History, beauty and simpler life makes Mackinac Island a perfect 'island getaway'

Mackinac Island used to be Michigan's best-kept secret.

Since vacation planning website TripAdvisor named the island the "America's No. 1 summer travel destination for 2018," the rest of the world now knows what we Michiganders have always known: Mackinac Island rocks!

With more horses (500) than full-time residents (492), Mackinac Island is a throwback to a simpler time. There are no motor vehicles allowed (except ambulances), so bicycles, pedestrians and carriages rule the road. The island itself is a beautiful mix of seaside luxury, rustic interior, shopping, sweets and the sights and smells of summer (and horses!)

How to get there

I-75 will bring you to the ferry docks of both Mackinaw City in the Lower Peninsula and St. Ignace in the Upper Peninsula. Two ferry companies transport visitors to the island: Shepler's Ferry and Star Line Ferry. Cost: about \$26 per person (online discount available).

Insider tip: You can buy two-for-one Star Line ferry tickets on Black Friday in November to use for the next season.

Just sayin'...

There are alternative road funding options

Last week, I was reading a WHMI online news story. It was about how members of one political party came up with a plan to fund Livingston County road repairs — without raising taxes.

Amazing and brilliant were the first words that came to mind.

They talked about the county's Delinquent Tax Revolving Fund Balance and how it has grown since the recession. I'm assuming every county has such a fund balance, including Genesee.

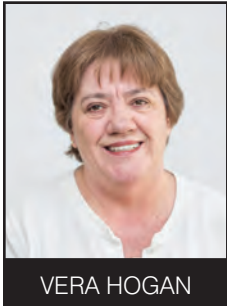
That fund is built with the interest and penalties on late property tax payments. As of the last financial report (Dec. 31, 2017), that fund was up to nearly \$43 million. This group's plan was to take \$10 million of that, give half (\$5 million) to the Livingston County Road Commission, and the other \$5 million would be reserved for a matching program with

township and city governments.

This plan won't cost the people anything and raising taxes for road repairs would not be "a thing." The money is just sitting there. And more than three-quarters of the fund will still be available for other contributions and emergencies.

I am very concerned about the condition of our roads and believe our local and county leaders can do a much better job of brainstorming a plan, like the one in Livingston County. All I have ever heard, at least in Fenton, is that we need a millage (tax the people) if our roads are to be repaired.

Fenton residents and businesses pay fees for everything — including all kinds of inspection fees, site plan review fees, late utility bill penalties,

you name it, there's a fee. A percentage of those fees could go into a road repair fund. I'll bet that builds up to a significant amount of money in a few years.

I did some more checking on my own and there are other options. According to usa.streetsblog.org, federal standards to combat climate change have required that automakers produce increasingly fuel-efficient cars and trucks. As cars use less gas, drivers end up paying less in gas taxes. So some states are thinking about charging for every mile driven, not just for every gallon of gas burned. People driving electric cars pay nothing.

Oregon is out in front on a transition to a VMT (vehicle miles traveled) fee. The state launched a permanent program in July 2015, capping participation at 5,000 vehicles. Car owners who volunteer for the pro-

gram are charged 1.5 cents per mile, measured by a device added to their car. Participants are refunded for state gas taxes they pay at the pump, and out-of-state travel doesn't count toward the total.

There are a few bugs to work out in Oregon's plan, but at least they are doing something.

Pennsylvania, according to its Department of Transportation, charges "Transportation Impact Fees."

As a general rule, they say for impact fees to be an effective funding tool potential should exist for development of at least 50 to 100 residential units per year and approximately 50,000 to 100,000 square feet of non-residential development per year for a minimum of five years.

In the city of Fenton, this may be like closing the barn door after the horses are out, but other local communities might benefit. There are clearly other ways to fund road repairs than through raising taxes.

Just sayin'.

What to do and see

Bike around the island

The eight-mile bike ride is a one-of-a-kind experience and physically doable for just about any age or ability. Rent a bike or transport your own from the mainland. For experienced bicyclists who want to explore the island's hilly, rustic interior there are plenty of options and maps to guide you.

Take a carriage ride

This is a fun way to explore the island's highlights while experiencing one of Mackinac Island's most unique characteristics — its horses.

View Arch Rock

This natural limestone formation is nearly 150 feet above the ground, overlooking the Straits of Mackinac. It's reachable by bike or carriage tour.

Enjoy the history

Visit Fort Mackinac, the huge fortress on the bluff that dates back to 1780. More than just a military outpost, Fort Mackinac served as a home for soldiers and their families. Demonstrations and tours are scheduled throughout the day.

There are also other specialty museums on the island, including the Dr. Beaumont Museum.

Visit the Grand Hotel

Non-hotel guests can enter the property and visit the grounds for a \$10 admission fee. It will be worth it for the views, history and culture of this 1887-era "grand" hotel. You can also enjoy breakfast (\$30), the Grand Luncheon Buffet (\$47) or Dinner

(\$80), or ice cream at Sadie's Ice Cream Parlor (no hotel admission required)

Be a "fudgie"

Enjoy all the dining, shopping and endless eating of fudge, ice cream and all the other treats available as part of the Mackinac Island tradition. Downtown stores range from T-shirt shops to upscale boutiques, so enjoy it all.

Island 'foodie' traditions

Fudge shops

With more than 14 fudge shops on Mackinac Island, you can spend your time sampling and deciding which is your favorite, and bring some home for a gift.

Ice cream stores

Sanders Chocolate & Ice Cream Shoppe has downtown stores, and there's always a line to get your favorite flavor served in a cup or a cone.

The Grand Hotel sells more ice cream than anyone else on the island, including 60,000 pecan balls every year (creamy vanilla ice cream, crunchy pecans, served in a pool of molten hot fudge).

Restaurants

Pink Pony and Mustang Lounge are island traditions for casual dining, and don't miss breakfast at Chuck Wagon of Mackinac. Other favorites are Doud's Market, Yankee Rebel Tavern, Seabiscuit Café and Millie's on Main. Fine dining favorites include the Grand Hotel, The Woods Restaurant, Carriage House and 1852 Grill Room.

For many, the fun begins when the sun sets, the "fudgies" have left the island and you can enjoy the nightlife of downtown pubs and bars.

THRILLING THEME PARK FACTS FROM AROUND THE WORLD

From the fastest to the weirdest to the most wonderful, there are 10 theme parks worldwide that stand out above the rest. Here are 10 thrilling theme park facts that may just surprise you!

1. EPIC TIDAL WAVES – DRENCHED

Drenched takes riders on a wet and wild adventure like no other. The fun ride includes spectacular views of Oakwood Theme Park, before plunging down and drenching everyone in the biggest, wettest tidal wave of any theme park in the UK.

2. WEIRD & WONDERFUL – THE RESTROOM CULTURAL PARK

In 2012, the South Korean city of Suwon opened what it declared the “world’s first toilet theme park.” Visitors to The Restroom Cultural Park are able to browse the site’s museum, which includes a collection of toilet-themed items, including European-style bedpans, traditional Korean squat toilets, and a sculpture garden dedicated to squatting figures.

3. FASTEST ROLLER COASTER – FORMULA ROSSA

With a top speed of 150 mph, Formula Rossa, located in Ferrari World, United Arab Emirates, is officially the fastest roller coaster in the world. It takes just 5 seconds to go from 0 to 150 mph and whizzes riders around the 2.2 kilometer track in just 1.32 minutes.

4. MOST EXPENSIVE THEME PARK ATTRACTION – TEST TRACK

Test Track is a high-speed ride located at Epcot Theme Park in Walt Disney World Resort, Florida. It is reported to have cost \$300 million, making it one of the most expensive theme-park attractions of all time.

5. TALLEST SKY SWING – VERTIGO

If you’ve got a head for heights you will fall in love with the adrenaline rush offered by Vertigo, the UK’s tallest sky swing at Oakwood Theme Park. Ride solo or in a group of up to three people and see what life looks like from one of the highest points in the entire park. This is one rush you won’t forget in a hurry.

6. LONGEST ROLLER COASTER – STEEL DRAGON 2000

If you want to ride the world’s longest steel roller coaster, you’ll have to travel to Nagashima Spa Land in Nagashima, Japan. The ride measures a staggering 8,133 feet in length and takes riders on an exhilarating 4-minute ride at speeds of up to 95 mph.

7. MOST NAKED RIDERS ON A THEME PARK RIDE - ENGLAND

In August 2010, 102 riders braved the cold at Adventure Island in Essex to set the record for the most naked riders on a theme park ride.

8. WORLD’S FIRST THEME PARK – SANTA CLAUS LAND

The doors opened to the world’s first theme park, Santa Claus Land, in 1946. Located in Santa Claus, Indiana, the park was dedicated to everything related to Santa Claus and the North Pole. Unlike earlier amusement parks, which were often just collections of unrelated rides, Santa Claus was the first attraction to have a dedicated theme.

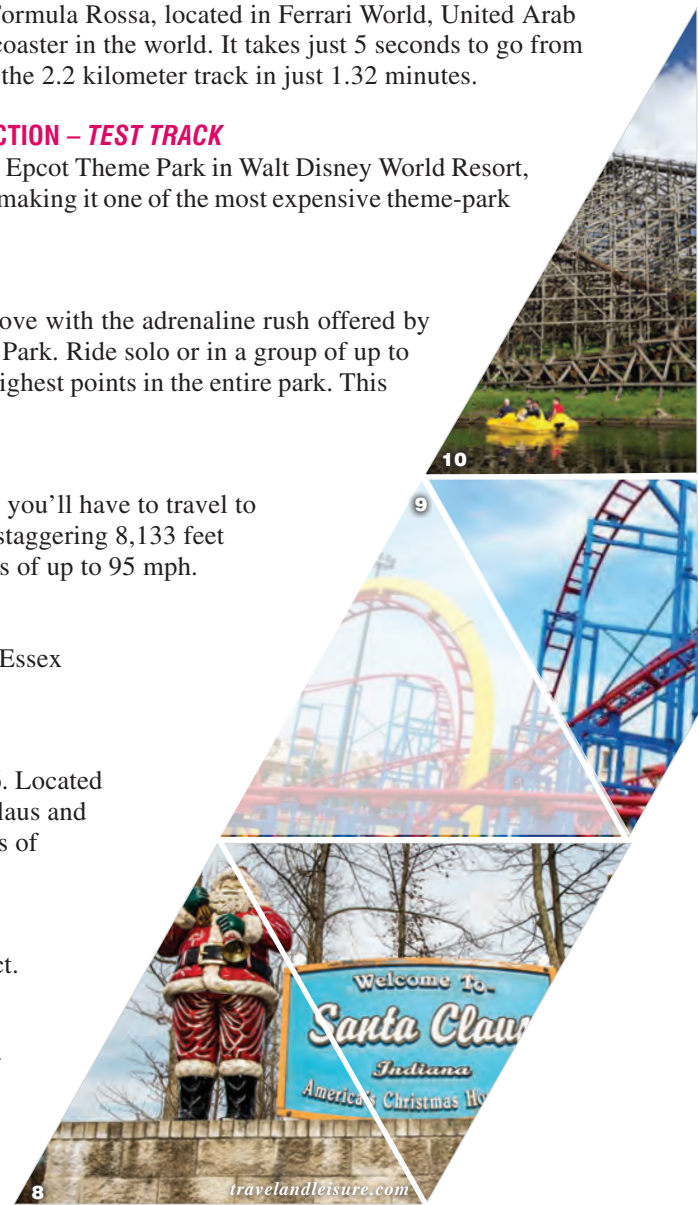
9. MOST ROLLER COASTERS – CHINA

Holly grad brings love of golf home for scholarships

Eric Dovre, a 2002 graduate of Holly High School, and his family are exactly where they want to be — living in Holly and making a difference in the community.

After high school, Dovre attended Ferris State University and enrolled in its Professional Golf Management Program. “I graduated in 2006 with my degree in business and membership with the PGA of America.

“During my time at FSU, I walked on to their men’s golf team, and in my first collegiate tournament recorded a hole-in-one. I also earned all-conference honors as a walk-on my senior year,” he said.

Dovre said he spent about 10 years in the golf industry, five as a PGA professional where he played tournament golf, provided golf instruction, and helped run multiple high-end golf facilities across the country.

“I was an accomplished tournament player, but my competitive playing career was cut short by low back issues with my lumbar spine,” he said. “I’ve had back problems for as long as I can remember and unfortunately the back is a pretty important area of the golf swing. The long and short of the diagnosis I’ve been given was that golf was no longer a viable option for a career.”

Despite his physical challenge, Dovre said golf is still one of his passions, even though it is no longer his career.

“Golf has always been a big part of my life, and one of my greatest achievements was being inducted into the Holly Athletics Hall of Fame in 2017,” Dovre said. “Being recognized for my accomplishments in golf is such an honor, and one I am very thankful for.”

In 2009 Dovre and his wife, Cara, a 2005 graduate of Holly High School, created the Growth of the Game Scholarship. It is awarded annually to graduating seniors from the boy’s and girl’s golf teams in Holly for achievements on the golf course, in the classroom, and with community involvement.

“I was the recipient of a similar award for golf when I was a senior in high school, and found out years later that the award was no longer in existence for financial reasons.

“That is why we started our version of the scholarship, so that Holly golfers could feel the same sense of accomplishment that I did when I won the award,” Dovre said. “We held our fundraiser golf outing on June 9 and with the funds raised this year for our winner we have reached the \$20,000 mark since inception. Many of our past winners have gone on to play college golf or pursue golf as a career.

After leaving the golf industry in 2011, Dovre got into banking and finance. “It turns out that a business degree came in handy after all,” he said.

Dovre said he met his wife at Holly High School. “She is my rock,” he said. “I was a senior when I first met her and didn’t know right away that she was only a freshman. By the time I found out it was too late, I was already head over heels for her. We will be celebrating 10 years of marriage this fall and we’ve been together for 16 years, since my senior year in 2002.

“We have two children,” Dovre said. “Nora is 4 years old and Lincoln is 16 months. Nora will be in Pre-K at Holly El this fall. Lincoln will be at Holly El,



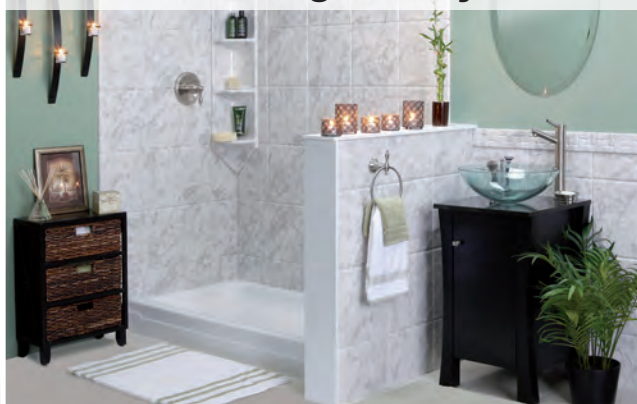

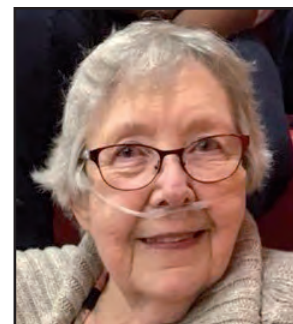

Potential threats to pets in your yard

Pets love to roam free, and homeowners with outdoor space often let their pets get some exercise and play time in their backyards. While it's important for pets like dogs and even some cats to get some time outdoors, pet owners should recognize the potential threats to pet health looming in their lawns and gardens.

•**Mulch:** According to the Pet Poison Helpline, mulch made from cocoa beans can pose a threat to pets. This type of mulch is made of discarded hulls or shells of the cocoa bean. These byproducts of chocolate production contain varying concentrations of the toxins theobromine and caffeine. When ingested in high concentrations, these toxins can cause vomiting, diarrhea, hyperactivity, abnormal heart rhythm, seizures, and, in some instances, death. The amount of these toxins present in a given batch of this type of mulch may not be readily known, so homeowners should avoid applying it.

•**Slug and snail baits:** The PPH notes that the active ingredient in slug and snail baits is metaldehyde, which is highly poisonous to cats and dogs. Symptoms of distress, including restlessness, vomiting, seizures, and high body temperature, can appear as soon as one hour after these baits are ingested. The baits are typically available in pellet, granular, powder, and liquid form, but each should be avoided by pet owners who allow their pets to play in their yards.

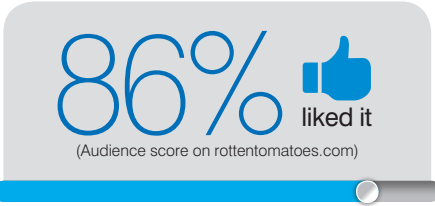
•**Compost:** Compost is a great and natural way to enrich soil. But compost piles should be cordoned off so curious pets cannot access them. As the organic matter within compost piles decomposes, mold can begin to grow. If ingested by pets, moldy materials inside compost piles can make pets sick in as little as 30 minutes. Pets who have ingested moldy compost may appear agitated, pant, drool, or vomit, and some may even suffer from tremors or seizures.



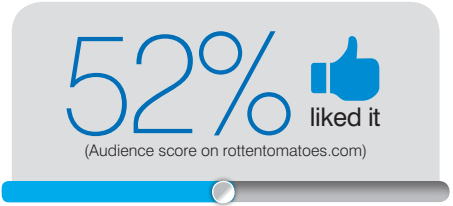
•**Flowers/plants:** Of course, some flowers and plants can pose a threat to pets as well. Before planting new plants and/or flowers in their gardens, homeowners should inquire at their local gardening center or speak with their veterinarians to confirm if the plants or flowers are safe to ingest. If not, do not plant them or plant them in raised garden beds that cannot be accessed by curious pets.

•**Fertilizers:** Certain types of fertilizer also may be harmful to pets. According to the PPH, fertilizers that contain blood meal, bone meal, feather meal, and iron can be dangerous to dogs. When ingested in large doses, such products can form a concretion in the stomach, which can obstruct the gastrointestinal tract and cause severe pancreatitis. Fertilizers that are high in iron also can contribute to iron poisoning if ingested by pets.

CHICAGO HOT DOG

"The Chicago Dog is a Windy City classic, and a big favorite with sports fans! The frank must be all-beef, the bun must be poppyseed, the ingredients must be piled onto the bun in the order specified. And whatever you do, don't spoil the splendor with ketchup!"

INGREDIENTS

- 1 all-beef hot dog
- 1 poppyseed hot dog bun
- 1 tablespoon yellow mustard
- 1 tablespoon sweet green pickle relish
- 1 tablespoon chopped onion
- 4 tomato wedges
- 1 dill pickle spear
- 2 sport peppers
- 1 dash celery salt

DIRECTIONS

Bring a pot of water to a boil. Reduce heat to low, place hot dog in water, and cook 5 minutes or until done. Remove hot dog and set aside. Carefully place a steamer basket into the pot and steam the hot dog bun 2 minutes or until warm. Place hot dog in the steamed bun. Pile on the toppings in this order: yellow mustard, sweet green pickle relish, onion, tomato wedges, pickle spear, sport peppers, and celery salt. The tomatoes should be nestled between the hot dog and the top of the bun. Place the pickle between the hot dog and the bottom of the bun. Don't even think about ketchup!
