How to get there

The drive from Fenton to The Villages will take about 16 hours and 51 minutes, if you drive straight through for 1,137 miles.

You can also fly from Bishop International Airport in Flint for as low as \$119 round-trip on budget carrier Allegiant Airlines. Expect to pay about \$250 round-trip on a major airline like Delta

or United, from either Bishop or Detroit Metro Airport.

An airport shuttle is available from Orlando International Airport to and from The Villages, at a price of \$40 to \$50 per person, depending on whether you're a resident or just visiting.

When to plan your visit

The busiest month at The Villages is February, followed by March and June. Prices for housing and airfare will be most expensive during these months. November is the least busy month, followed by the early part of December before the holiday rush.

Things to see and do

You certainly won't have to leave The Villages to find plenty of daily entertainment, whether it's sunning by the pool, playing the links, attending a concert, playing tennis or any other sport or activity.

Just 90 minutes away in Orlando, you'll find all the world-class entertainment and attractions you could imagine, from Walt Disney World and Universal Studios to Sea World.

If you're craving the beach, the Atlantic side is only 70 miles away, taking you to such popular locations as Daytona Beach, Ormond Beach, New Smyrna Beach and Cocoa Beach.

A two-hour drive will take you to the Gulf of Mexico and the beautiful sands and waves of Clearwater Beach.

Although I can't imagine it now because I love Diet Coke from time to time, but we were only allowed to share one bottle of soda when our parents were out. That soda was always Diet Rite and it was in a glass bottle. By the time I was old enough to decide what kind of pop I wanted, the regular stuff (with sugar) was so sickening sweet I couldn't drink it.

That also was about the time a new kind of popcorn came out, Jiffy Pop, so we had that sometimes, too. You could shake it over the stove until the kernels

popped and the big silver bowl appeared. Anyway, we had plenty of "snackage" for our spooky shows.

The Alfred Hitchcock Hour was the show I was old enough to understand, and Thriller. Both were great. My favorite Alfred Hitchcock episode was called "An Unlocked Window." It aired Feb. 15, 1965, when I was almost 12 years old.

The suspense in "An Unlocked Window" never lets up. A maniac who only kills nurses is loose. Meanwhile, two nurses and a drunken housekeeper are alone in an old mansion on a stormy night tending to a bed-ridden male patient. Another nurse only two miles away, they learn, is strangled, and needless to say, the three women are terrified as the tension mounts. You'll have to watch the show on YouTube to see what happens. Make sure you're not alone.

I have seen many spooky TV shows and movies since I was a child, but none compare to the Alfred Hitchcock Hour and Thriller TV episodes. It makes me so happy that I can watch them again, in their entirety, on YouTube.

All you need to do is Google Alfred Hitchcock Hour episodes and Thriller episodes. Just pick one. If you're a scary show buff like me, you'll love them all.

House Bill 6060: Authorize pre-application occupational licensure determinations

To establish a "pre-licensure" inquiry process for individuals seeking one of the many occupational licenses that are mandated by the state as a condition of earning a living in a particular profession. This would let an individual get a preliminary determination of whether any criminal convictions or court judgments against him or her would likely result in being denied a license under licensure provisions that require an applicant have "good moral character."

House Bill 6110: Limit using criminal background to bar occupational licensure:

To limit the use of criminal records to determine whether an individual is eligible to get an occupational license mandated by the state, which is required to earn a living in many professions. Specifically, a licensing board or agency could not consider past civil judgments or lawsuits against an individual as evidence of a "lack of good moral character," and also could not consider a criminal conviction, in and of itself, as conclusive evidence of this, unless the individual was convicted of a felony that is explicitly listed in statute as a disqualifying offense for the particular license.

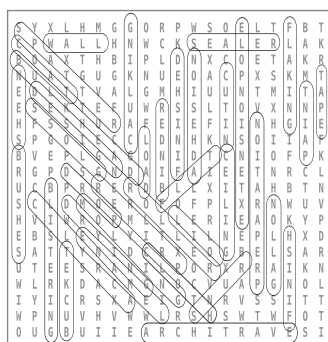

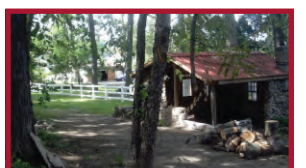

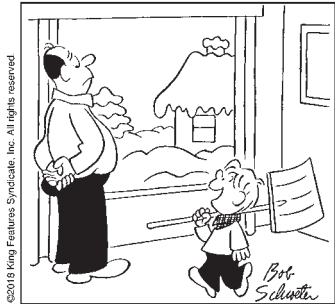
