## New fire hall decreases response time, increases morale

■ Fire department moves to larger Saginaw Street location after \$500,000 project is finished

**Holly** — On Wednesday morning Oct. 30, Firefighter/EMT Mason Babcock took advantage of the comfortable commons area of the new Holly Fire Department (HFD) to write a report for his last run on a HFD laptop.

There have been nine runs already as of 10 a.m. — three emergencies and six dialysis transfers.

In the kitchen, Battalion Chief Dan Myers works on cooking pork loin for the staff. There's always at least two staff members on hand and usually eight at the busy morning shift.

The renovation of the former Midwest Diesel building at 414 N. Saginaw St. started in the fall of

2018. They moved into the mostly completed building in late March and received official occupancy the beginning of October, according to Chief Steve McGee.

The project cost just under \$500,000 including purchasing the property and the build-out itself. McGee served as project manager using his experience as a builder and position as village building official. "We have completely updated the electrical, plumbing and mechanical systems, which will result in many years of efficient service," McGee said.

This new facility is 6,000 square feet allowing all equipment and personnel to stay at one freshly updated location. The former facility on E. Broad Street was half the size, forcing them to keep vehicles and equipment at three different locations.

Fenton City Council members serve four-year terms. Every two years, three members come up for re-election. Incumbents seeking re-election this year are **Nancy Draves, Pat Lockwood and Cherie Smith.**

They are being challenged by **Brad Jacob, Sean Sage and Damien Siwik.** The winner in the Nov. 5 race will serve until 2023. In 2021, the terms of council members **Tracy Bottecelli, Dave McDermott and Scott Grossmeyer** will expire and they will be up for re-election.

**Fenton Area Public Schools Sinking Fund Renewal**

Voters in the Fenton Area Public Schools district, which include those residing in the city of Fenton, and Fen-

ton, Rose and Tyrone townships, will decide whether they wish to continue paying the current .8999 mills being levied for another three years (2020, 2021 and 2022).

**New Sinking Fund for Lake Fenton Community Schools**

Lake Fenton Community Schools will ask voters to approve a 1.25-mill sinking fund for the next 10 years (2020 to 2029).

The district currently has a 1-mill Sinking Fund that was approved by voters in 2009 and expires at the end of this year.

**Oakland Community College mill-age renewal**

Voters in Oakland County, which locally includes the village of Holly, Holly and Rose townships, and 16 voters in the

city of Fenton (Water’s Edge homes), will decide whether to continue paying .7545 mills for Oakland Community College (OCC) operating purposes for 10 years.

**Gaines Township police funding**

Gaines Township voters will decide whether to support a referendum for police funding. If it passes, each parcel will be assessed \$115 annually for police services for a period of 10 years.

ORDINANCE NO. 79

CONSUMERS ENERGY COMPANY ELECTRIC FRANCHISE ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE, granting to CONSUMERS ENERGY COMPANY, its successors and assigns, the right and authority to construct, maintain and commercially use electric lines and related facilities including but not limited to towners, masts, poles, crossarms, guys, wires and transformers on, under, along, and across public places including but not limited to highways, streets, alleys, bridges, and waterways, and to conduct a local electric business in the TOWNSHIP OF ARGENTINE, GENESEE COUNTY, MICHIGAN, for a period of thirty years.

THE TOWNSHIP OF ARGENTINE ORDAINS:

**SECTION 1. GRANT and TERM.** The TOWNSHIP OF ARGENTINE, GENESEE COUNTY, MICHIGAN, hereby grants to Consumers Energy Company, its successors and assigns, hereinafter called “Consumers” the right and authority to towers, masts, poles, crossarms, guys, wires and transformers on, under, along and across public places including but not limited to highways, streets, alleys, bridges, and waterways, and to conduct a local electric business in the TOWNSHIP OF ARGENTINE, GENESEE COUNTY, MICHIGAN, for a period of thirty years.

**SECTION 2. CONDITIONS.** No public place used by Consumers shall be obstructed longer than necessary during construction or repair, and shall be restored to the same order and condition as when work was commenced. All of Consumer’s electric lines and related facilities shall be placed as not to unnecessarily interfere with the public’s use of public places. Consumers shall have the right to trim or remove trees if necessary in the conducting of such business.

**SECTION 3. HOLD HARMLESS.** Consumers shall save the Township free and harmless from all loss, costs and expense to which it may be subject by reason of the negligent construction and maintenance of the lines and related facilities hereby authorized. In case any action is commenced against the Township on account of the permission herein given, Consumers shall, upon notice, defend the Township and its representatives and hold them harmless from all loss, costs and damage arising out of negligent construction and maintenance.

**SECTION 4. EXTENSIONS.** Consumers shall construct and extend its electric distribution system within said Township, and shall furnish electric service to applicants residing therein in accordance with applicable laws, rules and regulations.

**SECTION 5. FRANCHISE NOT EXCLUSIVE.** The rights, power and authority herein granted, are not exclusive.

**SECTION 6. RATES AND CONDITIONS.** Consumers shall be entitled to provide electric service to the inhabitants of the Township at the rates and pursuant to the conditions as approved by the Michigan Public Service Commission. Such rates and conditions shall be subject to review and change upon petition to the Michigan Public Service Commission.

**SECTION 7. REVOCATION.** The franchise granted by this Ordinance is subject to revocation upon sixty (60) days written notice by either party. Upon revocation this Ordinance shall be considered repealed and of no effect past, present or future.

**SECTION 8. MICHIGAN PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION JURISDICTION.** Consumers remains subject to the reasonable rules and regulations of the Michigan Public Service Commission applicable to electric service in the Township and those rules and regulations preempt any term of any Ordinance of the Township to the contrary.

**SECTION 9. REPEALER.** This Ordinance, when enacted shall repeal and supersede the provision of any previous Consumers’ electric franchise Ordinance adopted by the Township including any amendments.

**SECTION 10. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Ordinance shall take effect on October 28, 2019.

Sheriff Mike Murphy said that on Wednesday, Oct. 30, at approximately 7:40 a.m., sheriff's deputies were dispatched to southbound U.S. 23 and Highland Road in Hartland Township for a single vehicle crash.

Murphy said the preliminary investigation has revealed that Morgan was operating a 2013 Dodge Ram Tradesman when he suffered an unknown

medical issue causing his vehicle to veer off the roadway and strike the cable guardrail just south of Highland Road. He was pronounced dead at the scene by Livingston County EMS.

Speed, alcohol and drug use are not suspected in this crash. Deputies were assisted at the scene by personnel from the Hartland Area Fire Department, Livingston County EMS and Michigan State Police Motor Carrier.

Overnight staff used to sleep on cots in the police department conference room. Now there are two upstairs bedrooms with bathrooms.

McGee said by moving, they've decreased their "chute time," the time they receive the call to when they're on the road, to 1:22. "This location reduces the chance for train delays as the preponderance of our calls are west of the station and south of the tracks," McGee said.

They're quicker, but also happier in this new building. McGee agrees it has been good for morale.

While their building is new, they've transferred their existing equipment and appliances to this location to keep costs down.

The new building emulates classic 1890s fire halls with large wooden beams and arched doorways. They looked at other fire halls for inspiration.

The old building parcel has since been split from the police department. McGee said there are parties interested in buying it.

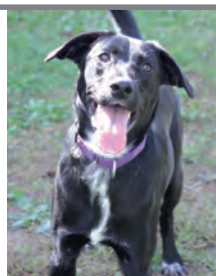

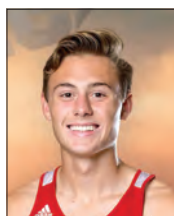

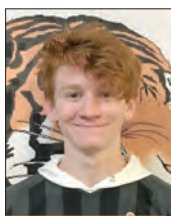
