

# There is much to see and do in the land of...

"Oh give me a home, where the buffalo roam ..." Well, maybe not a home, but it sure would be great to visit South Dakota. The Black Hills feature the highest mountains east of the Rockies.

Black Hills National Forest (pictured below) straddles the U.S. states of South Dakota and Wyoming. In the north, Roughlock Falls tumbles into the narrow, wildlife-rich gorge of Spearfish Canyon. South, the Peter Norbeck Scenic Byway is known for roaming

elk and views of the gigantic Mount Rushmore sculpture. Nearby are the spiky Cathedral Spires rocks and Black Elk Peak, overlooking the granite cliffs of the Black Elk Wilderness.

What people probably think of first when it comes to South Dakota is **Mount Rushmore** (pictured above), where a massive sculpture in the mountain depicts the faces of U.S. presidents George Washington, Thomas Jefferson,

# While you're in South Dakota, eat some...

According to foodnetwork.com, South Dakota's culinary scene is a collection of dishes heavily influenced by Native Americans, Scandinavians, farmers and ranchers, hunters and gatherers, meat eaters and vegetarians, and church basement ladies. Communities have their own food stories, but in a state where traditions and recipes vary, dishes like Indian fry bread, chislic, tiger meat, walleye, buffalo burgers, lefse and mocha cakes gather people around the table to eat and drink as neighbors.



# **Indian fry bread**

Also known as "Navajo Tacos," Frybread only requires four ingredients: flour, water, baking soda and salt. After it's fried, natives pile on the meat, beans, and other toppings.



Lefse, thin potato-dough flatbreads like Scandinavian tortillas, or Oslo injera, can be found on holiday tables throughout the upper Midwest, wherever Norwegian families settled to



Chislic is a traditional dish of cubed red meat most commonly localized to the state of South Dakota. Can be made with venison, lamb or game.



# **Buffalo Burgers**

American buffalo (bison) burger made with ground buffalo meat and seasoned with sage, topped with smoky barbecue sauce.

Theodore Roosevelt and Abraham Lincoln. Started in 1927, the sculpture in the Black Hills region was completed in 1941. Today, the site also features a museum with interactive exhibits.

Another beautiful site in South Dakota is Badlands National Park. Its dramatic landscapes span layered rock formations, steep canyons and towering spires. Bison, bighorn sheep and prairie dogs inhabit its sprawling grasslands. The Badlands Loop Road (Highway 240) winds past scenic lookouts. Several trails begin near the Ben Reifel Visitor Center. The Fossil Exhibit Trail is a boardwalk with displays on fossils uncovered in the park.

The granite peaks and rolling plains of Custer State Park are calling. The clear mountain waters are inviting and the open ranges are waiting to be discovered. Encompassing 71,000 acres in the Black Hills, Custer State Park is home to abundant wildlife and adventure; camping, hiking, biking, swimming, fishing, or relaxing, there's something here for evervone.

The Crazy Horse Memorial is a mountain monument under construction on privately held land in the Black Hills, in Custer County. Rising over 563 feet high, Crazy Horse Memorial dwarfs the carved portraits of Mount Rushmore by nearly 10 times and is set to become one of the tallest monuments in the world.

The Corn Palace, commonly advertised as The World's Only Corn Palace and the Mitchell Corn Palace, is a multipurpose arena/facility located in Mitchell, South Dakota. The Corn Palace serves the community as a venue for concerts,

sports events, exhibits and other community events.

One of the world's most well-known tourist attractions, it's hard to believe Wall Drug Store got its start with something many wouldn't even turn their heads at today ... the promise of free ice water. But in fact, the Husteads turned free ice water into a million-dollar idea with a little determination, quick thinking and a lot of signs.

Wall Drug drew weary travelers into the small-town drug store to enjoy a refreshing break. Today, more than 2 million visitors a year stop at the popular roadside attraction for a meal or activity, 5-cent coffee, and ice water — which is still free.

Located in Wall, South Dakota, Wall Drug has always been a popular stop on the road to the more populated areas like Mount Rushmore or Rapid City.

**Deadwood** is a city in South Dakota known for its gold rush history. Mount Moriah Cemetery has the graves of Wild West figures like Wild Bill Hickok and Calamity Jane. Exhibits at the Adams Museum include a huge gold nugget and a plesiosaur fossil. The 1892 Historic Adams House is a Victorian mansion with original features. South of town, the George S. Mickelson Trail leads through the Black Hills National Forest.

Conures can live 20 to 30 years, so they require a lengthy commitment. Mental stimulation is important to a conure so it doesn't get bored and begin to pluck feathers. Toys, foraging puzzles and time outside of the cage can help keep conures healthy and happy.

### **CANARIES**

Canaries are another type of bird that can be watched instead of cuddled. They're popular thanks to their prolific, operatic songs. Some are even bred to perform specific songs. When properly provided for, canaries can live from five to 10 years.

# NO-BAKE **CHEESECAKE** FLAG CAKE

# **INGREDIENTS**

### Crust

- 1 1/2 cups finely crushed graham cracker crumbs
- 1/4 cup white sugar
- 2 tablespoons unsweetened cocoa powder
- 6 tablespoons butter, melted

- 1 cup cream cheese at room temperature
- 1 cup mascarpone cheese at room temperature
- 2 teaspoons grated lemon zest
- 2 teaspoons lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/3 cup white sugar
- 1 1/4 cups cold heavy whipping cream

- 20 large fresh strawberries, hulled and halved lengthwise, or as needed
- 20 large fresh blueberries, or as needed

# **DIRECTIONS**

Combine graham cracker crumbs, 1/4 cup sugar, cocoa powder, and melted butter in a bowl until mixture is thoroughly combined and crumbly. Transfer crust mixture to a 9x11inch baking dish. Press crust into bottom of dish until smooth and even. Cover dish with plastic wrap and refrigerate until set, about 30 minutes. Mix cream cheese and mascarpone cheese in a bowl until thoroughly combined. Stir in lemon zest, lemon juice, and vanilla extract into mixture.

Whisk 1/3 cup sugar into whipping cream in a separate metal or glass bowl until the cream is fluffy and forms soft peaks. Add whipped cream to the cream cheese mixture and gently whisk until filling is soft, fluffy, and well combined. Spoon filling on top of the graham cracker crust, spreading and smoothing the top. Tap the pan gently on a work surface several times to settle the crust and filling. Cover pan tightly with plastic wrap and refrigerate until chilled and set, at least 3 hours. Starting at the bottom long edge of the cake, arrange strawberry halves in a horizontal line with the pointed bottoms of the strawberry halves pointing to the right. Start a second stripe of strawberry halves at the top right of the cake, arranging strawberries with the bottoms pointing right in a line stretching about 2/3 of the length of the cake. Continue to make strawberry stripes, starting about 3/4 inch up from the bottom stripe and laying down 3 more stripes stretching the full length of the cake. Make 1 more line of strawberries beneath the short stripe to leave a square space for the blue field of stars. Lay a line of blueberries with the blossom ends pointing up in the upper left square space. Continue to lay down blueberries in lines, berries touching the previous line, until the square is filled with blueberries. Cut cake into squares to serve.
