Christmas gift?

■ Fewer puppies up for adoption — more adult pets available

Fenton — Prince Charming is a 16-week-old shepherd mix puppy who hangs out near Director Jody Maddock's office at Adopt-A-Pet in Fenton. True to his name, he is very charming and affectionate. He likes dogs and humans alike.

Veterinarians, however, initially recommended he be euthanized.

His spine is twisted, so he has to pull his legs behind him if he wants to play. He doesn't seem to notice his handicap, but it's going to get worse, and will take a special family to adopt him, knowing what his condition entails.

Maddock estimates there is 30 percent more interest in adoptions during the holidays, but this doesn't necessarily result in more adoptions.

During the holidays, the shelter still cautions against adoptions as a "gift" or a rash decision. "This is a lifelong commitment ... this is adding a member to your household and it needs to be a well thought-out

decision," she said.

Sometimes families adopt before they've really thought out their schedules.

Potential families are counseled about making sure there's room in the home for their new friend. Still, in the last five years, they've expanded the criteria they use for allowing people to adopt, Maddock said.

Saving an old friend

When my husband and I were first married, we lived in a house on Center Street in Holly. It was just down the street from the old Holly schools administration building, the front of which faces College Street.

When we lived the neighborhood,

the building was still the Holly Area Schools administration building.

When our son Sean was a toddler we liked to walk down to the fenced-in play area, located next to the admin

building. Sean and I spent hours in the play area, swinging on the swings and digging around in the sandbox. We brought his little trucks and shovels and played all kinds of cool pretend stuff.

There were times when Sean would play in the sandbox and I would just sit on one of the swings looking at the admin building. For some reason I was always fascinated by it and what it was like in years past.

A few years later, in 1995 to be exact, I started working as a reporter for the Tri-County Times. Covering Holly Area Schools news and activities was part of my job. I remember attending my first Holly Board of Education meetings in that building.

Throughout the years, I also had a chance to learn more about the facility. According to some writings by the late Russell D. Haddon, President Franklin Delano Roosevelt in 1933 legislated the Federal Emergency Relief Act (FERA), which provided the hiring of teachers

and a full year of college for adults.

Haddon said Wayne State University established a freshman college in Holly and enrolled some 60 Holly, Fenton and Davisburg adults. Classes were held in spare rooms in the Bensett building, known as the Community Education and Holly Schools Administrative office.

Haddon said his 37 hours earned in Holly were fully accepted at Eastern Michigan University and launched his professional career. He returned to his Holly Freshman College building 30 years later, in 1965, to occupy the Holly Area Schools superintendent's chair for 12 years.

In 2007, the building was sold to The River church, which they used for Sunday services and other activities until their new East Holly Road facility was completed.

Pastor Cliff Powell said at the time that he hoped the building would continue to have a positive impact on the Holly area for many years to come, and not become an abandoned relic.

On Wednesday, Dec. 6, I read a news article that Cari Cucksey, owner of Re-Purpose and The Holly Vault, recently announced that she and her husband Vince would be opening a hotel, boutique, banquet center and Speakeasy Pub in the College Street building by the end of 2018.

Without having seen any plans, I will venture an educated guess that Ms. Cucksey and her husband have their work cut out for them if they want to accomplish this by this time next year.

I have a soft spot in my heart for this building and am not sure how I feel about these plans — but I guess it's better than tearing down another piece of local history.

In previous years, for example, a home where the new pet owners work full time might have been a disqualifying factor in adopting a puppy.

Today, they might give this family a chance because a home is still better than a shelter. At the end of the day, Adopt-A-Pet is still a shelter and is therefore

"They're in a loving environment. The puppy gets attention when they come home," Maddock said.

Changing trends

The Times published an article about adoptions during the holidays in 2012. Maddock said there's a different trend lately in the adoption world.

"In 2012, there were a lot more available puppies," she said. Adults are being adopted more, and overall adoptions are up from 2012.

She attributes this positive trend to more spaying and neutering.

Tough medical cases

While 2017 adoptions increased over 2012, they're lower than 2016 and 2015. This could be because of the difficult medical cases Adopt-A-Pet has taken on lately.

Adopt-A-Pet has earned the reputation for successfully handling these cases where a severely neglected animal is rehabilitated and adopted out to a loving home. "We feel it's our job to take on the harder medical cases," Maddock said.

While a noble endeavor, this animal takes up space and resources at the shelter. As previously reported in the Times, Adopt-A-Pet took in Harvey Dent, who was burned with acid and abused. Both of his eyes were surgically removed and his skin healed before being adopted in July.

Prince Charming will need time and resources before he can be adopted. He'll eventually get around in a cart, and unfortunately have a shorter life because of his condition.

"Eventually we'll be looking for a very very special home that can take him on and know that he won't have a long life, but he's got so much life in him," Maddock said.

Ways to help

Adopt-A-Pet is always in need of supplies for daily animal care, and funds, due

Another way to help is to take a dog or cat into your home temporarily until adoption. Fostering keeps the animal in a home environment where their personalities including compatibility with other animals can come out.



Traditionally, pizza is made with average mozzarella - but this pizza is made with Burrata, which is a fresh Italian cheese made from mozzarella and cream. The outer shell of the cheese is solid mozzarella, while the inside contains stracciatella and cream, giving it an unusual, soft texture. — Trish

INGREDIENTS

- 2 flat breads
- 2 ripe tomatoes
- 4 oz Burrata cheese
- 1 tbsp olive oil (not shown)
- 1 tbsp tomato paste
- 1 tsp basil pesto
- 1 shallot, halved
- 2 cloves garlic
- Big handful of spinach leaves
- Salt, Pepper, and red pepper flake (not shown)

DIRECTIONS

Preheat the oven to 450.

Dice or thinly slice the shallot. Mince garlic. Core and seed the tomatoes. Heat the olive oil in a small saucepan. Add the shallot and and saute for 3 minutes, stirring frequently. Add in the garlic, stirring constantly for 2 minutes, so it doesn't burn. Incorporate the tomato paste. Add the tomatoes and saute another 3-4 minutes, stirring occasionally. Add salt, pepper, and red pepper flake to taste. Cook 2-3 more minutes, remove from heat and set aside. In preheated oven, place the flatbread directly on the rack and par bake for 3 minutes. In a mixing bowl, mash the Burrata cheese.

Assemble the Pizzas:

Spread the sauce on the two flat breads. Dollop on the mashed Burrata cheese. Tear up spinach leaves and scatter them on top. Drizzle the Basil Pesto on. Bake on rack at 450 for 4-5 minutes or until the top is bubbly. Take care and watch them - the edges burn easily on the bread. Remove them from the oven, cool for 5 minutes, cut and enjoy!
