


After dinner, we snuggled on the couch and watched "Space Jam" and "Toy Story" before he, I mean we, fell asleep.



Things you may not know about Charles Dickens







NATIONAL HISTORY

NOV. 19

1863: At the dedication of a military cemetery at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, during the American Civil War, President Abraham Lincoln delivers one of the most memorable speeches in American history. In just 272 words, Lincoln brilliantly and movingly reminded a war-weary public why the Union had to fight, and win, the Civil War.

NOV. 20

2003: Phil Spector, the influential, eccentric music producer who worked with a long list of performers including The Righteous Brothers, The Ronettes, Ike and Tina Turner, John Lennon and the Ramones, is indicted in the murder of actress Lana Clarkson. Spector pleaded not guilty to the charges. The 40-year-old Clarkson was found dead from a single gunshot wound to the mouth in the foyer of Spector's Alhambra, California mansion in the early hours of Feb. 3, 2003.

NOV. 21

1986: National Security Council staff member Oliver North and his secretary, Fawn Hall, begin shredding documents that would have exposed their participation in a range of illegal activities regarding the sale of arms to Iran and the diversion of the proceeds to a rebel Nicaraguan group.

NOV. 22

1963: The nation is shocked by the assassination of its president, John F. Kennedy. Kennedy was riding in an open car in Dallas, Texas, when a gunman named Lee Harvey Oswald fired three shots at him from an upper-level window of a nearby building. Kennedy was pronounced dead upon arrival at a Dallas hospital. He was the fourth president in U.S. history to be assassinated.

NOV. 23

1959: Robert Stroud, the famous "Birdman of Alcatraz," is released from solitary confinement for the first time since 1916. Stroud gained widespread fame and attention when author Thomas Gaddis wrote a biography that trumpeted Stroud's ornithological expertise.

NOV. 24

1932: The crime lab that is now referred to as the FBI Scientific Crime Detection Laboratory officially opens in Washington, D.C., on this day in 1932. The lab, which was chosen because it had the necessary sink, operated from a single room and had only one full-time employee, Agent Charles Appel.

NOV. 25

1980: Sugar Ray Leonard regains boxing's welterweight title when his opponent, reigning champ Roberto Duran, waves his arms and walks away from the fight in the eighth round. "No más, no más," Duran told the referee. "No more, no more." He'd had cramps in his stomach since the fifth round, he said, and they'd gotten so bad he could barely stand up.

A furnace is a pretty basic piece of equipment. It heats your home, and

is comprised of a blower motor to move air, a heating element to heat air, and a thermostat to tell the furnace when to turn on and off.

There are several options available, however, that can increase efficiency and air quality.

So, how do you know you need new furnace?

Jared Staley of Staley's Plumbing Heating and Air Conditioning said that some people simply want to take advantage of rebates, or just upgrade to a more efficient,

new furnace. "Or they have no choice," he said. Maybe the heat exchanger is cracked, leaking fluid, and the whole unit has to be condemned as unsafe.

John Davis, service manager for Blessing Plumbing and Heating Company said that the average lifetime of a furnace is 15 to 20 years. While furnaces can usually be repaired as long as the heat exchanger is pressurized and not leaking, little repairs can start adding up, and certain parts can be difficult to find. "Once they start adding up, you might think of putting your dollars into a newer, more efficient piece of equipment," Davis said.

If it is time to get a new furnace, it's also time to get quotes. Davis suggests two or three to make sure they are all in same ballpark. He added that it's important for the quotes to be "comparing apples to apples." The efficiency features and warrantees should be similar.

Staley said competition is a good thing. "It drives cost down, it keeps everyone honest," he said. Different opinions and perspectives can be helpful.

A furnace is not a cheap item to replace and the final cost including materials and labor varies.

Staley said it could cost between \$2,200 to \$4,000 for an average furnace, depending on what the homeowner has already and needs to replace. There are air cleaner options that are available, like adding a HEPA (high efficiency particulate) filter, which could be good in the long run. "Air quality is pretty important," Staley said, especially with the tightly insulated houses of today.

Davis said an average furnace can cost about \$3,000 to \$5,000, also depending on a lot of factors, such as if the home has central air.

"You want to make sure whoever does it, does a load calculation to make sure it is being sized properly," Davis said. He said over-sizing a furnace is actually a typical problem. A furnace that is too large for the home will run in short cycles,

meaning it runs for a period of time, and then shuts off, instead of heating the come steadily. "It doesn't lead to good comfort

in the home," he said.

If the furnace is too small, it won't be able to keep up with the load on very cold days. He said this is why some furnaces are multistage. They can run for a longer

cycle on a lower firing rate for steady heat.

"If you undersize it, it's certainly not going to heat your home in extreme cold days," said Dave Lamb of Dave Lamb Heating & Cooling in Fenton. "If it's too large, it will kick on and off, which is less efficient than staying on most the time. You'll have hot and cold spots in the house because it kicks on and off so often."

Dan Lamb of D & T Heating and Cooling in

Byron said small furnaces won't keep up with the work load, and big furnaces burn too much fuel.

Thanksgiving marks the beginning of the most festive holiday season of the year and a great time to reunite with family and old friends.

Whether at a party at home or out on the town, here are a few festive cocktails sure to warm the cockles of your heart.



Cocoa Raspberry Heaven

- 1 oz. plus 1 tsp. raspberry liqueur (Chambord's nice)
- 1 oz. white crème de cacao
- 8 oz. hot chocolate
- whipped cream

• 1 fresh raspberry (optional) Pour raspberry liqueur and white crème de cacao in a cappuccino mug. Add hot chocolate and stir. Top with a dollop of whipped cream. Drizzle a teaspoon of Chambord on top of the whipped cream. Top with a fresh raspberry.



Hot Peppermint Rod

- bartender spoon
- vodka
- peppermint schnapps
- grenadine syrup
- hot water
- whipped cream
- peppermint rod

Fill Irish coffee mug with two parts vodka, two parts peppermint schnapps, two parts grenadine syrup (for color). Add hot water to fill mug and top with whip cream. Garnish with a peppermint rod and grenadine drizzled over the whipped cream.



Warm apple pie cocktail

- 6 oz. apple cider (heated)
- 2 oz. Tuaca liqueur
- whipped cream
- pinch of cinnamon and nutmeg
- 1 cinnamon stick

In a glass coffee mug or heat-resistant goblet, combine your heated cider and Tuaca. Top with whipped cream. Sprinkle with cinnamon and nutmeg. Add cinnamon stick.











Zuzu's peach sparkler

- 1-1/2 oz. cognac
- 1/2 oz. peach schnapps
- 1/4 oz. simple syrup
- 1 half peach (crushed)
- 1 lemon wedge
- 1 orange wedge
- 1 peach slice (garish)
- 1 mint sprig (garnish)
- Crushed ice

In a shaker glass, add the peach, mint leaves, lemon and orange and muddle together. Add regular ice, the remaining ingredients and shake. Pour into a long-stemmed wineglass filled with crushed ice.



Appleberry Pie Cocktail

- 2-1/2 oz. cognac (ask your liquor store for a good one)
- 2-1/2 oz. apple juice
- 1/2 oz. simple syrup
- 5 red grapes
- 5 raspberries
- 3 blueberries
- 2 blackberries
- 3 blueberries and 2 raspberries (garnish) Muddle all of the fruit in a glass cocktail shaker. Add ice. Add cognac and apple juice. Shake and strain over fresh ice in a large wine goblet. Garnish with a mix of blueberries and raspberries.



Whiskey buck cocktail

- 50 ml Irish whiskey
- 1 tablespoon ginger syrup (recipe follows)
- fresh lime juice
- lime and grapefruit to garnish In a highball glass, squeeze the juice of one lime wedge. Fill glass with ice cubes. Add Irish whiskey and ginger syrup and stir briefly. Garnish with lime and grapefruit wedge.

- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 2 tablespoon fresh lemon juice

Kauai is Hawaii's fourth largest island and is sometimes called the "Garden Island," which is an entirely accurate description. The oldest and northernmost island in the Hawaiian chain is draped in emerald valleys, sharp mountain spires and jagged cliffs aged by time and the elements. Centuries of growth have formed tropical rainforests, forking rivers and cascading waterfalls. Some parts of Kauai are only accessible by sea or air, revealing views beyond your imagination. You can kayak the Wailua River, snorkel on Poipu Beach, hike the trails of Kokee State Park, or go zip-lining above Kauai's lush valleys.

Molokai

Hawaii's fifth largest island, Molokai is only 38 miles long and 10 miles across at its widest point and is home to the highest sea cliffs in the world and the longest continuous fringing reef. Molokai remains true to its island roots, with a high percentage of its population being of Native Hawaiian ancestry who continue to preserve their rural lifestyle thanks to their love of the land. Whether you're led by a guide along the cliffs leading to Kalaupapa National Historical Park or discovering Papohaku Beach, one of Hawaii's largest white-sand beaches, Molokai is truly an island of outdoor adventure where Hawaii's past comes alive. Lanai

The smallest inhabited island in Hawaii, Lanai offers big enticements to its visitors. Only nine miles from Maui yet a world away, Lanai can feel like two places. The first is found in luxurious resorts where visitors can indulge in world-class amenities and championshiplevel golf. The other is found bouncing along the island's rugged back roads in a 4-wheel-drive vehicle to explore off-the-beaten-path treasures.

Weather:

August is the hottest month in Hawaii with an average temperature of 80 degrees F, and the coldest is January at 73 degrees F, with the most daily sunshine hours at 11 in July. The wettest month is November with an average of 4.88 inches of rain.

Favorite traditional foods:

A few of Hawaii's favorite traditional foods include **Poke**, a raw fish salad served as an appetizer in Hawaiian cuisine, and sometimes as a main course. **Saimin** is a noodle soup dish developed by different immigrant groups in Hawaii. Inspired by Japanese ramen, Chinese

mein, and Filipino pancit, saimin was developed during Hawaii's plantation era. Spam musubi is a popular snack and lunch food in Hawaii composed of a slice of grilled Spam on top of a block of rice, wrapped together with nori in the tradition of Japanese omusubi. Cha siu bao is a Cantonese barbecue-pork-filled bun. The buns are filled with barbecueflavored cha siu pork. They are served as a type of dim sum during yum cha and are sometimes sold in Chinese bakeries. Loco moco is a meal in the contemporary cuisine of Hawaii. There are many variations, but the traditional loco moco consists of white rice, topped with a hamburger patty, a fried egg, and brown gravy. A malasada is a Portuguese confection, made of egg-sized balls of yeast dough that are deep-fried in oil and coated with granulated sugar. They were first made by inhabitants of the Madeira islands

Airfare:

Roundtrip airfare from Detroit to Honolulu can range from about \$600 to approximately \$1,000 depending on time of year.

Languages

Hawaii is the only American state to have two official languages, Hawaiian and English. However, a third unofficial language is also widely spoken, Pidgin which is a slang combining words from many aspects of island life and culture.

The current official Hawaiian alphabet consists of 13 letters: five vowels (Aa, Ee, Ii, Oo, Uu) and eight consonants (Hh, Kk, Ll, Mm, Nn, Pp, Ww, okina). Alphabetic order differs from the normal Latin order in that the vowels come first, then the consonants.







trish delish

There is something ridiculously satisfying about a rich, decadent meal... a meal fit for Italian Royalty. This is where Osso Buco (aka, Milanese braised beef shanks) comes in. Osso Buco is traditionally made with veal but it is JUST as amazing with beef shank. The shank is a relatively

inexpensive cut of meat, but with slow braising... it becomes priceless. The shank comes from the leg portion of a steer or heifer. Prepare this dish for a dinner party and the accolades you receive will validate its deliciousness! And, do yourself a favor. Do all of your chopping and prepping ahead of time. It's so worth it, and it makes the meal come together very easily! OK, lets begin! — Trish

INGREDIENTS

- 1.5 c. finely chopped onion
- 1 c. finely chopped carrott
- 1/2 c. finely chopped celery
- 2 cloves garlic, minced • 1/4 c. butter melted
- 4 crosscut beef shanks, preferably 1.5 2 in. thick
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp pepper
- 1/2 c. AP flour
- 1/2 c. extra virgin olive oil
- 1/c. dry white wine (I use pinot grigio)
- 28 oz. can plum tomatoes, undrained and chopped
- OR 3 c. coarsly chopped tomato
- 2 c. low sodium chicken broth
- 1/2 cup chopped or 1 tbsp dried parsley
- 2 bay leaves
- 1/2 tsp basil 1/2 tsp thyme
- Cooked rice (enough for 4 servings)

Prep all veggies by chopping as described. In a dutch oven, saute onion, carrot, celery and garlic in the butter until tender, remove from heat and set aside. Preheat oven to 350. Salt and pepper the beef shanks and dredge in flour. Heat olive oil in a large skillet and sear the shanks on both sides. Remove and place in the dutch oven with vegaies. Discard oil from skillet and add wine over medium-high heat until it reduces to about 1/2 cup (about 8 minutes). Stir in tomato, and all remaining ingredients except cooked rice and bring to a boil. Once boiling, pour over beef and veggies in dutch oven. Cover and bake at 350 for 2 hours. When done, discard bay leaves. Serve over rice, and ladle the "gravy" or "juice" over the dish. Note: Dip the marrow out of the bones using a small fork. It is so delicious, you won't be sorry! It is a delicacy!
