Property values continue to rise on area lakes

Waterfront living is popular in the tricounty area because of the abundance of fresh-water inland lakes here. Many people remain home on holidays and weekends to "staycation," enjoying their favorite water sports, relaxation, wine and sunsets and more, close to home.

When it comes to buying a home on the lake, size matters. Lake Fenton is still "king," according to most Real-



tors, even though there are fewer than a dozen homes and lots available for sale on a lake with 845 houses.

"All our lakes are amazing and we are blessed to have them," said John Wentworth of Re/MAX Platinum in Fenton

Lake Fenton is double the size of the next largest lake, and its wide open spaces are attractive to many people who love fast water sports.





LOOKING BACK

NATIONAL HISTORY

JULY 2

1937: The Lockheed aircraft carrying American aviator Amelia Earhart and navigator Frederick Noonan is reported missing near Howland Island in the Pacific. The pair was attempting to fly around the world when they lost their bearings during the most challenging leg of the global journey. The U.S. Coast Guard cutter Itasca was in sporadic radio contact with Earhart as she approached Howland Island and received messages that she was lost and running low on fuel. Soon after, she probably tried to ditch the Lockheed in the ocean. No trace of Earhart or Noonan was ever found.

JULY 3

1985: The blockbuster actioncomedy "Back to the Future," in which John DeLorean's iconic concept car is memorably transformed into a time-travel device, is released in theaters across the United States. "Back to the Future," starred Michael J. Fox as Marty McFly, a teenager who travels back 30 years using a time machine built by the zany scientist Doc Brown (Christopher Lloyd). Marty arrives in 1955 and finds his own life will be in jeopardy if he doesn't make sure his parents meet and eventually marry.

JULY 4

1776: In Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, the Continental Congress adopts the Declaration of Independence, which proclaims the independence of the United States of America from Great Britain and its king

JULY 5

1946: French designer Louis Reard unveils a daring two-piece swimsuit at the Piscine Molitor, a popular swimming pool in Paris. Parisian showgirl Micheline Bernardini modeled the new fashion, which Reard dubbed "bikini," inspired by a news-making U.S. atomic test that took place off the Bikini Atoll in the Pacific Ocean earlier that week.

JULY 6

1946: George Walker Bush, the son of future President George Herbert Walker Bush, is born in New Haven. Connecticut. When he was 2 years old, Bush's parents moved to Texas, where the elder Bush worked in the oil industry. Bush was nicknamed "Dubya" for his middle name, which began with the letter "W," and as a way to distinguish him from his father, who was also named George.

JULY 7

1930: Construction on the Hoover Dam begins. Over the next five years, a total of 21,000 men would work ceaselessly to produce what would be the largest dam of its time, as well as one of the largest manmade structures in the world.

JULY 8

1951: Paris, the capital city of France, celebrates turning 2,000 years old. In fact, a few more candles would've technically been required on the birthday cake, as the "City of Lights" was most likely founded around 250 B.C.

But houses on Lake Fenton come at a steep price. Prices start at about \$500,000 for a 1,500-square-foot home on a canal, with houses on the main part of the lake commanding \$750,000 on up, according to Realtor Wade Pyles of Berkshire Hathaway HomeServices

Even vacant lots — there are two — are pricey. A lot on Haddon Drive is priced at \$550,000 and a smaller parcel on Margaret Drive for \$400,000, That's just for the land," said Tremaine.

He said the most affordable waterfront property will be on lakes that are farther away from the expressway, like Lobdell Lake.

bass tournaments may be more interested in Lake Ponemah, which is one of the area's deepest lakes, or Bennett Lake, said Patrik Welty of Legacy Realty in Fenton. "Lobdell Lake, because of shallow spots, may limit you on the size of boat you'll want to use but it's great fishing. It also appeals to people who don't want so much lake traffic."

He said that it's not so much "lake versus lake," when it comes to looking for waterfront property, but it's street and view that draw the price. "It's the beach, the neighbors, the view, the set-

lake." Prospective buyers with smallerbudgets, less than \$300,000, can still find waterfront property, but it may be on a channel of an all-sports

lake like Lobdell, Ponemah or Bennett, or on a no-wake lake.

"There are going to be sacrifices you'll have to make when buying a waterfront home in this market," said Wentworth. "You'll have to decide what you can live with, and what you can't live without, what's really important to you. So often, people are focused on the house. You can change the house, but you can't change the lot it's on."



Online sales of counterfeit products soaring

■Beware of fake designer clothing, medicine, purses and much more

Counterfeiters have been duplicating designer products for years. While spotting a fake can be as easy as being aware of a few facts and observing a few details, it could be a problem, if it isn't already, when it comes to counterfeit prescription drugs and other needed products to remain healthy.

According to the International Anti-Counterfeiting Coalition (IACC), many more product categories beyond luxury goods are counterfeited such as cigarettes, food items, spirits, pharmaceuticals, auto parts, airplane parts, medical device, toys and more.

The IACC claims only 4 percent of the items counterfeited are luxury goods. They say to not become part of the problem, don't buy counterfeit goods. Counterfeiting has increased over 10,000 percent in the past two decades due, in part, to consumer demand.

Take Prada handbags, for example. If no one bought the fakes, counterfeiters wouldn't use slave labor to turn them out to meet demand. Know for sure whether or not an item is a fake sometimes takes a forensic expert. But as a rule of thumb, use the three P's — price, product and place.

If the price is too good to be true, it probably is. Know the usual price range for your intended purchases.

Inspect the quality of the product — look at labels, detailing and packaging. Are there any misspellings? Does the country of origin match the country that normally produces the product? Does the packaging look banged-up, old or sloppy? If you see any of these warning signs, the product very well could be fake.

Legitimate products are not sold on street corners, in flea markets, mall kiosks, dark alleys or on suspect online auction sites.

Know who is an authorized dealer for the product you are planning to purchase and make your purchases from the most legitimate source possible.

Cheap prices and availability are never excuses for buying fakes. Your money means you have buying power and with power comes the responsibility of not supporting illegal activities like manufacturing and selling counterfeit products.

The following are a couple of examples of popular products frequently counterfeited, and how to spot if they are fakes.

Jeans

All your favorite brands of jeans are counterfeited. But, in addition to supporting criminal syndicates, any jeans-wearing, fashion-conscious shopper will tell you jeans are all about the perfect

fit. Here are a few tips to help you avoid buying fake jeans. They are likely fake if:

There are missing or generic rivets? Many jeans manufacturers' rivets (and other hardware) include the company name.

Have loose threads and other poor quality construction inside.

The logo is on inside of waistband in wrong font? The exterior hangtag is made with different paper quality, font or twine attachment?

The zipper is missing the name-brand ogo? Fake.

Again, using Prada as an example, the following are the top things to look for when you are buying a authentic Prada online.

The color of the enamel on the exterior logo plaque should be the exact color of the bag or very close.

The letter R on an authentic Prada plaque should have a curved leg not a straight leg. If the leg is straight then the bag isn't authentic.

The Prada exterior plaque should be firmly attached with even stitching around it.

On the newer Prada logo plaques the

rivets will be completely filled in, but on the older style bags the rivets will look like doughnut holes. The interior logo plaque on older bags

will read Prada Milano made in Italy on three lines The newer interior plaques say "Prada

made in Italy" on two lines.

The interior plaque should match the interior fabric of the bag.

Sometimes Prada bags don't have a ceramic interior plaque but a leather patch with four filled out rivets

Zippers are a very key part in deciding whether the Prada bag you want is authentic. Prada handbag zippers are smooth like butter. These names will be embossed on the back side of the zipper: Ykk, Riri, Opti, Ipi.

The words Prada will be printed throughout the entire interior lining of the bag. The words Prada will be written horizontal throughout the lining. In some cases, the interior will be plain nylon, and it will match the exterior of the handbag.

Hardware is an important key factor in identifying authentic Prada bags. All the hardware on an authentic Prada bag will say Prada no matter what, including zippers, buckles, locks metal feet and all decorative hardware. If the zippers and hardware on a bag are blank then you are looking at a fake.

The interior number tag is also a great way to determine if the bag you are looking at is authentic. Authentic Prada handbags will have a small white tag in the interior with a random number on them. If the seller of the item you are interested in does not include a picture of this it does not mean the bag is fake. Most established designer handbag sellers on Ebay will include a picture of this tag in their listing. This tag will be in every interior pocket of every handbag.







Remove pet stains and odors

Pet owners sometimes must contend with stains and odors. Some of these stains may be normal, while others might result from accidents.

Individuals may experience a trialand-error period as new pets become acclimated to litter boxes or grow accustomed to relieving themselves outdoors. Pet owners must remain patient as young animals learn where and where not to relieve themselves.

Pets that are already trained may also suffer accidents as they grow older. PetMD says that urinary and fecal incontinence can afflict dogs of any age, but is most often experienced by middle-aged or senior dogs. Cats, too, can experience incontinence, which is most common in older cats and large cats, as age and size can make it challenging for cats to reach the litter box in time.

Accidents can be troubling, as they often result in stains and smells. Treating these issues to prevent damage to flooring and deter pets from thinking a particular area of the rug is their personal bathroom requires patience and trial and error.


To treat old stains, sprinkle baking soda on the affected areas and allow it to sit overnight. Then spray the areas with white vinegar and let the two substances bubble to clean the area. Baking soda and vinegar can be an effective, homemade cleaning mixture if accidents are a frequent occurrence.

Pet owners also can purchase commercially produced enzymatic cleaners. Enzymes are proteins that help spark natural chemical reactions at the molecular level, and the enzymes in pet carpet care products attach themselves to the molecules that make up the urine and bacteria that feed on it (producing the foul odors), serving as a catalyst for their breakdown.

Stains from feces may take some more effort. Try to remove as much as possible without pushing the stain further into the carpet fibers. Use a stain removal product to help lift out the stain. This may take a few applications.

Pet owners also may want to invest in carpet cleaners if accidents continue throughout training periods.

If urine has seeped into the floorboards or padding under the carpeting, carpeting may need to be replaced, particularly if the animal repeatedly visits the same spot to urinate. This is the best way to remove the scent and prevent future trouble.
