There's a little place in Capaccio, Italy called Tenuta Vannulo, where customers line up to get a number before the cheese maker's specialty sells out. The cheese is mozzarella and it's made fresh from buffalo milk, who are cared for on a family farm behind the shop.


Nicola Palmieri runs his family farm, where the buffaloes are pampered, according to CBS News Sunday morning (May 19). Soothing music is piped into the pens, and when the buffaloes feel they are ready, they line up on their own to be milked by machines. They can also take a shower or get a massage.

Palmieri says they have to be relaxed — it's one of the secrets to making good mozzarella. Buffalo milk has a higher percentage of fat than milk from cows, so it's richer and sweeter. It's also said to melt in your mouth.

But you don't have to go to Italy for buffalo milk mozzarella. It can be purchased at just about any grocery store for under \$20.



- 1. The most expensive cheese in the world is called **Pule (\$575/pound)**, an extremely rare cheese made in Serbia from Balkan donkey milk. It takes over 3 gallons of milk from a donkey to make just a pound of this cheese, and there's only 100 donkeys that are milked for production, and they have to be hand-milked three times a day. Pule isn't produced commercially, so even if you're a billionaire, there's no point in rushing over to your local cheese shop to try to buy a slice.
 - **3. White Stilton Gold (\$450/pound)** cheese is made by the Long Clawson Dairy in the UK. It was once made as a limited edition Christmas cheese, but it got incredibly popular with celebrities and the oil sheikh crowd. Now, every one wants it as some sort of status symbol. It's a regular Stilton cheese, but infused with gold flecks and gold liqueur.

"Most of our customers are the older generation of RVers but the next wave is coming up with younger people looking for new experiences," said Pam Rush, owner of Rush RV Repair in Holly.

Younger millennials pushed RV sales to record highs in 2017, according to the RV Industry Association (RVIA), but most RV owners are slightly older. More RVs are now owned by those aged 35 to 54 than any other age group.

Brook and Kathleen Smith of Tyrone Township, ages 54 and 53, respectively, have been RV owners for five years. "We just bought a new toy hauler for our four-wheelers, Harleys, kayaks and snowmobiles," Kathleen said.

Their new 32-foot Coachmen Adrenaline can sleep six, a handy feature since the Smith enjoy camping with friends. They belong to a camping group on Facebook with 10 other couples.

The Smiths visit state parks just about every other weekend, to popular campgrounds like Port Crescent State Park in Port Austin, Wilderness State Park in the Mackinac Straits area and Ludington State Park.

"You meet many nice people at the state parks," Kathleen said.

Baby boomers Rich and Vera Ross of Davisburg have owned their Holiday Rambler fifth wheel for many years, and take it as far as Texas for three months in the winter. In the summer, they visit Outdoor Adventure locations, and also meet up with likeminded friends through a camping club, Michigan Buddies.

"Being with other people, having campfires with your friends, that's what we both love about camping," said Vera, 64.

Kathy Dawson of Clarkston, who had her vintage 1976 Airstream Argosy painted and restored at Rush RV, is 64 and single and enjoys taking her dogs to dog shows throughout the sate. "Dog shows are way more fun with a camper," she said.

What most RVers have in common, no matter what their age, is that they started out tent camping, moved to pop-up trailers, then stepped up to an RV for a more comfortable experience.

"No matter where you are, you're still sleeping in your own bed," Dawson said.

Get the scoop on pet food safety

Today's consumers are more conscious than ever before regarding the foods and other substances they put in their bodies. It would stand to reason that those same concerned individuals also would extend that caution to the meals they feed their pets, as the basic principles of food safety also apply to pet foods and treats.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says it is key to pick the right foods for pets, and to consider some important information before purchasing anything. The CDC does not recommend feeding raw foods to pets. Salmonella and listeria have been found in raw pet foods, as well as packaged ones sold in stores.

In the United States, the Association of American Feed Control Officials regulates the production, transportation and ingredient suppliers of manufactured pet foods. With the U.S. Food and Drug

Administration, these agencies help regulate animal feeds and impart new standards, process controls and other features. Pet owners concerned about their pets' foods should look for approval from AAFCO as well as the FDA before feeding.

Many pet owners prefer to seek locally sourced ingredients in the foods they select. This means protein and carbohydrate sources produced right in North America. Check package labeling to see where ingredients are procured if this is a concern safe

The same safe food handing procedures



people observe when handling their own foods should be followed when they prepare meals for their pets. Before or after handling pet foods and treats, wash hands to prevent the spread of foodborne ill-

nesses, states FoodSafety. gov. When possible, store pet food separate from human food, preparing the foods in separate spaces as well. Use a clean, dedicated scoop or cup to create a pet food serving. Follow manufacturer's guidelines for food storage. An airtight container is adviseable to keep the food fresh and free from possible

contaminants.

Pet owners also should routinely check for pet food recalls to ensure the brand they're using is safe. Every effort pet owners make to keep their pets' foods safe and contaminant-free keeps pets healthy and happy.

CHICKEN PARMESAN Lasagna



INGREDIENTS:

FOR THE CHICKEN:

- 4 (32 ounces) boneless, skinless chicken breasts, sliced in half lengthwise to make 8
- 3/4 cup seasoned breadcrumbs
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 2 large eggs, beaten
- olive oil spray

FOR THE LASAGNA:

- 15 ounce container part-skim ricotta cheese, (almost 2 cups)
- 1/2 cup grated Pecorino Romano or Parmesan cheese
- 1/4 cup fresh chopped basil, plus more for garnish
- 4 3/4 cups homemade or jarred marinara sauce (from about 2)
- 9 ounce box no-boil lasagna noodles.
- 3 cups baby spinach
- 3 cups part-skim shredded mozzarella cheese



DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Preheat oven to 425°F. Spray a large baking sheet lightly with spray.
- 2. Combine breadcrumbs and parmesan cheese in a bowl. Beat the egg in another bowl.
- 3. Dip the chicken into the eggs, then into the breadcrumb mixture. Discard the remaining crumbs.
- 4. Place the chicken on the prepared baking sheet, lightly spray the top with oil and bake in the oven for 25 minutes, do not turn. When done, remove from the oven and reduce oven temp to 400F.
- 5. Meanwhile, combine the ricotta, parmesan cheese, and basil in a medium
- 6. In a 9 x 13 x 3-inch Pyrex Deep baking dish, ladle 3/4 cup of marinara on the bottom of the dish.
- 7. Arrange 3 lasagna noodles across the dish (they will expand as they cook), top with 3/4 cup sauce, 4 pieces of chicken, 1/4 of the ricotta cheese mixture, 1/2 cup mozzarella cheese, 3/4 cup spin-
- 8. Repeat the 2nd layer, skipping the
- 9. Repeat the 3rd layer with the chicken, and the 4th layer without the chicken.
- 10. For the 5th layer, spread the last 3 sheets of pasta noodles with the remaining 1 1/2 cups of marinara sauce
- 11. Cover with foil and bake in a 400F preheated oven in the center rack 50 minutes.
- Uncover, add the remaining cup of mozzarella and bake until melted, 5 minutes.
- Remove from oven and let it rest 15 minutes before serving.


