After a 30-car rush, both Mansour and Bannister can pause before a few more vehicles pull up. They'll see up to 400 cars on a busy summer weekend day.

wash options in the tri-county area, from full-service washes, to "quarter" car washes. Fenton has approximately six car washes, which are in full summer

weather washing season. It's possible that Fenton Kar Wash on Silver Lake Road is the oldest auto wash in Fenton, having opened in the 1950s, after it was an auto dealership.

Co-owner Jake Chom said that believe it or not, the salty slushy winter is far busier, seeing as many as 600 cars after a road salting.

For residents who want their cars to look nice this summer, there are a myriad of options.

Most car washes offer a few tiers of what is offered. Chom believes that with each up-charge, "It's worth it. You get

spotted a small white cloud off in the distance. Nothing to worry about, I thought.

A short time later, I looked up again and saw that my little white cloud was joined by a few others, and they were slightly closer

His car wash includes the basics of a spray off, foam soap and water spray and rinse, but then you can add the undercoat spray and protection, and triple wax. He said cars are more thoroughly sprayed and prepped with an up-charge.

Giant muddy trucks are charged extra, which is a recent and necessary development, due to the size difference between vehicles.

With each wash there is someone to spray before the wash, and dry it after.

Then, I looked up and way off in the distance the horizon started looking a little darker, more gray than I was comfortable with. The boys had been in the water for quite a while and probably wouldn't grumble too much if I said it was time to go home.

an uneasy feeling. The air didn't feel right. So I called the kids up. They complained a little at first, but hopped

Chom said that tips aren't required, but appreciated. "The guys count on the tips for part of the money they're making," he said. A dollar or two is fair, which then goes into a pool for everyone to split.

A hallmark of the full-service wash is the conveyor belt that crawls vehicles through the wash. He said his system was recently replaced for \$60,000. Starting a new car wash would likely cost \$1 million with equipment. "It's a specialty kind of thing so there are only a few people you can get it from," he said.

At his wash, he said they use city water, which is softened, with back-flow prevention. They use new water for each wash.

Chom has worked at the wash since after college, and he said he can almost gauge the economic climate through his clients. "The community and economy; you can watch change just by the car wash, by the way the business runs, by the cars they drive, even the way people act," he said. "You can just see when things start getting better."

Joseph Chatel, president of the Midwest Carwash Association, estimates that tunnel exterior washes in Michigan to it when I promised ice cream when we got home.

number approximately 1,200. "You can figure roughly 1,000 to 1,500 car washes in each neighboring state in the Midwest," he said.

He said that "tunnel" washes, where vehicles are washed along a conveyor system are more common, and self-service washes are fading in popularity.

Automated car washes began in the '50s, as a primitive chain-driven system that pulled the vehicle down a straight line while staff would hand scrub, soap, rinse and dry the vehicle all by hand, said Chatel.

The 1960s brought more automated systems, but remained "primitive" into the 1970s.

In the future, he expects more automation and innovation, in areas like chemical engineering.

While carwashes are similar across the U.S., Chatel said that water conservation is the biggest difference between regions. "The West and Southwest regions focus heavily on water conservation, as they are mandated by governing bodies on a much more strict level than the Northern and Eastern regions," he said.

DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

Line a baking sheet with aluminum foil. Place a wire rack on top of baking sheet; place bacon strips on wire rack. Bake in the preheated oven for 10 minutes; remove from oven and sprinkle tops of bacon strips with half the brown sugar. Return to oven and bake 10 more minutes. Remove from oven and flip bacon to other side; sprinkle with remaining brown sugar and bake until bacon is crisp and brown sugar is golden brown, 10 to 15 more minutes. Pour batter into the hot skillet 1/2 cup at a time and cook until edges are browned, about 2 minutes; flip pancake and cook until golden brown and the center is set, 3 to 5 more minutes.
