WOMEN... PROTECT AND EMPOWER yourself

■ Be aware of your surroundings, trust your instincts and take a self-defense or martial arts class

Kelsy Hoerauf, 33, of Linden, carries a confidence about her that is a helpful protection against many of the sexual assaults, physical attacks and other predatory acts against women that have been in the news lately.

She's a Third Degree Black Belt in the World Tang Soo Do Association, and she knows what she would do if she ever faces a fearful situation.

"This has helped me avoid dangerous situations, especially at MSU and when I lived in Fort Lauderdale," said Hoerauf, a licensed marriage and family therapist and an instructor at Anderson's Karate in Fenton. "I've always been very aware of my surroundings and I've learned to evaluate how much trust to give people before I know them."

Empowering the women in your life is more important than ever, with rape, date rapes, mur-

der, domestic violence, human trafficking and physical assaults taking place all over the United States. According to the National Sexual Assault Hotline, one out of every six American women has been the victim of an attempted or completed rape in her lifetime.

Whatever your age, gender or experience, you can learn how to protect yourself with local self-defense workshops and martial arts classes.

Southern Lakes Parks & Recreation (SLPR) offers a Community S.A.F.E. course several times a year. S.A.F.E. is an acronym for Secure yourself, Avoid trouble, Flee, if possible and Engage, if necessary.

The next class for ages 13 and up will be Monday, Nov. 13, from 6 to 8 p.m. at the Fenton Community & Cultural Center, said Nancy Muffley, SLPR program administrator and event planner.

Class instructor is Grand Master Ibrahim Ahmed, R.N. and 10th Degree Black Belt. He has been teaching self-defense classes for almost 50 years.

SLPR also offers various martial arts programs for children and adults throughout the year, working with Fenton Karate and World Martial Arts Academy in Linden. Interested

"A lot of our coaching is how to stay out of physical harm," said Chris Anderson, 5th Degree Master Instructor in the World Tang Soo Do Association and owner of Anderson's Karate.

Anderson will offer self-

defense classes to any interested groups and also teaches Tang Soo Do martial arts to students as young as 3, up to older adults.

"Martial arts puts women on par with their male counterparts," said Anderson. "It breaks down those stereotypes. Women are quite capable of taking care of themselves. They have the brain

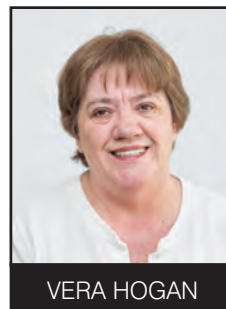

"I think martial arts should be mandatory in every school, it builds up your confidence level," he said. "It also gives you the tools you can use to hopefully get out of a situation safely."

When a stranger approaches you and you have an uneasy feeling, something's telling you that you could be in danger. "Keep your distance," said Husted. "One of the skills we teach is 'distancing' — who is allowed to approach you and how close you let someone get before you're uncomfortable. This is especially important for children."

He said that a lot of self-defense is common sense. "Don't put yourself in a vulnerable situation," he said. "Don't jog alone in a secluded area. You have to be smart."

How can you keep yourself safe?

Contrary to what one might think, martial arts is actually more about avoiding physical confrontations: How can I present myself as not being a victim?

Here are a few tips from local

martial artists and self-defense experts:

- **Be aware of** your surroundings. Don't be slumped over and tied to your phone.

- **Project strong body language.** Walk confidently with your head and shoulders up and your eyes looking all around.

- **Trust your instincts** when assessing the possible danger of a situation. If you feel it in your gut that something's not right, it probably isn't.

- **Don't let your guard down.** Predators will try to gain your trust and get close to you.

- **Take your keys** out of your ignition and keep them with you when you're pumping gas.

- **When you come up to a stoplight,** leave enough space between your car and the car in front of you that you could turn your car right or left to get out of a bad situation quickly.

- **Have a plan** so that you don't panic in a situation of severe distress. Use the element of surprise because what predators fear most is getting caught or getting hurt.

- **Fight to escape.** Wait for your assailant to be distracted and use that close proximity to strike back with a simple primal move — strike the eyes, the throat or groin. Give it 100 percent, then run.

WITCHES

In the Dark Ages, if you were a woman over 40 who was unmarried, single or widowed or socially awkward, you could have been labeled a witch. Celtic mythology paints witches with gray hair, with warts on their faces, bad joints and hunched from old age. The women were marked as evil.

BLACK CATS

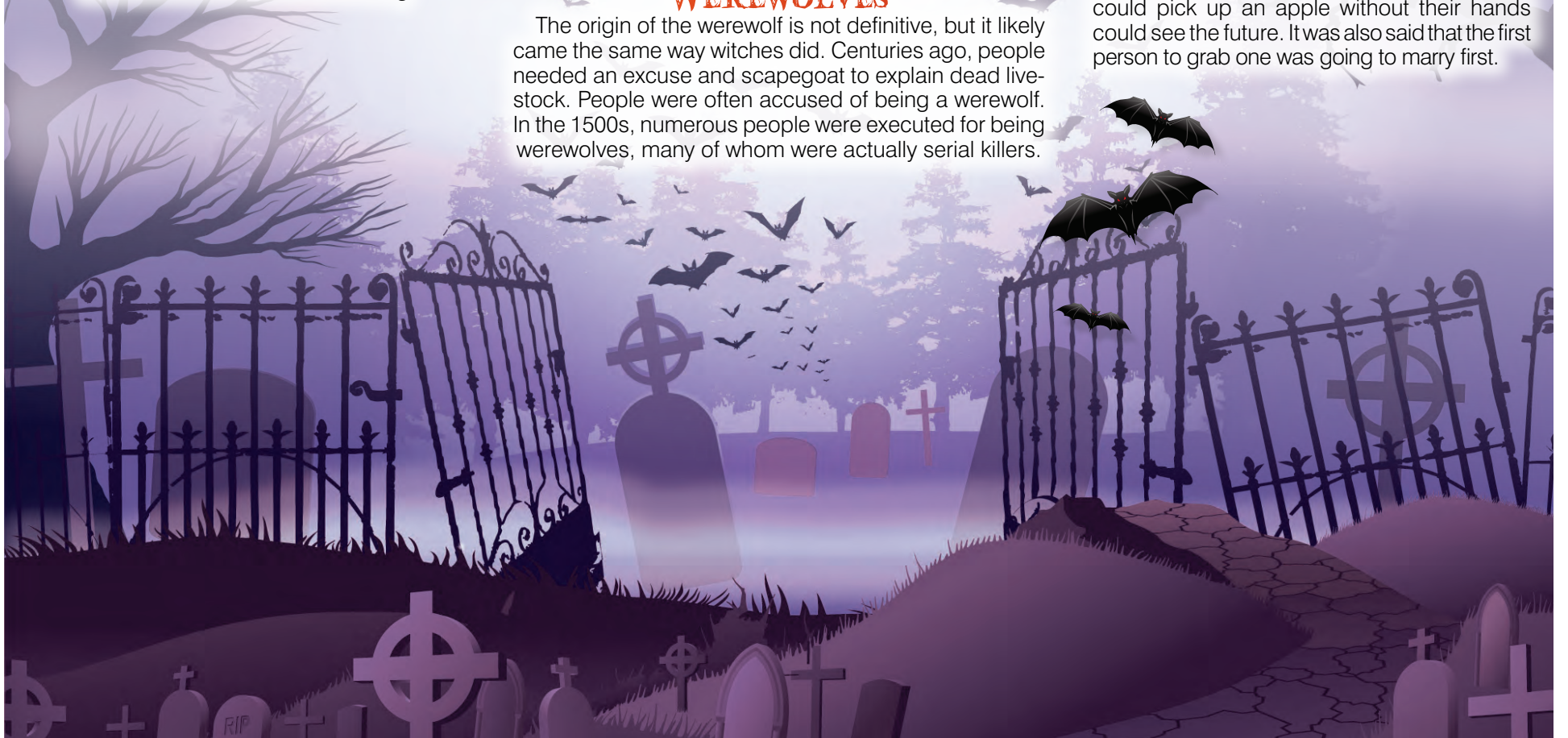

THE FOLLOWING CONSTITUTES A SUMMARY OF HOLLY TOWNSHIP’S AMENDMENTS TO THE CODE OF ORDINANCES:

SECTION 1 – AMENDMENT

INTENT AND PURPOSE. An Ordinance granting to Consumers Energy Company and its successors and assigns, the right, power and authority to do a local gas and/or electric business in the Township of Holly.

GRANT, TERM. Thirty years.

CONSIDERATION.

USE OF PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAYS.

A. Conditions.

B. Restoration. Trees. Grantee shall have the right to trim trees if necessary to prevent tree branches from coming into contact with the Gas or Electric Systems or to otherwise maintain the integrity of the Gas or Electric Systems, provided, however, that Grantee provide prior notice to all state and local governmental agencies with jurisdiction over the Public Right-of-Ways.

C. Marking. Vacation or Relocation. The Township has the right to require Grantee to vacate or relocate any portion of the Gas or Electric System at the Grantee’s expense if such vacation or relocation is necessary to secure the public health and welfare or is otherwise required by the Township in the exercise of a governmental function.

D. Public Emergency.

E. MISS DIG.

F. Compliance with Laws.

ASSUMPTION OF RISK.

FRANCHISE NOT EXCLUSIVE.

EXTENSIONS RATES.

REVOCATION. The franchise granted by this Ordinance is subject to revocation upon sixty (60) days written notice by either party.
