That wouldn't be the end of it. My dad would then take us to a nursing home or assisted

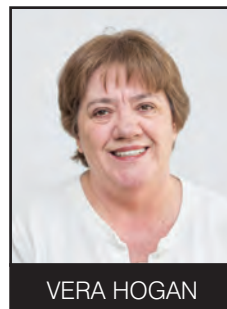

MICHIGAN VOTES
LEGISLATIVE ACTIVITY

MichiganVotes.org is a free, non-partisan website created by the Mackinac Center for Public Policy to provide concise, non-partisan, plain-English descriptions of every bill and vote in the Michigan House and Senate. This report was released Friday, March 6.

The Legislature was on spring break with no sessions scheduled until April 10. Rather than votes, this report contains some interesting or noteworthy bill introductions.

Senate Bill 651: Mandate continuing education for mortuary professionals

Introduced by Sen. Rick Jones (R), to impose a continuing education mandate on licensed funeral home operators, and establish a different combination of education and apprenticeship requirements to get this license. Reported from committee, pending in the full Senate.

Senate Bill 751: Revise details of government's permission to give shampoos

Introduced by Sen. Marty Knollenberg (R), to relax a few of the extensive and detailed licensure restrictions imposed on cosmetology students before they can give a shampoo and blow-dry (but not other services), subject to specified limits and conditions. Reported from committee, pending in the full Senate.

Senate Bill 683: Impose full licensure on acupuncturists

Introduced by Sen. Margaret O'Brien (R), to convert a registration mandate now imposed on acupuncturists into a more comprehensive licensure regime, including training and apprenticeship requirements, license fees, statutory and administrative regulations and more. Referred to committee, no further action at this time.

Senate Bill 826: Impose licensure on naturopathic physicians

Introduced by Sen. Rick Jones (R), to impose licensure and regulation on "naturopathic physicians," with license fees, education requirements and more. The bill defines naturopathic medicine as "a system of practice that is based on the natural healing capacity of individuals." Reported from committee, pending in the full Senate.

Senate Bill 916: Impose licensure mandate on "automatic recycling kiosks"

Introduced by Sen. Mike Kowall (R), to require second-hand goods and junk dealers that use an "automatic recycling kiosk" to obtain a license from each local government where one is located. "Automatic recycling kiosk" is defined as one that verifies identity by "remote examination of a seller's government-issued identification card by a live representative during all hours of operation," and that takes a picture of the seller and goods. Referred to committee, no further action at this time.

SUGGESTIONS FROM OUR READERS ON FACEBOOK

Cory — We've seen folks complain about their experience in not being able to ride or see anything they wanted, not being able to dine at certain establishments, etc. The key is preparation, it all starts and ends there.

You must book fast passes in advance. We walked right into attractions that had 90-plus minute wait times. Fast passes are free, you simply need to take the time and book them. If you're staying in Disney you can book 60 days before your trip, if not you can book 30 days beforehand. In addition, you can book dining and other experiences six months in advance without park tickets.

Lastly, download the Disney app to track your schedule throughout the day, where you need to be and when, including GPS navigation through the park, book/change fast passes, etc.

Our trip this year was amazing, we spent two days in Magic Kingdom, one in Epcot and one in Hollywood Studios. We rode everything we wanted multiple times, waited no more than 20 minutes for any ride during peak season, ate lunch in Cinderella's castle, had lunches and dinners with princesses at various places, ate lunch in the west wing of the Beast's castle, and in every single event the characters engaged with us during our meals (signatures, photos and conversation). None of this would have been possible without planning and preparation, and most of all fast passes. The best trip we've taken to date, 100 percent due to preparation.

Jodi — **Avoid peak times.** You can get better rates at Disney hotels and discounts on dining. If you plan to attend at a peak time, arrive early because they close after the first 100,000 people enter the gates regardless if you have passes.

Melissa — **Fast passes,** getting to parks at rope drop. If you have little kids that can't ride larger rides, you can get a child swap voucher and after one parent rides, other one can use fast pass line. Plan a vacation where you can relax after your Disney vacation, you're going to need it.

Janine — **Go during non-peak** times. Late February was good for us. We had the meal plan and were able to eat where we wanted without reservations. We had moderate lines but were able to get through them easily.

Randy — **If you don't** want to stay at the park look to rent a house. We have always done that and booked one with a pool. Also most are fairly well equipped to cook your own meals so you don't have to eat out all the time.

Scott — **When you think** you have saved enough money, save more. The mouse is a pickpocket.

John — **Go early.** Go back to your hotel for an early afternoon swim and a nap for two to three hours. Come back refreshed in late afternoon when crowds are reduced and enjoy the rest of the day — especially if you have small children.

What to see, what to do

The Magic Kingdom, home of Mickey and Minnie Mouse and the Cinderella Castle, is one of four Disney parks that also include Epcot, Disney's Hollywood Studios and Disney's Animal Kingdom.

Each of the parks has its own advantages for kids and families. While Epcot is more adult-themed (don't miss the Epcot International Food and Wine Festival from late September through mid-November), there are still plenty of kid-pleasers in that park as well, including its Frozen Ever After ride and Turtle Talk With Crush show.

The new Toy Story Land at Disney's Hollywood Studios now makes that park especially kid-friendly. For families with preschoolers, Magic Kingdom's Fantasyland is the perfect destination. Disney's Animal Kingdom just might be the most kid-friendly of all the parks, with its DinoLand USA, petting zoo and Kilimanjaro Safari.

Disney World also includes two water parks, Blizzard Beach and Typhoon Lagoon, but with one-day passes priced at \$65 per person, you may want to enjoy your hotel's swimming pools and water features instead.

For Disney fun without the sticker shock, spend a day at Disney Springs (formerly Downtown Disney), featuring unique shops, one-of-a-kind restaurants (make reservations first, for popular ones like T-Rex) and lively entertainment.

Plan, plan, plan

Before making reservations, do your research first and plan your trip well in advance. Otherwise, you'll be disappointed with limited dining options, sold-out Disney character events and long, long ride waits. Better yet, take advantage of the knowledge and experience of local travel agents to book your trip.

Make sure to use Disney FastPass+, a reservation system that allows a guest to book advance reservations for experiences and attractions in the park — up to six days ahead for resort guests, and up to 30 days in advance for off-resort guests. Dining and character event reservations can be made up to six months in advance.

Speaking of dining, Disney Dining Plans are another way to make eating at Disney more affordable and convenient. You can make all your dining and FastPass+ ride reservations at disneyworld.disney.go.com.

How much will your Disney World vacation cost?

According to Disneytouristblog.com, a five-day, four-night Walt Disney World vacation for a family of four will cost about \$2,700, not including transportation. Adding average airfare for four from Detroit to Orlando, you can add another \$1,400 onto your trip cost. Your trip will total about \$4,100 for a "moderate" hotel on the Disney World property, park passes, food/dining and airfare.

If you only have one day to visit Disney World, spend that day at the Magic Kingdom — home of classic attractions like the Cinderella Castle, It's a Small World and the Haunted Mansion.

But to get the full Disney experience, you'll need to spend more than one day at just one park. You'll find that the huge expense of visiting this world-class family theme park goes down exponentially

when you spend multiple days using multi-day park passes. Your one-day pass will cost you \$104.50 per person, but buy a 10-day pass and it's just \$44.50 per person.

Of course, your park passes are only one part of your Disney vacation expense. Hotel accommodations on the resort property can range from "value" rooms, like the Disney All-Star Movie Resort at about \$100 per night to "deluxe" accommodations like The Swan or Grand Floridian that can cost more than \$600 per night in peak season.

Is it worth it to stay on the property?

One of the advantages of a Disney World vacation is its family friendliness and convenience. They've thought of

everything so you don't have to.

The advantages of staying on resort property include transportation on Disney's Magical Express from the Orlando airport to your resort hotel, as well as transportation to and from the parks every day. You'll also be able to enjoy Magic extended park hours by being a resort guest.

It's impossible to see and experience everything on your trip to Disney World, but half the fun will be in trying.



BENEFITS ORDINANCE

An Ordinance to create and establish Groveland Township's benefit and insurance plan covering public employer contributions to medical benefit plans, life insurance, long term disability insurance, accident insurance, dental & vision insurance as may from time to time be duly authorized, for eligible persons and their respective eligible dependents, and to authorize the Groveland Township Supervisor, Clerk and Treasurer to contract in the name of the Township for such plan(s); to define those classes of eligible employees who shall be covered by such plan(s) as set forth in the summary of Benefits / Insurance in the Groveland Township Employee Manual (7.3 Group Benefits / Insurance as amended 12-12-2017); to set forth the respective funding; to provide for the payroll deduction of contributions, if any, to establish the time at which existing and future employees shall become eligible for such plan; to ratify and confirm the validity of any plan in existence on the effective date of this ordinance; and to repeal all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict.

THE TOWNSHIP OF GROVELAND, OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN, ORDAINS:

Section 1: This ordinance shall be known and cited as the Groveland Township Benefits Ordinance.

Section 2: The Groveland Township Board, by action on April 9, 2018

Pursuant to Public Act 77 of 1989, as amended (MCL 41.110b), the Township of Groveland hereby creates and establishes the Groveland Township Benefits and Insurance Plan covering public employer contributions to medical benefit plans, life insurance, long term disability insurance, accident insurance, dental & vision insurance and the MERS (Municipal Employees Retirement System) Health Care Savings Program or other approved HCSP as may from time to time be duly authorized for eligible persons as enumerated herein and/or in the Groveland Township Employee Manual, (12-12-17) as amended.

Section 3: Eligibility

The benefits created, established and contracted for under this division shall cover each eligible person within the Senior Management Group and all full-time Support Staff hired before October 2, 2009, and may also cover the eligible dependents of such person as established in the Groveland Township Employee Manual: The Township reserves the right to establish the time at which existing and future full-time employees shall become eligible for such plan benefits.

Section 4: Contributions

The Township may pay the required premiums, or a portion as established by the Township Board, to cover eligible employees and their dependents under any approved Township group insurance plan or contributions made on behalf of the eligible employees under IRS rulings for Public Employer Contributions Annual Cost Limitations.

Section 5: Documentation

All the above benefits sought or provided are subject to appropriate documentation, which will control.

Section 6:

The Township hereby ratifies and confirms the validity of any life, long term disability insurance, accident insurance and dental and vision insurance coverage, or any one or more of such forms of insurance in existence on the effective date of this ordinance.

Section 7:

This ordinance shall take effect on the date of its publication. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

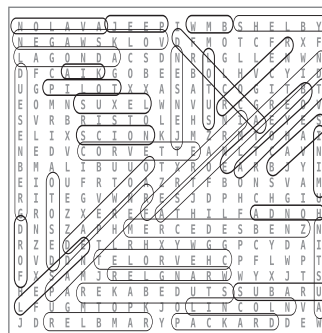

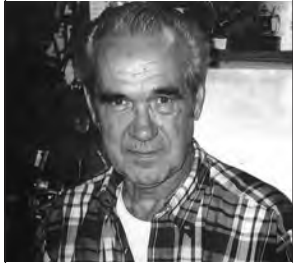

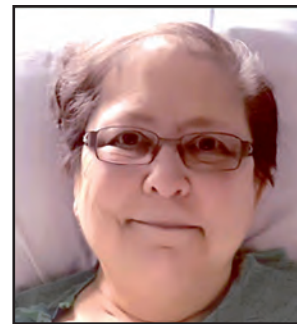

How to pet-proof a home

Tens of millions of households throughout North America include pets. The American Veterinary Medical Foundation reports that more than 80 million households in the United States include companion animals, while the 2014 Canadian Pet Market Outlook reported that 57 percent of Canadian households owned pets.

Pets are a big responsibility, and responsible pet owners recognize that the work begins even before pets come home. Pet proofing a home protects pets from accidents and injuries as they grow acclimated to their surroundings.

• **Install childproof latches.** Much like children after they learn to crawl and then walk, young pets tend to be curious, and that curiosity can put them in precarious positions. Pet owners should install childproof latches on low drawers and cabinets, especially those beneath sinks where potentially harmful cleaning products are typically stored. Curious pet paws may be able to pry or pull open cabinets and drawers, but childproof latches can make that considerably more difficult if not impossible.

• **Close toilet lids.** While images of puppies drinking from toilets may elicit some laughs, the nonprofit organization American Humane warns that chemicals in common toilet cleaners can be deadly to pets. In addition, small puppies or kittens can drown in toilets. Keep all toilet lids closed when toilets are not in use.

• **Keep potentially harmful items out of pets' reach.** Household cleaners beneath the kitchen sink are not the only items around the house that can be harmful to pets. Medications should always be stored on high shelves where pets cannot reach them. In addition, make sure all laundry room items, including detergent and dryer sheets, are stored out of pets' reach. Discuss human foods that might be harmful to pets with a veterinarian and make sure such foods are not left out where pets can reach them when you are hosting friends or family members. If necessary, make sure all foods are served on dinner tables or kitchen counters that are inaccessible to pets.

• **Conceal all wires.** Today's homes are more connected than ever before, and that of-

ten translates to more wires around the house. Make sure all wires are bundled together and out of the reach and view of pets, who may be tempted to chew on them. Even wires that are out of reach may tempt pets if they can see them, so pet owners should make concerted efforts to conceal wires.

• **Move or remove potentially poisonous plants.** Plant lovers may not have worried if their plants were poisonous when they had no intention of welcoming pets into their homes. But prospective pet owners should research each plant in their homes to make sure they're not poisonous. Move potentially poisonous plants to places where pets cannot access them. Remove any poisonous floor plants from the home before purchasing or adopting a pet.

Pets, particularly puppies and kittens, tend to be curious. Pet parents can protect pets from their own curiosity by pet proofing their homes.

PASTA PRIMAVERA

“Pasta primavera is quite a straightforward recipe; spaghetti or fettuccine tossed with an array of fresh spring vegetables. When done right, this is one of the year’s great seasonal recipes. This looks, smells, and tastes like a cool, sunny spring day.”

INGREDIENTS

- 1 bunch fresh basil
- 3 cups chicken broth, divided
- 1/2 cup olive oil
- 2 cloves garlic
- 1 pound fettuccine pasta
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 bunch green onions chopped
- 2 jalapeño peppers, seeded & diced
- 2 pinches salt
- 2 zucchinis, diced
- 1 cup chopped sugar snap peas
- 1/2 cup shelled English peas
- 1 large leek, white & light green parts only, chopped
- 1 bunch asparagus, stalks, diced, tips left whole
- 1/2 cup grated parmesan cheese, or as needed

DIRECTIONS

Fill a large pot with lightly salted water and bring to a rolling boil. Hold basil bunch by the stems and dip basil leaves in boiling water until bright green, about 2 seconds. Immediately immerse basil in ice water for several minutes until cold to stop the cooking process. Once the basil is cold, drain well. Remove basil leaves from stems and discard stems. Blend basil leaves, 1 cup chicken broth, 1/2 cup olive oil, and garlic together in a blender until smooth. Stir fettuccine into the same pot of boiling water, bring back to a boil, and cook pasta over medium heat until cooked through but still firm to the bite, about 8 minutes. Drain. Heat remaining 2 tablespoons olive oil in a large saucepan over medium heat. Cook and stir leek and green onion in hot oil until softened, about 5 minutes. Add jalapeno and salt; cook and stir until jalapeno is soft, about 5 minutes. Increase heat to medium-high. Stir 2 cups chicken broth, zucchini, sugar snap peas, and English peas into jalapeno mixture; bring to a simmer and cook for 5 minutes. Add asparagus and continue cooking until asparagus is soft, about 3 minutes more. Pour 1/4 cup basil-garlic mixture into zucchini mixture and cook and stir until heated through, about 1 minute. Remove from heat. Place pasta in a large bowl; pour zucchini mixture over pasta and pour remaining basil-garlic mixture over the zucchini mixture. Spread Parmesan cheese over the top. Toss mixture briefly to combine and tightly wrap bowl with aluminum foil. Let stand until pasta and vegetables soak up most of the juices and oil, about 5 minutes. Toss again.
