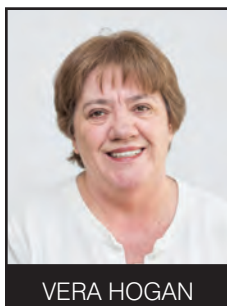
Good grief! I hate walking through Walmart.


