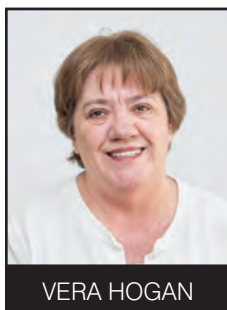
I witnessed that rolling eye moment on more than one occasion.

House Bill 5017: Create adult "cyberbullying" crime

To create a crime of "cyberbullying" another person, with sanctions ranging from 93 days in jail for a first offense to 10 years if the action causes an individual's death. The bill defines "cyberbullying" as intentionally using an electronic network to intimidate, frighten, harass or cause emotional distress. Similar bills and laws apply to minors and students but this one applies to everyone.

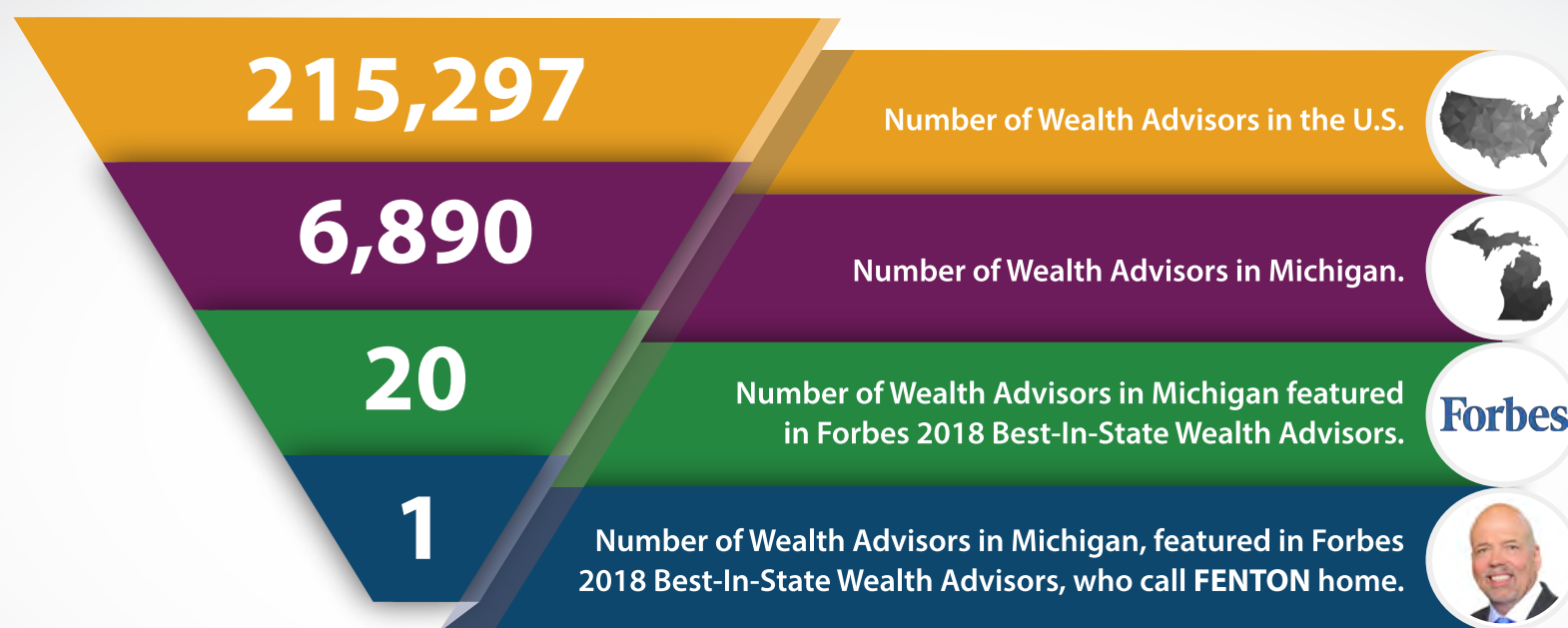
House Bill 5494: Clarify operator liability for drone crimes

To define unmanned aerial drones as "an extension of the person" for purposes of assigning responsibility for criminal misuse. Bills have been introduced to essentially add "also illegal if done with a drone" provisions to various criminal offenses, and this bill would make that presumption automatic.

◆ GRENADE BASEBALL

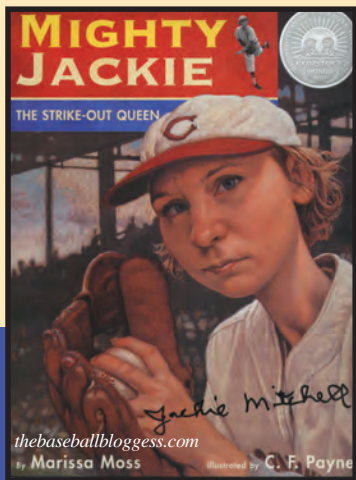
◆ BREAKING THE COLOR BARRIER

◆ 'STEEEEEEERIKE'

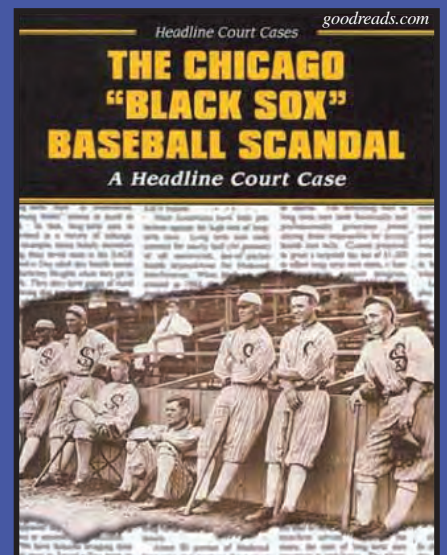

◆ Cover of a '50s Jackie Robinson comic book, Issue No. 5, 1951

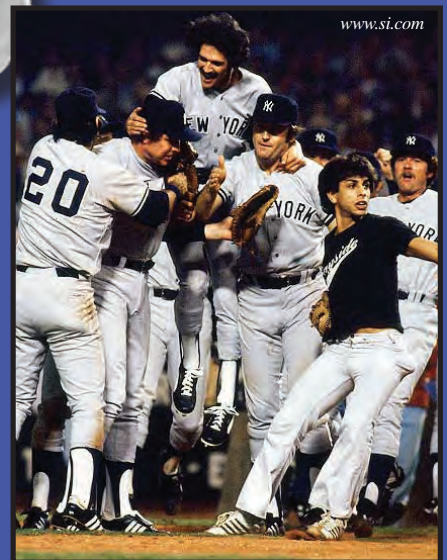
◆ BAD BOYS OF BASEBALL

In 1919, the Chicago White Sox earned the name "Black Sox" when eight players were accused of intentionally losing the World Series. Because he was kicked out, he is also ineligible for the Hall of Fame.



◆ MOST WINS

The Church of the Holy Sepulchre is believed to be the site of Jesus' crucifixion and hence regarded as one of the most important Christian sites in Israel. It's an impressive looking church on the inside, perhaps less so from the outside where it's wedged between other buildings. The various sites throughout the church mark various spots in Jesus' final hours and in his death.

The **Church of all Nations**, along with the adjoining **Garden of Gethsamane**, is at the bottom of the **Mount of Olives**. Here, Jesus is believed to have conducted his last prayers before being betrayed by Judas and then captured by the Romans. Gethsamane is believed to have been a garden even in Jesus' time and is a lovely, tranquil spot. It is here that Jesus and the Disciples came after the Last Supper, and here where Jesus gave his last sermon.

Nazareth is the largest Arab city in Israel with a population of over 60,000, of which some 31 percent are Christians. Since Jesus spent much of his childhood here, Nazareth has ever since been closely associated with Christianity and attracted many pilgrims throughout the last 2,000 years.

There are a number of Christian sites in Nazareth, including the Greek Orthodox Church of the Archangel Gabriel (built over the freshwater spring known as "Mary's Well"), the Greek Catholic "Synagogue Church" (site of the synagogue where a young Jesus was taught, and where he later preached), and the Church of St. Joseph (built over a cave identified as the "workshop" of Jesus' father Joseph).

The Jesus Trail

This recently created hike has fast become one of the must-sees for Christian tourists also interested in experiencing some of the culture that thrives through Galilee.

The Jesus Trail is a beautiful trail, starting from Nazareth and ending on the shores of the Sea of Galilee, some 40 miles (60km) away.

"The town of Jesus," Capernaum

Located on the northern shore of the Sea of Galilee, the small town of Capernaum is another of the important Christian sites in Israel. It is mentioned several times in the Bible because Jesus lived here for some time and was in charge of the ministry there. There are several churches here that celebrate the life of Jesus, including the Church of the House of St. Peter, a large house of several rooms and a courtyard that Jesus chose as his home, and the Synagogue, where Jesus often preached and performed miracles. Both these locations have been restored and converted into a museum.

The Mount of Beatitudes

If you know your Bible well, you will be familiar with The Sermon on the Mount, one of the most famous of all sermons. Some questions remain about the authenticity of the actual site where Jesus delivered his sermon, but for some 1,600 years, it has been accepted as being a small hill known as the Mount of Beatitudes, overlooking the Sea of Galilee.

Tabgha

Tabgha is located on the northwestern shore of the Sea of Galilee and is the traditional site of the feeding of the 5,000 with five loaves and two fish (marked today by the Church of the Multiplication). It is also believed to be the place of the sighting of Jesus' third resurrection appearance (marked by the Church of the Primacy of St. Peter), where Jesus conferred authority of the church to Simon Peter.

Bethsaida

Just north of the Sea of Galilee, where the Jordan River enters the Sea of Galilee, Bethsaida is perhaps one of the lesser-known Christian sites in Israel, but well worth seeing for those interested in revisiting the sites of miracles. It is here Jesus is believed to have healed a blind man.

Bethsaida is also known as the birthplace of three of the Apostles, Peter, Andrew and Philip. Recently rediscovered, there is some dispute as to its exact location but the site known as Bethsaida has a lot to offer archeological fans over its 21-acre site: there is even an old cobbled street from the days of Jesus.

House Bill 4265: Mandate 3-foot clearance when passing bicycle

To require drivers passing a bicyclist going the same direction to stay at least 3 feet to the left if practicable. The bill would facilitate this by also letting drivers cross the centerline in a no-passing zone while passing, if it is safe to do so. The same 3-foot margin would apply to passing a

bicycle on the left where this is not prohibited under current traffic laws.

House Bill 4106: Give high school graduation credits for internship or work

To require school districts to give 9th-through 12th-grade students credit toward state graduation requirements for spending at least four hours per week getting work experience or in an internship. The credit would equal that granted for taking one traditional course. Students would be excused from one class period of instructional time for each day they work or intern. This would not apply to students who are struggling in school as defined in the bill, and would be subject to various specified conditions.

HAM & POTATO SOUP



"This is a delicious recipe for ham and potato soup that a friend gave to me. It is very easy and the great thing about it is that you can add additional ingredients, more ham, potatoes, etc and it still turns out great."

- INGREDIENTS**
- 3 1/2 cups peeled and diced potatoes
 - 1/3 cup diced celery
 - 1/3 cup finely chopped onion
 - 3/4 cup diced cooked ham
 - 3 1/4 cups water
 - 2 tablespoons chicken bouillon granules
 - 1/2 teaspoon salt, or to taste
 - 1 teaspoon ground white or black pepper, or to taste
 - 5 tablespoons butter
 - 5 tablespoons all-purpose flour
 - 2 cups milk

DIRECTIONS
Combine the potatoes, celery, onion, ham and water in a stockpot. Bring to a boil, then cook over medium heat until potatoes are tender, about 10 to 15 minutes. Stir in the chicken bouillon, salt and pepper. In a separate saucepan, melt butter over medium-low heat. Whisk in flour with a fork, and cook, stirring constantly until thick, about 1 minute. Slowly stir in milk as not to allow lumps to form until all of the milk has been added. Continue stirring over medium-low heat until thick, 4 to 5 minutes. Stir the milk mixture into the stockpot, and cook soup until heated through. Serve immediately.
