Holly business commissions muralist to create vibrant scene on Battle Alley building

Holly — Kevin Burdick of Fenton finished the mural on the back of the RHL Group Investments building in Battle Alley last week, and people are still walking up to take photos of the mural, and Burdick himself, in front of the colorful scene.

Fenton and Linden residents are famil-

iar with public art. Fenton has its sculpture show and Detroit Institute of Arts outdoor exhibits, and Linden features the colorful abstract mural on city hall.

Now, Holly has its own colorful public art. Burdick said this wave of public art is good for him. He hopes the mural can add to the appreciation of art. "It doesn't have to be in a museum," he said.

While riding in my husband's truck up Park Street in Fenton last Sunday, the road was so bumpy from potholes that my mind started wandering to what it must have been like in the 1800s.



PLACE:	Holly Board of Education Meeting Room 920 E. Baird Street, Holly, MI 48442
EFFECTIVE DATE:	Immediately upon publication

The proposed ordinance number 452 amends Ordinance 72.01, sections (A) and (B) of Chapter 72 of the Village of Holly Ordinances by amending those sections to read:

(A) No parking on any Village street during a snow emergency. A snow emergency is declared when two (2) inches of snow or more are predicted by the National Weather Service out of Flint or White Lake, whichever is higher.

(B) Parking will remain prohibited until 24 hours after the snowfall has ended.

The full text of the proposed Ordinance as amended is available for review in the Office of the Village Clerk/Treasurer, 300 East Street, Holly, Michigan 48442 during regular business hours. Comments concerning the ordinance amendment should be directed to the Village Clerk-Treasurer at the above address or by telephone to (248) 634-9571.



Everyone has a mom, but not everyone knows these 10 interesting facts about motherhood and famous moms throughout history.


In a survey of 4,000 moms by sheknows.com, it was found that...

Randy Redmond of RHL Group Investments Group commissioned Burdick.

This mural depicts a steam engine rounding a bend in the track, flanked by a pond on one side and a car racing along beside it on the other. The horizon is all trees and farmland and the sky is dotted with hot air balloons.

Burdick estimates the mural is 26 feet high and 60 feet wide, not including the smaller “pond” section. He has done more than 20 murals, and this is his largest to date.

He describes his style as “street art,” which has its roots in graffiti. While it’s all spray paint, he accommodates the preferences of the municipality he’s working in. His design is colorful, and clearly spray painted, but was originally more abstract. He made the design more realistic for the village. “You kind of have to be a little bit flexible,” he said.

The mural contains soft fades, solid swaths of color, as well as sharp dense details. This is all possible with what spray paint artists call “can control,” literally referring to the control of the finger with the spray nozzle. The best place to

see the possible sharp lines are in the cattails in the smaller section of the building.

He uses high quality acrylic spray paint, with interchangeable tips to change the spray pattern as needed. “They’re all specially made for street art, murals,” he said. He estimates he used 40 cans to paint the walls. He said his mural should last 15 years before it begins to fade.

The mural process


The mural process starts with the client. Burdick went through four to five different designs to show Redmond, and photo-shopped the images onto the building to simulate the final product.

Once Redmond and Burdick agreed, they went to the Village Council for approval. The village

approved the design, which Burdick said he appreciates. Burdick started by scraping and spraying 10 gallons of primer on the wall.

On late Monday, April 23, he projected the image of the design onto the wall to get the outlines of the design, and was painting details on Tuesday.

“You take the classic art styles and process and just adapt it to a larger scale,” he said.

Burdick has been commissioned to paint a mural on the south side of the El Topo restaurant at 113 Mill St. in Fenton. Burdick will create the mural from Monday, May 14, to Wednesday, May 16, between 11 a.m. and 3 p.m.

The public is welcome to watch. The mural is sponsored by the Fenton Arts Council, and will depict a stylized fox and eagle, spray painted with colors from the Mexican flag. The eagle is symbolic of Mexico City and connects to Fenton through various eagle sightings in the area.

How to recognize signs of heat stroke in dogs

Summer is a great time of year for people and their pets to enjoy the great outdoors and soak up some sun. Just as men and women exercise caution by applying sunscreen and staying hydrated on hot summer days, dog owners must take steps to protect their four-legged friends when bringing them outdoors.



Dog owners must be especially mindful of their dogs' behavior on hot days. Protecting dogs from extreme heat can safeguard them from heat stroke, which can be fatal.

Heat stroke can pose a serious threat to dogs on hot days. Dog owners who routinely take their pets outdoors in summer must learn how to protect canines from heat stroke and how to recognize its symptoms.

What is heat stroke?

Dogs suffer from heat stroke when their body temperatures exceed 104 F and the built-in mechanisms they rely on to cool themselves - including panting - cease to function properly. But any temperature 103 F or above is considered abnormal. According to PetMD, heat stroke is a form of non-fever hyperthermia that can lead to multiple organ dysfunction.

Is heat stroke immediately evident?

Heat stroke can overwhelm dogs quickly, so dog owners should be especially diligent and watch their dogs closely when they are spending time outside on hot days. Dogs may first suffer from mild heat-related stress or moderate exhaustion before they begin experiencing the more severe symptoms of heat stroke, so dog owners should look for signs of stress or fatigue and bring their dogs inside immediately after noticing such symptoms. The consequences of heat stroke are severe, so dog owners should always err on the side of caution.

What are the symptoms of heat stroke?

Dogs that are overheating and potentially suffering from heat stroke may exhibit a number of symptoms. Such symptoms are typically easy to spot, but dog owners still must pay close attention to their four-legged friends during summertime walks or play sessions in the backyard. According to the American Kennel Club Canine Health Foundation, signs that a dog is overheating include:

- Panting followed by disorientation and fast, noisy breathing
- Collapsing or convulsing
- Bright red or blue gums
- Vomiting and diarrhea

Vomit and diarrhea connected to heat stroke may contain blood. In addition, the eyes of dogs suffering from heat stroke may be glazed-over and such dogs may be unresponsive to commands, or their replies to commands may be slower than usual.

Can heat stroke be prevented?

Though dogs can suffer heat stroke even on mild days, dog owners can take precautionary measures.

- Alter routines. Walking can be great exercise for dogs, but on hot days dog owners can walk their dogs when temperatures tend to be at their most mild, such as in the early morning hours or evenings when the sun is setting or has already set.
- Limit play time. Dogs generate heat when playing and exercising, and their body temperatures may rise considerably on hot summer days. To reduce dogs' risk of heat stroke, limit play time on hot days.
- Don't travel with dogs. Temperatures can be unbearable inside vehicles, so dog owners should not take their dogs along when running errands on hot days.

Dog owners must be especially mindful of their dogs' behavior on hot days. Protecting dogs from extreme heat can safeguard them from heat stroke, which can be fatal.

FRUIT PIZZA



A fruit-covered cookie crust that is shaped like a pizza. Try using star fruit, peaches, bananas, kiwi, orange slices, blueberries, and pineapples.

INGREDIENTS

- 1 (18 ounce) package refrigerated sugar cookie dough
- 1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese, softened
- 1 (8 ounce) container frozen whipped topping, thawed
- 2 cups sliced fresh strawberries
- Fruits of your choice; star fruit, peaches, bananas, kiwi, orange slices, blueberries, pineapples
- 1/2 cup white sugar
- 1 pinch salt
- 1 tablespoon cornstarch
- 1/2 cup orange juice
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1/4 cup water
- 1/2 teaspoon orange zest

DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Slice cookie dough and arrange on greased pizza pan, overlapping edges. Press dough flat into pan. Bake for 10 to 12 minutes. Allow to cool. In a large bowl, soften cream cheese, then fold in the whipped topping. Spread over cooled crust. You can chill for a while at this point, or continue by arranging the fruit. Begin with strawberries, sliced in half. Arrange in a circle around the outside edge. Continue with fruit of your choice, working towards the middle. If bananas are used, dip them in lemon juice so they don't darken. Then make a sauce to spoon over fruit. In a saucepan, combine sugar, salt, corn starch, orange juice, lemon juice and water. Cook and stir over medium heat. Bring to a boil, and cook for 1 or 2 minutes, until thickened. Remove from heat, and add grated orange rind. Allow to cool, but not set up. Spoon over fruit. Chill for two hours, then cut into wedges and serve.
