Can you spot a SNOWY WHITE OWL this winter?

■ An influx of this majestic Arctic bird into Michigan is making local sightings much more common

Harry Potter's faithful snowy owl companion, Hedwig, sparked interest with moviegoers in these mystical, majestic large white birds.

Now their influx into Michigan this winter has brought the magic to real life.

A large flock of migrating snowy white owls, native to the high north and Arctic, are flying into our state in numbers unseen in recent years. These owls look for habitat here that reminds them of their Arctic home: very wide-open treeless spaces, places like airports, large farm fields and shorelines. Look up, you might find one perched on utility poles, barn roofs, even hay bales, as they search the open land for prey.

Jill Martin, a park naturalist at Indian Springs Metropark in White Lake, was on her way to work on Dec. 23, 2017, when she heard a bunch of crows harassing a bird. But it wasn't just any bird — Martin identified it as a snowy white owl, the first one she has ever seen in her life.

"I parked my car on the park driveway and ran along the north side of White Lake Road to get a closer look," said Martin of Rose Township.

"It flew into a farmer's field. Of course, I didn't have my binoculars with me. I just stood there and watched it. Its eyes



looked right at me. I was really excited and ran back into the park office for a pair of binoculars and went back out, but, of course, it wasn't there anymore. I feel really lucky to have been at the right place at the right time."

Another resident, Maureen Tulip of Tyrone Township, recently saw a snowy white owl on private property north of Fenton. "It was my goal for this winter to see one," said Tulip, who calls herself a "bird nerd." "They are a beautiful, beautiful bird."

Snowy white owls are easier to spot than other owls because of their size, coloring and the fact that they do a lot of their hunting for prey during daytime hours.

They're the heaviest of the North American owls.

Adults can weigh in at 5 pounds with a wingspan of up to 5 feet. A snowy owl usually eats small mammals like rodents and hares and small to medium birds, but can take down a bird as big as a Canada goose.

This year's irruption in places like the Great Lakes actually is driven by a very successful summer, with an abundance of food, according to a recent story in the Detroit Free Press.

That success was driven by a peak in the population cycle of a staple of the snowy owls' diet — lemmings, a small rodent found on the tundra. Every four years on average, the lemming population swells, making snowy owl breeding and survival of the young more prosperous. That results in an influx of these snowy creatures into places like Michigan.

While these beautiful birds are a welcome sight for winter enthusiasts and bird lovers, they are a big nuisance and safety hazard at airports, where they have to be removed or chased away.

Cold and sleepy, this too shall pass

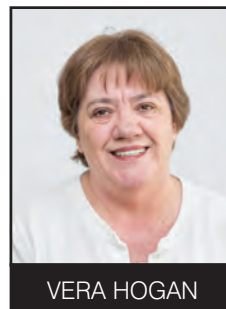

But for everyone else in Michigan, the sighting of a snowy white owl just may put the magic back into our frigid, cold winter.

If you do spot a snowy white owl:

- Keep a safe distance to observe quietly, as with any wildlife.
- Do not play bird calls from your phone or other device.
- Don't feed the owls.
- Avoid flashes when taking photos.
- Keep noises to a minimum.

- If you find an injured owl, contact your state wildlife agency or local rehabilitator.
- If you find a dead owl, contact your state wildlife agency.

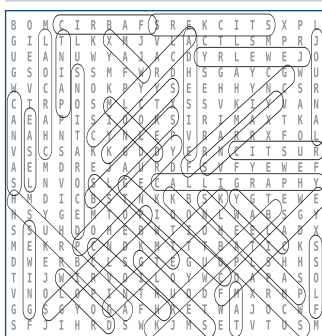

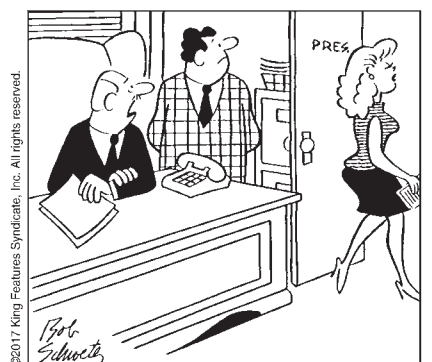

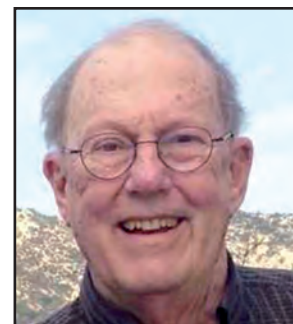
