# STRAWBERRY SEASON... short and sweet

Sweet red Michigan strawberries are a sure sign that, indeed, summer has arrived.

The strawberry season is in the air at Spicer Orchards & Farm Market in Hartland Township, with strawberry fields ripe for the picking as of Monday, June 11. Fresh strawberries are also available by the quart inside the farm market.

This year's strawberry season will last about four weeks, according to Will Cartwright, crop manager. "We plant different varieties to grow throughout the season," he said.

Always phone ahead or check the farm market's

website to make sure of picking and prepicked availability. At Spicer's, U-pick prices are \$2.25 per pound, "slightly higher in the market for pre-picked berries to make up for our picking costs," Cartwright said.

This season's crop is a few days behind

normal because of April's chilly temperatures, said Bob Tritten, district fruit educator for Michigan State University Extension. But the record warm weather in May, including more than a week of really hot weather, got the strawberry crop closer to where it should be.

The U.S. is the world's largest producer of strawberries, with fields located primarily in southern and coastal areas of California, then Florida. The remaining crops come from Oregon, North Carolina, Washington, New York, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Wisconsin and Ohio.

But the difference in flavor and texture from locally grown strawberries compared to others will leave you craving a ripe, red Michigan strawberry in season.

# Best Strawberry Shortcake

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1-1/2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 cup plus 2 teaspoons cold butter, divided
- 1/3 cup half-and-half cream
- 1/2 cup heavy whipping cream 1 tablespoon confectioners' sugar
- 1/8 teaspoon vanilla extract 2 cups fresh strawberries, sliced

#### **PREPARATION**

Yield: 4 servings.

In a small bowl, combine the flour, sugar, baking powder and salt. Cut in 1/4 cup butter until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. In a small bowl, combine egg and half-and-half; stir into crumb mixture just until moistened.

Spread batter into a 6-in. round baking pan coated with cooking spray, slightly building up the edges. Bake at 450 degrees for 13-15 minutes or until golden. Cool for 10 minutes before removing from pan to a wire rack.

In a small bowl, beat whipping cream, confectioners' sugar and vanilla until soft peaks form. Cut cake horizontally into two. Soften remaining butter. Place bottom layer on a ser ving plate; spread with butter. Top with half of strawberries and cream mixture. Repeat layers of cake, strawberries and cream.

Unfortunately, that season is short and Michigan strawberries are delicate with a short shelf life. "I always tell people to keep them in the refrigerator and use them within 24 hours, either eating them fresh or processing them to enjoy later," Cartwright said.

You can preserve their flavor by freezing them and enjoying their sweet taste

for up to a year.

To freeze, wash the berries and place them on a tray. Place the tray in the freezer until they are frozen and then place in a bag. Take out only as many berries as you need when you're ready to eat them or use them in a recipe.

Another U-pick farm market that offers locally grown strawberries is Fowlers Farm Market at 10184 Grand Blanc Rd. in Gaines.

# PUBLIC NOTICE – Groveland Township Because the People Want to Know Chapter 38 Subdivision and Other Divisions of Land

#### Section 38-291 - Definitions.

*In-house administrative staff* means the township staff personnel or consulting planner whom may review the application: supervisor, administrative staff planner, planning coordinator or planning department, and/or the township consulting planner.

*Planner* means the township supervisor, township staff planner, planning coordinator or planning department, or the township consulting planner.

### Sec. 38-294 – Review of application – Planning Commission or In-House Administrative staff.

(b) In order to provide sufficient time to review an application to divide, or divide and combine property, an application shall not be scheduled for review by the planning commission unless the application has been received by the township 30 days from the date of submission of an application, or 30 days prior to the next planning commission meeting if application must be scheduled for review by the planning commission. Upon conclusion of its review the planning commission or in-house administrative staff shall:

- Approve the application, because the application is in substantial compliance with the requirements of this Code;
- (2) Deny approval of the application. Because it does not meet the standards in Section 38-293; or
- (3) Table the applicant's request pending revisions to the application

#### Sec. 38-296. - Same - Staff

(b) The planners, in conducting their review, shall find that the following requirements are met before recommending approval by the in-house administrative staff or recommending if the application must be scheduled for review by the planning commission.

- (1) The minimum land area requirements of each division, combination, or division and combination meet land area of the zoning district
- (2) Minimum property width requirement of the district must be met at the Minimum required front yard setback line of the district.
- (3) The length of each division, combination, or division and combination does Exceed four times its width
- (4) A deed strip does not exceed 600 feet in length, is not more nor less than 60 feet wide, not located next to any other deed strip, public road or private easement.

A complete copy of the approved amended ordinance to Chapter 38 is available for review at the township office during regular business hours or will be on-line after 30 days of publication.

At a regular meeting of the Groveland Township Board held Monday, June 11, 2018 an amendment to Section 38(Subdivision and Other Division of Land) was approved and adopted by a vote of 5-0. Copies of the amendment are available for your inspection at the Groveland Township office during regular business hours. Effective June 11, 2018.

### He'd probably go to jail

Today is Father's Day and, as always, I miss my own father, Willi Pforr, very much. He died in 2010. I also miss my father-in-law, Larry Hogan, who died in 1993. I am somewhat bitter about their deaths because my kids were totally cheated by not having these two fun-loving grandfathers to look up to and hang out with today.

About my father though. If we could zoom the events of the early 1960s ahead to today, I think

some of the things my father did would land him in jail.

Back then, we had a huge family car, so large that my sisters and I could stand up in the backseat and hang onto the back of



our parents' headrests as Dad drove. There were no car seats for children back then. In fact, I don't remember there being seatbelts. If there were, we never used them.

My Mom and Dad liked to do a lot of visiting on Sundays. We would visit their friends as far as three hours away sometimes. My Dad liked his beer and would drink all day. Then we'd all hop in the car and go home, with him driving. No one thought anything of it. It was illegal to drink and drive in Illinois, but until 1967, it was only illegal if your blood alcohol content was .15 or higher — it changed to .10 on Jan. 1, 1967. He also smoked, so not only was he buzzed (not that we noticed) he would also smoke in the car. He never got pulled over.

My younger sister, Monika, was a real 'daddy's girl.' When he was home, she had to be wherever he was. My dad loved cars and one of his favorites was a Ford Fairlane 500 Sports Coupe. It was bright red. My dad spent every Saturday washing his new car. Of course, Monika had to help.

But here's the deal. My dad would wash and wax his car barefoot and shirtless, wearing nothing but his summer shorts. So, Monika, who was about 5 at the time, would help him wearing only her shorts, no shirt. Can you even imagine if this happened today, people driving by, seeing a little half-naked girl helping a half-naked grown man throwing soap and water all around.

When we got a little older, my mom and dad would go out for the evening. When they got home, we would already be in bed, but not sleeping. Only Mom would come in the house. "Where is Dad?" Then we would hear it, the faint scratching on the window outside of our bedroom. We knew it was him but were terrified and screaming just the same. That's because our older sister, Renate, let us watch "Thriller" (with Boris Karloff) and the "Alfred Hitchcock Hour."

Other times Dad would open the bedroom door and just stand in the doorway. He was pretty tall so with the light from the background, he looked like a giant shadow in the doorway. He said nothing for the longest time, just stood there. Then he would jump on the bed and start the merciless tickling. We squealed with joy — we loved it.

If any of that stuff happened today — yeah, he'd probably go to jail. Love you, Dad. Happy Father's Day wherever you are.


After graduation as the valedictorian of 1998, Bosn attended Kettering University where she obtained her degree in Mechanical Engineering with a Biomed Specialty.







#### CITY OF LINDEN **ORDINANCE NO. 385**

AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT THE INTERNATIONAL PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODE, 2015 EDITION AND TO REPEAL ORDINANCE NO. 338.

#### THE CITY OF LINDEN ORDAINS:

Section 1. Adoption of the International Property Maintenance Code,

The City hereby adopts the International Property Maintenance Code, 2015 edition, as published by the International Code Council, Inc., copies of which are on file in the office of the City Clerk. The City hereby refers to, adopts, and makes a part hereof, as if fully set out in this ordinance, each and all the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions and terms of the International Property Maintenance Code, 2015 edition, except for the additions, insertions, deletions and changes prescribed in section 3.

#### Section 2. Definitions.

- Code Official shall mean the City of Linden Building Official, or any designee of the City Building Official.
- Jurisdiction or City shall mean the City of Linden. b.
- Structure shall mean any building or structure for which a permit C. must be obtained for construction under any ordinance or code of the City.

#### Section 3. Modifications and Amendments to Code.

The following sections and subsections of the International Property Maintenance Code are deleted and replaced with the following:

Section 101.1. These regulations shall be known as the Property Maintenance Code of the City of Linden, referred to as the Code.

Section 101.2. The provisions of the Code shall apply to all existing and future structures in the City and shall constitute minimum requirements and standards for such premises, structures, equipment and facilities for light, ventilation, space, heating, sanitation, protection from the elements, life safety, safety from fire and other hazards, and for safe and sanitary maintenance, the responsibility of owners, operators and occupants, the occupancy of existing structures and premises, and for administration, enforcement and penalties.

Section 102.3. Repairs, additions or alterations to a structure, or changes of occupancy, shall be in accordance with the procedures and provisions of the Michigan Residential, Building, Plumbing, and Mechanical Code, the State Electrical Code, and the International Fire Code. Nothing in this Code shall be construed to cancel, modify or set aside any provision of the City Code of Ordinances or City Zoning Ordinance.

Section 103.5. The fees for activities and services performed by the department in carrying out its responsibilities under this Code and the fines charged for failure to comply with this Code shall be those adopted by resolution of the City Council, and the City Council may amend by resolution those fees and fines from time to time.

Section 106.4. Violations of this code shall be a municipal civil infraction subject to the provisions of Ordinance No. 383.

Section 112.4. \$100.00 and \$500.00 respectively.

Section 302.4. 8 inches

Section 304.14. March 15 and November 15, respectively.

Section 602.3. January 1 and December 31, respectively.

Section 602.4. January 1 and December 31, respectively.

#### Section 4. Repeal.

The City Council hereby repeals Ordinance No. 338 in its entirety.

#### Section 5. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days following publication.

# Recognize pica in house cats

Cats can have some strange eating habits, prefering dog kibble to their own canned food or munching on a blade of grass here and there. However, when culinary choices are especially strange, and particularly when cats have the urge to eat nonfood items, a condition called pica may be to blame.

Pica can be quite common in cats. While certain cats may be predisposed to pica, others, particularly cats that may have been weaned too young, can suck or consume many items. These include wool, fleece, stuffed animals, or even hair. Asian breeds are known to do this more often than other breeds.

Other suspected causes of pica stem from mineral deficiencies, and cats may be eating abnormal items

to provide for sustenance they're lacking. However, pica also may be linked to feline leukemia and feline immunodeficiency virus, according to the Canidae pet food company. Other suspected causes of pica

concern diabetes and brain tumors.

Cats also may feed on items due to behavioral compulsive disorders. Boredom and lack of stimulation may drive cats to seek entertainment elsewhere, which may lead to compulsive grooming or eating weird things.

Pica tends to show up most frequently in young cats, but that does not rule out problems in older cats. Concerns about eating strange things

should be addressed with a veterinarian, who may ask if there are any stressful or environmental changes that may have

instigated this sort of behavior.
Testing may be done as well to rule out underlying medical conditions.

Removing targeted items and giving cats something else to divert attention may help alleviate pica. Eating nonfood items, and even some natural

items, such as plants or potting material, can lead to intestinal distress. That is why it is key for owners to help their cats get the help they need as soon as symptoms are noticed.

# FATHER'S DAY BBQ RIBS

Country-style ribs are cut from the loin, one of the leanest areas of pork. These ribs are seasoned, boiled until tender, then baked with Dad's favorite barbeque sauce.

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 2 1/2 pounds country style
- 1 tablespoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 2 tablespoons salt
- 1 cup barbeque sauce

#### **DIRECTIONS**

Place ribs in a large pot with enough water to cover. Season with garlic powder, black pepper and salt. Bring water to a boil, and cook ribs until tender. Preheat oven to 325 degrees F (165 degrees C). Remove ribs from pot, and place them in a 9x13 inch baking dish. Pour barbeque sauce over ribs. Cover dish with aluminum foil, and bake in the preheated oven for 1 to 1 1/2 hours, or until internal temperature of pork has reached 160 degrees F (70 degrees C).
