When colder months arrive, snowbirds head to warmer climes

Most birds migrate south for the winter, including swallows, ducks, bluebirds and snowbirds.

As fall weather approaches, it's time for snowbirds, which refers to people who stay in warmer states for the winter, to start packing and choosing a date to head south.

Bob Harris of Fenton Township travels to Murrieta, California every winter to be closer to his daughter and grandchildren.

"I go out before Christmas and come back when I think the snow is gone," the 94-year-old said. "It's a nice place to go. It's wine country area."

Most snowbirds are baby boomers or older who travel to states like Florida, Texas, Arizona, California, or any warmer state, to escape the snow and colder temperatures a Michigan winter brings.

The word "snowbird" was first used in 1923 to describe seasonal workers who moved south for the winter months, according to vacationsmadee-

asy.com. By 1979, it was used to reference the flock of retiree tourists who travel south.

What started as a way to escape colder months has turned into a whole lifestyle. Many snowbirds take an RV down south and stay in various parks.

People can subscribe to magazines aimed at snowbirds, including Snowbirds Gulf Coast magazine. These publications cover topics like popular traveling spots, destination locations, events, casinos, and often feature a snowbird couple.

Packing for a four-month long trip isn't easy. Snowbirds have to think about prescriptions, winterizing their northern homes, and forwarding mail.

Harris' favorite thing to do while in California is spend time with his family.

"Cold is one aspect, but most of it is being with people," he said. "The big thing for me now is family. I get to see my great grandchildren and see them play baseball and that's very nice."

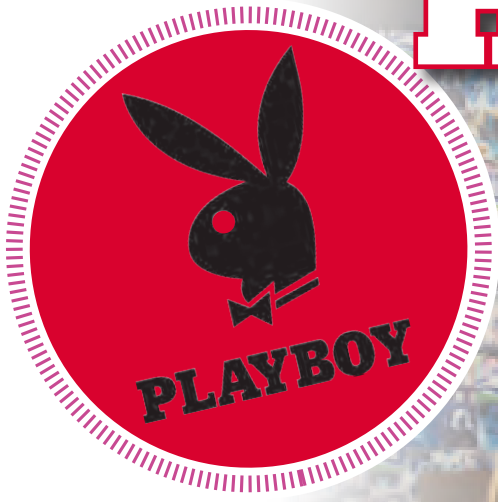

HUGH HEFNER

Hugh Hefner of Playboy magazine fame died on Wednesday, Sept. 27 at the age of 91. While most people know of him for the obvious reasons, there are a few things many people do not know.

The first issue of Playboy magazine, published in December 1953, featured Marilyn Monroe and sold over 50,000 copies. Hefner, who never met Monroe, bought the crypt next to hers at the Westwood Village Memorial Park Cemetery in Los Angeles in 1992 for \$75,000. It has been reported that "a playboy to the end," Hefner will be interred there. He'll be sleeping on the left.

Hefner was an animal lover. The Playboy Mansion in Los Angeles has a zoo license and dozens of animals roam the grounds.

Hefner has a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame for television and has made several movie appearances as himself. On another note, in 1978, Hefner helped organize fundraising efforts that led to the restoration of the Hollywood Sign. He paid \$27,000 for the letter Y in a ceremonial auction.

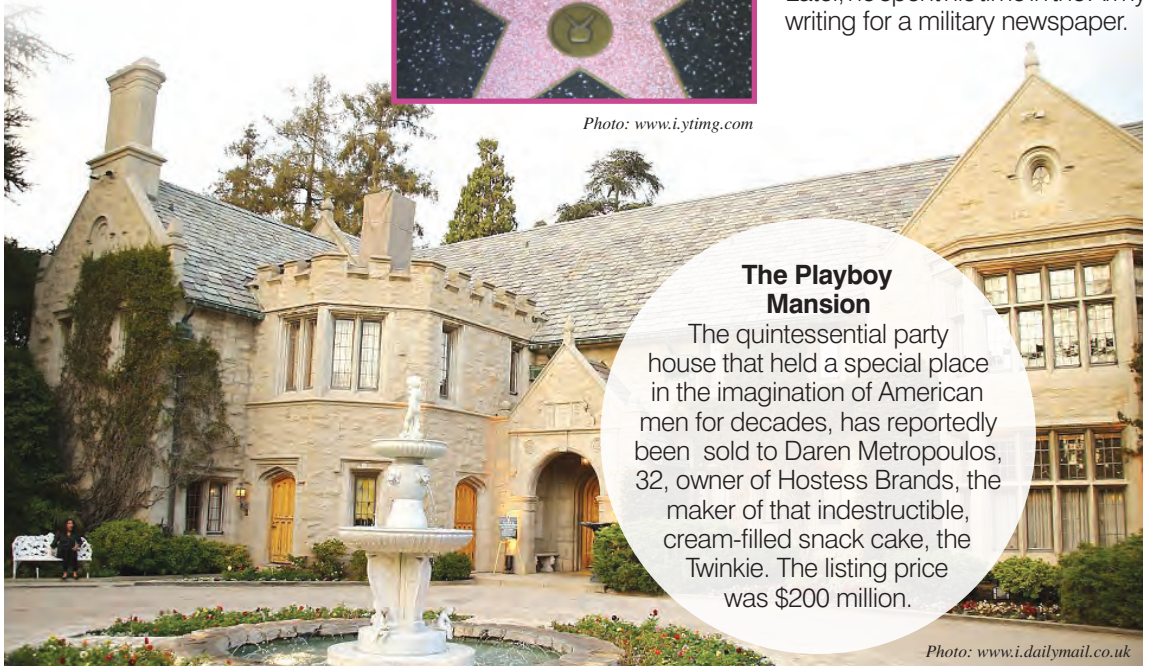

LOOKING BACK

at this week in

NATIONAL HISTORY

OCT. 1

1890: An act of Congress creates Yosemite National Park, home of such natural wonders as Half Dome and the giant sequoia trees. Environmental trailblazer John Muir (1838-1914) and his colleagues campaigned for the congressional action, which was signed into law by President Benjamin Harrison and paved the way for generations of hikers, campers and nature lovers, along with countless “Don’t Feed the Bears” signs. Yellowstone became America’s first national park in 1872.

OCT. 2

2006: Charles Roberts, a 32-year-old milk truck driver from a nearby town, enters the West Nickel Mines Amish School in Nickel Mines, Pennsylvania, where he fatally shoots five female students and wounds five more before turning his gun on himself and committing suicide.

OCT. 3

1995: At the end of a sensational trial, former football star O.J. Simpson is acquitted of the brutal 1994 double murder of his estranged wife, Nicole Brown Simpson, and her friend, Ronald Goldman. In the epic 252-day trial, Simpson’s “dream team” of lawyers employed creative and controversial methods to convince jurors that Simpson’s guilt had not been proved “beyond a reasonable doubt,” thus surmounting what the prosecution called a “mountain of evidence” implicating him as the murderer.

OCT. 4

1988: Televangelist Jim Bakker is indicted on federal charges of mail and

wire fraud and of conspiring to defraud the public. The case against the founder of Praise the Lord (PTL) Ministries and three of his aides exploded in the press when it was revealed that Bakker had sex with former church secretary Jessica Hahn. On Dec. 6, 1980, Bakker and Hahn had a sexual encounter in a Florida hotel room. Although they each told different stories of what had happened, Bakker eventually paid Hahn over \$350,000 to remain silent. When the arrangement became public, the scandal helped to bring down the entire PTL ministry.

OCT. 5

2011: Steve Jobs, the visionary co-founder of Apple Inc., which revolutionized the computer, music and mobile communications industries with such devices as the Macintosh, iPod, iPhone and iPad, dies at age 56 of complications from pancreatic cancer.

OCT. 6

1991: Actress Elizabeth Taylor marries her seventh husband, the construction worker Larry Fortensky, in a ceremony held at the pop singer Michael Jackson’s Neverland Ranch in California. Taylor, a Hollywood screen legend known for her violet-eyed beauty and her roles in such movies as Cat on a Hot Tin Roof and Cleopatra, reportedly met the two-decades-younger Fortensky at the high-profile Betty Ford Center for Drug and Alcohol Rehabilitation. The pair divorced in 1996.

OCT. 7

2003: Actor Arnold Schwarzenegger is elected governor of California, the most populous state in the nation with the world’s fifth-largest economy. Despite his inexperience, Schwarzenegger came out on top in the 11-week campaign to replace Gray Davis, who had earlier become the first United States governor to be recalled by the people since 1921. Schwarzenegger was one of 135 candidates on the ballot, which included career politicians, other actors, and one adult-film star.

Rose Township celebrates 180 years of rich history

■ Chippewa Chief Jacob Tipsico was a strong ruler and friend to the local settlers

Rose Township is located in northwest Oakland County, south of Holly Township and the village of Holly. There are at least 25 lakes within its boundaries.

The township was originally populated by the Chippewa Indians.

Tipsico Lake is the largest lake in the township. It was originally known as Little Long Lake, and is part of the Shiawassee River Basin. The lake was renamed Tipsico after one of Rose Township’s famous leaders, Chief Jacob Tipsico, who was born in Macomb County on March 1, 1827 and died in 1914 at the age of 87.

He was a renowned wrestler, strong ruler and friend to the local settlers.

Not much is recorded online about Chief Tipsico, however, there is a book about his life and impact he had on the community. Written by William P. Schimmel and illustrated by Thomas Bern, “Jacob Tipsico—a Michigan Chippewa, His Life, His Family and the End of an Era.”

The Act of Legislature creating Rose Township was approved on March 11, 1837. As part of its 180th Anniversary Celebration, the Rose Township Heritage Committee and Oakland County will be hosting a bus tour of historic and

present day sites of interest throughout the township on Sunday, Oct. 8, from 1 to 3:30 p.m.

Harris used to rent a place in Florida for the colder months with his wife, Marie, but when she died in 2013, he started traveling to California instead. While in Florida, their residence had a pool.

“Every morning you could go and jump in the pool. We’ve got a lake but it freezes up in the winter,” he said. Harris lives on Lake Fenton. “It was nice. It was a change of pace. There was warmer weather and the swimming pool was a huge attraction. We drank a lot of orange juice, I remember,” he said.

Florida and California have a more tropical climate than Fenton, which is what attracts snowbirds as they age and the colder temperatures become harder to manage.

“The biggest difference was the temperature. It’s just like going on vacation, just a change of everything,” he said.

While Harris relaxes in his retirement and getaway for months, he’s not always idle. Harris has published five books so far on Fenton’s history, called “The Village Players.”

SUMMARY

■ “Snowbird” refers to the people who stay in the warmer, southern states to avoid the harsh winters in the north.

“Since the last five to 10 years, I’ve been doing a lot of writing. I take my writing with me. When I go to California, I have a computer and all that and I do all my work out there,” he said.

Harris also enjoys the numerous casinos. One casino has a senior citizen theatre and they have a free show every Tuesday.

“I look forward to going to that every Tuesday. We don’t have anything like that here unless you travel,” he said.

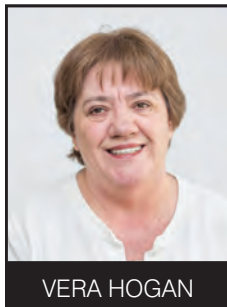
But Christmas means much more to me than the shopping. I love the whole season and everything that goes with it — the decorations, the movies, the songs on the radio, the baking — all of it.

In 2009, Sears introduced a new, interactive, online version of everyone's Wish Book, only it's now called the Holiday Wish Book.

First settlers

The first settlement in Rose Township was on 80 acres by Daniel Danielson, in 1835. He built the first house in the township. His land was covered with timber, and his log house stood on the west side of the Indian trail, now known as White Lake Road.

The next settler was Benjamin Hicks, who came to Rose Township from Livonia, Livingston County, New York, with his wife, one son (Benjamin C. Hicks), and two daughters, early in the spring of 1836.

Hicks and his son had been out the previous October (1835), and built a log house and a log stable. The house was the second one built in the township, and while erecting it Hicks and his son boarded with Danielson.

The first white child born in the township was said to be Daniel Gage, whose birth occurred in October, 1836.

His father, David Gage, lived at the time in a shanty on land owned by J. C. Wendell, the latter going through the woods to Fenton after a physician when Daniel was born, and finding his way with great difficulty.

At the time the "Buckhorn tavern" was built, the mail route from Pontiac to Shiawassee was over the White Lake Road, and a line of stages was either in operation then or began to run soon after. When the tavern was built the mail was carried on horseback.

A post office had been established at Buckhorn as early as 1837-38, and the first postmaster was John A. Wendell. The Indians who lived in the region were usually quiet and peaceable, and many an instance is related of their bringing supplies of food to the settlers and attending to the wants of the sick. The Rose Township pioneers carefully preserved the memories of their cherished Indian neighbors, to whom they were genuinely grateful.

**EJ Rundles
1926-2017**

EJ Rundles - age 90, born Ellajane Sloan on October 27, 1926 in Wyandotte, MI, passed away on Friday, September 22, 2017 just a month shy of her 91 birthday. The story goes that the mother of a high school beau dubbed her "EJ" as a "more proper" name for a grown woman, and the name stuck (except with her mother, Mary Kerr Sloan). EJ grew up in Wyandotte, MI with her parents, older brother Dale, and younger brother Dean. Upon graduation from high school, she entered nurses training at the University of Michigan School of Nursing, where she was awarded her R.N. in 1947. Later that year, on November 28, 1947, she married Walter Z. Rundles, a young physician she met on a blind date while they were both in training at U of M. The couple resided in Ann Arbor, MI for a few years while Walter completed training, and while there, welcomed daughter Karen in 1948 and daughter Janice in 1950. In 1951 they moved to Flint, Walter's home town, where the new doctor began his practice as an ophthalmologist, and subsequently had three more children, Jeff in 1952, Chris in 1953, and Lindsay in 1956. While being a busy wife and mother was her primary occupation, EJ nevertheless found the time over the ensuing 60+ years to engage in numerous civic endeavors for which she was highly respected for her intelligence, wit and acumen, and will long be remembered. The most prominent among these

was helping to found and serving on the board of directors for nearly 40 years of the Cedar Street Children's Center in Flint, one of the first organizations of its kind in the state that provided child care services for children in the Flint and Genesee County area. EJ also served many years on the board of directors of the YWCA of Greater Flint, where she was president from 1980 to 1981, and on the board of directors, and treasurer, of the McFarlane Home. For the last 17 years of her life, EJ resided in Fenton and also maintained a home in Petoskey, MI, where she and her husband enjoyed many years of cross-country skiing, golf (EJ was a wicked golfer), and entertaining numerous family and friends. EJ was preceded in death by: her husband, Dr. Walter Z. Rundles; her daughter, Karen Piper and her son, Christopher Rundles. She is survived by: daughter, Janice Rundles of Fenton; son, Jeff Rundles of Denver and daughter Lindsay Tatum of Fenton; her brother, Dean Sloan and his wife, Jeanne Sloan of Fallon, Nevada; 19 grandchildren; and ten great-grandchildren. NEAPOLITAN PIZZA MARGHERITA

Who doesn't like a good PIE. I mean a real, yummy, nearly authentic Torta napoletana di margherita! You can make it easy on yourself using flatbreads! This is a real treat - and I am sure whomever you share it with will agree!! — Trish

INGRIDIENTS

•One shallot
•4.5 oz cherry tomatoes
•1/4 oz basil
•2 flatbreads
•4 oz marinara sauce (store bought is OK!)
•6 oz sliced mozzarella fresca
•1 oz shaved parmigiano reggiano
•Red pepper flake to taste
•1/2 oz balsamic vinegar
•2 oz baby arugula
•Olive oil
•Salt
•Pepper

DIRECTIONS

Preheat your oven to 400.
Prepare a baking sheet with foil. Peel and halve the shallot, and slice into thin strips.

Halve the cherry tomatoes. Stem the basil - keep the leaves in tact. Heat olive oil in a non stick pan over medium heat. Add 1 tsp olive oil. Add the sliced shallot to the pan, cook until they're starting to caramelize. Take the pan OFF the burner. Put the flat breads directly on the oven rack, and bake maybe 5 minutes - get them slightly crisp. Take them out of the oven, and place them on the prepared baking sheet. Spread marinara on the bread. Top with the sliced mozzarella and half of the Parmesan cheese. Add halved cherry tomatoes, shallot strips, and red pepper flake (to taste). Bake until cheese is bubbly - maybe 14 minutes... Remove from oven and let them rest. They're probably tired after all... Whisk the vinegar and remaining olive oil. Toss in arugula to coat. Season with salt/pepper. Plate the pizza and top it with the FRESH basil leaves, remaining Parmesan and more red pepper flake (if you like it el' diablo).

You can either top the pizza with the arugula, or serve it on the side. Either way is delicioso!!
