Poet Robinson Jeffers, arriving with his wife in 1914, called the town “our inevitable place,” and built his stone Tor House overlooking the ocean, now open on weekends for tours.

The town’s charming eateries offer a full range of international, regional and local cuisines. Along with restaurants, Carmel Village is stocked with wine-tasting rooms and boutiques. The range of culinary options in Carmel ranges from country French to modern European to romantic.

Carmel-by-the-Sea features some of the world’s finest scenery, historic sites, art galleries, and boutique shops. On foot, by car, or both, there’s no lack of things to do.

But it’s the beautiful environment that best defines this stretch of California, and that means venturing out. Navigate 17-Mile Drive by car or bike, stopping to contemplate the Lone Cypress that’s clung to a patch of rock for centuries. Play a round at Pebble Beach, the No. 1 public golf course in the country, book a surf lesson, or make for Point Lobos

State Reserve, where scuba divers and kayakers share the water with harbor seals and sea otters.

When the day is almost done, hit the sand to admire the sunset over the Pacific with your canine (or human) companion, and ponder why it is you don’t live here. Yes, Carmel is very pet friendly.

Unusual facts about Carmel

Permit is required to wear high heels

This peculiar law was authored by the city attorney in 1963 to defend the city from lawsuits resulting from wearers of high-heeled shoes tripping over irregular pavement distorted by tree roots.

No street addresses

There are no street addresses anywhere in town. The early residents wanted to encourage people to meet their neighbors, and they figured the best place to do this was at the local post office. So, everyone living here picks up their mail at this central location.

No ice cream could be sold or eaten

This local ordinance prohibited the sale and eating of ice cream in the city. The reason was that ice cream tends to fall off cones, creating a sticky gooey mess on the streets. So they basically just outlawed it. That law, in particular, didn’t sit right with one local resident, the famous actor named Clint Eastwood. In 1986, he ran for mayor on a pro-business platform and promptly repealed it. So today, you can enjoy your ice cream and walk around town without worry.

No chain restaurants

Don’t look for those well recognized symbols of well-known eateries here. Rather, what you will find is a special place with more than 60 restaurants — many one-of-a-kind — and 14 wine tasting rooms. In fact, for a city that is only one square mile, there are reportedly more restaurants per capita than any other place on the earth.

No street lights

It seems the city founders decided that they didn’t want their city to be as light polluted as many of their big city cousins. Consequently, they made the decision to keep light to a minimum so that locals and visitors could enjoy the night sky, being able to see the moon and the stars, which is actually a nice thing. Note: If you come for a visit, bring a flashlight.



Coronavirus suspends rest of winter season; suspends start of spring practices

The Michigan High School Athletic Association (MHSAA) has suspended what remains of the winter athletic season Thursday afternoon due to the spread of the coronavirus.

"Earlier today the MHSAA made the very difficult decision to suspend all of our winter tournament events effective immediately," MHSAA Executive Director Mark Uyl said in a video on the MHSAA's website and Twitter account. "This is because of the new information we have received over the last 48 hours from the governor's office, from the department of health and human services as well as being in contact with our superintendent's group, principal's group as well as all the other sport leagues at various levels."

"This is a true and real public health crisis at the time and we need to do what we can to help slow and mitigate the spread of this virus. More information will be forthcoming in the next few days. Please understand with all of our winter events — our athletes, our coaches and our spectators this is a suspension of our winter tournaments. We just don't have enough information at this time, and the information we do have is rapidly changing so this suspension should





Blue Devils dominate regional semi contest

Goodrich — Katelyn Siebert and the rest of her Lake Fenton varsity girls basketball team had one goal at the start of the squad's regional semifinal game against Marine City at Goodrich High School on Tuesday.

"We had the same mindset we had against Goodrich — just get ready to go out and play, play together and just really hit the boards," Siebert said. "We wanted to throw the first punch and that's what we did."

If it was a boxing match, the Blue Devils may have thrown the first 20 punches. Lake Fenton's defense was stifling and it resulted in many breaking layups during the early portions of the game. Before the Mariners knew what hit them Lake Fenton had scored 27 points. The Blue Devils went on to win by a dominating 74-31 verdict earning a spot in Thursday's regional title game against Imlay City. The game will be at Goodrich High School at 7 p.m.

Game Scrapbook coming soon

The Blue Devils played in the first regional semifinal game in 18 years on Tuesday. To celebrate the occasion the sports staff will be doing a statistical picture story of the contest in an upcoming edition.

Marine City had only one glimmer of hope of making it a contest. With Lake Fenton leading 4-0, the Mariners were able to tie the game at 4-4 after a bucket by Morgan McConnell.

However, right after that hoop, the Blue Devils (18-6) were able to get a breaking bucket off an Aubrey Fray assist on a Siebert layup. Fray earned a steal on Marine City's next possession and followed it with another breaking layup. The Blue Devils kept up their pressure and scored off another breaking layup after Siebert got the defensive board and went coast-to-coast for another breaking layup. Just a minute after

Marine City had tied it up, the Blue Devils suddenly had a 10-4 lead.

The closest the Mariners would come after that was 10-6 after a jumper by Khloe Austin, but a converted free throw by Fray sparked a 17-0 run in which the Blue Devils pressing defense forced five straight turnovers during the run. Fray had two steals and Siebert had a steal as well, all resulting in breaking layups. When the run ended with a Sydney Hammis assist on a Siebert layup with 38 seconds left in the quarter, the Blue Devils led 27-6. The game was seemingly over before the first quarter ended.

"It seemed we outworked them a little bit more," Hammis said. "We wanted it a little bit more and it showed on the court. I'm really proud of everyone."

"We were hustling," Siebert said. "We had a few players who were really getting their hands out in the lane and stealing passes which opened up the backcourt and al-

Devils see season end vs. Martians in district semi, 94-57

Flint — The Lake Fenton varsity boys basketball team faced a familiar rival Wednesday night at Flint Powers Catholic High School gymnasium. The Devils came out strong in its district contest but fell to the Goodrich Martians, 94-57.

Lake Fenton held serve through the first quarter. The two teams were tied at 13 after a bucket from Devils' senior, Matt Turgeon, with 3:00 left in the quarter. Both teams were deadly early from behind the arc with Lake Fenton (6-15) hitting two 3-pointers and Goodrich one within the first minute and one-half of play. Goodrich led 21-18 after the first eight minutes.

The Martians (21-1) came out on fire in the second quarter and used a 16-0 run to begin to pull away. They led 49-26 at the break.

Two early steals from Goodrich stand-out Tyson Davis in the first 16 seconds of the second half propelled the Martians

early in the third quarter, but the Devils battled back to cut the lead to 55-38 at the 4:50 mark of the quarter.

Down 72-43 entering the final quarter, the Devils went on a 8-0 run to cut it to 72-51 with just under six minutes left in the game. But, again, Goodrich used an aggressive defense led by Davis for a quick six points to put the game out of reach.

While the final record may not show it, it has been a productive year for the young Devils. Returning next year will be junior Carter Foerster. Foerster had a strong game with 10 points and six rebounds.

"We kind of lost our cool a little bit," said Foerster. "We just have to learn from it. Our record doesn't show how much we have grown. We can learn from this and keep growing. The off-season starts now."

Turgeon and fellow senior Cade McMillan both were big contributors for Lake Fenton.

give us some time to see where the dust settles in a few days. Further information and updates will be coming at that time.”

The virus is starting to impact the spring sports season as well. The MHSAA allowed the start of spring practices for all prep sports on Monday, but by the end of the week all four tri-county schools had suspended practices until further notice. a shot that could end up being the highlight of his career. Mathews, who finished with a game-high 34 points, worked inside for about an 8-foot turnaround jumper. He missed it. The rebound went to Holly's Jacob Welch who flipped a desperate putback at the rim, but it also missed enabling the Eagles to sneak out with the 67-66 victory.

In a contest that Linden struggled mightily, the Flint Metro League Stripes Division champions figured out a way to win in what was a very dire situation for a long portion of the contest.

“The game isn't over until the buzzer goes off,” Lund said. “We had that one time out at the beginning of the second half and we knew what we had to do. We had to execute, run our stuff, get it together and we'd be fine. ... You have to play 110 percent all 32 minutes of the game.”



- INGREDIENTS
- 3.4 ounce box instant vanilla pudding
 - 3/4 cups milk
 - 1/4 to 1/2 cup creme de menthe
 - 8 ounces whipping cream more if you want to top the pudding with whipped cream
 - chopped chocolate optional

- INSTRUCTIONS
1. Combine the pudding, milk, and creme de menthe and blend with an electric mixer just until it begins to thicken a little. (note 1)
 2. With clean beaters beat the whipping cream until stiff peaks.
 3. Add the pudding mixture to the whipped cream and fold in the pudding.
 4. Fill dessert dishes. Top with sweetened whipped topping and chopped chocolate if desired.
 5. Refrigerate for about 1/2 hour to let the pudding set up.

- NOTES
1. Add only 1/4 cup of the creme de menthe to the pudding and mix just a little and taste. If you desire more of a mint taste and the remaining 1/4 cup or desired amount.
 2. For a kid-friendly dessert use mint or peppermint extract. The texture and flavor will be a bit different but you will still get that great minty flavor. If you want the dessert to have that pretty green color just add a few drops of green food coloring.
 3. Refrigerate for about 1/2 hour before serving to let the dessert set up.
 4. The pudding can be kept in the refrigerator for up to 3 days.
