What's not to love about pumpkins. There are Jack-o-lanterns at Halloween, pumpkin pie and other pumpkin spice treats during the autumn season. How about the classic movie, "It's the Great Pumpkin, Charlie Brown."

It may interest you to know there is more to these big orange gourds than Halloween and sugary desserts and drinks. Pumpkins also have numerous health benefits as well.

It's technically a fruit

Blessings in a Backpack chair presents program to Rose Township

■ Mission is to feed Holly Area Schools children over the weekends

At its regular meeting Wednesday, Oct. 9, the Rose Township Board of Trustees heard a presentation on “Blessings in a Backpack” by Karen Gietzen-Stewart, the founder of the effort.

In her advance letter to the board, she

described Blessings in a Backpack as a “wonderful community-based program that helps children at risk for hunger in Rose Township and in the other communities of Holly Area Schools.”

Blessings in a Backpack provides a “backpack” of food each Friday to children at risk for hunger on the weekends. A little over \$100 feeds one child each weekend for the entire school year, providing six meals each weekend.

Gietzen-Stewart said in Michigan,

food is purchased at or below cost from Meijer. In Holly Area Schools, there are over 1,300 children that qualify for the Federal Free/Reduced Meal program at school during the week who are eligible for this program.

“In the fall of 2015 we piloted the program at Holly Elementary, feeding 91 students each weekend,” Gietzen-Stewart said. “Today, we are providing weekend food for approximately 420

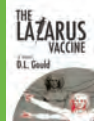

Halloween is just around the corner and what better way to get into the "spirit" of things than to watch some old scary movies that feature the "unexplainable." Here are some frightening movies with an actual plot that you can watch without too much trauma.



The Sixth Sense (1999)

Young Cole Sear is haunted by a dark secret: he is visited by ghosts. Cole is frightened by visitations from those with unresolved problems who appear from the shadows. He is too afraid to tell anyone about his anguish, except child psychologist Dr. Malcolm Crowe. As Dr. Crowe tries to uncover the truth about Cole's supernatural abilities, the consequences for client and therapist are a jolt that awakens them both to something unexplainable.

Signs (2002)

Everything that farmer Graham Hess assumed about the world is changed when he discovers a message — an intricate pattern of circles and lines — carved into his crops. children, offering the program at all four Holly elementary schools and the middle school."

In order to offer the program at these schools, Blessings in a Backpack organizers must raise more than \$45,000 each year, which they do through fundraisers.

Gietzen-Stewart asked the Rose Township Board to join them at fundraisers and help spread the word. She said "the need is great and 100 percent of all funds raised stay here in Rose Township and other Holly Area Schools communities to help our children."

The Holly group is part of a statewide organization Blessings in a Backpack Michigan, which has approximately 14 chapters in the state.

Like many non-profit organizations, this group survives with the help of volunteers.

The group raises approximately \$45,000 annually, which creates 110,000 meals for children over the course of the school year. This is made possible by several fundraising mechanisms such as a golf outing, murder mystery show, bowling event and trivia night.

LOOKING BACK at this week in HISTORY

OCT. 13

1975: In a 35-year career that ran from the rockabilly genius of "Lonely Weekends" (1960) to "Behind Closed Doors" (1973), the versatile and soulful Charlie Rich earned eleven No. 1 hits on the country charts. In 1975, the man voted Entertainer of the Year for by the Country Music Association of America one year earlier stood onstage at the CMA awards show to announce that year's winner of the Association's biggest award. When he opened the envelope and saw what was written inside — John Denver — Rich reached into his pocket for a lighter and set the envelope on fire. Denver himself was present only via satellite linkup, and he offered a gracious acceptance speech with no idea what had occurred.

OCT. 14

1912: Before a campaign speech in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Theodore Roosevelt, the presidential candidate for the Progressive Party, is shot at close range by saloonkeeper John Schrank while greeting the public in front of the Gilpatrick Hotel. Schrank's .32-caliber bullet, aimed directly at Roosevelt's heart, failed to mortally wound the former president because its force was slowed by a glasses case and a bundle of manuscript in the breast pocket of Roosevelt's heavy coat. Schrank was immediately detained and reportedly offered as his motive that "any man looking for a third term ought to be shot."

OCT. 15

1965: In a demonstration staged by the student-run National Coordinating Committee to End the War in Vietnam, some of the first public burnings of draft cards in the United States takes place. These demonstrations drew 100,000 people in 40 cities across the country.

OCT. 16

1991: George Jo Hennard drives his truck through a window in Luby's Cafeteria in Killeen, Texas, and then opens fire on a lunch crowd of over 100 people, killing 23 and injuring 20 more. Hennard then turned the gun on himself and committed suicide. The incident was one of the deadliest shootings in U.S. history.

OCT. 17

1931: Gangster Al Capone is sentenced to 11 years in prison for tax evasion and fined \$80,000, signaling the downfall of one of the most notorious criminals of the 1920s and 1930s. He got out early in 1939 for good behavior, after spending his final year in prison in a hospital, suffering from syphilis.

OCT. 18

1867: The U.S. formally takes possession of Alaska after purchasing the territory from Russia for \$7.2 million, or less than two cents an acre. The Alaska purchase comprised 586,412 square miles, about twice the size of Texas.

OCT. 19

1923: Walt Disney and his brother Roy found the Disney Brothers Cartoon Studio in Hollywood, California. The studio, now known as the Walt Disney Company, has had an oversized impact on the entertainment industry and is now one of the largest media companies in the world.

Weight loss

Pumpkin is rich in fiber, which slows digestion. Pumpkin keeps you feeling fuller longer. There are seven grams of fiber in a cup of canned pumpkin. That's more than what you would get in two slices of whole-grain bread.

Pumpkin may be filling, but it's also a low-calorie superstar. Canned pumpkin is nearly 90 percent water, so besides the fact that it helps keep you hydrated, it has fewer than 50 calories per serving.

Sharp vision

Pumpkin's brilliant orange coloring comes from its ample supply of beta-carotene, which is converted to vitamin A in the body. Vitamin A is essential for eye health and helps the retina absorb and process light. A single cup of pumpkin contains over 200 percent of most people's recommended daily intake of vitamin A, making it an outstanding option for optical health.

Pumpkin also contains lutein and zeaxanthin, two antioxidants that are thought to help prevent cataracts and may even slow the development of macular degeneration.

Better immunity

Looking for a way to ward off illness and improve your immune system? Try pumpkin. The large shot of vitamin A the fruit provides helps your body fight infections, viruses and infectious

diseases. Pumpkin oil even helps fight various bacterial and fungal infections. Plus, pumpkin is packed with nearly 20 percent of the recommended amount of daily vitamin C, which may help you recover from colds faster.

Younger looking skin

Eating pumpkin can help you look younger (beta-carotene in pumpkin helps protect us from the sun's wrinkle-causing UV rays), but the pulp also makes a great, all-natural face mask that exfoliates and soothes. All you need is 1/4 cup pureed pumpkin (not pumpkin pie), an egg, a tablespoon of honey and a tablespoon of milk. Mix, then apply it, wait for 20 minutes or so and wash it off with warm water.

Lower cancer risk

Beta-carotene is great for your eyes and skin, but it's also good for fighting cancer. Research shows people who eat a beta-carotene-rich diet may have a lower risk of some types of cancer, including prostate and lung cancer.

It (may) help treat diabetes

In scientific tests, pumpkin has been shown to reduce blood glucose levels, improve glucose tolerance and increase the amount of insulin the body produces. More testing needs to be done before we can say for sure what pumpkin's benefits for diabetics will be, but if you have diabetes, munching on pumpkin certainly won't hurt.

PUMPKIN RECIPES

ROASTED PUMPKIN SEEDS

Roasted pumpkin seeds are a delicious, healthy snack.

INGREDIENTS:

1/2 cups raw whole pumpkin seeds
2 teaspoons butter, melted
1 pinch salt

PREPARATION:

Preheat oven to 300 degrees F. Toss seeds in a bowl with the melted butter and salt. Spread the seeds in a single layer on a baking sheet and bake for about 45 minutes or until golden brown; stir occasionally.

PUMPKIN PUREE

Homemade pumpkin puree can be frozen and used in a number of recipes including pumpkin pie, pumpkin muffins and bread, pumpkin soup and more.

INGREDIENTS:

1 pumpkin

PREPARATION:

Preheat oven to 325 degrees F. Cut the pumpkin in half, stem to base. Remove seeds and pulp. Cover each half with foil. Bake in the preheated oven, foil side up, 1 hour, or until tender. Scrape pumpkin meat from shell halves and puree in a blender. Strain to remove any remaining stringy pieces. Store in the freezer in freezer safe bags.

THE STRINGY STUFF

Don't throw it away — you can eat it. You can eat the stringy bits, once separated from the seeds. Although you can munch on it, a more appealing use is to turn them into pumpkin cider. According to treehugger.com, boil the strings to make a thin broth. Strain, then mix with apple cider and a dash of cinnamon and nutmeg.

THE JACK-O-LANTERN

You won't be able to make pumpkin puree out of a pumpkin cut up into a Jack-O-Lantern, especially if you place a lit candle inside and leave it on your front porch Halloween night (you can get the seeds and the string out first though). After Halloween is over, you can cut the remaining outside of the pumpkin into pieces and leave it outside for your backyard wildlife to enjoy.

Carving pumpkins originally started in Ireland, as part a Celtic tradition on All Hallow's Eve. People would carve turnips and rutabagas to help ward-off evil spirits like Stingy Jack. Irish immigrants in America discovered pumpkins were a much better substitute and that is why we still carve pumpkins for Jack-O-Lanterns for Halloween today.

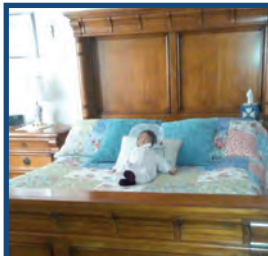

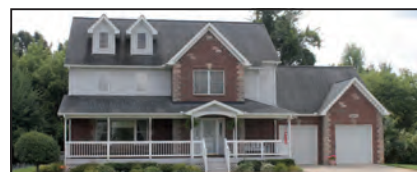

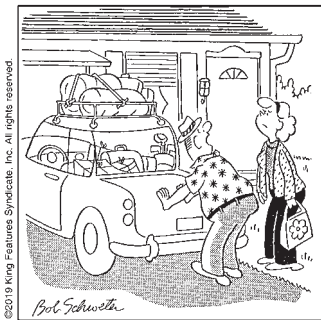
