Little League — big lessons

■ Hundreds of local families partake in spring baseball to build skills and character

Fenton — “I don’t even care what the score is; let’s just focus on playing well,” said girls Little League coach Kelly Jobe in response to an inquiry during the Tuesday night, June 4, game.

During springtime on any given weekday evening, hundreds of families are playing, coaching, volunteering or watching a local Little League baseball game.

Fenton, the Lake Fenton area, Linden and Holly all have their own leagues, which together comprise the Quadtown league. It also includes the Hartland Area Youth Athletic Association. Games start in April and many divisions finish the end of June.

Playing against Jobe is Coach Samantha Sturgis with her assistant coaches. While technically she coaches the coach-pitch team, a T-ball stand can be used if a player is struggling.

Silver Lake Park diamonds. Across town, more advanced games are happening with intermediate level play with boys and girls at AGS Middle School.

In one diamond, an intermediate Fenton versus Lake Fenton game was held. The Fenton team coach, Susan Smallwood, said that sometimes people assume Little League games are full of

errors and player mistakes, but these games are actually more skilled than that. “It can be pretty intense; it can be pretty fun,” she said. Smallwood was coaching opposed to Jason Zelek with Lake Fenton.

Fenton Little League President Kevin Johnson said there are approximately 75 teams that compete in Quadtown. He estimates it tops 100 teams when non-Quadtown programs are included.

Generally, Little League starts at age 4, and ends at age 12. Some programs run until age 16. Lake Fenton Little League President Brad Reichert said the league leads to middle school baseball.

Skills start at the beginning with how to hold and swing a bat, and catch and throw a ball. These skills are built upon until “real baseball and softball stuff,” Reichert said.

Players start with T-ball, which leads to coach-pitch and eventually player pitch starting at age 9 or 10.

Of course, players also learn about cheering on their friends and working hard. Young players cry at frustrating mistakes, walk off injuries and take specific instructions from their adult coaches.

While hundreds participate, Reichert said numbers at least in Lake Fenton are down from recent years. He believes that more competitive players instead join travel leagues and take their coaches and volunteers with them. “It’s absolutely a problem throughout Quadtown,” he said.

Reichert said the philosophy is different with Little League. There are no try-outs, and every player gets to play and learn, and winning is less important.

Linden Little League has 330 players overall in 32 teams. League President

Sean Jeric said the league runs on approximately 100 volunteers, including coaching staff. Linden, like most leagues, has a board of directors.

Holly Little League has 250 players on 23 teams. “In Holly we make a big deal out of our Opening Day and All-Star games,” said league president Lance Coleman. On opening day, the league held a parade through town and to the fields. This year U.S. Rep. Elissa Slotkin attended.

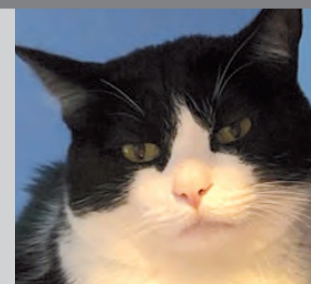

LOOKING BACK at this week in HISTORY

JUNE 9

1956: One of the world's top-selling crime novelists, Patricia Cornwell, best known for her forensic pathologist character Dr. Kay Scarpetta, is born in Miami, Florida. Cornwell became a reporter for the Charlotte Observer, eventually covering the police beat. She went on to work for six years as a technical writer and computer analyst in the chief medical examiner's office in Richmond, Virginia.

JUNE 10

1752: Benjamin Franklin flies a kite during a thunderstorm and collects a charge in a Leyden jar when the kite is struck by lightning, enabling him to demonstrate the electrical nature of lightning. He coined a number of terms used today, including battery, conductor and electrician. He also invented the lightning rod, used to protect buildings and ships.

JUNE 11

1982: Then 34-year-old director Steven Spielberg reportedly drew on his own experiences as an unusually imaginative, often-lonely child of divorce for his science-fiction classic E.T.: The Extra-Terrestrial.

JUNE 12

1994: Nicole Brown Simpson, famous football player O.J. Simpson's ex-wife, and her friend Ron Goldman are brutally stabbed to death outside Nicole's home in Brentwood, California, in what quickly becomes one of the most highly publicized trials of the century. With overwhelming evidence against him, including a prior record of domestic violence toward Brown, Simpson became the chief suspect

JUNE 13

2006: Jurors began deliberations in the trial of Susan Polk, 48, for the October 2002 murder of her psychotherapist husband Felix

Polk, 70, in a poolside cottage at the couple's Orinda, California, home. Felix was stabbed and cut 27 times and had suffered blunt force trauma to the head. The couple, who had raised three sons together, was in the midst of an ugly divorce at the time of Felix's murder.

JUNE 14

1968: A Federal District Court jury in Boston convicts Dr. Benjamin Spock and three others of conspiring to aid, abet, and counsel draft registrants to violate the Selective Service Act.

During the Johnson administration, Spock, a physician and the famous author of The Common Sense Book of Baby and Child Care, along with Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., and entertainer Harry Belafonte led an estimated 300,000 people on a march to the United Nations headquarters in New York City, the largest antiwar demonstration to date.

JUNE 15

1846: Representatives of Great Britain and the United States sign

the Oregon Treaty, which settles a long-standing dispute with Britain over who controlled the Oregon territory. The treaty established the 49th parallel from the Rocky Mountains to the Strait of Georgia as the boundary between the United States and British Canada. The United States gained formal control over the future states of Oregon, Washington, Idaho, and Montana, and the British retained Vancouver Island and navigation rights to part of the Columbia River.

Dr. Rebecca Ball is a 2009 graduate of Linden High School

■ Now a scientist in Boston, her work is aimed at combating disease

When interviewing local high school seniors throughout the year, one of the questions the Times often asks is, “Where do you see yourself in 10 years?”

We caught up with one of those seniors whose 10-year anniversary is this year. Her name is Dr. Rebecca Ball, formerly of Argentine Township and a 2009 graduate of Linden High School. She was the class salutatorian.

Ball, who will be 28 in two days, on June 11, earned her bachelor’s degree in Chemical Engineering from Wayne State University in Detroit. She earned her doctorate in Chemical Engineering from Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh.

“The whole process of getting my PhD took four and a half years,” Ball said. “The first two years are mostly classes and some research. Afterwards it was purely research — I spent most of my time doing experiments in the lab or writing papers.

“I worked on using lipid nanoparticles to deliver siRNA and/or mRNA to diseased cells,” she said. “This involved a good amount of cell culture and also testing the drugs in mice.”

Ball said she was attracted to chemical engineering because of the wide variety of jobs that can be done with the degree.

“I was not exactly sure what I wanted to do when I was a senior in high school,” she said. “Who does? Chemical engineers can go into the automotive, chemistry, beauty and pharmaceutical industries, and many other fields.”

Ball works at a small biotechnology company in Boston, Massachusetts called Translate Bio. “I am a scientist in the drug formulations group,” she said.

“I make lipid nanoparticle formulations that contain the drug, mRNA,” she said. “mRNA is a natural

molecule found within all of our cells and is made into proteins that control the function of cells. In many diseases, the proteins or mRNAs do not work properly and cause issues and diseased cells.

“Translate Bio wants to deliver new mRNA to improve cellular function for specific diseases,” Ball said. “mRNA cannot get into cells by itself and needs a protective delivery vehicle, the lipid nanoparticles, which is what my group specializes in making.”

Translate Bio has an mRNA therapeutic in clinical trials for cystic fibrosis and is also working on liver diseases and mRNA vaccine applications. “I really enjoy where I work and what I do,” she said. “Everyone at Translate Bio is very nice and genuinely wants to better the lives of patients.”

In her spare time, Ball said she loves to read fantasy adventure books with a great magic base. Some of her favorites are the “Stormlight Archives” by Brandon Sanderson. Also, the “Lightbringer” series by Brent Weeks, “Kingkiller Chronicle” by Patrick Rothfuss, “A Pattern of Shadow and Light” by Melissa McPhail, to name a few.

Ball also is interested in fish and taking care of a saltwater tank as a hobby. “I also love to do anything outside, like hiking, swimming and biking when I’m not working,” she said.

Ball’s next major accomplishment this year will be to start her married life. She and fiancé John Goldman are planning to wed Oct. 11 near Boston.

She has a few words of wisdom for the 2019 Linden High School

graduating class. “Don’t doubt yourself and never stop seeking answers,” she said. “Also, kindness and compassion will get

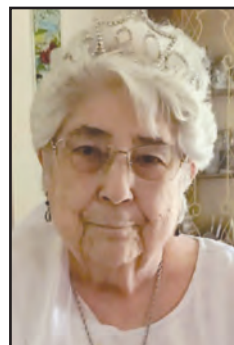

Things to look for in a boarding facility

Pet ownership involves making careful decisions with the well-being of pets in mind. When pet owners need to go out of town, bringing the pet along can be a smart move. But in other instances, it may be preferable to leave pets behind. In such instances, it becomes essential to find a place that can accommodate the animal in a safe and humane fashion.

Pet owners who do not have the luxury of asking family or friends to watch their animals can enlist the services of a boarding kennel. Touring some facilities and asking the right questions can help people find the best options.

Care.com, the company that provides companionship and care for seniors, children and pets, advises first speaking with your veterinarian about the best kennels nearby. Some vet offices also have boarding facilities on premises. This can be a great option, as the vet and staff will already be familiar with your animal and be able to provide medical care if an emergency arises. Look at various facilities and what they offer before making a final decision. Many boarding facilities now offer luxury spaces, complete with couches and televisions. The staff may pamper the pet, and packages also may include grooming or pet playdates. Visiting the facility in advance also affords owners the chance to see if it looks and smells clean and has proper ventilation. Pet owners also will want to ensure that all pets that are boarding there are required to be current on vaccinations and healthy.

The pet adoption company Petfinder suggests gradually introducing a pet to boarding. Try a short overnight or weekend trip before booking a week-long excursion. When dropping off dogs or cats for boarding, avoid long and emotional good-byes, which may upset the pet. With practice, the parting period will be easier for all involved.
