DISTANCE FROM DETROIT TO REYKJAVIK

'The Land of Fire and Ice' is one of Europe's most popular and adventurous destinations

Why is everybody all of a sudden talking about Iceland?

Iceland has become one of the most popular worldwide adventure destinations because of its remoteness, beauty and spectacular landscapes.

It's also a relatively inexpensive destination because of affordable airfare and accommodations. Whether you are traveling on a budget or opting for luxury, you can find a plan to fit your needs, in a little guesthouse, country bed and breakfast, a suite in the city or a tent and sleeping bag.

Iceland is an active vacationer's paradise:

the rivers are perfect for rafting, fishing, diving and snorkeling; its mountains, volcanoes and glaciers await you for hiking, climbing, dog-sledding and snowmobiling; its snowy hills for skiing and snowboarding; its waves for surfing; its caves for exploring and its barren highlands for

Iceland remains largely uninhabited, with more than half of its population living in the capital city of Reykjavik. Just a 20-minute drive away from the capital takes you out of the hubbub of city life and into the seclusion of Iceland's spectacular landscapes.

Iceland... At a glance

Location: Iceland is a North Atlantic island and the westernmost country in Europe, midway between North America and mainland Europe. Its northern coast is just below the Arctic Circle.

Square miles: 39,768.5-square miles, 62.7 percent of which is tundra (vast treeless plain near the Arctic Circle). The United States is 95 times bigger than Iceland, easily fitting inside the state of Colorado.

Population: 334,252

Capital: Reykjavik, the world's northernmost capital city Language: Icelandic is the official language, and it's the official second language taught in schools. Danish is the official third language.

Religion: Predominantly Christian

Government: Parliamentary constitutional republic

Currency: Icelandic Krona

Climate: Gulf Stream brings cool, temperate maritime climate with refreshing summers and fairly mild winters, with sudden weather changes.

expensive. The weather is very pleasant and the sun barely sets, a natural phenomenon called the Midnight Sun. The weather stays mild until mid-September, when summer activities are put on hold until May.

Don't let the name Iceland fool you. Winters in the lowlands average about 32 degrees F and in the highlands, about 14 degrees F. However, the northern part of the country can dip down to 22 below zero. Winter is also when daylight shrinks to about five hours, a period called Polar Nights.

Even though Iceland offers wonderful nightlife in Reykjavik, the Northern Lights and many outdoor activities in the winter, airfare and hotel prices drop dramatically in the colder part of the year. **Flight distance:** 2,797 miles from Detroit to Reykjavik (6-hour, 6-minute flight time)

New low-cost WOW air begins in April 2018

An Icelandic, low-cost airline, based in Reykjavik, will offer flights from Detroit to many European destinations, starting in April 2018. One-way WOW air flights to Iceland start at \$99, plus taxes, according to a Detroit News article.

PLACES TO VISIT

- The Volcano Hekla is one of the most active volcanoes on earth.
- Reynisfjara Beach is a black sand beach surrounded by roaring surf and the

hexagonal basalt columns of Reynisfjall mountain. Walking distance away is Dyrholaey, a gigantic pillar of dark lava, which forms a peninsula where travellers can see the mighty Myrdalsjokull glacier and view the south Icelandic coastline.

- The Blue Lagoon is a geothermal spa filled with seawater, and believed to have natural healing powers.
- Seljavallalaug Pool is one of the oldest outdoor geothermal swimming pools in Iceland, built into a wet hillside at the roots of a mountain.
- Hornstrandir Nature Reserve is at the northernmost part of the Westfjords. This colossal Cliffside peaks at 534 miles above sea level, providing a perfect habitat for one of the greatest seafowl colonies on earth.
- Husey in East Iceland is between two glacial rivers and surrounded by the Mountains of the East, offering endless opportunities to discover Iceland's untouched nature.
- **Skaftafell Park** is home to some of the strangest and most surreal landscapes on the planet, formed by a constant duel between fire and water.

Iceland continually ranks near the top for quality of life, gender equality and democracy and is one of the highest ranked countries in the world, in terms of health care, education and internet availability.

Senate Bill 335: Revise campaign finance law to reflect Citizens United ruling

To revise Michigan campaign finance law provisions that violate the holding of the U.S. Supreme Court in the Citizens United case. The decision limited the power of congress and state legislatures to restrict election-related political speech by corporations, including nonprofit groups motivated by ideological or political concerns. The bill would authorize "independent expenditure committee" (dubbed "super-PACs") that could advocate for a candidate but not contribute to or coordinate with a candidate. Committees would be subject to campaign finance filings but would not have to disclose the identity of donors, and there would be no cap on spending or contributions, which could come from corporations and unions.

Senate Bill 100: Ease restrictions on cost and fee awards in lawsuits against

To ease restrictions on a person who successfully sues the state also collecting costs and fees in addition to any courtordered damage awards, with some exceptions. Under current law, the winning plaintiff must prove a state agency's position was "frivolous" to collect costs and fees. The bill would instead require the state provide clear and convincing evidence that its position was justifiable. It would also remove a cap on attorney fees that may be reimbursed.

NATIONAL HISTORY

SEPT. 24

1789: The Judiciary Act of 1789 is passed by Congress and signed by President George Washington, establishing the Supreme Court of the United States as a tribunal made up of six justices who were to serve on the court until death or retirement. That day, Washington nominated John Jay to preside as chief justice, and John Rutledge, William Cushing, John Blair, Robert Harrison, and James Wilson to be associate justices.

SEPT. 25

1970: In the 8:30 p.m. time slot immediately following The Brady Bunch, ABC premiered a program that would give Screen Gems its second TV-topop-chart smash: The Partridge Family. In the pilot episode, the five children of a widowed single mother convince their mom to join them in their garage recording sessions and then watch their first record, "I Think I Love You" become a No. 1 pop hit.

SEPT. 26

1820: The great pioneering frontiersman Daniel Boone dies quietly in his sleep at his son's home near present-day Defiance, Missouri. The indefatigable voyager was 86. In the Yadkin Valley of North Carolina, the young Daniel Boone began his life-long love for wilderness, spending long days exploring the still relatively unspoiled forests and mountains of the region. An indifferent student who never learned to write more than a crude sentence or two, Boone's passion was for the outdoors, and he quickly became a superb marksman, hunter and woodsman.

SEPT. 27

1999: Operatic tenor Placido Domingo makes his 18th opening-night appearance at the Metropolitan Opera House, breaking an "unbreakable" record previously held by the great Enrico Caruso, the biggest star the world of opera had ever seen. With his death in 1921, Caruso's streak stopped at 17 — a mark that no other singer even remotely approached for the next 60 years. Domingo never thought that Caruso's record would be broken, much less that he would be the one to break it.

SEPT. 28

1918: A Liberty Loan parade in Philadelphia prompts a huge outbreak of the flu epidemic in the city. By the time the epidemic ended, an estimated 30 million people were dead worldwide. Though a pandemic of the virus in 1889 had killed thousands all over the world, it was not until 1918 that the world discovered how deadly the flu could be.

SEPT. 29

2005: New York Times reporter Judith Miller is released from a lederal detention center in Alexandria, Virginia, after agreeing to testify in the investigation into the leaking of the identity of covert CIA officer Valerie Plame. Miller had been behind bars since July 6, 2005, for refusing to reveal a confidential source and testify before a grand jury that was looking into the so-called Plame Affair. She decided to testify after the source she had been protecting, I. Lewis "Scooter" Libby, Vice President Dick Cheney's chief of staff, signed a waiver giving her permission to

1962: In Oxford, Mississippi, James H. Meredith, an African American, is escorted onto the University of Mississippi campus by U.S. Marshals, setting off a deadly riot. Two men were killed before the racial violence was quelled by more than 3,000 federal soldiers. The next day, Meredith successfully enrolled and began to attend classes amid continuing disruption.

How to care for your senior dog

Senior dogs require some modifications in care so they can continue to enjoy a high quality of life.

Dogs mature at faster rates than human beings. While many have heard the rule that every human year equals seven dog years, the reality isn't so cut and dry. Size and breed play roles in determining a dog's age equivalent. According to the pets division of WebMD, the first year of life for a dog may be roughly equivalent to 15 years for a human. Dog food manufacturer Purina says that by its tenth year alive, a small, medium and large dog is 56, 60 and 66 in human years, respectively.

Thanks to advancements in veterinary care, dogs are living longer lives. Pet owners may have to adapt their care and exercise regimen to accommodate the changes in their pets. Senior dogs show some distinctive signs of aging that are on par with what humans experience. These include cloudy eyes, gray hair (in dogs this starts around the muzzle and spreads to other areas of the face, head and body) and loose skin. Elderly dogs also may begin to experience stiffness in their legs, particularly the hind quarter. To ensure a dog's quality of life remains consistent through its senior years, pet owners can take the following steps.

- · Have a candid conversation with the vet. Make an appointment with your dog's veterinarian to discuss a plan for making the dog comfortable and happy as the animal ages. Your vet can make recommendations regarding which type of foods the dog should eat and how much exercise it needs.
- Make accommodations based on disability. A dog may develop arthritis or

another degenerative disease that causes a general slowing down. Dogs may not be able to walk as far or play games as long as they used to. Some dogs also struggle to find a comfortable position when attempting to lie down or sit. Dogs also may have difficulty getting up and down stairs. As a result, aging dogs may need some extra help getting around. Invest in ramps and ergonomic pet beds and bowls to help ease aging dogs' discomfort.

- Examine and modify dogs' diets. Food needs can change as dogs become less active. Keeping dogs lean can prevent a host of illnesses. PetMD says more than half of American pets are overweight, and obesity can contribute to disease and put stress on pets' joints. Let your vet be your guide in choosing high-quality, lowcalorie foods and treats. He or she may also recommend supplementation to alleviate stiffness and address other needs.
- Keep up the exercise. Exercise helps slow down the degeneration of joints and helps keep dogs healthy. Continue walks, but pare them down if your dog can't keep up. Swimming is a low-impact exercise that is great for senior dogs. Look for a dog swim vest, which can help the animal maintain some buoyancy.
- Be patient. Elderly dogs will need extra care, and that can be taxing. Exercise patience and you will see that the pampering and extra attention will help prolong your dog's happiness through its golden years.





AN ORDINANCE, granting to Consumers Energy Company, its successors and assigns, the right, power and authority to lay, maintain and operate gas mains, pipes and services, and to construct, maintain and commercially use electric lines consisting of towers, masts, poles, crossarms, guys, braces, feeders, transmission and distribution wires, transformers and other electrical appliances on, along, across and under the highways, streets, alleys, bridges, waterways, and other public places, and to do a local gas and/or electric business in the Charter Township of Fenton, Genesee County, Michigan, for a period of thirty years.

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF FENTON ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. GRANT, TERM

The Charter Township of Fenton, Genesee County, Michigan, hereby grants to the Consumers Energy Company, a Michigan corporation, its successors and assigns, hereinafter called the "Grantee," the right, power and authority to lay, maintain and operate gas mains, pipes and services, and to construct, maintain and commercially use electric lines consisting of towers, masts, poles, crossarms, guys, braces, feeders, transmission and distribution wires, transformers, and other electrical appliances on, along, across and under the highways, streets, alleys, bridges, waterways, and other public places, and to do a local gas and/or electric business in the Charter Township of Fenton, for a period of thirty years.

SECTION 2. CONSIDERATION

In consideration of the rights, power and authority hereby granted, said Grantee shall faithfully perform all things required by the terms hereof.

SECTION 3. CONDITIONS

No street, alley, bridge, highway, waterways, or other public place used by said Grantee shall be obstructed longer than necessary during the work of construction or repair, and shall be restored to the same order and condition as when said work was commenced. All of Grantee's structures and equipment shall be so placed on either side of the highways as not to unnecessarily interfere with the use thereof for highway purposes. All of Grantee's wires carrying electricity shall be securely fastened so as not to endanger or injure persons or property in said highways. The Grantee shall have the right to trim trees if necessary in the conducting of such business, subject, however, to the supervision of the highway authorities.

SECTION 4. HOLD HARMLESS

Said Grantee shall at all times keep and save the Charter Township of Fenton free and harmless from all loss, costs and expense to which it may be subject by reason of the negligent construction and maintenance of the structures and equipment hereby authorized. In case any action is commenced against the Charter Township of Fenton on account of the permission herein granted, said Grantee shall, upon notice, defend the Charter Township of Fenton and save it free and harmless from all loss, cost and damage arising out of such negligent construction and maintenance.

SECTION 5. FRANCHISE NOT EXCLUSIVE

The rights, power and authority herein granted are not exclusive. The right to do a gas business and the right to do an electric business hereunder are several, and such rights may be separately exercised, owned and transferred. Either manufactured or natural gas may be furnished hereunder.

SECTION 6. EXTENSIONS

Said Grantee shall from time to time extend its gas and electric systems to and within said Charter Township of Fenton, and shall furnish gas or electricity to applicants residing therein in accordance with applicable laws, rules and regulations.

SECTION 7. RATES

The Grantee shall be entitled to charge the inhabitants of said Charter Township of Fenton for gas and/or electricity furnished therein, the rates as approved by the Michigan Public Service Commission, to which Commission or its successors authority and jurisdiction to fix and regulate gas and electric rates and rules regulating such service in said Charter Township of Fenton, are hereby granted. Such rates and rules shall be subject to review and change at any time upon petition therefor being made by either said Charter Township of Fenton acting by its Township Board, or by said Grantee.

SECTION 8. REVOCATION

The franchise granted by this Ordinance is subject to revocation upon sixty (60) days written notice by the party desiring such revocation.

SECTION 9. MICHIGAN PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION, JURISDICTION

Said Grantee shall, as to all other conditions and elements of service, both gas and electric, not herein fixed, be and remain subject to reasonable rules and regulations of the Michigan Public Service Commission or its successors, applicable to gas or electric service in said Charter Township of Fenton.

SECTION 10. REPEALER

This ordinance, when accepted and published as herein provided, shall repeal and supersede the provisions of Ordinance No. 366, a gas and/or electric franchise ordinance adopted by the Fenton Township Board on December 21, 1987 entitled:

AN ORDINANCE, granting to CONSUMERS POWER COMPANY, its successors and assigns, the right, power and authority to lay, maintain and operate gas mains, pipes and services, and to construct, maintain and commercially use electric lines consisting of towers, masts, poles, crossarms, guys, braces, feeders, transmission and distribution wires, transformers and other electrical appliances on, along, across and under the highways, streets, alleys, bridges and other public places, and to do a local gas and/or electric business in the CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF FENTON, GENESEE COUNTY, MICHIGAN, for a period of thirty years.

and amendments, if any, to such ordinance whereby a gas and/or electric franchise was granted to Consumers Energy Company.

SECTION 11. EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall take effect upon the day after the date of publication thereof, provided, it shall cease and be of no effect after thirty days from its adoption unless within said period the Grantee shall accept the same in writing filed with the Fenton Township Clerk. Upon acceptance and publication hereof, this ordinance shall constitute a contract between said Charter Township of Fenton and said Grantee.






