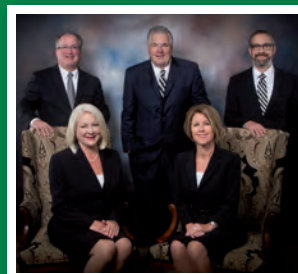

Bottles, Brews & News will benefit FARR (Fenton Area Resources and Referral Network, Inc.). Formed in 1990 by community leaders, churches and civic organizations, FARR works with Fenton, Lake Fenton and Linden area residents in crisis by assessing their basic needs (food, shelter, health) and identifying immediate and long-term objectives.

FARR then coordinates with local partnering organizations to help address those needs and raise the level of self-sustainability for those needing help.

Apple pies and apple crisps will be the "stars of the show" at Applefest this year, and thankfully, there's a bumper crop of apples available to make this happen.

The apples are purchased at a discount from Spicer Orchards in Hartland Township and delivered by the crate to St. John's Activity Center. According to Spicer's crop manager Will Cartwright, Paula Reds and some Red Cortlands will make up the majority of the 120 bushels.

"It's been an excellent year for apples," Cartwright said. "We've been working with Applefest for as many years as I've been here, and we love doing it."

"The mixture of different kinds of apples makes the pies so good," said Amy

Volunteers are the 'core' of Applefest success

From the Core Committee to individuals and families, Applefest is community's biggest volunteer effort

The saying goes, "It takes a village ..." and that is definitely true when it comes to Applefest, now in its 47th year.

"There are over 1,000 people involved in running Applefest, including parishioners and other volunteers from the community," said Pat Lockwood, finance committee co-chair.

"You don't have to be a member of St. John's (Catholic Church) to work on Applefest," she added. "Many of our own family members come from out of town to help out."

Heading up Applefest is the Core Committee, including:

- Ryan and Miriam Sage, co-chairpersons
- Kim Heethius
- Tom and Suzanne Danner
- Ron and Pat Lockwood
- John and Sue Dansky

"Every Applefest event has its own chair and co-chair," Lockwood said. "They all come together a couple of times a year as a group and report to the Core team. Each event chair does its own scheduling for volunteers."

One of the largest volunteer efforts is the set-up/tear-down committee, headed by Brianne (Hajec) Johnson, 39, and her husband, Mike, 38. It has been a Hajec family tradition for as long as the festival. "I've been doing it since I was 14," Brianne said.

Set-up begins the Saturday before Applefest, then tear-down takes place on Monday or Tuesday after Applefest. "We get it going and make it look like a festival," Brianne said.

Mike actually takes a week of vacation

from his regular job as a custom homebuilder to handle the coordinating effort and physical work of setting up and tearing down Applefest.

"We have roughly 20 very dedicated volunteers every year, plus folks who help when they can," Brianne said. "Our volunteers include parents and cousins, plus our Applefest family."

What they really need are younger volunteers because the work is very physical.

"Getting younger volunteers, that's the challenge," she said. "We need heavy equipment operators, help with electrical set-up, coordinating tent set-up, tables and chairs, fencing, propane gas, etc."

Padre's Chili

David Harvey's famous concoction still reigns supreme, even after his retirement

(FESTIVAL SIZE BATCH)

INGREDIENTS:

10 lbs. lean ground beef
10 c. diced onion
7 c. diced green pepper
1/3 c. sugar
1 bottle Worcestershire sauce
1/3 c. salt (or less)
1/4 to 1/3 c. black pepper
1 8 oz. container tomato paste
8-10 quarts fresh stewed tomatoes (the more the better)
1 No. 10 can pinto beans
1 No. 10 can chili beans, and half of another can.
1 c. of chili powder (mixture of hot and medium)
Five to six bay leaves (remove before serving)

PREPARATION:

Brown meat. Mix all other ingredients together and add to browned meat mixture. Cook about three hours.

Blissett, chairperson of the Applefest apple pie-baking committee.

Blissett has chaired this committee for 12 years and was co-chair before that. But she admits she gets lots of help in the process and that's what makes it fun.

But Applefest pie-baking is a serious business that starts well before the Happy Apple Tent opens up for business. More than 1,000 pies and 100 to 200 apple crisps are hand-made on-site in the St. John's Activity Center

kitchen, all in just a four-day period, from Sunday, Sept. 8 through Wednesday, Sept. 11. Parishioners will also hand-make about 600 to 700 pies.

Pie bakers use the same original apple pie recipe every year, but it gets tweaked along the way, depending on the sweetness or tartness of the apples. "Everyone has to do taste testing," Blissett said. "Is the pie done? Is it too sugary? You have to make adjustments along the way."

Sunday and Monday are apple peeling days. "All our apples are hand-peeled," said Blissett. "Volunteers come in after the noon Mass on Sunday, and stay 'til 8 or 9 in the evening. On Monday, we'll peel for 12 or 13 hours."

It's a big job that takes about 80 volunteers at any one time. "We have to bag about 88 bags of apples, with each bag making about 15 pies," Blissett said. "It's a pretty well-oiled machine."

Kids even get involved in this aspect of pie-making, earning community service hours for their efforts. "On Tuesday and Wednesday, it's baking time and kids can't be in the kitchen," Blissett said.

"The last pie goes in the oven Wednesday night, and we never know exactly when that will be," Blissett said. "We can do about 80 pies at a time, until all are done. I put all the pies in and take all the pies out. By the end of Wednesday night, I am sore," she said.

But the soreness and pressure of getting this huge baking job done is nothing compared to the reward of friendships made along the way. "I've met a lot of fabulous people," Blissett said. "That's why I keep doing it."

Meet 'apple pie volunteers' Tom and June Miller ...

"Tom and June Miller are always right beside me," said Amy Blissett, chairperson of the Applefest apple pie-baking committee. "I couldn't do it without them."

From washing and bagging apples to

making the topping for the apple crisp, this St. John's parish volunteer couple are "right hands" for Blissett.

When it comes to baking, there are only two people who do this finishing job. "That's Tom and me," Blissett said. "I put the pies in the oven and take them out. He gets the pies ready to go in the oven. He leaves off where I begin."

Raw Zucchini Salad

Salads are a dietary staple across the globe. Salads are traditionally served chilled or at room temperature, and many are enhanced by oil, vinegar or another dressing. Many people are quick to think of certain varieties of lettuce as the prime base for salads. However, just about any fruit or vegetable can serve as a foundation for a tasty salad.

Zucchini and tomato provide excellent nutrition and can be hydrating. These versatile ingredients can be combined to form a robust salad to accompany any meal or one that can be enjoyed on its own.



Fresh veggies add spark to salad dishes

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 medium zucchini, shredded or sliced paper thin
- 6 cherry tomatoes, halved
- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- Juice of 1 lemon
- Sea salt and freshly ground pepper, to taste
- 3 to 4 basil leaves, thinly sliced
- 2 tablespoons freshly grated low-fat Parmesan cheese

My puppy has worms; now what?

Bringing a new puppy home can be an exciting time that’s full of challenges. Change also is part of welcoming a new puppy into the family.

Puppies rely on their owners to meet all of their needs, and it can take weeks for a pup to acclimate to a new home and adapt to a routine.

New puppy parents may be surprised to learn their puppy - particularly one rescued from a shelter - has parasitic worms. This is a common occurrence. According to a report published in the journal *Animals*, the prevalence of gastrointestinal parasites in shelter dogs is typically higher than in owned dogs. This is due to the combination of daily admissions of dogs from diverse backgrounds and the difficulty of preventing environmental contamination with infectious parasitic developmental stages. Shelters provide favorable conditions for the establishment and spread of GI parasitic infections.

Worms are transmitted in various ways, and many result from pups walking through the infected waste of other dogs. Some dogs ingest contaminated feces or develop infections after being in an environment where there is a buildup of waste and poor sanitation. The American Kennel Club says worms also can be passed from an infected mother to her unborn puppies in-utero or through nursing.

By and large, worms are not something that should be terribly concerning. With the right treatment and preventative care, most parasitic worms, like roundworms, hookworms, heartworms, and whipworms, can be treated effectively. However, if left untreated, worms can compromise the health of a puppy, potentially contributing



to anemia, low weight/poor growth, diarrhea, and inflammation.

- Some symptoms of worms include:
- pot belly appearance
 - vomiting
 - coughing
 - weight loss
 - diarrhea
 - abdominal pain
 - visual confirmation of worms in stool

A veterinarian can walk new pet parents through deworming their young dogs. Medications produce results in a matter of hours and will immobilize worms in the digestive tract before they’re soon expelled. It may take a few treatments to get a handle on the problem. In addition, vets will likely want to examine stool samples on an ongoing basis to ensure all immature and fully formed worms are gone.

To prevent future outbreaks, clean up pet waste in the yard frequently and administer a monthly heartworm medication with a generalized deworming agent for other parasites.
