# Swiss Alps — cool, refreshing and breathtaking

Not much could be better on a hot summer day than daydreaming about a vacation in the cool, refreshing European Swiss Alps. The good news is your daydream could become a reality if you're willing to spend a couple thousand dollars, about the same as you would spend on any other worthwhile, exciting vacation.

## Swiss Alps

The Swiss Alps is the mountainous region of Switzerland and is part of the Alps Mountain Range, which extends across Europe.

According to alpenwild.com, the northern part of Switzerland is known, as the Swiss Plateau. Many of Switzerland's largest cities, including Zurich, Basel, and Bern, are located on the Swiss Plateau. The Swiss Alps lie to the south of the Swiss

Plateau. The geographic boundary between the Alps and the Plateau runs from Vevey on the shores of Lac Lemman (Lake Geneva) to Rorschach on the shores of Lake Constance. The cities of Thun and Luzern are on the southern fringe of the Swiss Plateau and are set against the Swiss Alps to the south. The lower hills and mountains in Switzerland that lie in the foothills of the Alps are called the *Swiss Prealps*.

Continued from Page 1B**Geographic setting**

The Swiss Alps lie at a northerly latitude which is roughly between 45 degrees and 47 degrees, which is a latitude comparable to that between Minneapolis and Duluth, Minnesota.

**Swiss Alps geographic importance**

Since before Roman times, the Swiss Alps have formed a natural barrier and division between northern and southern Europe. As such, they have played an important role in European history. At the same time, the mountain passes through the Swiss Alps have provided important trade routes connecting Italy with European countries to the north.

**The Swiss Alps today**

Today, most international travelers visiting the Swiss Alps fly into airports in Zurich or Geneva, then travel by car, bus or Switzerland's excellent rail network to popular tourist destinations like Luzern and Interlaken, which are traditional gateways to the Swiss Alps. From there, they visit many of the winter and summer resorts in the higher elevation alpine valleys such as Zermatt, Grindelwald, and St. Moritz.

**Hiking the mountains**

Hiking enthusiasts can explore the two most picturesque corners of the Alps — Zermatt and the Jungfrau. Hiking in Zermatt and hiking in the Jungfrau gives you the best the Alps has to offer.

Zermatt lies at the base of the Matterhorn, the most recognizable peak in the world, while the Jungfrau region is dominated by the North Face of the Eiger, one of the most spectacular and formidable mountain landscapes on earth, and the ideal spots for the perfect hiking tour in the Swiss Alps.

**Day hikes and mountain excursions**

Cable ascents and cogwheel railroads will take you from the valley floor in Zermatt, Grindelwald and Lauterbrunnen to breathtaking alpine settings. Invigorating day hikes and excursions lead you past glistening lakes and underground waterfalls.

**Train tour of Switzerland**

Imagine the spectacular alpine scenery through the panoramic "vista" windows that run from your elbow to the ceiling while you sit comfortably in your first-class Swiss rail seat. Your eyes gazing effortlessly on the beautiful Swiss Alp peaks, the sparkling lakes, lush flowered meadows, historic castles, the iconic profile of the Matterhorn, deep-cut glacial valleys, vineyards, gushing white water streams, magic mountains flanked by enormous glaciers.

The legendary trains of Switzerland are among the finest in the world and the Swiss have perfected making mountains accessible. Their ingenious network of trains, rack railways, trams, and funiculars easily puts you in the midst of the most spectacular glaciers in the Alps and the highest peaks in Europe.

You will also get to ascend the Gornergrat above Zermatt to arrive at an alpine panorama, where you are surrounded by more 4,000-meter peaks than anywhere else in the Alps. Then you will get to ride through a tunnel in the Eiger to arrive at the Jungfraujoch, the highest railway station in Europe.

Switzerland's rail system is the finest and most popular in the world.

**What to pack**

When selecting clothing, especially if you're going on hiking and other outdoor excursions in the Swiss Alps, think about dual-purpose clothes and about layering for warmth and keeping dry. It is better to have several layers you can take off and put on one at a time versus one heavy layer.

**You will need:**

- one pair of walking shoes or sturdy tennis shoes with good traction
- one rain jacket
- one lightweight fleece sweater or

fleece vest

- one mid-weight jacket (it does get cooler at the higher elevations)
- four to five T-shirts
- three to four pair pants
- one to two long sleeve shirts
- four to five pair socks
- one pair extra shoes for wearing at end of day and in town
- Casual dinner attire
- one hat (one with a brim offers excellent sun protection)

**Swiss cuisine**

Swiss cuisine combines influences from the German, French and North Italian cuisine. However, it varies greatly from region to region with the language divisions constituting a rough boundary outline. Many dishes have crossed the local borders and become firm favorites throughout Switzerland. These dishes include, among others:

**Cheese fondue**

Melted cheese with bread cubes. The bread cubes are picked up on the fork and swiveled in the melted cheese, which is served in a traditional ceramic fondue pot called 'caquelon.'

**Raclette**

Melted cheese served with "Gschwelli" (jacket potatoes), cocktail gherkins and onions as well as pickled fruit.

**Älplermagronen**

A kind of gratin with potatoes, macaroni, cheese, cream and onions. And most importantly, stewed apple on the side.

**Rösti**

A flat, hot cake made of grated, cooked jacket or raw potatoes and fried in hot butter or fat. The dish is bound by nothing apart from the starch contained in the potatoes.

**Birchermüesli**

Developed about 1900 by the Swiss doctor Maximilian Oskar Bircher-Brenner, it contains oat flakes, lemon juice, condensed milk, grated apples, and hazelnuts or almonds.

**Swiss chocolate**

Chocolate came to Europe in the course of the 16th century. By the 17th century, at the very latest, it became known and was produced in Switzerland as well. In the second half of the 19th century, Swiss chocolate started to gain a reputation abroad.

Rudolph Lindt invented the process of conching, refining the texture of chocolate by warming it and then grinding it between rollers. ... When Swiss milk chocolate is compared to milk chocolate from other countries, the Swiss chocolate is creamier due to its higher milk content and it contains less cocoa and more sugar.

**Swiss cheese**

One could quite easily explore Switzerland traveling from cheese dairy to cheese dairy. Each area of the country, each region has its own types of cheese — the diversity of products created from one single base ingredient — good Swiss milk — is said to be astonishing. Such as, for example, the soft and melting Vacherin cheese, the aromatic Appenzeller, the full-flavored Sbrinz, the Emmentaler, famous for its big holes, the world-famous Gruyère or the Tête de Moine, which is shaved into decorative rosettes. All of these — and their approximately 450 other cheese siblings — make a fondue, a raclette, an afternoon snack platter a culinary experience. By the way, the stalls of farmers and cheese merchants at the weekly markets are a true treasure trove.

Arachnophobics beware! Here are eight of the biggest spiders in the world. They're huge. If you are visiting Europe, you won't be at risk. If you spend time in the tropics, check your shoes before you slip them on. Next time you squeal because there's a tiny spider above your bed, thank goodness it's not one of these bad boys!



## HERE ARE THE BIGGEST, UGLIEST SPIDERS IN THE WORLD



### The Phormictopus Cancerides or Hispaniolan Giant Tarantula

This spider is native to Antilles and Brazil and has a leg span of 18 centimeters (7 inches) and 2 centimeters of fangs. You don't want this spider sinking his teeth into your flesh.



### The Theraphosa Blondi or Goliath Bird Eater

The largest of the tarantula family, weighing in at between 120 and 130 grams. Some have weighed as much as 170g. This spider is native to South America and has a leg span of 30 centimeters (nearly 12 inches). Its venom is neurotoxic (although no worse than a wasp sting if it bites a human), but its 2 cm fangs will certainly draw blood. This is a nocturnal spider and females can live for six to 15 years in the wild, or 25 if held in captivity. Males, however, have a much shorter lifespan of three to six years.



### The Lasiodora Parahybana or AKA the Brazilian Salmon Pink

This is a big spider with a huge appetite. As well as feeding on insects, this creepy-crawly also eats small mammals and reptiles. It's the second largest tarantula in the world and females can weigh up to 100 grams. This spider, native to Brazil, has a leg span of 25 cm (nearly 10 inches).



### The Macrocheira Kaempferi or Japanese Crab Spider

The biggest arthropod in the world, these sea-dwelling crustaceans and their flesh are considered to be a culinary delicacy in Japan. Despite their size, Japanese Crab Spiders can be kept in captivity and are often found in aquariums. Their leg span is 3.5 meters (11-feet, 5-inches).



### The Heteropoda Maxima or AKA Giant Huntsman Spider

This spider is the biggest land-living species, with a body that measures around 4.6 cm (1.8 inches). Its leg span is 60 cm (23 inches). It doesn't weave webs, but nests in caves. This giant doesn't need to inject poison, unless its bite fails to kill its prey. Its favorite dish is cave crickets. It is native to caves in Laos.



### The Sparassidae or Huntsman Spider

These giant spiders bite, but they're not considered to be a danger to humans. They're native to southern hemisphere countries and huge male specimens in Laos have been known to reach a leg span of 60 cm (23 inches).



### The Poecilotheria or Tiger Spider

This venomous spider is quick and agile, thanks to its long front legs, which span 30 cm (nearly 12 inches). It won't kill us, but its bites will hurt badly and its poison is strong enough to cause swelling, muscular pain, nausea and even headaches. A colorful beast, but one to avoid, is native to India and Sri Lanka.



### The Calorctenus Cacachilensis or Sierra Cacachilas Wandering Spider

This spider can measure the size of a plate. It has a leg span of 23 cm (9 inches) and is native to Southern California and Mexico.
