'It's the ethical thing to do'

■ Trackers recover deer shot during bow hunting season to prevent waste of meat

During bow hunting season, which ends next week, trackers may be called upon to recover a wounded deer that could have fled up to a mile away into the brush. The hunters can lose the blood trail, which is when a tracker comes in.

It's not only bow hunting season, but also the rut, meaning deer are distracted and easier to hunt by bow. But the problem with bow hunting is that the shots are almost always non-lethal, and once struck with an arrow, the deer will flee.

Rob Miller, 41, of Linden has been tracking since 2007. He does it as a hobby, and takes a vacation from his regular job welding and maintaining his shop for a couple weeks to track with his dachshund Sypris and Slovakian Kovop Hound, Sargent.

Sypris has recovered 263 deer. Miller said he's essentially the handler for his dogs that do the tracking by scent.

Miller is busy during this time of year, fielding phone calls when he's not tracking. On Wednesday, he recovered a deer in Kingston, north of Lapeer. He'll receive more than 300 calls in the season, and might recover a few a day.

Sarah Thompson of Fenton Township switched from bow hunting to tracking during bow season a few years ago. She said while rifles almost always take a deer down with one shot, an arrow usually does not.

Where the arrow lands will determine how long it takes for

the deer to die, and during that time the deer is usually fleeing.

Miller said that a "paunch" shot, or shot to the deer's gut can take 12 hours to kill. Thompson said a shoulder shot may not even be fatal. A shot to the lung is usually a quicker death, not requiring a tracker.

It's illegal to hunt with a dog in Michigan, so a tracker has to be called if the hunter loses the blood trail.

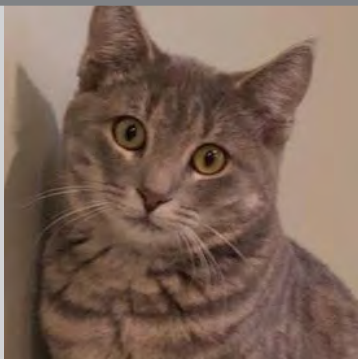

Miller said he first takes his dog to the site where the deer was shot, and then they follow the blood trail as long as it lasts. The dog will then track the deer by its hooves. Deer have a gland under their hooves that provide a scent that he likens to a fingerprint, and the dogs track that.

The tracker and hunter follow the leashed dog as they follow the scent trail. They'll hopefully find the beleaguered or dead animal before it is found by a scavenger, or begins to spoil.

"It's the ethical thing to do," Miller said, recovering the deer 99 percent of the time. Hunters are harvesting the animal for the meat, and for the trophy and don't want it to go to waste. "Hopefully most hunters are doing the ethical thing, to find the animal which they've shot."

"I enjoy all of it. I enjoy being in the woods. I enjoy helping the hunters and not letting the deer go to waste," Thompson said.

She's newer at tracking, having found about 20 deer with her own Kopov hound Annie Oakly. She said it's always fun when they find the deer. "It's awesome, everyone's happy, the dog's happy, the hunter's happy," she said.

Other facts about tracking

Miller said that a tracker cannot trespass on someone's property to find a deer. He recommends that hunters become familiar with property owners and get contact information ahead of time in case they have to cross property lines to

recover a deer. He said most allow others on their property to track down a deer.

One doesn't need a certification to be a tracker in Michigan, but one is offered. It requires the applicant to have a concealed pistol license and pass a state test. Miller said that he can't legally shoot a hunter's injured deer.

Thompson said it costs about \$3,000 to get into tracking, with the dog and the training it takes.



PEANUT BUTTER BANANA MUFFINS



If you like peanut butter and banana together, these muffins are for you.

PREP 10 M	COOK 18 M	READY IN 28 M

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 3/4 cup quick cooking oats
- 1/3 cup packed brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon baking powder
- 1 cup milk
- 1/2 cup peanut butter
- 1/2 cup mashed ripe banana
- 1 egg, beaten
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 2 tablespoons butter, melted
- 2 tablespoons packed brown sugar

DIRECTIONS
 Preheat oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C). Grease 12 muffin cups or line with paper muffin liners.
 Combine 1 cup flour, oats, 1/3 cup brown sugar, and baking powder. Whisk together milk, peanut butter, banana, egg, oil, and vanilla. Add banana mixture to dry ingredients, mixing just until moistened. Fill prepared muffin cups 3/4 full.
 In a small bowl, stir together 1/4 cup flour, melted butter and 2 tablespoons brown sugar. Sprinkle topping evenly over muffins.
 Bake in preheated oven for 18 minutes, until golden brown. Serve warm.

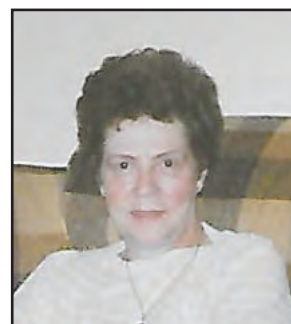

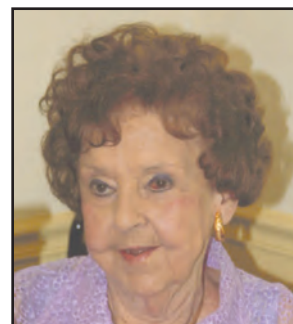
