Sandy Fielder, 65, looks over her winding flower gardens and sees all the beauty of the plants she has tended during more than 24 years of living in her Fenton Township home.

She walks down the paths that lead to Barnum Lake on North Long Lake Road and enjoys the splashes of color and textures in unexpected places, from along the fences, down by her home and in shade gardens highlighted by hostas.

One of her favorite spots is her fairy garden, where she

Must remember the June wedding

June has traditionally been the most popular month to marry. This year, I am going to try very hard to remember that my husband and I have a wedding anniversary in June. It was our second ceremony.

We first got married Oct. 7, 1988. We decided to elope to the 52-2 Dis-

trict Court in Clarkston. It was a Friday. We arranged to leave work that day at noon and take the rest of the weekend off. No one but my husband's brother and his fiancée, our witnesses, knew what we were up to.

Our ceremony was scheduled to take place in the late afternoon so we stopped at home in Holly for a while first. My husband's parents dropped by for a visit unexpectedly.

I don't even remember what we told them but we managed to hustle them back out before we had to leave for the courthouse. We could tell they knew something was up but didn't say anything. I regret that now and cringe when I think of it.

We arrived at the courthouse about an hour early. Judge Gerald McNally was to perform our ceremony. It was just past 2 p.m., too early for us to go in when someone came and got us from the lobby. The judge asked for the wedding party because he wasn't in the mood to deal with "the drunks" just yet. So we got married and it was a nice ceremony.

Even though they didn't show it, I knew in my heart that my new inlaws were not happy. I believe they were hurt that they were not told in advance.

Zoom ahead to 1990, our son Sean arrived in January. My father-in-law was diagnosed with melanoma. We knew it would mean the world to

him if his son and I were married in the church. We took the necessary steps to not only make that happen, but also arranged to have my husband's boys from a previous marriage, and our son, Sean, baptized during the same Mass at St. Augustine's Catholic Church in Howell. That was June 29, 1991.

My father-in-law was a wonderful man. Almost immediately, he and my mother-in-law forgave us for eloping. He died Thanksgiving Day (Nov. 25) in 1993. Hardly a day goes by that I don't think of how my sons and stepsons were deprived. He would have been the greatest grandpa ever. Thank goodness their grandma is still here.

June 29, I must remember that anniversary because it is when I was honored to become a member of the Hogan family — again.




Vanisha Mittal & Amit Bhatia \$66 million

International recording artists and actress Kylie Minogue was paid \$330,000 to perform for just half an hour. Aftewards, a fireworks display was launched from the Eiffel Tower. The marriage did not last long as the couple called it quits in early 2013.

Wayne Rooney & Coleen McLoughlin \$8 million



English football player Wayne Rooney of the Manchester United and Coleen McLoughlin made their vows at the Abbey of Cervara near Genoa in Italy in 2008. Serenading the couple and the guests was the Irish boy band, Westlife, which cost \$670,000. Rooney chartered five private jets to fly 64 of their guests to the wedding. While the ceremony was lavish, the couple had a little help in paying the bills as a magazine offered \$4.2 million for the exclusive rights of the wedding photos. Today, they are happy and raising three children.

holds the memory of her then-3-yearold granddaughter setting up a little tea set party.

"My garden does have stories," Fielder said. "Certain plants or garden art have different meanings and memories for me."

Her favorite flowers are her lilies, especially the fancy Asiatic varieties that provide the earliest lily blooms. She also loves unusual plants, like Bear's Paw succulents and Turtleheads, with names that hint at their unique features in the garden.

Fielder has been interested in gardening since she was a little girl, watching her parents take pride in their gardens. "I did a science project on plants, feeding them water, fertilizer and adjusting their



sun and shade," she said. She learned the science behind growing successful plants, and knows by trial and error how to grow beautiful gardens.

She has also taken many Master Gardener classes, although most of her gardening knowledge comes from her own experiences. "I've done a little bit of everything," she said. "I experiment. If it doesn't bring me joy, I don't keep it. I start over with something else."

Although gardening may be intimidating for some people, she doesn't think it necessarily takes having a "green thumb" to be successful in this hobby.

"Anyone can garden," she said. "The biggest thing is you've got to have the will to work in your garden. When someone says

they want a maintenance-free garden, I know that there really isn't such a thing. Eventually, you have to thin plants out and move them around."

Fielder spends at least four hours every day in her yard, tending, watering, fertil-

izing, weeding, etc. This year, she put 130 bags of mulch around her garden beds. "My husband (Bruce) helps me," she said. "He asks me, 'how do you get

enjoyment out of all this?' I answer with a smile, 'I've got dirt in my teeth.'"

For Fielder, gardening isn't just a relaxing hobby; it is its own reward. "You can walk down here and smell the flowers," she said. "You can pick flowers and display them in vases throughout your house and realize, 'I did all this." She also loves attracting birds to her gardens and spending time in nature.

SUMMARY

Sandy Fielder finds joy in her garden every day, spending most of her time working outdoors while she has the opportunity. She is currently on the liver transplant list at Henry Ford Hospitál in Detroit.

Fielder counts her time spent in the garden very thoughtfully, as she knows it is fleeting.

It takes her mind off health worries

She's on the list for a liver transplant at Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit, suffering from a liver disease since 2015 that has nothing to do with drinking alcohol, "a common misconception," she

added. Once she has the transplant, she'll have to hang up her gardening gloves for good because of the dangers of infection.

With so many health worries, she's grateful to have her garden to take her mind off things for a while. "It helps me not get so wrapped up in myself," she said. "It

makes me appreciate my footprint that I'm going to leave behind."

For now, she's grateful to have led a full life and now has a second chance. "I'm getting everything done in my garden now that I can," she said.

at this week in **HISTORY**

JULY 23

1992: Mafia boss John Gotti, who was nicknamed "Teflon Don" after escaping unscathed from several trials during the 1980s, is sentenced to life in prison after being found guilty on 14 counts of conspiracy to commit murder and racketeering.

JULY 24

1901: The first major exhibition of Pablo Picasso's artwork opens at a gallery on Paris' rue Lafitte, a street known for its prestigious art galleries. The precocious 19-year-old Spaniard was at the time a relative unknown outside Barcelona, but he had already produced hundreds of paintings. The 75 works displayed at Picasso's first Paris exhibition offered moody, representational paintings by a young artist with obvious talent.

JUNE 25

2009: Michael Jackson, one of the most commercially successful entertainers in history, dies at the age of 50 at his home in Los Angeles, California, after suffering from cardiac arrest caused by a fatal combination of drugs given to him by his personal doctor.

JUNE 26

1975: With a string of pop hits in the mid-1960s that began with the career-defining "I Got You Babe" (1965), Sonny and Cher Bono established themselves as the most prominent and appealing married couple in the world of popular music. Sonny and Cher projected an image of marital harmony that a lot of people could relate to. They portrayed that image professionally for a solid decade, even several years past the point that it was true. After 13 years together as a couple and six years of marriage, Sonny and Cher were legally divorced on this day in 1975.

JUNE 27

1988: Heavyweight champion Mike Tyson knocks out challenger Michael Spinks 91 seconds into the first round. The decisive victory left the boxing world wondering if anyone could beat "Iron Mike" Tyson.

JUNE 28

1972: President Richard Nixon announces that no more draftees will be sent to Vietnam unless they volunteer for such duty. He also announced that a force of 10,000 troops would be withdrawn by Sept. 1, 1972, which would leave a total of 39.000 in Vietnam.

JUNE 29

2003: Katharine Hepburn — a fourtime Academy Award winner for Best Actress and one of the greatest screen legends of Hollywood's golden era - dies of natural causes at the age of 96, at her home in Old Saybrook, Connecticut.








McKay assisted on making a rap music video in 2011 with Hurley and Brian Hecox. The video, "Go Hard," featured Ionia rapper Joe Buys and was shot in Fenton High School.

Both Taylor and McKay attended Full Sail University in Orlando, Florida.

"I started my career focused solely on video and cinematography but that changed over time as I grew my own business and started to delve into the world of marketing and content creation," he said. "We do business in all 50 states and even travel internationally for our work. My job as creative director for Black Pine Films centers around learning about the client's business or story and creating content that helps communicate that with their customers, donors, and or fans."

This content ranges from photos and videos to graphics and more. The website, blackpinefilms.com, offers full-service production, website design, and social media marketing as well. It has samples of photography for cars, huge football stadiums, engineering, sports and more, as well as video work.

The best part of McKay's job is being able to create his own path.

"I've never been much of a follower and being both a business owner and a creator allows me to choose my own direction. Meeting professional athletes and celebrities is pretty cool, too," he said.

The hardest part of his job is eliminating self-doubt.




Attending Fenton schools helped shape McKay into the person he is today, and he said he owes a "huge debt of gratitude" to all the teachers and staff.

QUICK & EASY DINNER SERVED ON A BUN

Sloppy Joes

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 pound ground beef (93% lean or leaner)
- 1 cup minced sweet onion
- · 1 cup minced green bell pepper
- 1 can (14 ½ ounces) unsalted tomato sauce
- 1/4 cup barbecue sauce
- 1/4 cup ketchup
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 2 teaspoons packed brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon dry mustard
- 4 whole wheat hamburger buns or 8 slider buns



Busy families often find it hard to serve fresh and quickly prepared meals. But before pulling up to the nearest drive-through window, family chefs should know that many homecooked meals can be whipped up in a pinch.

During barbecue season, burgers are often a go-to meal for their convenience and portability. But another bun- and beef-based option is readily available - and it could stir up nostalgia for comforting family meals of years past.

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Heat a large, nonstick skillet over medium heat. Add onion, cook 3 to 5 minutes until golden brown. Add ground beef and bell pepper; cook 8 to 10 minutes, breaking beef into 1/2-inch crumbles and stirring occasionally.
- 2. Stir in tomato sauce, barbecue sauce, ketchup, Worcestershire sauce, brown sugar, and mustard; increase heat to medium-high. Bring to a boil; cook 5 to 10 minutes, or until sauce is thickened, stirring occasionally. Season with salt, as desired.
- 3. Divide beef mixture evenly among buns. Top with pickles, coleslaw and cheese, if desired. Close the sandwiches.

That's due in part to the climate during these seasons, which tends to be warmer and therefore more inviting to cats, compelling them to spend more time outdoors than they do in winter. Ticks, which are eggshaped, are big enough to spot, so cat

owners should conduct a careful examination of their cats' fur each time they come into the house after spending time in the yard. Blue Cross for Pets notes that ticks feel like small bumps on a cat's skin. Ticks are most likely to attach themselves to particular areas of a cat's body. These areas include the head, neck, ears, and feet. Routine brushing, especially whenever cats come inside after time spent outdoors, can help cat owners spot and remove ticks from their cats.

It's important to recognize that indoor cats are not invulnerable to ticks, as other pets and humans can track ticks indoors. Periodic inspections and brushing of indoor cats' can protect them from ticks and the diseases ticks carry.




