LEGISLATIVE ACTIVITY

MichiganVotes.org is a free, non-partisan website created by the Mackinac Center for Public Policy to provide concise, non-partisan, plain-English descriptions of every bill and vote in the Michigan House and Senate. This report was released Thursday, March 29.

The Legislature is on spring break with no sessions scheduled until April 10. Rather than votes, this report contains some noteworthy legislative proposals to amend the constitution. To become law these require a two-thirds vote in the House and Senate and approval by voters.

House Joint Resolution HH: Ban conflict of interest voting by legislators

Introduced by Rep. Scott Dianda (D), to place before voters in the next general election a constitutional amendment to prohibit legislators from voting on bills in which they have a direct financial interest. See also House Bill 5730, which would criminalize legislator conflict of interest voting; and House Bill 4968, which would ban local planning and zoning board members from voting on matters in which they have a financial interest. All three measures have been referred to committee with no further action taken at this time.

Senate Joint Resolution Q: Make "best interests of the child" paramount over parental rights

Introduced by Sen. Curtis Hertel, Jr. (D), to place before voters in the next general election a constitutional amendment that would establish that public officials' determination of the best interests of a child "are paramount to the rights of a parent and all other factors in determining whether parental rights should be terminated" in child custody proceedings, juvenile justice cases or cases of child abuse and neglect. Referred to committee, no further action at this time.

House Joint Resolution II: Establish parental rights as paramount

Introduced by Rep. Gary Glenn (R), to place before voters in the next general election a Constitutional amendment to establish that, parents and legal guardians have a natural and fundamental right to direct the care, education, and upbringing of their children. No government action shall burden, abridge, or hinder this natural, fundamental right unless it is in furtherance of a compelling governmental interest and is the least restrictive means of furthering that compelling governmental interest." Referred to committee, no further action at this time.



Transparency, what does it mean?

Transparency — that's the latest "buzzword" we'll be hearing often before the August and November elections.

I asked myself what that really means recently, after hearing from some parents in the Fenton Area Public Schools district regarding the changes for the 2018-2019 school year, which include a pre-Labor Day start date. These are not minor

changes so an article was published on the front page

of our Sunday, March 25 edition. Block scheduling and an after Labor Day school start have been in place for at least more than a decade. A change to either is important news.

How this information was disseminated by the school district was of concern to parents, who said they did not

know about it until they read my article in print and online. It garnered more than 5,000 page views on our Facebook page.

I questioned Superintendent Adam Hartley how information about the changes were distributed to families in the district. He said all of the information is on the district's website, which it is. He also said the early school start was in his December 2017 and January 2018 newsletters. Well, they were, but the only reference to an early school start

was on the second page of the new calendar, included with the newsletters. At the top of the second page of the calendar is a sentence about the district applying for the waiver to allow an early start. Right below that it lists Tuesday, Aug. 28 as the first day of school.

Do we really have to make finding unexpected information a "Where's Waldo" moment? Would it have hurt to include on the front page of the newsletters the important new change? Just one sentence - maybe in bold.

There also was a public hearing about the early, pre-Labor Day start date, on Feb. 5.

Dr. Hartley said, "... we followed our normal procedures for posting public hearings and/or closed sessions, following the law and making sure we are as transparent as possible, as we are with every meeting."

OK, there was a notice on the district's website announcing the public hearing. It did not, however, say on that notice what it was about. But the agenda for that meeting, if you bothered to look after seeing nothing on the notice, did reference the pre-Labor Day start.

Notice of the public meeting, with no indication of what it was about, was emailed to all local media, including me. Shame on me for not delving into it further, but I don't believe anyone else did either.

I realize there are many parents who are very active in the schools. However, there are equally as many who, even though they would like to be more involved, simply don't have the time due to career and other obligations.

The public hearing was scheduled for 5 p.m. on a Monday. That cuts out any employed parent getting out of work at 5 o'clock. I know everything the district did was "legal," but failing to go above and beyond a little is not what I would call being "transparent."

BRICK KILLS PASSENGER

In 2011, a dash cam caught the shocking and heartbreaking footage of a brick flying through a windshield and killing the passenger, a 29-year-old mom. You can hear the husband screaming in the video.

AMMONIA HAZE KILLS COP

In 2000, police vehicle footage shows a man lying on the ground after he collapsed near a toppled tank with smoke coming out of it. The officer rushes out to help him, but collapses, too. The tank was leaking massive amounts of ammonia, and the police officer is seen dying in the video.

CARGO PLANE PLUMMETS

In 2013, a camera caught the footage of a passenger airplane seemingly going straight up in the air very close to the ground. The car drives along the road, and the passenger watches as the plane crosses close over the highway and crashes into the ground in a fiery explosion.



devastating is from a high-speed police chase in Texas. A police car is following a white car along the highway and the car swerves off the road. For a moment, the car is off the screen. When the car comes back into the frame, it appears that the car goes through a chainlink fence. (It's more likely the car went around the fence when it was off frame).

PLANE SLICES BRIDGE

In Taiwan, a person is driving along a long, narrow bridge. Dash cam footage catches a plane flying close to the bridge, right in front of the vehicle, and tilting just enough to slice through part of the bridge. It doesn't appear anyone was hurt in the video.



SKETCHY ROADBLOCK

In 2014, a car driving along the highway at night is stopped by a random person setting up cones along the road. The man, who's not an officer, goes to the vehicle's passenger window. He reaches for something in his pocket then the car speeds off, between the cones.

CANADIAN HELLFIRE

In May, 2016, there was a massive wildfire in Fort McMurray, Canada. Dash cam footage shows a car driving through neighborhoods to get to escape the fire. With fire and smoke on both sides of the road, and the fire occasionally raining down from the sky. It supposedly resembles...

UNPROVOKED SHOOTING

Dash cam footage from a police officer shows the officer pulling over someone for speeding. The man immediately gets out of his car, with a mask on and one hand behind his back holding a gun. The officer and the man exchange fire and the officer gets hit in the side. The man speeds off.

and gigolo is pronounced with a short "i." Again, he can in no way be compared to an actual gigolo (even though he is an American), but you'll never forget his name, right?

And who can ever forget Sharon Stone, the editor. It's just basic instinct that everyone remembers her name.

Seriously though, one of the best ways to make a favorable first impression, and to get ahead socially or in business, is to remember people's

names. Dale Carnegie said it best with, "A person's name is to him or her the sweetest and most important sound in any language."

Everyone can improve their ability to remember names if they make a commitment to remembering people's names. Forgetting names is due less to a bad memory than the lack of application. You can remember names if you want to and work at it.

Concentrate on paying attention to the person's name when you first hear it, and forming an impression of the person. The more vividly you observe people's physical characteristics, the more likely you are to remember them. Use all of your senses to form the most striking impression possible.

Repetition helps engrave the name in your memory. Use the name immediately.

Repeat it silently to yourself. Comment on the name, if possible. Use it occasionally in the conversation without overdoing it. Use it when leaving and write it down afterwards.

Remembering someone's name through association, like we did above with the Times' editorial staff, can be more fun.

Try to make an association between the person's face and an image the name suggests. Even if you can't create an image for the name, don't despair. Just by working on it, just by trying to figure

out an image that goes along with the name, you have reinforced your memory.

If you remember visual images most easily, try creating an image based on the name and

linking it to some physical characteristic of the person.

Imagine a ham that weighs a ton spinning on the end of Mrs. Hamilton's nose. Picture an old-fashioned car jack

under Jack's prominent jaw. See margarine melting through Mar-

garet's curly, blonde hair.

If you are more attuned to sounds, make a rhyme, associating the name with your impression of the person. Or link the person's name to a song lyric, such as:

Dave needs a shave.

Latrice is Patty's niece. Michelle, ma belle (The Beatle's tune)

If you are more comfortable dealing with sensory feelings and gut instincts, try linking the name to the impression the person makes or to a reaction you have to the person. For example:

Martin Peck is a pain in the neck. Suzanne Patterson has sweaty palms. Paula is pushy.

All this takes time and energy and that's the point. It makes people feel important. It wins you their good will. And it opens the door to successful relationships.

Remembering numbers

We all have numbers that mean something to us - birthdays, anniversaries, bank accounts, credit cards, user IDs and passwords. The secret to remembering new numbers is to find connections between the number you want to remember. For example, a person who is trying to remember 7018, but can't think of anything to associate with 70, should move to the number 18. That might conjure up a song, like "I'm Eighteen," by Alice Cooper. As the music plays in my head, imagine a now 70-year-old Alice Cooper singing the song.'

Look for patterns. For longer numbers, look for relationships in the numbers. Do the first two add up to the third one? Do you see a sequence of odd or even numbers? Then use those patterns to create a story with the more arbitrary numbers. For example, if the number is 6700 0123, note the pattern "0123" and figure out how it can be remembered using 6700. You could say something like, "Well, once I spend my credit limit of \$6,700, I'll have to start over at zero and build it back up again one dollar at a time - 1, 2, 3.

Learn actively. Our muscles have better memories than our brains, so don't just think the number. Say it out loud at least three times. When you say it, your brain has to tell the muscles of your mouth how to say it and your ear has to hear the words and pass them along. It forces you to use a lot more of your brain. Also, try writing the number down a couple of times, or even singing it to a memorable tune.

Convert numbers to words or images. Consider assigning the numbers 1 through 9 a letter equivalent: A=1, B=2, etc. So if your new PIN number is 2737, say, you'd convert it to the letters BGCG. Once you think of a sentence with those letters, such as "Bad Guys Can't Get," as in "bad guys can't get this number," you'll be able to recall it more easily.

What is behind cat scratching?

When frisky kitties shred new sofas, the cats probably did not do it out of spite or even aggression. Cats do not claw at things because they are inherently bad pets. Rather, the urge to scratch is buried within their DNA.

According to the pet adoption and animal welfare resource the Animal Care Centers of New York City, scratching is a normal part of cat behavior. Scratching is a good form of exercise for cats, enabling cats to stretch out their limbs and paws. Scratching also serves the purpose of removing the outer nail sheaths so they can be shed and the nails can be naturally maintained. VetStreet.com says that cats also scratch to leave visual and olfactory markers to other animals. Glands that are located between the pads of the paws leave odors behind wherever the cat has scratched. Other cats know to investigate or avoid the area thanks to the scent and visual hint.

Unfortunately for cat owners, scratching can be problematic when the healthy behavior is not focused on objects that should be scratched. When furniture, walls, bedding, or more are targeted by cats, the damage can be irreparable. Presenting alternatives that are fun can focus cats' attention on scratching elsewhere. Experiment with store-bought or homemade scratching posts. The back of a carpet square, some corrugated cardboard or a rope-covered

post may suffice, offers The Humane Society of the United States.

Scratching where it is not desired can also be dissuaded by placing an appropriate scratching post next to the off-limits item. Use food treats as rewards when the cat scratches responsibly. Place double-sided tape or aluminum foil on items that shouldn't be scratched, as those textures often keep cats away.

If redirecting the scratching does not work, cat owners can seek the help of a veterinarian for more advice.
