The Founding Fathers actually built a secret portal under Washington where secrets of the universe are hidden.

In reality, no such portal has been discovered. The Freemasons are often used in books and mythology, and rumors about the group run rampant. These theories often overlap with conspiracy theories about the New World Order and the Illuminati.

It's known that one Founding Father, Benjamin Franklin, was a Mason, and these symbols appear in American culture, such as the pyramid and eye on the Great Seal of the United States on the dollar bill.

The Priory of Sion

In "The Da Vinci Code," Brown writes that a brotherhood was founded in 1099 with members such as Isaac Newton Botticelli, Victor Hugo and Leonardo Da Vinci. These people knew that Jesus married Mary Magdalene and has a surviving heir.

In the book, Mary and her descendants are the Holy Grail.

In reality, the Priory of Sion was a monastic order formed that year. In 1982, a book was published about The Holy Blood and the Holy Grail and how they protect Jesus and Mary's secret. The Priory is now considered a hoax created in the 1950s by a Frenchman named Pierre Plantard.

In real life, it's a real Catholic organization with an estimated 87,000 members worldwide. However, none are monks. Their goal also isn't to find the Holy Grail.

The Illuminati

Perhaps one of the biggest theoriesturned-fact in his books is the Illuminati in "Angels and Demons." This secret society works to bring down the Catholic Church for their crimes against scientists like Copernicus and Galileo, who was convicted of heresy for claiming the Earth moved around the sun.

In real life, the Illuminati was a real organization founded in 1776 in Bavaria with the ideals of free-thinking and rationalism. Copernicus was never attacked by the church, but Galileo was mistreated. He was subjected to lifelong house arrest after his claim about the Earth and Sun, but he was never convicted.

The Ark opened last July 7, 2016. Its phase one construction included the Ark, petting zoo and zipline. Plans for additional phases, including replicas of a first century Middle Eastern village, Tower of Babel and a 500-seat special effects theater will be completed by 2018-2019.

Tickets are \$40 for adults, \$30 for seniors 60-plus, \$28 for children 5 to 12 and children under 5 are free. There

are also combo discounts available for a visit to the Ark's sister attraction, the Creation Museum, 45 miles away in Petersburg, Kentucky.



NOTICE "TO ALL OWNERS, AGENTS OR OCCUPANTS OF LAND IN THE TOWNSHIP OF HOLLY:

Notice is hereby given that after May 15 of this year the provisions of Holly Townships Code of Ordinances, Chapter 10, Article VI, Noxious Weed Ordinance will be enforced.

No owner of any parcel of land within the township or the occupant or agent of such owner shall permit on such parcel of land or upon any sidewalk abutting the same, or upon that portion of any street or alley adjacent to the same between the property line and the curb or traveled portion of such street or alley, any growth of weeds, grass or other rank vegetation to a greater height than six inches on the average, or any accumulation of dead weeds, grass or brush. No such owner or agent shall permit on such land poison ivy, ragweed or any other poisonous, noxious or unhealthful growths.


If after May 1st an owner, agent or occupant has failed to cut or cause such noxious weeds to be destroyed it shall be the duty of the commissioner to abate the nuisance, either utilizing township employees or private contractors which may enter upon such land and destroy by cutting, with or without mechanical equipment, any such weeds and all expenses incurred in such destruction shall be paid by the owner of such land. The township shall have a lien upon land for such expense, to be enforced in the manner prescribed by the general laws of the state providing for the enforcement of tax liens.

(d) Means of abatement.

If an owner, agent or occupant has failed to cut or cause such noxious weeds to be destroyed after receiving notice as hereinbefore provided in subsection 6(b), it shall be the duty of the commissioner to abate the nuisance, either utilizing township employees or private contractors which may enter upon such land and destroy by cutting, with or without mechanical equipment, any such weeds and all expenses incurred in such destruction shall be paid by the owner of such land. The township shall have a lien upon land for such expense, to be enforced in the manner prescribed by the general laws of the state providing for the enforcement of tax liens.

Exclusions. This Article does not apply to weeds in unimproved lands, (e) designated open space, open fields or fields devoted to growing small crops such as wheat, oats, barley, or rye. In the case of an easement or public property such as a forest preserve, and all other land as to which definite ownership is not known to the commissioner and cannot be established the county board of commissioners shall cause the destruction of noxious weeds in accordance with Public Act 359 of 1941.




