Free hearing and vision screenings for Genesee County students
Hearing and vision screenings are offered at no cost to Genesee County students, ages 3 to 17, throughout the year by trained health department technicians. Both hearing and vision screenings are offered to pre-school children, ages 3 and up, at daycares and preschools throughout Genesee County. During the spring and summer, technicians provide hearing and vision screenings to children preparing to enter kindergarten in the fall. These screenings are done in each school district in the county. During the school year, students are provided vision screenings in grades one, three and five at each school. Students may also be screened during the seventh grade and during the ninth grade in preparation for driver's education. Vision screenings for seventh and ninth grade students may be offered in the school and can also be completed during one of the health department's clinics at the health department's Burton branch. Hearing screenings are provided in grades kindergarten, two and four at each school. Teachers or parents may refer students for a hearing or vision screening at other times. Hearing and vision screenings for all children, ages 3 to 17, are offered monthly at a clinic at Genesee County Health Department's Burton branch, G-3373 S. Saginaw St., Burton. Although it is a walk-in clinic, parents are encouraged to call (810) 257-3193 for information and appointments. Upcoming hearing and vision screening clinic dates are: Sept. 20, Oct. 18, Nov. 15, Dec. 13, Feb. 21, 2020, March 20, 2020, April 17, 2020, May 15, 2020, June 19, 2020, July 17, 2020 and Aug. 21, 2020.

Just sayin'...

Knock it off

There's a commercial on TV where two guys are in a movie theater. One of them likes to chew on ice and is happy that the new toothpaste he found allows him to do what he enjoys — crunch on ice. Another movie-goer down the aisle, clearly annoyed at the sound of the other guy chewing ice, says, "Oh good, aren't we lucky!"

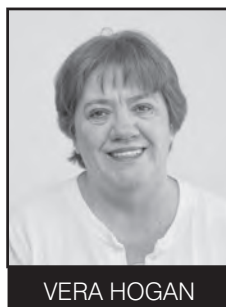
There are three sounds that absolutely drive me bats. One is the sound of someone whistling. I hate whistling! Even though the hair on the back of my neck is standing up, I try to be polite and joke, "I'll pay you to stop that whistling." Usually they stop, but some don't and say, "But I whistle nice." No, no you don't. There is no such thing as nice whistling.

The other thing is rapid drumming on a table or other hard surface with a pencil or pen. Why are they doing that? It is so annoying. But again, instead of snapping at them like I would like to, I try to inject a little humor and ask, "Clearly you're nervous, would you like a cigarette?"

The last thing is when someone chews their gum so loud I can hear the wet, sloppy sound of lips smacking and gum popping. If it wasn't so annoying it would be comical. I have not chewed gum in more than 50 years.

I learned this week that there is a name for this. It's called misophonia. According to webmd.com, "Misophonia is a disorder in which certain sounds trigger emotional or physiological responses that some might perceive as unreasonable given the circumstance. Those who have misophonia might describe it as when a sound 'drives you crazy.' Their reactions can range from anger and annoyance to panic and the need to flee. The disorder is sometimes called selective sound sensitivity syndrome.

"Individuals with misophonia often report they are triggered by oral sounds — the noise someone makes when they eat, breathe, or even chew. Other adverse sounds include keyboard or finger tapping or the sound of windshield wipers."

There are ways to treat this disorder. Webmd.com says, the condition does affect daily life, but you can learn to manage it. "Treatment often involves a multidisciplinary approach combining sound therapy by audiologists and supportive counseling in which coping strategies are emphasized. You might try a device like a hearing aid that creates a sound in your ear similar to a waterfall. The noise distracts you from triggers and reduces reactions. Other treatments include talk therapy."

Nope, not doing that. I prefer the easy way — "Knock it off!"

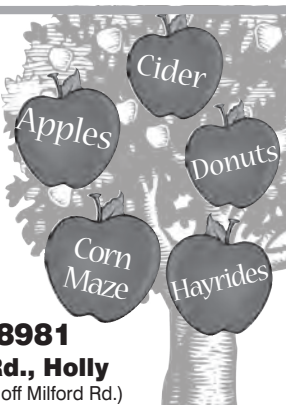

Generally speaking, Kenya is ideal for families, people who want to experience cultures and those looking for a more natural, rustic experience. Tanzania is the better option for more luxury safari experiences and for work-

ing Mt. Kilimanjaro into the itinerary.

If gorilla trekking is part of your game plan, you might look at Rwanda or Uganda.

Some of the most well known game reserves, with great opportunities to see lion cubs in the wild, are South Africa's Kruger National Park, Serengeti National Park in Tanzania and Maasai Mara National Reserve in Kenya.

Ingrid Ream, owner of Superior Travel with offices in Fenton and Lapeer, is going on safari for her first time in February 2020, although she has previously traveled to Egypt on the continent of Africa. They'll be flying from Detroit to Paris, then Paris to Nairobi, the capital and largest city in Kenya.

What animals will you see?

Depending on where you travel, you might see lions, elephants, cheetahs, rhinos, Cape buffalos, Masai ostriches, leopards, wild dogs, zebras, giraffes, hippos, gazelles, wildebeests, baboons, crocodiles, waterbucks, antelopes and vultures. Despite the headline of this story, tigers are not native to Africa and won't likely be seen on your safari adventure, unless you're in India.

How much will it cost?

"It's not as expensive as people think," Ream said. "Pricewise, air fare is very comparable to what you'd pay to go to Europe."

For two people, Ream estimates an average cost of about \$12,000 for a nine-day package, including airfare.

How to get there

Flights leave Detroit Metropolitan Airport for a flight time of about 17 hours, priced on the average from \$1,500 to \$2,000 per person.

When to go

The best time for an African safari is typically from July through October, when animals are easy to find and in substantial numbers, according to Tripsavvy.com. It also depends on what country you'd like to visit and when you can plan your trip.

Seasons differ in East and Southern Africa so you can plan an excellent safari for almost every month of the year, if you're flexible about where you want to go.

Ream suggests that travelers avoid the rainy season of March, April and May when many muddy, rain-soaked roads are impassable.

How long should your trip be?

Travelers are wise to concentrate on one particular area of the African continent, rather than traveling all over to fit in as many countries as possible. Most people don't realize that Africa is bigger than the United States, China and all of Europe combined.

Nine to 14 days is about typical for

an African safari. Plus, the 14-hour time difference adds several travel days before and after your trip.

What should you pack?

Pack lightly, with easy, washable clothing. Malaria is a very real and present concern in many safari areas. Tuck your socks into your pants and wear light colored clothing to avoid attracting mosquitos.

Women should consider wearing a sports bra while on the road, said Ream, and all travelers should wear Totes over their footwear to protect it.

Pack toilet tissue and hand sanitizer for going to the bathroom in the wild, and women should also pack Go, Girl, a portable urinal for ease "in the bush."

Don't forget to pack the best pair of binoculars you can afford.

What about shots?

Be current on your routine vaccines, including your annual flu shot, pneumonia vaccination and Zoster for shingles.

Most travelers to Africa will also need Hepatitis A and B, typhoid, polio booster and yellow fever vaccine. Rabies vaccine may also be recommended, depending on your travel itinerary.

"You can go to the MSU (Michigan State University) Health Clinic or Passport Health in Farmington Hills to get all these shots, which may not be available at your local doctor's office," Ream said.

You'll also want to avoid traveler's diarrhea by adhering to the adage, "Peel it, boil it or forget it."

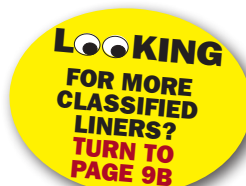

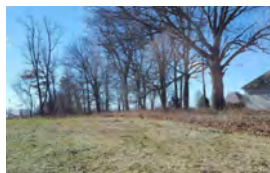

Meatball
Gyros

INGREDIENTS:

- ½ cup seasoned bread crumbs
- 1 egg
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon pepper
- 1 pound lean ground turkey
- ¾ cup (6 ounces) reduced-fat plain yogurt
- ½ cup finely chopped peeled cucumber
- 2 tablespoons finely chopped onion
- 1½ teaspoons lemon juice
- 8 whole wheat pita pocket halves
- 2 cups shredded lettuce
- 1 cup chopped tomatoes



MAKES 4 SERVINGS

The same foods served time and again can get boring very quickly. Offering new options for your family doesn't have to be complicated. Such can be the case with Greek-inspired gyros. The fillings can vary depending on the ingredients available in the house. For "Turkey Meatball Gyros" from the "Taste of Home: Healthy Cooking Cookbook" (RDA Enthusiast Brands) by the editors of Taste of Home, the meatballs can be made the night before or in big batches and frozen to be used as needed. The yogurt sauce in this recipe is reminiscent of traditional Greek tzatziki, which is fresh and flavorful.

DIRECTIONS:

1. In a large bowl, combine the bread crumbs, egg and seasonings. Crumble turkey over mixture and mix well. Shape into 16 balls.
2. Place meatballs on a rack coated with cooking spray in a shallow baking pan. Bake uncovered at 400 F for 15 to 20 minutes, or until no longer pink.
3. Meanwhile, in a small bowl, combine the yogurt, cucumber, onions, and lemon juice. Line pitas with lettuce and tomatoes; add the meatballs and drizzle with the yogurt sauce.

Simple ways to prevent dog-related lawn damage

Dogs love spending time outdoors. Dog owners with yards know that dogs benefit greatly from some exercise in the backyard. While that time might be great for dogs, it can take its toll on lawns.

Dog urine and feces can adversely affect the look and health of a lush green lawn. Nitrogen is essential to healthy soil, but only at certain levels. When those levels are exceeded, the result can be lawn damage. According to The Spruce Pets, an advisory site that offers practical tips and training advices to pet owners, this is what happens when pets frequently urinate on grass. Urine is naturally high in nitrogen, so when pets urinate on lawns, the grass might turn yellow or brown due to the excess nitrogen content. Nitrogen also is present in lawn fertilizers, further exacerbating the problem for pet owners who fertilize their lawns.

In addition to urine damage, dogs can trample frosted grass, contributing to problems that may not become evident until spring, and get into areas like gardens where they wreak additional havoc.

Pet owners who want to let their dogs run free in the yard but don't want damaged grass may be tempted to put their pooches in diapers or confine them to crates when letting them outside. But such an approach isn't necessary. In fact, some simple strategies can be highly effective at preventing dog-related lawn damage.

• **Speak with a landscaper about planting new grass.** Certain types of grass, such as Bermuda grass, can withstand dog damage better than others. Local climate will dictate which types of grass are likely to thrive in



a given area, so speak with a professional landscaper about the viability of planting new grass.

• **Install fencing.** Pet owners with expansive yards can install fencing that allows dogs to spend time exercising outdoors without granting them access to the entire property. Large dogs will need more room than small ones, but try to build fenced-in areas that allow dogs to run freely and get the exercise they need to stay healthy.

• **Work with a dog trainer.** Dog trainers might be able to work with dogs so they only urinate in certain areas of the yard, greatly reducing the damage they can cause to a lawn. Trainers also might help curb digging and clawing behaviors that can damage lawns as well as gardens.

• **Consider hardscaping.** Hardscaping might be most effective for pet owners with small properties. Hardscaping does not include grass and can add visual appeal to a property while saving pet owners the headaches of dealing with dog-related lawn damage.

Dogs need time outdoors, and homeowners can take various steps to protect their lawns from dog-related damage.

Pet owners who are considering microchips for their pets but are concerned that inserting a microchip into their pets will make the animals susceptible to cancer should not allow that concern to dissuade them from going forward. The American Veterinary Medical Foundation notes that the likelihood that a pet will develop cancer due to a microchip is very, very low. The AVMF also advises that the benefits associated with microchips, namely that lost pets will be reunited with their owners, greatly outweighs the very minimal risk that the pets will suffer from adverse health conditions as a result of their implants. The AVMF also notes that animal shelters and veterinary clinics are acutely aware of the concerns about missing an implanted microchip, leading them to take extraordinary measures to determine if a microchip is present before deciding to put the animal up for adoption or, in certain instances, to euthanize the animal.
